

Girls' basketball team eyes bounce-back season

BROOKINGS - The Brookings girls' basketball team is looking to bounce back after a rough 2019-2020 season where they went 1-19.

Brookings head coach Mitch McLagan said after the season his coaches and players went through a reflection period to make sure that they never had a season like that again.

"Through this reflection period our coaching staff has worked really hard and so have our players," McLagan said. "Our players have spent a lot of time in the offseason working hard at the things that we needed to improve on. This team has a bit of a different attitude this year and I think that attitude is going to help us going into this season.

"[Heading into this season] it's up and down. Do I think we're ready right now? Probably not. ... We're going to find out pretty quick where were at. Everyone is going to go through it and that's why I think depth is going to be so important this year."

The Bobcats have three seniors this year in Lydia Engebretson, Olivia Jorgenson and Haley Sampson. McLagan said he is going to count on them to lead the team this season.



"We have three seniors and they're going to provide us with a lot of leadership. But then outside of the three seniors there's going to be a lot of younger players that are going to play significant minutes for us. If you asked me a couple weeks ago or a month ago, I wasn't sure if they were going to be ready. They have worked extremely hard. We're going to be more athletic this year and we


have a different mindset if they do those things the in wanting to attack and constantly making contact offensively and getting to the basket. I feel this group has a little fight in them," McLagan said.

Heading into the season McLagan said he didn't want to have a win total goal because he didn't think it would be fair with the schedule his team plays. Instead he made other goals and said

wins will come.

"A big issue for us last year was turning the ball over," McLagan said. "So a big goal for us every night is going to be to have less turnovers than the other team. We want to defend. We want to rebound. So another goal is going to be to outrebounding every team that

"I think our goals as a team are to have a constant fight. I thought last year there were a couple times where the other team kind of punched us in the mouth and we didn't really have a response. Our goal this year is to compete more. If the other team starts to go on a run, we have to put our foot down and put a stop to that and I feel like we didn't do a great job of that. So that's going to be interesting to see once the season gets started."





Boys' basketball squad trying to get back on track

BROOKINGS - After a challenging season last year, the Brookings boys' basketball team is looking to get back on track this year.

The Bobcats went 2-18 last year and did not qualify for the playoffs. Head coach Travis Engebretson said it was a crazy offseason, but he is looking forward to this season.

"The biggest thing was that we were not able to get in the gym a whole lot last season. But we have four guys back from last year that have good experience in Nick Schefers, Henry Hammrich, Casey Woodall and Brock Longville. So we have a pretty good core. Kids have been working pretty hard in practice and so we're feeling pretty good," Engebretson said.

Brookings returns just one starter from last year in Schefers. Schefers averaged 12.6 points and 5.3 rebounds per game last year and Engebretson said he expects big things from Schefers

"Obviously were going to ask a lot of things from [Schefers] this season," Engebretson said. "He was our leading scorer last year and leading rebounder. So those things we're definitely going to lean on him for. He's a really good perimeter shooter. Shoots the ball well from three. He's got a good post up game as well, so we're going to have to spend some time trying to get him the right looks. Whether that's in the perimeter or the post."

Schefers is going to need some help if the Bobcats want to improve from last season. Engebretson said Hammrich and Woodall are guys who he thinks can be main contributors.

"For Henry, the biggest thing for him is being able to play under control," Engebretson said. "He got himself in trouble last year when he kind of got out of control. But we're going to



have to have him play the point for us and he's going to be our playmaker. He's going to have to be a floor leader and we're going to ask a lot from him offensively and then defensively he's extremely quick and extremely athletic.

"As for Casey, he's kind of our glue guy. He does everything well and does all the little things. He boxes out and rebounds well. He makes the right pass on the offensive end and he play 1 or the 5 and guard anyone in any situation. So he's the guy that's a big X-factor for us because he does a lot of things and he does them well."

The Bobcats have a total of six seniors on the team including Schefers, Woodall and Hammrich. Engebretson said he thinks the other three seniors, Keegan Fields, Max Struck and Noah Bayer and junior big man Brock Longville are going to be the most improved guys this

"We have a couple seniors who are coming off of good football seasons in Keegan Fields and Noah Bayer. Those guys are going to have to kind of find their roles and I think that's the biggest thing right now for these guys. They're going to be given an opportunity though. Brock Longville manned the post for us last year and he's going to be a big force for us down in the post. He's another guy that's coming


off a good football season. We're going to ask a lot from him and he's going to have to spend a lot of time guarding guys that are a lot taller than him, but he's a big physical kid and I know he'll be up for the task," Engebretson said.


