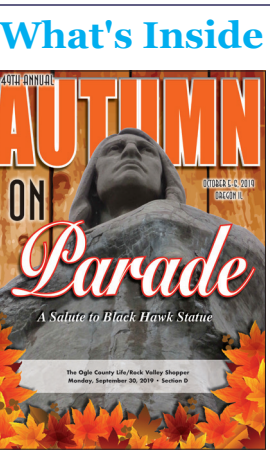

Statue work nearly complete

Restoration on the Eternal Indian set to be finished by early November

OREGON – In a matter of weeks, restoration work on the Black Hawk Statue near Oregon is scheduled to be complete.

Earlier this month, the scaffolding was put in place and the long-anticipated work began on the statue, created by Lorado Taft and originally completed in 1911.

“It’s amazing,” said John Lindhorst, president of Oregon Together. “But we’re going to stick right through until it is done, done, done.”

The work is scheduled to be completed by Nov. 4, with a couple of extra weeks after that to take down the scaffolding and remove the fence that is in place during construction.

The Illinois Conservation Foundation is overseeing the work – and writing

the checks from money donated locally as well as state matching funds. Locally, \$225,000 was raised, including \$100,000 donated last year by E.D. Etnyre & Co.

Lindhorst said that 364 freeze/thaw tests were done to determine the best material mixture to use on the statue during the restoration.

“It took a year to get the formula,” he said.

They are even bringing red granite from northern Wisconsin to mix with the concrete. And it is not just any red granite from any quarry.

“The same quarry where Taft got his red granite for the mix,” Lindhorst said.

The next step, scheduled for next spring, will be the re-design of the grounds around the statue.

Oregon Police investigate threat made by local student

On Sept. 25, students at David L. Rahn Jr. High told school staff about a social media post that they had seen the night before that discussed threat of a school shooting by a student, Oregon Police said. The Snapchat post was from a current Oregon High School student. Oregon High School staff and the Oregon Police Department School Resource Officer immediately

began investigating the incident. Based on the investigation, Oregon Police said they did not feel there was an immediate threat to students or staff. The Oregon High School student, a 15-year-old male, Oregon, was taken into limited custody for the Offense of Disorderly Conduct and has been released to his parent's custody. The matter has been referred to the Ogle

County State's Attorney's Office for a petition for Juvenile Delinquency. "We take these types of threats against the safety of our schools, staff, and students very seriously. I would like to commend the student(s) who had the courage to speak up and bring this to the attention of school staff so the issue could be safely resolved," said Oregon Police Chief Darin DeHaan.

Oregon man busted after search finds pot

OREGON – Oregon Police arrested Michael E. Blake, 61, Oregon, for possession of cannabis more than 500 grams but less than 2,000 grams, a class 3 Felony. On Sept. 19 at approximately 6:03 p.m., officers executed a search warrant on a residence located at 108 N. Nohe Ave., Oregon. This search resulted in the arrest of Blake. Blake was also issued a civil citation for possession of drug paraphernalia. Blake was transported to the Ogle County Jail and left in the custody of the correctional officer in lieu of bond.

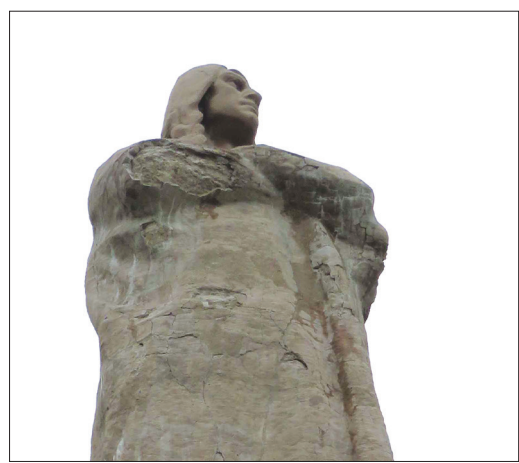

That will include all signage and parking. Lindhorst said the funds are already "locked in" for that work. He said Oregon Together has had a great working relationship with the ICF, Illinois Department of Natural Resources and Northern Illinois University during this process. "It's been a team effort, he said. The 48-foot tall statue stands 125 feet above the Rock River. It brings about 400,000 visitors per year to the Oregon area.

