



# Area's biggest and best car show returns to Amboy Sunday, Aug. 26

**AMBOY** - The area's biggest and best car show returns this year bigger and better than ever. The Amboy Depot Days Car, Truck and Motorcycle Show will take place on Sunday, Aug. 26 (rain or shine) during Depot Days in Amboy. As in years past, the judged show will include an array of cars, trucks and motorcycles on display throughout the downtown area. Pre-registration has indicated that this year's show will be a big one.

"We are doing something new this year," said show coordinator, Garth Dallam. "The cars and trucks will be parked as they come in, not in classes as we have done in the past. This is something we have been talking about for months, so we are going to try it and see if it works." Cars will begin parking on Main Street next to the highway and continue down to Whisky Ave. Then they will fill Sensient Parking lot and progress from there. The cars that enter the show do not have to be judged, but judging sheets

will be on each car. Once Main Street is full, the entrants will have one hour to get ready before judging begins.

"If the sun shines, they will come," said Dallam

The Amboy Depot Days Car, Truck and Motorcycle Show was started in 1991 by a group of friends who not only had an interest in antique and classic vehicles but also desired a way to showcase their community. Since that time, the show has grown not only in the number of vehicles on display but also in the quality of vehicles, which has continued getting better each year.

The IASCA (International Auto Sound Challenge Association) will also be part of the show again this year.

These cars will be on display at the triangle at the Amboy Junior High School.

Help is needed to park cars and judge them. If you are interested in helping in any way please contact the show organizers.

"As volunteers, our day



starts early," said Hank Gerdes. "Most car shows start registration at 8 a.m. We start registration at 6 a.m. and by 5 a.m., there is a double line waiting to get in. Cars come from as far away as Iowa and Wisconsin for this show."



Gerdes and his crew, also known as the A Team, start at 2:30 a.m. Their job is to close the streets and set up the gates. Then another crew comes in to mark off the various classes and set up markers.

"We also have to set up the tents, the motorcycle area, the registration booth and it all has to be ready to go by 6 a.m.," Gerdes said.

Registration of vehicles will be from 6-11 a.m. Sunday morning and dash plaques will be given to the first 600 cars and first 65 motorcycles. Judging takes place from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m.

There are 47 classes and three trophies are awarded in each class; four trophies will be awarded for any class with over 20 entries. Awards will be presented after 3 p.m. on the main stage near the Depot Museum.

**Participant** awards include best engine, best paint, best interior, best GM, best Ford, best Mopar, Best of Show and Best of Show Motorcycle. Other awards include Mayor's Choice Award, Miss Amboy Award and a special prize to the longest distance traveled to the show.

Special features at the show this year will be two old Hudson cars with Nascar engines and a monster

A free shuttle service will again be available on Sunday. Visitors may park at Amboy High School and be transported to the downtown area.





#### Travi named 2018 Depot Days Parade Grand Marsha

AMBOY — The Amboy Lions Club is proud to announce that Jean Travi has been named the 2018 Amboy Depot Days Parade Grand Marshal.

For 39 years Jean Travi has taught three generations of Amboy youth, many of whom have gone on in various sciences related fields.

Jean grew up on a farm outside of Hampshire, the daughter of Art and Shirley Getzelman. Her family was science oriented with her father being a farmer, her mother a nurse, brothers, Bob of Denver, Colo., and

Tom of Hampshire, both veterinarians, and sister, Ann, of Hampshire, an ER nurse.

Her father was a 30 year 4-H leader and she and her siblings showed beef cattle and exhibited various other projects. In 1970 she was chosen Northern Illinois Shorthorn Lassie and toured the county fairs that summer to present trophies and ribbons. One of those fairs was the Lee County Fair.

Jean recalls, "Amboy seemed like a nice, friendly rural town, a lot like her hometown of Hampshire." In 1971, she graduated with a BS in Education from Illinois State University and saw that District 272 was looking for a teacher. After submitting her resume, she was called in for an interview.

On that spring Saturday in May she remembers walking into a beautiful new high school building that was being transformed for the prom that evening. Principal Jim Braida was on a ladder hanging decorations for the "Age of Aquarius" prom theme. After a tour of the building and an interview she was offered the job and

has always been grateful for the opportunity to begin her teaching career in Amboy.

It was at Amboy High School that she met her husband, Jim Travi, of 44 years. For the past 33 years he has been a Financial Advisor with Waddell & Reed in Sterling, son, Matt, is an AHS and Western Illinois University graduate and is the lead software design engineer for Gain Compliance out of Des Moines, Iowa. He lives with his wife Andrea, daughter Ella, (4) and son, Cade (1) in Cumming, Iowa.

