## Informative programs presented to Rotary Club

Rhonda Kennedy, a past district governor of Rotary District 5890, and Debra Jenke, director of the Angelina College-Polk County Center, recently presented informative programs to the Livingston Rotary Club.

### “Discover New Horizons”

Kennedy addressed the club regarding the myriad volunteer opportunities for the Rotary International Convention slated for June 4-6, 2022 at the George R. Brown Convention Center in Houston. A member of the Paul Harris Society, Kennedy is the 2018 recipient of the Rotary International Service Above Self Award and is the chairperson of the Rotary International Host Organization Committee.

“Discover New Horizons” is the theme of the convention which is expected to have an attendance of 20,000 people from around the globe and will provide a \$30 million economic impact, Kennedy said.

Convention sites are chosen up to nine years in advance, Kennedy said, adding that it took about a year to put the bid together to host it in Houston and that she worked closely with the staff of Rotary International and the host organization committee.

She said there are 11 host events and a service project and that 43 hotels in Houston are under contract for the convention. Rotarians from around the world will have the opportunity to visit Discovery Green, the Kemah Boardwalk and Space Center Houston.

This year’s service project will be an environmental one in which attendees may download an app on their phones and track their carbon footprint throughout the event. Additionally, about 50 trees will be planted, through the project, in an area given by the City of Houston.

Kennedy told of one of her first experiences at a Rotary International Convention when she and her husband sat down at a table during a break and were soon joined by Rotarians from Egypt, Japan, New Zealand and the United Kingdom.

“We didn’t want to leave that table,” she said, referring to the camaraderie and friendships being formed.

“Melbourne, Singapore, Calgary and Honolulu are all tentative sites for future conventions. Houston is in your backyard. Don’t miss this op-

portunity. Don’t wait to register. Register now,” Kennedy urged the local Rotarians. To learn more, go to [rotary.org](http://rotary.org) or [houstonri2022.org](http://houstonri2022.org).

### “Technology in the Classroom”

Footage of the King George character singing “You’ll Be Back” in the Broadway musical “Hamilton” kicked off Jenke’s recent presentation to the Rotarians on “Technology in the Classroom.”

In addition to serving as director of the Angelina College-Polk County Center, Jenke also serves as assistant dean of the School of Arts and Education at Angelina College and is a government instructor.

“Everything we have at Angelina College is in a learning management system. We use one called Blackboard, a cloud-based system. We don’t pass out paper anymore,” Jenke said, adding that the class syllabus, as well as all quizzes and exams are online. “All of the lectures are there. All of the reviews.

She commented that the quizzes and exams are scrambled and randomized in an attempt to avoid cheating.

“We know that COVID-19 changed education and how classes are delivered. On-line classes were already being delivered, but as classrooms emptied during the pandemic, on-line course delivery became the single delivery method,” Jenke said. “The pandemic has produced new trends, on-line learning being just one of them.

“We don’t know when the next COVID will be, or Snowmageddon, or a hurricane, but we are ready to flip the switch at any time,” Jenke said.

**Home repaired through partnership**

Center of Hope and Habitat for Humanity of Polk County joined forces to repair a woman's home in Goodrich Saturday. The completed project is the first of what the two local organizations hope will become a successful collaboration.

"The partnership just makes good sense. We can pool both our resources and volunteers to help repair more homes of low-income families in Polk County," Habitat Executive Director Amy Borel said.

Center of Hope and Habitat have both seen a rise in the number of home repairs due to recent disasters like the deep freeze from earlier this year. Busted pipes

can cause serious damage to homes, especially to those who don't have insurance and lack the means to repair the damage quickly.

"We get just as many calls for assistance with home repairs as we do people needing a home. Partnering with Center of Hope will allow us to help twice as many people," Borel said.