Mount Morris, Oregon group working to attack plastic problem plaguing public

The amount of plastic drifting on and in our oceans is alarming.

World production of plastics has increased exponentially since 1950 to about 450 million tons in 2015 and it continues to grow. It is predicted that by the middle of the century there will be more plastic in the ocean than fish. What is the lifespan of all that plastic? Forever.

Most of us can easily discard the hard plastic into recycling bins, but what about film plastic? The largest market for plastic today is in packaging which is used once and thrown away. The trash from these packaging materials accounts for almost half of all plastic waste generated globally. Film plastic can be described as any plastic that can be flattened and wadded up into a ball.

What is one solution? The Mount Morris and Oregon Indivisible Group is working with civic and non-profit organizations in both communities to recycle film plastic and earn Trex benches. Trex (www.Trex.com) is a company that uses plastic to create

products such as decking, porch rails, fences and lawn furniture. Communities are invited to participate in the program by donating 500 lbs of film plastic within 6 months in exchange for each bench.

We are seeking help from everyone in our communities to contribute their film plastic waste for recycling in order to keep it out of the landfills, oceans and, even more importantly, out of our bodies.

We are looking for clean and dry film plastic such as the items listed below:

Grocery bags, bread bags, case overwrap, dry cleaning bags, newspaper sleeves, ice bags,

wood pellet bags, Ziplock and other reclosable bags, produce bags, bubble wrap, salt bags and cereal bags.

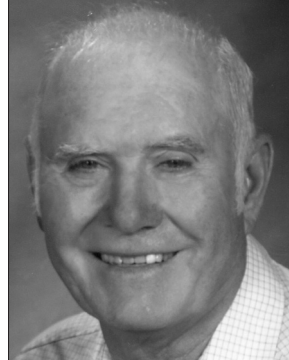

United Church of Byron offering variety of programs for kids

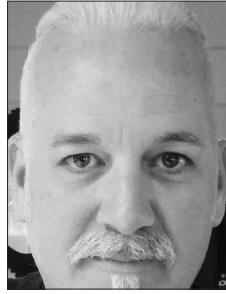

Sure, in my dreams I saw a huge group of people running toward Area 51 like a wave of humanity. And just as they got to the gates, our alien overlords rose up, 60

