


No. 13 – Josephine Vourliotis


No. 22 – Kacey Parks Hometown: Casper, Wyoming


No. 22 - Alain Nziza







No. 30 - Russell Moorer








No. 31 – Nathan Mirich Hometown: Cheyenne, Wyoming

No. 32 – Rodrigo Sanchez Hometown: Madrid, Spain






Charlie Schowengerdt Hometown: Glenrock, Wyoming