Center of Hope is a non-profit organization made up of 14 area churches whose mission is to provide emergency food and other necessities to the needy of Polk County. They offer education and training on writing a resume and job hunting, nutrition information, family management and information on drug abuse, all while teaching the power of prayer. Habitat for Humanity of

Polk County is the local affiliate for Habitat for Humanity International which builds homes for low-income families who are unable to qualify for traditional mortgages. Both organizations are funded through local donations and volunteer efforts. According to the 2010 US Census, Livingston has a total area of 8.4 square miles with only .12 percent covered by water. The population from this census is noted to be 5,335. The economy continues to centered around agriculture, primarily lumber. The Polunsky Unit, State Prison, in West Livingston is a major employer at this time.

Center at 101 W. Mill Street in Livingston, the Onalaska Subcortthouse at 14115 U.S. Hwy. 190 West in Onalaska and the Sechrest Webster Community Center at 100 West Front Street in Corrigan.

Applications for ballot by mail and federal postcard applications must be received by the Polk County Clerk's Office no later than the close of business on Friday. Applications for ballot by mail shall be mailed to Polk County Clerk Schelana Hock at P.O. Drawer 2119, Livingston, Texas 77351 or emailed

to shock@co.polk.tx.us or faxed to 936-327-6855.

However, if an application for ballot by mail is faxed or emailed or if a federal postcard application is faxed, the original application must be received within four business days.

The proposed additions to the Texas Constitution were passed as bills during this year's legislative session and a majority of voters in the state must approve each amendment before it can be officially added to the Constitution. There are no state elected seats on the ballot this November.

**The eight proposed constitutional amendments on the ballot are:**

**PROPOSITION 1:** The constitutional amendment authorizing the professional sports team charitable foundations of organizations sanctioned by the Professional Rodeo Cowboys Association or the Women's Professional Rodeo Association to conduct charitable raffles at rodeo venues.

**PROPOSITION 2:** The constitutional amendment authorizing a county to finance the development or redevelopment of transportation or infrastructure in unproductive, underdeveloped, or blighted areas in the county.

**PROPOSITION 3:** The constitutional amendment to prohibit this state or a political subdivision of this state from prohibiting or lim-

iting religious services of religious organizations.

**PROPOSITION 4:** The constitutional amendment changing the eligibility requirements for a justice of the supreme court, a judge of the court of criminal appeals, a justice of a court of appeals, and a district judge.

**PROPOSITION 5:** The constitutional amendment providing additional powers to the State Commission on Judicial Conduct with respect to candidates for judicial office.

**PROPOSITION 6:** The constitutional amendment establishing a right for residents of certain facilities to designate an essential caregiver for in-person visitation.

**PROPOSITION 7:** The constitutional amendment to allow the surviving spouse of a person who is disabled to receive a limitation on the school district ad valorem taxes on the spouse's residence homestead if the spouse is 55 years of age or older at the time of the person's death.

**PROPOSITION 8:** The constitutional amendment authorizing the legislature to provide for an exemption from ad valorem taxation of all or part of the market value of the residence homestead of the surviving spouse of a member of the armed services of the United States who is killed or fatally injured in the line of duty.

program serves primarily 35 sixth-grade students at Livingston Junior High from 3-6 p.m., Monday through Friday.

The program has a capacity of 150 students, and they are beginning to reach out to parents of seventh graders about joining. The program targets "bubble" students who are one standard deviation above or below the STAR test passing rate. They began with sixth graders, so

that they may benefit from attending the program all three years while enrolled at the junior high.

The afterschool program helps students focus on fine-tuning academic skills. Recently, they have worked on dictionary skills and journaling to improve creative writing. Sixth grade world history teachers are collaborating with the afterschool program and a "traveling around the world" activity, where students have their own "passports" and receive stamps when successfully completing tasks. The goal

is to visit Asian countries in the fall term and European countries in the spring, coinciding with the sixth-grade world history curriculum.

Students also participated in a cooking activity Friday as they completed their segment on Germany by making German Pfeffernüsse cookies. Sixth grade math teachers have applauded the recent achievements by students engaging in afterschool activities. The afterschool staff incorporated math facts in all daily activities and found that students were making im-

provements in their classroom performance. Students engage in enrichment activities every day, which include soccer and basketball. The afterschool program is funded through a five-year grant from Texas Education Agency, but Frazier emphasized, "The program doesn't have to end in five years. If additional funding can be found, the program can continue. The Texas Education Agency measures factors of student improvement by evaluating ELA test scores and attendance."