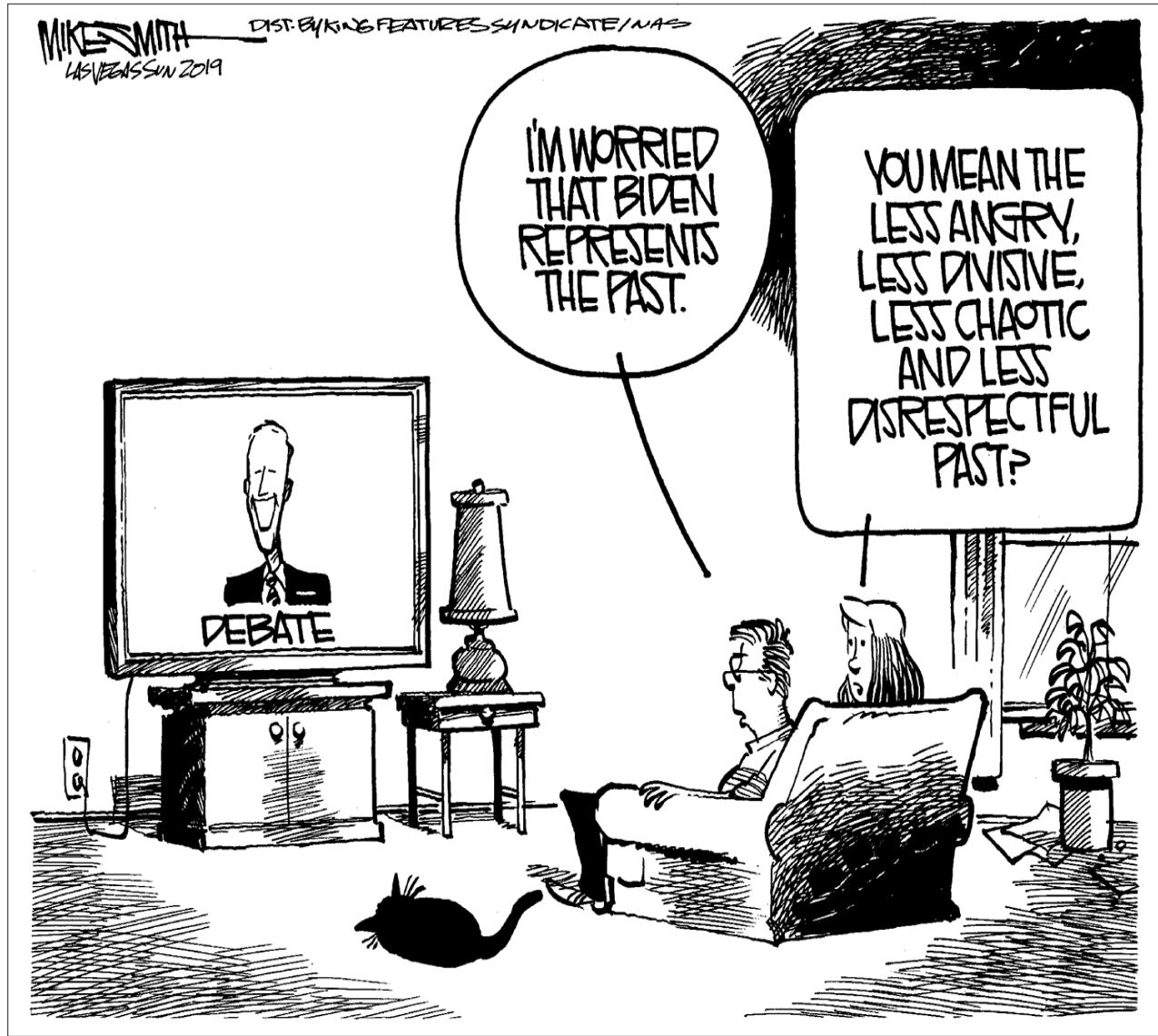
feet tall, and shot lasers out of their bulging eyes which exploded the shrieking millennials.

"Yesterday" (PG-13) -- What would you do if suddenly you were the only person in the world who remembered the Beatles? Meet Jack (Himesh Patel), who is hit by a bus during a massive blackout and wakes up to find that in the new reality, he is the sole keeper of such hits as "The Long and Winding Road" and, of course, "Yesterday," which he sings to his friends, staring incredulously when they think it's original material. His rocket to stardom is swift, including some pretty cute back and forth with a souped-up version of Ed Sheeran, played by Ed Sheeran. But it forces Jack to question what he may be giving up to be falsely famous. Lily James is at her wide-eyed best as Jack's friend and love interest, as is Kate McKinnon as a seedy manager. From director Danny Boyle.

"Shaft" (R) -- JJ (Jessie Usher), a soft but smart MIT-educated cybersecurity expert with the FBI,

goes to Harlem to investigate the death of his childhood friend. The criminal underbelly is hard to navigate for a man with no real-world experience, so he looks to his long-absent father (Samuel L. Jackson) for help. It's a good thing his initials stand for "John Jr." and his last name is "Shaft"! That's right, he's third in a line of legendary private investigators who excel at butt-kicking and looking good doing it. While Dad gives JJ a mean-streets education, they pursue bad guys aplenty -- and even grandpa (Richard Roundtree) gets in on the action. There are some witty one-liners and an exciting action moment or two, and even though it mostly fell into cliches, I still found it watchable.

"Child's Play" (R) -- Inspired by the original 1988 classic, this version finds single mom Karen (Aubrey Plaza) again gifting her darling boy Andy (Gabriel Bateman) with a very special doll. An AI, Wi-Fi-enabled piece of high tech designed to learn and grow with its owner, Chucky (voiced



by Mark Hamill) befriends Andy and sets off a wave of chaotic violence that puts Andy under the microscope of Detective Mike Norris (Brian Tyree Henry). This wave culminates in typically gory fashion. Although I like Plaza in everything, I didn't see any justification for a re-make.

