TORRINGTON – The Torrington High School track team is gearing up for an action-packed 2025 spring season beginning with the Scottsbluff Invitational on Saturday, March 29.

Both the boys and girls teams are looking to snag hardware in the postseason and improve from last year's record.

The Lady Blazers clinched second place at regionals in 2024 and went on to place sixth at state.

The Blazers finished fifth at regionals and ninth at state.

Head coach Russell Stienmetz is entering his second season at the helm of the Torrington track program and summed up the team's goals, including peaking in May

around the postseason:

“Stay healthy and get better each week to be focused in the month of May for regionals and state.”

Sixteen athletes are returning to the Blazers and Lady Blazers track teams this year, along with a solid group of underclassmen.

Junior Brooklyn Asmus clinched gold in the 100-meters, 200-meters and 400-meters at state in 2024. Asmus set a new 3A class record and Torrington High School record in both the 100-meters and 200-meters, along with a school record in the 400-meters.

Junior Trishell Pontarolo advanced to second place on the triple jump leaderboard at

state in 2024 and placed eighth in the long jump.

In boys' jumping events, senior Evan Hellus captured fourth place in the long jump and fifth in the triple jump at state.

Senior Teryn Stokes finished fourth in the girls' shot put at state last year.

Junior Natalie Hawes took sixth place in the 100-meter hurdles at state in 2024 and seventh in the 300-meter hurdles.

The girls' 4x100-meter relay team – Hawes, Hurley, Asmus and Alyssa Wondercheck – pulled into first place at state the previous year to post a new 3A class record and Torrington school record.

Senior Jaycee Hurley

snagged seventh place in the girls' 100-meter dash at the 2024 state meet.

Southeast track: ‘dig deep’ and improve daily

YODER – The Southeast High School Cyclones and Lady Cyclones are preparing for a run at regional and state hardware as the team enters the second week of practice for the 2025 season.

Southeast girls

The Lady Cyclones primary goal for 2025 is to “improve each day” at practice and meets during the season, coach Jeff Fullmer said.

“By the end of May, we hope to be peaking and have a great showing at the state track meet,” Fullmer added.

Southeast will rely on a strong group of returning seniors, juniors and even sophomores to provide guidance to newcomers on the squad.

“There are several girls in all grade levels that are ready to step up and be team leaders this year,” Fuller remarked.

Team strengths include throwing events as well as sprinting, relays and jumping events.

“Coach (Craig) Leithead does a great job with the throwers and we have a good group again,” Fullmer noted. “I also see us doing well in long sprints, relays and jumping events. We will be balanced again and also trying to branch out and try some girls in events that we typically don’t have a lot of athletes compete in.”

The latter will include girls stepping up to try new events.

“We are encouraging girls to try some different events that they have never competed in,” Fullmer said. “I think by year’s end they will have a chance to score some points in them.”

Southeast looks forward to a competitive season, particularly with Lingle-Fort Laramie and Niobrara County moving back to the 1A classification.

The Lady Cyclones’ success in winter sports set the momentum for a successful spring season.

“Coming off another state championship run in basketball, I’m excited to see the Southeast girls bring that same grit and determination in track,” Fullmer added. “We also had some girls compete in indoor track and had very good seasons. Meshing them all together and find-

ing ways to score points at state will be our main goals for the year.”

Southeast boys

A talented group of 12 returning letter winners will pace the Southeast boys track team as it gears up for the 2025 season, including a core of experienced upperclassmen.

“We look for seniors Will Knowlton and Kannon Tippetts to have a huge year this season in running events along with sophomore Trevor Jolovich and junior Liam Haas in jumps,” coach Jeff Logsdon

said. “We have a good group of upperclassmen to lead and guide the younger boys.”

The team’s goals include improvement at “every meet” and athletes stepping up to “compete against themselves,” Logsdon remarked.

“We need to dig deep and push ourselves and not settle for a lower placing,” Logsdon continued.

The 2025 season opens with the Morrill Early Bird invitational on March 29, followed by a meet in Bayard on April 5.

“We are excited to get the season going,” Logsdon said. “We plan to show up and compete in every event at every meet.”

Ultimately, the Cyclones hope to make a run for hardware in the postseason at regionals and state.

“We’re a small group this year,” Logsdon noted. “We have some boys that will compete and place high right away. I’m hoping that by the time regionals rolls around, everyone will be placing and we can be in the hunt at state.”

LINGLE – Both the Lingle-Fort Laramie (LFL) girls and boys track teams are preparing for an exciting season of competition as LFL returns to the 1A bracket with an eye on state hardware.

LFL girls

LFL plans to take advantage of its skilled senior- and junior-stacked girls' varsity squad, including nine returning state qualifiers and 11 letter winners from the previous season.

"We have a great deal of returning state experience," coach Mike Lashley said. "We will rely on these athletes to set the tone for us early in the season."

The roster of returning state qualifiers includes senior Grace Gibson (hurdles and relays), senior Jada Kaufman (hurdles and relays), senior Brenly Shipp (mid distance), senior Kenzie Wilkins (relays), junior Anna Frederick (distance), junior Kaiten Schilreff (jumping), junior Jordynn Speckner (relays and mid-distance), sophomore

Kiera Fleenor (relays) and sophomore Addi Wilkins (hurdles and relays).

Returning letter winners are senior Alisha McGraw (throwing) and senior Haven Torres (distance).

The team welcomes seven new athletes to the program in jumping, sprinting, hurdles, distance and mid-distance events.

"Once the younger girls begin to contribute as the season progresses, we should be able to cover all event areas," Lashley remarked. "This should give us the opportunity to compete for team accolades."

LFL's principal goal is "week to week improvement," Lashley added.

"By the end of the season, this improvement should put us in a position to challenge for conference, regional and state championships," Lashley continued. "It will not be easy to reach these challenging goals, but it will be

exciting to see just how successful this team can be.”

Since 1991, the LFL girls have won 11 state championships. The team also punched in 14 regional titles over the past 20 years.

LFL boys

A boys’ roster consisting of seven talented returning letter winners and six state qualifiers will anchor the LFL Doggers team this season.

“While we are a little thin on returning state qualifiers, those guys have scored a lot of points at the state meet in the last few years,” Lashley said. “We will be leaning on them to lead the way for our team.”

The roster of state qualifiers from 2024 includes senior Loudon Bremer (hurdles and relays), senior Nathan Fish (pole vault and relays), senior Brody Roberts (mid-distance and relays), senior Cooper Smith (sprints and relays), junior Brady Cook (throwing and relays) and sophomore

Tyler Smith (distance).

Junior Colter McFarlin also lettered in throwing events for the 2024 season.

A group of 12 athletes new to the sport fill out the 2025 roster.

“We have added a strong group of newcomers and we feel really good about their contributions,” Lashley added. “It will be interesting to see how they develop throughout the season and what events they end up competing in.”

LFL plans to build on its momentum from 2024 when the Doggers snagged second place in the 2A division at state.

“Our depth will be very important this season as we have moved back down to 1A,” Lashley said. “Similar to previous years, our goals this season include competing for conference and regional championships and ultimately winning a state title. Those are lofty goals but they are definitely in our reach.”

The LFL boys have won nine state track titles since 1973 while clinching 10 regional titles over the previous 15 years.

Blazers soccer team eyes state title run

TORRINGTON – The Torrington High School Blazers soccer team hopes to build off its success from 2024 with a run at the state title in 2025.

Torrington advanced to third place at the 3A state tournament the previous year with the Blazers posting an impressive 13-3 season record.

A majority of the Blazers' talented starting lineup are returning to the field this year to anchor Torrington's regular season and postseason performance for 2025.

"We have some strong soccer players returning this year," coach Jeshua Arnusch said. "I am excited to watch them lead by example."

Returning seniors include Ayden Shimic at goalkeeper, Kaiden Riggs at center back, Carter Blevins at right back along with strikers Elijah Hatch and Skyler Thomas.

"This team has been playing together since they were little," Arnusch re-

marked. "They have great team chemistry and they play for one another. Goalie play is also very solid for this team. Ayden Shimic is one of the best goalkeepers in the state and I am excited to watch him anchor our team."

The Blazers' primary objective this year is to punch their ticket to state and clinch hardware.

"The goal for the season is to make it to and win state," Arnusch said. "We are going to focus on playing more possession ball. That means our off-the-ball movement needs to improve. We also need to work hard on improving our defensive shape."

Torrington looks forward to an action-packed season in a competitive 3A division.

"I am excited to play everyone this year," Arnusch added. "I think most teams are pretty even this year. Worland, Green River, Cody and Powell will be tough. I think we are up to the challenge."

Torrington softball excited for varsity play

TORRINGTON – While the Torrington High School girls' softball team launched its inaugural season in 2024, the team played a junior varsity schedule. As a result, 2025 will mark the Lady Blazers' first official varsity run.

Torrington is returning 10 starters from the previous year, representing each of the high schools in Goshen County. Four talented and seasoned leaders anchor the team – Torrington senior Hope Hager, Southeast senior Emilee Moats, Lingle-Fort Laramie junior Skyla Wunder and Torrington junior Kennedy Reinhardt.

“Bringing players together from three different schools is challenging but these young ladies are up to the challenge to bring cohesiveness to the team,” coach Robin Schainost said. “Hope, Emilee, Skyla and Kennedy played last year and were great leaders.”

Torrington posted a 7-6-1 season re-

cord as a junior varsity team in 2024 and the Lady Blazers look to improve on this record as a varsity team.

“We are a young but experienced team,” Schainost added. “This group of girls works well together. We have a young pitching staff and we need to give them time to adjust to varsity level softball. We also look to build on our overall skills and knowledge of the game.”

The season opened with a tournament hosted by Cheyenne East from March 21-22. The Lady Blazers played their home-opener against Cheyenne South on Tuesday, March 25 followed by a home game against Laramie on Thursday, March 27.

Torrington will be eligible to compete in the postseason in 2025 as a varsity team.

Laramie hosts the regional tournament from May 16-17 while the state championships takes place in Cheyenne from May 22-23.