The goal for the spring semester is to double the enrollment to 60 students taking advantage of the program. During the summer, the Boys and Girls Club will allow attendance of 150 students that continues for six weeks, from late June through July, 8 a.m.-3 p.m., Monday through Friday. In addition to academic support, the summer program also includes field trips and sports clinics.

LISD Chief Academic Officer Janan Moore presented information on Elementary and Secondary School

Emergency Relief (ESSER II) funds during the public hearing. The board approved the ESSER II budget, which includes a 4% retention stipend along with other salary costs. Money will be allocated to technology devices and software programs to increase student learning. ESSER II funds also include indirect costs associated with district operations.

Also approved was the consent agenda, comprised of the financial statement, payment of bills, overnight trips, and the 2021-2022 district improvement plan.

the Pueblo. A positive ruling from the Supreme Court could provide the economic security we have long sought for our tribe, employees of Naskila Gaming and the East Texas community."

In 2016, the Pueblo opened a bingo facility in El Paso, offering the same type of electronic bingo games that the Kickapoo Traditional Tribe of Texas located near Eagle Pass has offered on its lands since 1996. Thereafter, the state Texas filed suit against the Pueblo, arguing that under the 1994 Fifth Circuit decision the Pueblo, unlike the Kickapoo Tribe, were prohibited from offering bingo under IGRA. In an April 2020 ruling, a panel of the Fifth Circuit panel sided

with the state; it is this same ruling that the Supreme Court agreed to review Monday.

In a separate case, this past August a federal judge in Beaumont agreed with the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe that it could legally offer electronic bingo at its Naskila Gaming facility under the Tribe's 1987 Restoration Act.

Despite the state's long-time effort to close the facility, Naskila Gaming enjoys broad, bipartisan support among Texans. More than 80 civic, community and business groups have formally approved resolutions supporting Naskila Gaming. Earlier this year, the U.S. House of Representatives approved bipartisan legislation saying that the Alabama-Coushatta Tribe of Texas and Pueblo should be governed under IGRA—legislation that would effectively stop

the state's efforts to close the facilities. That legislation, H.R. 2208, has not yet been acted upon by the U.S. Senate.

"Recent legal decisions have been very encouraging, but we still need the U.S. Congress to complete its work on H.R. 2208 to provide fairness and certainty for our tribe," Battise said. "We are grateful for all of the community supporters who have stood by us as we have battled against the state's efforts to take away the jobs at Naskila Gaming."

Naskila Gaming is the second-largest employer in Polk County. Some 700 jobs are tied directly or indirectly to Naskila Gaming, as well as over \$170 million in annual economic stimulus, making its long-term stability essential to the economic future of East Texas.

identified as Steven Malone and Samantha Hall. Frank Ruiz and Michelle Dodson were also at the scene.

Through the investigation, deputies determined that the disturbance was only an argument and that no criminal offenses had been committed related to the firearms. However, detectives became suspicious regarding the subjects possibly being in possession of illegal narcotics, Childers said.

Having obtained consent

to search, detectives found Ruiz, Dodson, Roach and Nichols to be in possession of methamphetamine. A search of Malone and Hall's residence revealed that they were in possession of marijuana and methamphetamine, as well as items used to distribute methamphetamine, according to Childers.

Malone was charged with manufacture and/or delivery of a controlled substance and Roach, Nichols, Ruiz and Dodson were charged with possession of a controlled substance. Further charges are pending and the case remains under investigation.

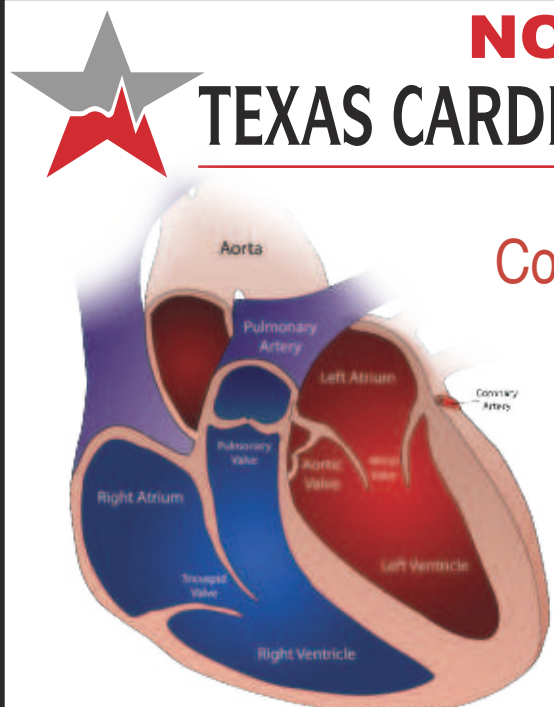

The Livingston Lions travel Friday for what could be the biggest district challenge in 2021. The Vidor Pirates are 6-0 (2-0 in district) with a recent 29-12 district victory over Little Cypress-Mauriceville.

A Slot-T offense and strong defense has been the path to success for the Pirates in 2021. Vidor will run the ball almost every play on the offensive side and have stopped opponents when they attempt to run.

"We have faced it a few times before, but they are one of the masters at it," Livingston coach Finis Vanover said of the Slot-T offense. "They got away from it some the last couple of years, but this is who Vidor is. They are tailor-made to do this and nothing else. They totally believe in it." Defensive backs for Livingston will need to be prepared for the rare time that the ball is put in the air, while coming up to help

night they threw two passes." Ricky Gall leads the team in rushing with 625 yards and nine scores, averaging seven yards each time he carries the ball. He is third in the district, and teammates Layne Wilhelm and Weston Sepulvado are seventh and eighth, respectively. Both recently surpassed 500 yards and have combined for 10 touchdowns.

Vanover said the Vidor linemen on both sides of the ball are what stands out on film to the staff.

"They are the straw that stirs the drink. They jump off the film at you. They are thick, aggressive and the defensive linemen are big. The nose tackle is just like the kid from Needville two years ago, who is big and muscled up and looks like J.J. Watt.

He is dominant and physical. They don't play both ways on the line. The offensive line is just well-oiled. They flash-break the huddle three yards from the ball, getting the count and sprinting toward the line of scrimmage to snap the ball."

The coach said getting to the line quickly is their version of the hurry-up offense. It means the Lions will not have time to match up on each down and will need to play a simplistic style.

"They are more geared this year to the true version of the Slot-T and will run that ball 92% of the time or more. They are the epitome of great, sound high school football players. They are not playing for scholarships, they are not trying to make magazines, and they are really fun to watch. They are good for the sport."

Not only are the Pirates the top-ranked defense in 10-4A, Vanover said they may be the best the district has to offer.

"Their defense is fabulous. They retooled that thing and they are monsters. Their three defensive linemen and

two inside linebackers are as good as we have seen anywhere, and they can play."

It will be important for the Lions to have both the run and pass game clicking as they did versus Splendora. Livingston was able to run the football with both tailbacks and the quarterback, as well as throw the ball down the field to keep the defense guessing. They totaled 236 yards passing and five ball carriers combined for 228 yards on the ground.

Vanover said keys to the game will be the ability to block the Vidor defensive front and turnovers. Turnovers were crucial in the two Lion losses this year and additional possessions would help keep the Pirate ball-control offense off the field.

After the win last week to even the district record at 1-1, the Lions control their own destiny to make the playoffs. They are still striving for a district title, but need some help in order for that to occur. A win Friday would go a long way toward contention.

# Dogfight in New Waverly

The 2-1 Corrigan-Camden Bulldogs will travel to face the 2-1 New Waverly Bulldogs in their district match this Friday.

Both teams are coming off district wins, but Corrigan's offense is still looking to regain its rhythm after a tight win last week against Anderson-Shiro.

"I thought we were pressing a little too hard and trying not to lose the game instead of winning it and that was evident in the video. We were almost playing it too safe. We just have to cut it loose and play football like we know how to," said Bulldog head coach Brett Ratliff.

Although junior JaVarion Williams managed the snaps for Corrigan last week, junior backup quarterback Morgan Rayburn will likely

see some action again in order to expand their offensive playbook.

"There is no doubt about [New Waverly] being a hard-nosed, tough football team,"

said Ratliff. "We are going to have to play like we did against Hemphill, Crockett and Centerville to win. I think we will do that. We typically rise to the occasion ... If we play up to the level of our opponent this week, we are going to be fine."

New Waverly's offense will be led by senior Sabastian Amaro returning as starting quarterback. The run offense will feature New Waverly senior back Peyton Cooper and junior back Will Larrison.

"[Amaro] is their four-year starter and plays with a lot of confidence," Ratliff said. "He has been there since [Coach Schaub] has and they grew in the system together. They run a really fluid offense. In order for us to play well, we will have to disrupt that a little."

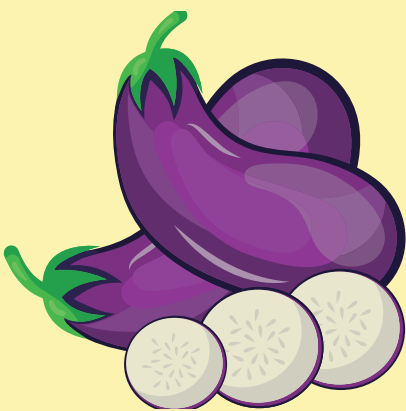

- 2 eggplants, sliced 1/4 inch crosswise and lightly salted
- 1 large egg
- 2 tablespoons water
- ½ teaspoon garlic powder
- 3 tablespoons fresh basil, minced or 1 tablespoon dry
- ¾ teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes
- A pinch of salt and coarse black pepper
- 4 tablespoons extra virgin olive oil
- 1 cup shredded mozzarella cheese and ½ cup grated Parmigiano Reggiano cheese, combined
- Black pepper for garnish

### Directions

- Heat 1 tablespoon oil in a medium skillet. Sauté the onion until soft. Stir in the next 7 ingredients and simmer 4-5 minutes to blend flavors. Reserve.
- Lay the eggplant slices out on paper towels and lightly salt them. Let stand to draw out moisture. This step is not required but it will result in a lighter and more flavorful eggplant. After 5 minutes pat the eggplant dry with paper towels.
- In a small bowl or pie pan beat the egg and water together. Mix in the garlic, basil, red pepper flakes, salt and pepper. Heat the remaining oil in a large skillet over medium-high heat until hot. Dip eggplant slices in egg mixture and sauté them in the skillet for 1-2 minutes per side or until golden brown and tender. Drain on paper towels and reserve. Add a little more oil if needed while sauteing.
- In an oiled baking dish, place a single slice of eggplant, then a spoon of tomato mixture, then a spoon of cheese. Repeat this layering to create a tower three eggplant slices thick. Using the remaining ingredients tower the rest of the eggplant in the baking dish. Sprinkle the top of each tower with coarse ground black pepper. Bake in a 300-degree oven for 15-20 minutes or until the cheese is melted.

Ever wonder why we call them french fries? In France, don't try to order french fries from a menu. They are called pommes frites or fried potatoes. Our french fries are so named because they are frenched, a culinary term meaning cut into long strips. The dish Eggplant Napoleon derives its name from a similar confusing of a noun with a proper noun.

In the 18th century, chefs in Naples, Italy were known for creating irresistible contrasts in foods; sweet and savory, firm and soft. They created a dessert by layering creamy custards between sheets of flaky pastry. Later a French chef added icing to the top and named it a Neapolitan after its Neapolitan (from Naples) origins. Think of our Neapolitan ice cream, layers of different flavors. English chefs popularized the pastry dessert and translated it on their menus into napoleon because of the dramatic impact made by the French emperor.