"Anna" (R) -- Director Luc Besson has a thing for icily beautiful women who are simultane-

ously vulnerable and fierce. The titular Anna, played by Russian model-turned-actress Sasha Luss, is -- surprise, surprise -- a Russian assassin turned model. Much like Besson's "Nikita," Anna is trained to kill in return for the promise of five years' service. But then the KGB reneges on the deal, trapping her in the role of killer. To get out of it, she'll need to hold onto her wits against a CIA agent (Cillian Murphy) and her guns against her

Russian handlers (Luke Evans, Helen Mirren), with no shortage of crosses and double-crosses.

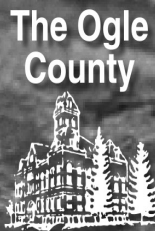

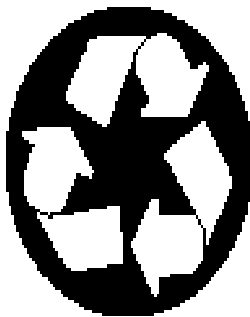

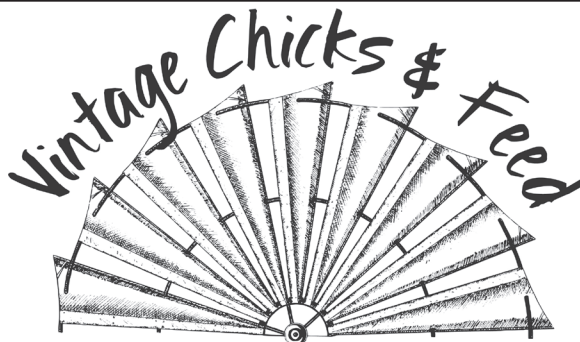

Local organizations celebrated

Two local organizations that are celebrating milestone anniversaries this year have been chosen as this year's Autumn on Parade Units of Honor.

The Village of Progress and the American Legion will be recognized in the Harvest Time Parade on Sunday, Oct. 6 for 50 and 100 years of service respectively.

"We're just delighted to be asked," said VOP Executive Director Brion Brooks. "We've already begun deciding how we can participate along with our people. They're excited to be part of it as well."

"We are very honored," said John Tuttle, Commander of Oregon American Legion Post 97. He said the group plans to have its float with seats in the parade, pulled by the post's Jeep, which once belonged to former post commander T. Richard Day.

"We plan on inviting all veterans and their families to ride on the float in the parade."

Village of Progress celebrated its golden anniversary with an open house in August.

Robert Brooks, one of the founding board members, launched the successful 708 initiative in Ogle County in 1968 to help fund services for people

with developmental disabilities and mental illness.

The Village of Progress was founded at that time to provide those services. Over the years it has grown in the scope and nature of the services offered. In its infancy, the Village provided day care to children with developmental disabilities — something that neither Illinois nor the federal government provided. Special education wasn't created until passage of the Education for the Handicapped Act in 1975.

The Village broke new ground in Illinois again in the 1970s when it built its current training center. It's believed that the Village was the first nonprofit in Illinois to construct a building specifically dedicated as a training center for those with disabilities. Over the years the Village reached out beyond its four walls. In 1975 they launched the Village Cleaning Service as a way of providing competitive, integrated employment to those with disabilities. The Yellow Bird also launched that year, a cooperative effort with the local seniors group. The project acted as both a storefront for Village-produced goods and a location for seniors to meet and socialize. In 1980 the Yellow Bird transitioned into the Rock River

Center, which remains a vibrant part of the community. Since the beginning, the Village has looked first toward entrepreneurial activities whenever possible. That mindset has continued into the present with the opening of the Village Bakery in 2017.

The Village of Progress Foundation, created in 1990, has been a strong partner in helping to advance the Village's mission. At present, the Village of Progress serves the needs of more than 90 men and women in Ogle County.

The American Legion is celebrating its centennial.

