**OREGON** – After spending a number of years a vice chairman of the Ogle County Board, John Finfrock had learned a lot about how the county operates.

That will serve him well as Finfrock is now chairman of the Board after the sudden death of former Chairman Kim Gouker.

"There was some trepidation there because this wasn't in the script," Finfrock said of being elected chairman at the County



Finfrock, who is retired from Kable News Co. and lives in Mount Morris, was first elected to the Board in 2010. He had served as vice chairman since 2012, when Gouker asked him to fill the role. He said he told Gouker he would do it, as long as it was understood that if asked his opinion, he would certainly give it.

"We didn't always agree, but we always worked something out," Finfrock said of Gouker.

Finfrock said Gouker's death was "unbelievable." He said that when Gouker did not show up for county meetings on consecutive days, they knew something was wrong. Gouker was found dead at his Byron home during a wellness check on Sept. 10. Finfrock admitted that he will have big shoes to fill following Gouker as chairman. But he said he is confident.

"Basically, the board's in good shape," he said. "The county's in good shape. We've got probably the best group of board members that I've been around since I came on the board."

Another plus is that the county has a strong group of department heads, and that they all work well together. "We all debate, and we all have our own ideas," Finfrock said."But when there's

a vote, the vote is it and you move on from there." He said that he plans to

stay "on the course that is charted." He said there may be some little differences in leadership, "but the objective is still the same."

First, the focus is on getting the new Judicial Annex completed, which was a priority for Gouker. He said the county is also facing issue like solar power and the question of how to handle legal cannabis.

But he main focus for now is keeping the county moving forward.

"I'd like to see the cohesiveness of the board itself stay where it is, because we've got a lot of cohesion there and a lot of people are engaged," Finfrock said. "I'm not going to try to change much. Everything's working well right now."

As he settles into his new role, Finfrock said fellow Board members and county department heads have approached him to ask how they can help.

"And that is a boost you can't believe," he said. "But that's the kind of people they are."

# MOMENTS IN TIME

\* On Oct. 25, 1881, Pablo Picasso, one of the greatest and most influential artists of the 20th century, is born in Malaga, Spain. Picasso's work comprises more than 50,000 paintings, drawings, engravings, sculptures and ceramics produced over 80 years. He had his first exhibit at age 13.

\* On Oct. 24, 1901, schoolteacher Annie Edson Taylor becomes the first person to take the plunge over Niagara Falls in a barrel in an attentiongetting stunt. She reached the shore alive, if a bit battered. Taylor claimed she was in her 40s, but records later showed she was 63.

\* On Oct. 26, 1942, the last U.S. carrier built before America entered World War II, the USS Hornet, is so badly damaged by Japanese warplanes in the Battle of Santa Cruz that it must be abandoned and was later sunk. The Hornet launched the Doolittle Raid on Tokyo.

\* On Oct. 22, 1975, Air Force Sgt. Leonard Matlovich, a decorated Vietnam War veteran, is given a "general" discharge after publicly declaring his homosexuality. Matlovic's discharge was later upgraded to "honorable," and he was buried with full military honors in 1988.

\* On Oct. 23, 1989, 23 people are killed in a series of explosions sparked by an ethylene leak at a Phillips Petroleum plant in Pasadena, Texas. The blasts were caused by inadequate safety procedures.

\* On Oct. 27, 2006, the last Ford Taurus rolls off the assembly line in Hapeville, Georgia. The keys to the silver car went to 85-year-old Truett Cathy, the founder of Chick-fil-A, who added it to his automobile collection.

to run around, not sit still

and cry loudly when told to do so, feel free to not take them out to dinner, or to a movie theater, or on a long flight.

Look, the rest of us should not have to suffer for your lack of parenting.

I understand that parents of young children want to go out to dinner sometimes. No problem. If you do and bring your kids, teach them how to behave. If they can't, don't bring them. I certainly don't want to go out to a dinner with my wife and have to put up with your little darling running around, or jumping up and down in the booth behind me.

I did not go out to eat much for years when I had young kids. I tried to be thoughtful of those around us, and often we just stayed at home until my children were old enough to behave well in public consistently.

What a concept, eh?







# Variety of water aerobics classes available from Oregon Park District

**OREGON** – The Oregon Park District offers three different types of water aerobics classes.

Classes meet 14 different times per week to accommodate schedules. Classes are held at the Nash Recreation Center pool. The pool is accessible for everyone with not only your traditional ladder but offers walk-in stairs or a chair lift for those that need extra assistance.

The Nash Recreation Center pool has a 13-person hot tub that is available for use when the pool is open and at least 15 minutes before and after all aerobics classes.

Water aerobics classes are for participants 18 years and up and can be paid daily with a drop-in fee or by purchasing a 5, 10, or 15 punch pass that is good for up to a year for any of the classes.

Cost for a drop-in water aerobics visit is \$5.50. Passes are available for 5 visits (\$21 resident/\$25 non-resident); 10 visits (\$36 resident/\$43 non-resident); 15 visits (\$47 resident/\$56 non-resident).

The traditional water aerobics class meets seven times per week with morning and evening options to choose from. In this class, you will exercise your entire body without putting stress on your back and joints. The class works on toning, cardiovascular strength, endurance and flexibility. Class takes place in the shallow and deep end of the pool. Fall classes are Monday-Friday from 8:30-9:30 a.m. and Mondays and Wednesdays 6:30-7:30 p.m.

Twinges class meets four times per week with morning and afternoon times available.


The natural buoyancy and resistance of the water helps improve joint strength and flexibility along with improving cardiovascular endurance while walking and jogging in the shallow end. Participants do not need to know how to swim to participate in this lower impact class. Classes are Tuesdays and Thursdays 1-2 p.m. and Wednesdays and Fridays from 10:30-11:30 a.m. Deep water aerobics is a more intense work-out than traditional water aerobics class and meets Monday and Saturday mornings. Working out in the deep end allows you an intense cardiovascular workout without the impact. Participants will also increase endurance, flexibility, and strength. Participants do not need to know how to swim. An aqua jogger belt will be provided. Fall classes are Mondays from 9:30-10:30 a.m. and Saturdays from 9:30-10:30 a.m.



"Spider-Man: Far From Home" (PG-13) -- Peter Parker (Tom Holland) sets off on a well-earned trip to Europe with his classmates after the death of his mentor. His attempt leave the Spider-Man suit at home is derailed by Nick Fury (Samuel L. Jackson) and the mysterious appearance of both parallel-universe hero Quentin Beck (Jake Gyllenhaal) and a group of havocwreaking creatures called Elementals -harnessing the power of Earth, Water, Fire and Air. All the while, Parker attempts to weave a web of good-old fashioned teen romance around friend and schoolmate MJ (Zendaya). The vibe is slightly more relaxed than "Homecoming," and definitely earned my kids' stamp of approval.

"Anna and the Apocalypse" (R) --There's a school of thought that in film, bloody violence and Christmas are a natural mix -- e.g., "Gremlins," "Die Hard" or even "The Nightmare Before Christmas," although that one was just spooky, not scary. "Anna and the Apocalypse" has one more genre thrown in for good measure: a musical, centered around Anna (Ella Hunt), a normal Scottish teen with friends, a job at the bowling alley and a zombie problem. When her town is overrun by the undead, Anna and her friends must band together to save themselves and their families. I found it to be quite fun, with a lot of humor and catchy show tunes.

"Driven" (R) -- The first of TWO films chronicling the life and personality of car designer John DeLorean, "Driven" tells the automaker's crazy story from the perspective of low-level FBI informant Jim Hoffman (Jason Sudeikis), who is endearingly sleazy, a nice foil to DeLorean's (Lee Pace) outwardly rock-hard confidence. Of



course, that confidence hides the soft center of desperation in a man who staked his reputation on a very impractical vehicle. He enlists Hoffman to raise an obscene amount of capital, and in 1980s California, you know that means a drug deal. Based on the life that was stranger than fiction.

"Framing John DeLorean" (NR) -- John DeLorean was a weird, visionary and iconic personality, so it's only fitting that his story is told in a phenomenally odd but entertaining docudrama with three interweaved but distinct parts. First, it's a documentary, with footage of DeLorean's meteoric rise at GM, interviews and insight of his family members and colleagues. Then it's a dramatization, with Alec Baldwin stepping into the shoes (and wigs and prosthetics) of DeLorean, reenacting some pivotal moments alongside other key players. The cherry on top is the bizarre documentary within the movie within the documentary: Baldwin examining, analyzing DeLorean's motivations as he prepares to portray him. It should be insane, but it's like a fascinating circus act you can't look away from. And why would you?

HOLLYWOOD -- Hollywood tried to compete for viewers in the 1950s with Cinerama, CinemaScope, Smell-O-Vision, scratch-and-sniff cards and, of course, 3D, which gave new depth to black and white horror films like "Creature from the Black Lagoon," "The Scorpion" and even the musical "Kiss Me Kate," starring Kathryn Grayson, Howard Keel and Ann Miller. When the movie moguls realized it wasn't working, they produced bad TV shows to drive people back into movie theaters.


Now IMAX and 3D rule the box office, and films that don't go big and three-dimensional may have action, but no WOW factor. In today's marketplace, a film must make twice its cost to break even. "Dark Phoenix" had the benefit of the "X-Men" franchise, as well as James McAvoy, Michael Fassbender, Jennifer Lawrence and Nicholas Hoult, but is considered a flop because it cost \$200 million and earned only \$252 million.

"Godzilla: King of the Monsters" would've benefited from IMAX and 3D, and a big name star (Kyle Chandler and Vera Farmiga didn't draw big) because costing \$200 million and earning \$386 million didn't impress. The reboot of "Shaft," despite starring Samuel L. Jackson and Regina Hall, fell short of its \$35 million cost, making just \$21 million. "Once Upon a Time in Hollywood," with Brad Pitt and Leonardo DiCaprio, should have killed, but grossed only \$330 million, less than a blockbuster when you compare it to Di-Caprio's Oscar-winning film "The Revenant" (cost \$96 million and amassed \$533 million).

Director Quentin Tarantino's previous film, "The Hateful Eight," cost only \$50 million and earned \$156 million. Judging from reviews, Brad Pitt's current release, "Ad Astra," will probably make more than "The Hateful Eight" and "Once Upon a Time in Hollywood" combined. The problem with making films by the numbers is that most of the time, the numbers don't add up.

"Superman" Henry Cavill, who stars in the Netflix series "The Witcher," is trading his cape for a magnifying glass as Sherlock Holmes in "Enola Holmes." The story revolves around Holmes' child sister, played by Millie Bobby Brown, who at age 13 broke out in the Netflix series "Stranger Things" as Eleven and the aforementioned "Godzilla: King of the Monsters." She returns with Alexander Skarsgard for the sequel, "Godzilla vs. Kong."

Skarsgard passed on another season of "Big Little Lies" to topline the CBS Access miniseries "The Stand," with James Mars-



den and Whoopi Goldberg. The Stephen King novel was a miniseries in 1994 starring Molly Ringwald, Jamey Sheridan and Laura San Giacomo, and it won Emmys for make-up and sound mixing. But can a "Superman" succeed as a "super sleuth" playing second fiddle to a 15-year-old? Stay tuned!
