Rain, rain stay away to let the Toy Show have great days

SUBLETTE – Last year's Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show didn't have the

best weather.

Actually, it was miserable with cold winds and rain.

This year, all fingers are crossed Mother Nature doesn't ruin the party.

"The show takes a lot of preparation We have six committee members in John Stenzel, Anthony Morgan, Mark Henkel, Jeremy Zapf, Evan Bickett, and myself, and a lot, a lot of volunteers who are putting this thing together," said Maurice Zimmerlein, who doesn't like to be called the committee president but is viewed as the lead chairman. "There are people who will come out of the woodwork a week before the show to help us set up. It really works out. It's a community minded event.

"As every year, we're

hoping for a beautiful spring day with nothing but sun and maybe a few clouds in the air. The weather has a strong influence in the show's turnout."

Weather aside, the 42nd annual toy and tractor show looks to be in fashion for large crowds, big tractors, and enormous fun.

"We depend a lot on the locals for volunteerism. It takes a lot of volunteers to bring in the local tractors," Zimmerlein said. "We usually get 100-200 tractors and 6-10 semi-tractors on the Sublette streets; Main Street mostly. We have a lot of local farmers that bring equipment to town.

"We get support from local dealerships. We get monetary support from a lot of the local businesses. With John Deere being this year's featured tractor company and it being prevelant in our area, we could see a spike in numbers across the board.

The volunteers and committee members set up and take down tables and take money at the doors of the five different buildings housing the show, which are Main Street Repair, Jacoby Building, Sublette Farmers Elevator, Sublette Community Building, and the Ellice Dinges Center.

A few changes have been made to the regular scheduled programming.

After hosting a Saturday cookout for many shows, the Illinois Pork Producers are no longer going to man grills, for this year's event or others moving forward.

The money the pork producers used to give to two food pantries is being supplemented by the tractor and toy show group as \$500 dollars will be given to two local food pantries.

Evan Orzech, who bought the building formerly owned by Chris Leffelman, Leffelman Automotive, brought in Orzech Auto Truck & Towing LLC, will showcase a large model train.

The show's shuttle will include Orzech Auto to the stop schedule so riders can check out the new to Sublette choo choo train.

Zimmerlein and the committee are thrilled to continually change, adapt, and install new people and attractions to the Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show for 42 years.

"When it first started, it was back in the 1980s and toy shows were a fairly new thing. There were a lot of guys that collected farm toys years ago," Zimmerleinsaid. "Ithink it's a little more family orientated now.

"I'm a vendor myself. I've been setting up a table, buying, and selling at the toy show since 1985. What I like to see is a lot of families come through with younger kids. It's good to see younger people getting involved with it because there are a lot of older collectors."

Zimmerlein mentioned there are a lot of avid collectors who have cast iron toys that were made in the 1800s, and added, those are worth some money if you have them.

The committee president is always interested in what everyone brings to the toy show

"We handed out questionnaires to our vendors two years ago to get an opinion on wha we should do different," Zimmerlein said. "Everyone likes what we have. They like coming to the show. We're going to try to not change anything and keep it going the way it is.'



Call all green tractors, equipment to represent the featured company, John Deere

SUBLETTE – The rotation of featured tractors at the Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show has revolved to a popular company.

Anytime you see a green tractor, one name comes to mind, John Deere.

"Our feature changes from year to year between eight different brands of tractors from old to new. Some companies are no longer around but there are still the antique tractors in this area," said Maurice Zimmerlein, who is recognized as the president of the Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show Committee, although he'll deny and tell you the committee works together. "John Deere

has always been big in this area. They have such a big dealer network, and a lot of local farmers are either John Deere or CASE IH. I prefer the John Deere because that is what I grew up on."

All green tractors, equipment, and toys are welcome by the committee, including the featured John Deere tractor, the John Deere 4020 as it celebrates its 60th birthday.

John Deere as the feature promises to bring out machinery from the local area in droves.

At the same time, the popularity of the brand is bringing in showcase tractors from the entire Midwest.

Classic Green, an organization based

out of Burlington, Iowa that has expanded to 700-plus members through North America including Canada, will be in attendance.

"I haven't been to the show in Sublette before," said Darren Redding, the president of Classic Green. "I don't have exact numbers, but I think there are only one or two people from our group, who are going this year, that have been there before. It's going to be brand new for the majority of us who are going to represent Classic Green.

"I'm really looking forward to it. It's kind of hard to come by a show that's a toy and tractor display show, all in one, especially this early in the season. I've heard of the Sublette Farm toy & Antique Tractor Show in the past, but I've never had the chance to go before.

"I can't wait. I have a tractor that I'm bringing to put on display and I'll be there for Classic Green for our set up and to push our membership and the benefits of being a member.

Redding will show a 1962 version of the 4010, the predecessor of the 4020.

The tractor isn't only special because of its age or importance to the company, but also for what it means to him and his father, Mark Redding.

"I lost my dad in November 2022. I lost my travel companion. My knight in shining armor only goes with him in spirit now," said Redding. "I'm continuing what we've done. I don't think he'd want me to give it up. I'm going to keep going.



"I'm actually bringing a tractor that my dad and I had started putting back together. We were working on it at the time he passed away. I was able to finish it last fall. I'm making a debut with the tractor. I'm happy and excited to take the tractor to the next level and show everyone the work dad and I did on the tractor.

'It's a feel-good kind of thing for me knowing this tractor was the last thing my dad and I worked on as a team."