Jean is active in St. Patrick's Parish of Amboy and served 18 years as sacristan. She also helps her husband plant, weed and maintains the Amboy Welcome signs.

Jean received her MS from Northern Illinois University and taught her entire career at AHS. "The first year I taught Health and Physical Education with Jim Mahar, Life Science and was the coach for football, basketball and wrestling cheerleading," she said. "In 1972 Title 9 was passed which mandated girls could participate in team sports so I also became the frosh-soph and varsity volleyball and basketball coach for many years. At that time we played conference teams but our facilities were not the best.

Sandy Mahar refereed most of our volleyball matches standing on a wooden step ladder with it tied to the gym wall for stability. The host and visiting teams then met for "milk and cookies" after the game.

When Orville Spurlin retired she took over the Biology classes, Anatomy and Physiology and was fortunate to team-teach the Environmental classes with Joyce Gibson and Gary Carlson, as well as coach the Northwest Council #1 Environthon teams with Mark Streit. "I am ever grateful to Lyle Reuter, Hazel Reuter, Deb Carey and Sally Baumgardner and other community volunteers for their many hours of help with our prairie trips in educating our students about the great local area prairies of our state," said Travi. "Gail Dunn and Carolyn Nelson were always available to help with

various research projects and preparing student slide show presentations for state competitions."

In the 1990s Mr. Braida and Sauk Valley College introduced AHS to Tech Prep courses in the vocational and applied technology fields. Amboy participated in the "school to work program" for many years.

Jean was a National Tandy Corp. Technology Scholar finalist and nominated several times for the Illinois Science Teacher of the Year.

"One of my favorite classes was Anatomy and Physiology," said Travi. "I have had many of my students continue on into various medical professions. We were able to take field trips to the Sauk Valley Community College Science and Nursing Departments, including examining Sauk's human cadavers. My classes were invited for many years to the office of the late Dr. Thomas Lawless to examine the eye."

Many of Jean's students were allowed to take advantage of job shadowing opportunities at KSB Hospital with medical, business, pharmaceutical and laboratory personnel. During her last 5 years of teaching, she was able

#### Safety measures in place during annual Depot Days

AMBOY - The Amboy Fire Department will ramp up the safety procedures during the Amboy Depot Days this year.

"Each year we try to build on the services that we were able to offer the year before," said Amboy Fire Chief Jeff Bry-

In the 2018 Depot Days there will once again be a cooling center housed inside the Lee County Farm Bureau Building from 8 a.m. – 4 p.m.

There will be an area for cooling off, an area to have your vitals checked, a first aid station, a triage area and a treatment area that will be staffed by EMTs and a physician from Mercy Health.

In addition to the cooling center, there will be five mobile ATV with an EMT and a paramedic on them to assist visitors as needed.

There will also be five stations throughout the area, staffed by local churches, that will dispense free water. The water is donated by the Amboy Fire Department, Republic Services, the Amboy Lions Club and Amboy Food and Liquor.

"One of the major issues we have seen over the years, is that people become dehydrated," said Bryant. "So we hope to alleviate issues by having free water available to everyone. The water was donated by the Amboy Fire Department, the Amboy Police Department, the Amboy Lions, Republic Service and the Car Show committee. Area churches will handle dispensing the water."

"Every year we get better and are better prepared to handle emergencies," said

The attendance at the car show on Sunday averages about 100,000 people.

In addition area departments who will assist this years event include Advanced EMS Dixon, Sublette Fire Department, Harmon Fire Department, Walnut Fire Department and Compton Fire Depart-



## Amboy Depot Museum open during annual Depot Days

AMBOY - The Amboy Depot Museum is located in a former depot and division headquarters of the Illinois Central Railroad located in downtown Amboy.

The structure is an architecturally unique two-story building built of brick and cut Joliet limestone and is listed on the National Register of Historic Places.

The Depot has been completely restored both inside and out and includes the original brick tarmac surrounding the depot and the grounds of the former rail-yard, which is now preserved as a city park. Also reconstructed were the distinctive chimney caps on the building's eight chimneys, fully restoring the building to its original exterior configuration. Within the museum are artifacts of both the history of Amboy and the Illinois Central Railroad.

The museum complex also includes a freight house with additional artifacts, a fully restored one-room country schoolhouse, a retired steam engine and a caboose. Everyone is welcome to stop in and enjoy some local history at one of the best small-town depot museums to be found anywhere.

The Amboy Depot Museum and gift shop will be open to the public throughout Depot Days. Their regular hours are from 1 – 4 p.m., Sunday and Thursday, and from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m., Friday and Saturday. They are closed on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday. The Depot closes for the season from Nov. 1 through March 31.

The museum is located on Main Street, two blocks

west of US 52. There is no admission; donations are accepted.