He added that junior Zach Moe could also step up and surprise some people this season.

[Moe] has a good all around basketball game. He can shoot it from the perimeter or put it on the floor and take it to the basket. He's the one that might surprise some people as the season goes along," he said.

Engebretson said if his team wants to improve from last year they are going to have to play as a team, share the basketball and box out and rebound.

"I think the biggest thing is that we have good team chemistry, so I would say playing together as a team has to be a big goal for us. Offensively, we have to do a much better job than we did last year at sharing the basketball and getting guys touches. I think that's going to be a big part for us. Defensively, I think we're going to be very athletic on the defensive side of things, so I think we have to make sure that we have to do a good job boxing out and rebounding. If you look at our roster we don't have a lot of size. ... It's going to have to be a team rebounding mentality," Engebretson said.

Ranger boys seeking state title

The Rangers are on a mission of go out with a bang. From last this season. vear, we have some unfinished

"I think the past two years have been our development years," said coach Justin Kirchhevel. "Last year we ended up getting second place in league and we graduated a few kids that were part of the team but we had some younger guys step up.

"So I think our goal this year is to end up at the top and kind

of go out with a bang. From last year, we have some unfinished business that we need to take care of this year and keep moving forward."

The Rangers were perhaps the hottest team in the field last year when the state tournament was canceled due to COVID-19.

Brookings belted Watertown 9-0 in the quarterfinals and was set to face No. 6 seed Oahe in the

semis when things were called off.

Sioux Falls 1 won the league with 34 points (17-3) and Brookings was second at 32 (15-3-1-1).

Max Kjelden led the squad with 32 points (18 goals/14 assists) in 2019-20.

The Rangers return six of their top seven scorers overall, including Breck Hirrschoff 26 (14/12), Ashton Witte 23 (17/6), Logan Bortnem 22 (10/12), Jamison

Honkomp 13 (2/11) and Talon Richter 10 (4/6).

Brookings graduated Carter Merritt – 27 (11/16)

Kade Brecher was 7-1-1 with a 2.46 GAA and a .880 save percentage while splitting time at goalie a year ago.

"I think our strengths are depth – we have a lot of guys back from last year that are our leading scorers," added Kirchhevel. "We have some guys that move up from Bantams that are looking to basically take the roles of the guys that left. We have a core defense 5-6 deep.

"For the first time, we have deep lines so we can play with the lines and kind of manipulate the situation to benefit us the most. So we're excited about the depth and continuity we have throughout the program right now."

Ranger girls building depth, looking to take next step

The Ranger girls continue to add depth as they battle through the 2020-21 campaign.

"(We're looking) really good. We're obviously battling a lot of health issues right now; we're kind of over them. If we can stay healthy, we'll be good – it's just a matter of keeping everybody there," said coach Donovan Peterson.

Sophomore Savannah Barber led the team in scoring a year ago, racking up 39 points with 22 goals and 17 assists.

Fellow sophomore Kiran Vugteveen added 10 points (4/6).

Senior goalie Jadyn Runge is coming off an 8-4 campaign that saw her post a GAA of 2.87 and a save percentage of .889.

Brookings has six seniors.

"So we're looking for a lot out of our seniors," added Peterson. "... That's kind of our goal is to get everybody a lot of minutes and get ready for next year and have a good finish to this year."

The Rangers fell in the semifinals each of the past two seasons – to Sioux Falls in 2019 and Aberdeen in 2018 – after reaching the final in 2018. They dropped an 11-6 decision to Aberdeen that year.



Wrestlers young but talented in 2020-21

BROOKINGS – The Brookings wrestling team is going to be going through a bit of a rebuilding season this year. The Bobcats have just one senior on their roster.

Despite that, head coach Scott Miller said he thinks his team has a lot of talent.

"We're rebuilding this year with a real good freshman and sophomore class. At 195 were returning Luke Rassmusen who was a state runner up last year and it looks like he'll be right in the thick of things for a state championship this year. We also return sophomore Tyson Brandt who finished eighth last year [at 152]. So we're looking at those two to really get us back," Miller said.

Nolan Archer is the lone senior on the roster. He will be wrestling at the 182-pound weight class after missing last season with an injury. Sophomore James Olson made it to the state tournament at 220.

"With Nolan back we're pretty excited to see him. He's a very athletic young man. He's fun to watch wrestle and is very quick. ... James is a year stronger and a year bigger. We have a lot of competition for that 220-pound

weight class. We had three or four challenge matches already. We have another man in Caleb Loehr [at 220] who was here a few years ago and moved to Ohio and now he's back. So it's good to see him," Miller said.

Miller said his team is young, but he expects some big things from them.

"We have inexperience with eight freshmen and seven sophomores that are going to see some varsity time at different weights this year. It's going to be a trying year, but at the same time as kids get more experience, it's going to be fun to watch them grow and get better as we head into February," Miller said.

Of the 14 underclassmen, Miller said he is most excited to see freshmen Nolan Miles, Joey Fitzpatrick and Samson Flakus.

"We had high hopes for Nolan Miles last year and he ran into probably one of the toughest weights at region at 106 last year and he'll be at 113 this year and have a possibility to make the state tournament. Joey Fitzpatrick, who will be wrestling probably at 132 or 138, he actually placed at the middle school state

tournament last year and lost in the first round and came back and won six or seven matches in-a-row. So that's awesome. ... We also have another freshman in Samson Flakus [at 285] who's new to our program. He's fun to watch and is going to be a good wrestler as time goes on," Miller said.

Miller said his goal for the first part of the season is to fill in the weight classes. As the season goes on he hopes that he can send some guys to the state tournament.

"As the year goes on we're

going to fill in the weight classes. Some of these younger kids, we're going to see how they adapt to the ESD wrestling schedule. It's not easy because there are no let downs throughout the season. So we'll slowly get into and as time goes on we're looking to place top three in the region and depending on how we develop we're going to see how many we can place at the state tournament. It could be anywhere from two to six kids. So we're young and it's all going to depend on how we improve,' Miller said.

Gymnastics team looking sharp again in 2020-21

The Brookings gymnastics team has placed in the top four at the state meet each of the past three seasons.

The Bobcats were fourth behind Watertown, Mitchell and Harrisburg in 2019. They took third behind the former two in both 2018 and 2017.

"We're doing well so far," said Hall of Fame coach Rachelle Engbrecht. "We went to the Sioux Falls Invite, which is probably a good look to see where everybody is in the state – we didn't get to see Rapid City – but we ended up third there. Mitchell and Watertown were ahead of us – kind of the same as last year.

"(We definitely want) to hang in the top three and we'll do our darndest to try to catch (the Arrows and Kernels)."

Returning letterwinners are senior Hannah Walsh, senior Sierra Stevens, senior Lily Siemonsma, senior Isabella Portz, senior Kasey Bachar, junior Sydney Grendler, junior Rachel Gannon and sophomore Tayla Dobrenski.

Gannon has placed in at least one event at state every season she's been on varsity and has a trio of podium visits in the allaround.

Gannon won the floor exercise



in 2017 with a score of 9.6.

She was seventh in the all-around in both 2017 (35.875) and 2018 (35.475) and eighth in 2019 (35.775).

Gannon took third on the floor as a freshman (9.45) and fifth as a sophomore (9.425).

The last three years she's been ninth (8.975), 10th (8.825) and tied for eighth (8.85), respectively, on

the beam.

Gannon tied for ninth on the bars with an 8.8 as a seventh-grader. Brookings was sixth as a team in 2016.

Stevens ended up 10th on the vault (9.175) and tied for 10th on the beam (8.95) a season ago.

Siemonsma was seventh on the bars (8.7) in 2018 and finished in a tie for fifth on the beam (8.925) in 2017.

"We have a huge group. We have a bunch of returning letterwinners and some new girls coming out for the first year this year," added Engebretson. "It's really hard as a coach right now to pick, because they are so good and so close together.

"So we have a really good core group back from last year and

we have some new girls coming in too, so it will be interesting to watch.

"Even from tryouts it was hard (to pick a lineup). We cut at a higher score than we ever have and we kept more girls than we ever have. So we have a lot of girls in the girl. With six seniors really being leaders for us, it helps a lot."