Today we see the term napoleon used in many dishes. It refers to a layering of ingredients and in the case of Eggplant Napoleon the layers create an impressive presentation.

Back when I hosted a local food show, I had the privilege of working with a very talented chef, Mani Marini. Before writing each show, I would meet with Mani to decide on recipes to feature. On one such occasion, Mani said he wanted to do Eggplant Parmesan. I said, "Great! we haven't prepared eggplant before." And Mani said, "But I want to do something different, a napoleon. I want it to be vertical." I left the meeting scratching my head wondering how he was going to make Eggplant Parmesan vertical. What does he mean by vertical? During the show I watched as Mani created little towers of layered eggplant, tomatoes, cheese and spices. This was not the gooey casserole that I had in mind. And what a presentation! As Mani always said, we eat with our eyes.

This recipe is simple to make and turns a good dish into something



spectacular. Don't be intimidated by the number of ingredients. There are some simple shortcuts to reduce prep time. If you prefer, you can use your favorite jarred pasta sauce in lieu of making your own ragout (the first 9 ingredients). And you can skip the step of salting the eggplant slices. Eggplant is a valuable culinary vehicle for absorbing and transferring flavor but it is 92% water. Salting the slices and patting them dry will improve their absorption of flavors and make the dish lighter, not in calories but in texture. Try this dish at least once salting and I think you will find it's worth the extra step. I've made it with and without salting and the reviews are good for both. Another nice variation is to use fresh sliced mozzarella instead of the popular shredded version. Shredded cheeses are convenient but they are coated with cellulose to inhibit mold and extend shelf life which unfortunately reduces flavor. As with all cheeses, fewer ingredients mean more flavor. When you

put the dish together, you might end up with a few extra slices of eggplant. These make wonderful sandwiches or can be chopped and added to your favorite salad.

So Eggplant Napoleon, a tower of flavor is not named for the emperor destined to over compensate for his diminutive stature. Rather, the name is but a caveat in the world of menu writing and food history. Vive la France!

#### NOTICE OF RATE CHANGE REQUEST

On October 5, 2021, Entergy Texas, Inc. ("ETI") filed an application to amend its Transmission Cost Recovery Factor ("TCRF") with the Public Utility Commission of Texas ("Commission" or "PUC"). The application was assigned PUC Docket No. 52624. The proposed TCRF is requested in accordance with the Public Utility Regulatory Act § 36.209 and 16 TAC § 25.239. A TCRF allows a utility to recover its reasonable and necessary costs that have occurred since the end of the test year in the utility's last base rate case for transmission infrastructure improvement and changes in wholesale transmission charges to the electric utility under a tariff approved by a federal regulatory authority. In its requested amendment, ETI is seeking recovery of costs for transmission capital investments it incurred from September 1, 2020 through July 31, 2021. ETI also seeks to recover approved transmission charges that are not otherwise being recovered through rates.

The proposed TCRF as amended would result in total TCRF retail revenues of approximately \$66.1 million, which is \$15.1 million in incremental annual TCRF revenue beyond ETI's currently effective TCRF. This \$15.1 million amount would be a 1.57% increase in ETI's annualized non-fuel revenue requirement as compared to revenues approved in Docket No. 48371, ETI's most recent base rate case, and a 1.01% increase in ETI's overall annualized revenue requirement including fuel costs as compared to such revenues. The impact of the rate change on various customer classes will vary from the overall impact described in this notice.

The effective date of the proposed rate change would be the date that a Commission order adopting the proposed TCRF is issued. ETI has requested that, if no hearing is requested, the Commission adopt an order approving the proposed TCRF at or before its currently-scheduled open meeting on December 16, 2021. All customers in ETI's Texas retail rate classes are affected by this request.

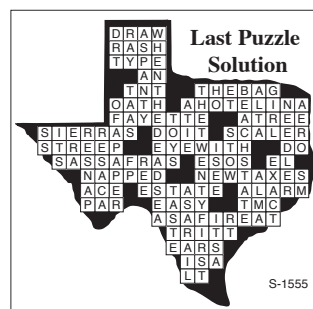
