The rendezvous center will be a place to see posters and board displays involving fabric and fashion projects.

Horses are checked in for exhibit on Monday, July 29 from 8 a.m. to 10 a.m. in the pavilion. The horse show kicks off on Monday with a horse show featuring an English riding class, trail class, ranch riding, and rodeo events, followed by Tuesday classes in showmanship, halter, and performance.

Market swine, lamb, and goats will be making their way to the fair on Monday with weigh-in classes scheduled through. The arrival deadline for all livestock to be on the premises and entered is 5 p.m. on Monday, July 29.

Inside the rendezvous center at 5 p.m. on Monday, July 29, 4-H members will participate in the cat show. In the cat project, there will be showmanship and conformation classes. Participants also have the opportunity to compete in classes by cat age division such as kitten class for cats four to eight months

of age. For a little fun, there will also be classes for the oldest cat, longest and shortest tails, tricks, and more.

Kicking off on Monday, July 29, at 5 p.m. in the grass show ring will be the breeding meat goat show, breeding sheep showmanship, breeding sheep show, and breeding swine show. The Canine Classic begins with the open canine costume contest at 6 p.m. in the pavilion, followed by the 4-H dog agility show and open agility show at 6:30 p.m. in the pavilion. Lil' Bits N' Spurs Dog Races will be at 7:30 p.m., Monday evening.

Bright and early Tuesday, July 30 the horse show will be held in the pavilion at 8 a.m. featuring showmanship, halter, and performance classes.

The first- and second-year lamb conferences will be held for those members in their first or second year of the project on Tuesday, July 30 at 2 p.m. in the rendezvous center and a mandatory livestock

exhibitors meeting will follow at 4 p.m. in the grass show ring.

The first- and second-year swine project show kicks off on Tuesday, July 30 at 6 p.m. in the grass show ring followed by an all-species costume contest at 7 p.m. in the ring.

At 7 p.m. on Tuesday, July 30 the Torrington Kiwanis Pig Wrestling will begin in the pavilion. Admission is \$10 and children five and under are free.

The sheep show gets the day rolling on Wednesday, July 31 at 8 a.m. featuring showmanship and market classes, first- and second-year lamb projects, and the Goshen County Bred and Fed Lamb Show.

In the poultry barn at 8 a.m. on Wednesday morning is the rabbit show followed by the poultry show at noon.

In the pavilion on Wednesday at 9 a.m. will be the Rising Champion Timed Event Jackpot.

On Wednesday at 5:30 p.m., there will be a Platte Valley Bank Ice Cream Social and Lamb BBQ near the sheep barn, and at 7 p.m. on July 31, the Goshen County Sheep Led Contest begins in the grass show ring.


