
This year we were able to start preparing for the CDE competitions the end of January. We had several individual FFA members place at the competition and we also had many teams place.



The HHS Student Council is made up of freshmen, sophomore, junior, and senior representatives who are elected by their classmates each year.


The student council is responsible for planning many events at HHS:


