MENDOTA – Tons of free, hot, buttered, delicious sweet corn will be the highlight of the 77th annual Sweet Corn Festival to be held in Mendota on Aug. 8-11.

The Mendota Area Chamber of Commerce is preparing for the gigantic undertaking of hosting over 60,000 visitors, who consume over 50 tons of sweet corn during the festival weekend.

Don't miss the excitement as the festival offers a variety of entertainment events for the entire family. The events take place primarily in the downtown area, and with the exception of the beer garden, have no admission fees or parking fees.

Free musical entertainment is in abundance. The Crafters Market Place and Flea Market features dealers in hand-made crafts and unique merchandise. There is a Queen Pageant, beer garden with live bands, grand parade and a carnival with rides and games for both adults and children, plus much more.

The midways are lined with food booths, featuring a multitude of ethnic, regional and festival foods, but the "BIG EVENT" is the serving of the free sweet corn on Sunday afternoon. For over 75 years, it has been cooked to its golden goodness with the help of a vintage steam engine.

The good times are waiting, the welcome mat is out, come to Mendota for one of the Midwest's oldest and largest harvest festivals, the 77th annual Sweet Corn Festival.

The Neverly Brothers to present A Rock 'n' Roll Tribute from Elvis to the Beatles Aug. 23 at Amboy Depot Days

AMBOY – Back by popular demand, The Neverly Brothers will take the Main Stage at the 2024 Amboy Depot Days on Friday, Aug. 23, from 7-9 p.m. The concert is free to the public.

Formed in 2003 by brothers Kevin and Kegham Giragosian, The Neverly Brothers are a very popular and unique retro-rock tribute act based in Homer Glen. Kevin plays a combination of lead and rhythm guitar as well as harmonica. Kegham plays a minimalistic drum set in a unique style while standing (vs. sitting). The Giragosian brothers both are lead vocalists and sing stunning harmonies in the style of John Lennon and Paul McCartney and Phil and Don Everly. The group is rounded out by Mike Bradburn on the upright bass fiddle and backing vocals.

The Neverly Brothers are one of the few local musical groups that has developed and sustained a successful career as a full-time national touring headline act. Fall through spring they take their show on the road to perform at ticketed concerts in theaters and performing arts centers across the country. In the summer months they draw huge crowds at over 50 outdoor concerts and festivals around the Midwest.

They've graced the stages of many prestigious festivals like Taste of Chicago and Ribfest (Naperville) - thrilling crowds ranging in size from 500 to 5000. The theaters they've performed in range in size from 400 seats (The Beverly Arts Center/Chicago) to 1400 seats (Superstar Theater/Atlantic City, NJ).

The Neverly Brothers concerts take you on a guided musical virtual tour of the birth, near death and resurrection of rock n' roll - from 1955 to 1965. Their stage show illustrates how rock was created in America in the 1950s, how it died in 1960 and how it was brought back to life by the 1964 British Invasion bands - who re-recorded their favorite American rock, Motown and rhythm & blues songs with additional vocal harmonies, faster tempos

and new energy. You'll learn rock history and be thoroughly entertained with their chronological song sequence, stories behind the music and vintage wardrobe changes. Their energetic performances consist of show-stopping renditions of early hits by Jerry Lee Lewis, Chuck Berry, Buddy Holly, The Beatles, Rolling Stones, The Dave Clark Five and more!

The Neverly Brothers are currently in the middle of their 20th Anniversary tour. To highlight their enduring popularity, they recently hit a major milestone with their 15th Chicago network television news show appearance as the featured musical guest on the Fox Morning News "Orange Friday" show. This is an unprecedented accomplishment for any locally-based act. It is also a testament to their reputation as a world-class and highly respected musical outfit.



The Hegeler Carus Mansion was designed in 1874 by W.W. Boyington, who also designed the iconic Water Tower in Chicago. August Fiedler, the Mansion's interior designer, became one of the most sought-after interior designers after completing his work at the Mansion.

The Hegeler Carus Mansion was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 1995, and designated a National Historic Landmark in 2007, a prestigious designation granted by the U.S. National Park Service. The Mansion is located at 1307 Seventh St., LaSalle.





The county fair speedway and barrel train will run daily for great fair fun.