John Deere has impacted many farms and families in different ways.

The featured company is sure to bring out many more fond memories during the 42nd Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show.

'Why isn't there an organization for John Deere?' prompts the creation of Classic Green

SUBLETTE – In 2018, a very good question was asked in Burlington, Indiana.

"A group of us came together and said, 'There are all of these other organizations for other colored tractors, why isn't there an organization for John Deere?" said Darren Redding, the president of Classic Green. "We decided to try to do something. That's where it spearheaded, a group of people that thought John Deere collectors and enthusiasts of the brand deserved an organization.

"We are anything and everything related to John Deere or John Deere associates and partnering companies. We don't care if the stuff runs, if it's rusty, if it's painted, if it's dragged in on a chain, or if you drive it. As long as it's a John Deere piece you're proud of and you love owning it, you're part of our group.

"We don't turn many

people away. If you have a love for the brand, which John Deere has a significant brand and logo that is worldwide, we want would love to have you part of Classic Green."

Redding, 54, of Burlington, Ind., and seven others created Classic Green in 2018.

He started as the vice president and was named the president in June 2023.

Classic Green has more than 700 paid members (\$25 for yearly membership) which have the ability to enter more options than unpaid viewers on the website, classicgreen.

On Facebook, Classic Green has 88,000-plus followers

"We're really excited about our numbers. Naturally, we would like them to bigger and we hope they grow in time," Redding said. "That's what we're working on. We have great people in position on the board of directors and committees we've created internally to actually go out, represent Classic Green, and promote sponsorship, shows and events."

Classic Green holds its own event, the Classic Green Reunion, every other year on odd years, but makes sure it attends as many shows held by other organizations throughout the year.

Hence a stop in Sub-

"It's a labor of love. There is a lot of work behind the scenes and

there is a lot of work from all over, it's not up front," Redding said. "We've got a fantastic core group of people. We have a 15-member board of directors and we're scattered all over the country. We definitely have great input

centralized.

"It makes it even better because we get ideas and brainstorming from every corner of the United States. We also have a board member in Canada."

The feature of the feature: John Deere 4020 celebrates 60th anniversary

SUBLETTE – Although the tractor manufacturer John Deere is the overall feature, the feature has a feature.

It's the 60th year anniversary of the John Deere 4020, which is known as changing the way tractors were made.

"All models of John Deere equipment are welcome to showcase. We would like to feature the Model 4020 tractor because it's the 60th year of the tractor," said Maurice Zimmerlein, the president of the Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show Committee. "We're looking for those specifically. I know there are a lot of those in the area and we're trying to get them to the show."

The 4020 was produced from 1964 to 1972 as it replaced the 4010, which was nearly an identical tractor introduced with John Deere's New Generation Series in 1960. The 4020 offered three different engines with diesel, petrol or LPG. The 4020 diesel had a six-cylinder engine which tested at 84 drawbar and 91 PTO horsepower.

According to tractordata.com, John Deere made 184,879 of the 4020s and it

sold for \$10,345 in 1972.

The 4020 is known for provided operators with comfort in the cab, deluxe seats, and hydraulic controls to replace levers.

Darren Redding, the president of Classic Green, an organization built on appreciation for John Deere, lists 4020 on top of all green tractors.

"I'm going to speak biasedly. In my opinion, strictly my opinion and everyone has their own opinion, reading different articles, talking to farmers and other collectors, and researching, I believe the 4020 is what set John Deere apart from the rest," Redding said. "They were moving from the two-cylinder engine era into the multiple-cylinder engines. It was a big step. The 4020 was definitely a well-rounded piece of machinery for the user, the farmer, who was using it for work.

"In my opinion, the 4020 is the greatest thing John Deere has ever done. "You'd be surprised how many 4020s are still running around on farms today, either as a user tractor, stashed away as a show tractor, or as a keepsake. The 4020 is highly significant in the physical makeup of the company John Deere."



Andy Clean brings soap to Sublette

SUBLETTE – Part of the reason tractors sparkle in the sunlight during the Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show is the exquisite care their owners induct.

Since 2018, Andy Clean has been a primary name when it comes to washing farm machinery.

"The people really responsible for Andy Clean becoming a product and the reason the soap was created is because of the people online sharing, resharing, commenting, and reacting with the photos," said Andy Pasztor, the owner of Andy Clean. "I'd like to say I did 10 percent of the work, but honestly, I did two percent of the work because I'm not the chemist who created the soap and I didn't do the



marketing work, people online did."

The idea for Andy Clean came out of the blue, out of social media dust.

Pasztor, a farmer based in Ontario, Canada, shared photos of himself washing a combine on X (formerly Twitter) in 2014.

One repost led to an-

other and soon enough reactions and comments had started a trend, Andy Clean.

Fast forward four years, 2018, Pasztor received a package from John Deere with Andy Clean stickers. Pasztor began marketing as he sent the stickers to different countries in five of the seven continents.

At this time, the highlight of Andy Clean came in 2022 when John Deere featured a tractor with an Andy Clean sticker visually mounted during a global advertisement.

"It was mind blowing," said Pasztor, who farms and is in business with his father Arpad Pasztor and his brother Mike Pasztor. "To have your sticker, your brand on a John Deere tractor is amazing."

Andy Clean, for the first time, is coming to the 2024 Sublette Farm Toy & Antique Tractor Show to bring the product directly to the community of Illinois farmers.