The military veterans' organization was founded on March 15, 1919, in Paris, France, by 1,000 officers and men of the American Expeditionary Forces and was chartered on Sept. 16, 1919 by the U.S. Congress. Tuttle said the Oregon post was originally founded in 1919 and named the Shirley Tilton American Legion Post 97 in honor of the first Oregon soldier killed in World War I.

In more recent years, the post was disbanded for a few years due to insufficient members and was then rechartered as Oregon American Legion Post 97. "Otherwise, we would be celebrating our centennial, too,"

Tuttle said.

The American Legion got its start when returning World War I veterans who wished to continue the camaraderie and relationships that they found during wartime built the foundation of the organization. It is a service organization that supports veterans and local charitable organizations, provides honor guards for veterans funerals, sponsors leadership opportunities for high school age boys through its Premier Boys State program, operates youth sports programs, and performs ceremonies for Memorial Day, Veterans Day and Pearl Harbor Day.

Legionnaires also take part in numerous community functions, fundraisers and educational events, among them American flag education and code awareness. The American Legion's four core pillars "promoting veterans affairs and rehabilitation, national defense, Americanism and children and youth" were born in aftermath of World War I and continue today, in a world still engaged in conflict.

Legion membership is open to those who have served on active duty and received an honorable discharge or are currently serving in one of the Armed Forces.

Take a step back in time at the Chana School

Reading, writing, and arithmetic are just three staples awaiting Autumn on Parade visitors at the historic Chana School, located on River Road in Oregon Park East.

This unique two-room school, built in 1883, is celebrating its 131st birthday this year!

It will be open for tours on Saturday, Oct. 5 from 10 a.m. to 3 p.m.

Costumed docents will greet visitors inside the school.

The school originally stood in the town of Chana seven miles from Oregon and was set to be torn down in 1998.

But a group of local citizens formed the Chana School Foundation to move the building to a new location, restore it to its original appearance, and operate it as a living history museum.

“This fairy tale story began with a building that was going to be destroyed,

because it was in the way of progress. It had been used in a variety of ways, since the closing of the Chana School District in the late 1960s,” said Connie Stauffer, who along with Chana native Duke Thomas, spearheaded the school’s move and restoration.

“Little had been done to keep the old building standing. It had not been painted in 60 years. Was it an eyesore? Yes! But we had a vision of what the old Chana School could do for education and history of our area if it were saved and restored.”

After five years of fund raising, grant writing and thousands of hours of volunteer labor, the Chana School Museum opened in the Fall of 2003.

In December 2005, the school was placed on the National Register of Historic Places.

“This was an amazing recognition for the school

and to everyone who had volunteered their energy to help make the school a landmark—not only for Oregon, but for the state of Illinois and our nation,” said Stauffer.

“There are only two schools with two classrooms on the National Register from Illinois and the Chana School is the only two-room wooden school on the register from Illinois.”

This unique V-shaped building is not your typical rural schoolhouse.

Inside visitors will find cloak rooms with curved walls, decorative pressed tin walls and ceilings and fancy carved woodwork painted in Victorian colors.

One classroom has been restored to how it would have looked in the mid 1890s complete with period desks, pump organ, antique lithographs and a decorative wood stove.

The other classroom



contains exhibits about life in the late 1800s and information about rural education in northern Illinois.

The Chana School is open by appointment by calling 815-732-4714 or 815-732-2447.

The school offers simu-

lation field trips for school classes throughout the year. The museum can also be used for weddings, meetings, and workshops.

Stronghold is the camping and retreat ministry of Blackhawk Presbytery, Presbyterian Church (USA). It is situated on 360 acres of woodlands on the bluffs overlooking the Rock River.

When not hosting the Faire, the Center offers facilities for overnight retreats, summer camps, leadership development programs and outdoor education programming.

Walter Strong, owner and publisher of the Chicago Daily News, and his family built the Castle as a vacation home in 1928. It was purchased by a group of Presbyterian churches in 1962 and is the centerpiece of the retreat center.

Stronghold is located two miles north of the Ogle County Courthouse Square on IL Rte. 2 North.
