

Contested sheriff race going to trial Motion for summary judgement denied

COLDSPRING — The lawsuit contesting the primary election results between San Jacinto County Sheriff Greg Capers and Constable Sam Houston will go to trial — most likely on the day that early voting begins in the state.

On Sept. 17, District Judge John Wells denied a motion for summary judgment, which requests

a judge render a verdict without a full trial. The motion was by submission, meaning the attorneys were not present for the decision.

The ruling meant that a trial set for Sept. 25-26 would have commenced; however, both attorneys in the case — John Raley for Houston and Andy Taylor for Capers — have requested the case be moved to Oct. 21 before Judge Albert McCaig.

According to the Texas Secretary of State's website, Oct. 21 is the first day for in-person absentee voting,

Capers filed a suit in May contesting the results of the March primary election, claiming that more than 200 votes were cast improperly because there were 503 people illegally registered to vote. At that time, Capers had lost his bid for the Republican nomination, garnering 2,887

votes to Houston's 2,994.

The result essentially gave Houston the position, as there are no Democrat candidates.

However, the suit claims 255 voters were registered improperly, and another 218 were not county residents. It also contends 30 felons voted.

The suit seeks to have the results of the election voided, and either name Capers the winner or a new election should be ordered.

SJC court urged to take care of budget process

COLDSPRING — The public, and later Commissioner Laddie McAnally, cautioned the San Jacinto County Commissioners Court that "the way we've always done things" should not apply in court proceed-

Former County Commissioner Ray Mc-Coppin, during public comments at the Wednesday meeting, said the county needs to look at the court's history and try to learn

He related a story about a former Commissioners Court in 1995 passed a pay raise for themselves during emergency meeting on Dec. 31. After the new County Judge

was in office, he discovered the raises and told the treasurer to stop paying it and take funds back that were overpaid.

McCoppin said the reason for that was raises for elected officials can't be set in an emergency meeting, but must be done in a regular meeting separate from discussions about raises for county employees.

"I say that to say this: I've seen in several

meetings that you guys did not quite follow the law," he said. "I'm not the villain here. I'm trying to help."

McCoppin said that elected officials are different than employees and are not eligible for the raises given to regular employees. He also said that a discussion for this meeting,





To tell the truth

When I was a kid of five years old, my favorite TV show was 'Captain Kangaroo". We got our first TV the year the show debuted, in 1955. It was a wooden box with a small screen, but the slightly noisy B&W image was magic.

The next year, a new game show came along that my mom was obsessed with called "To Tell the Truth". You might not think a six-year-old would have much interest in game shows, but it was one of the few shows on one of the three channels we got, so I watched it too.

The premise was simple. There were four celebrities who made up the panel and faced three contestants. The host read aloud an affidavit describing one of the contestant's unusual jobs or experiences. The panelists asked questions of the contestants and tried to determine who the real person was. The actual person had to tell the truth, while the others could lie as much as they wanted to try to fool the panel. It was a very successful show and was revived in one form or another through 2022.

and, well, games. In politics, it is corrosive to our democracy and undermines our government. At the very least, we should demand that the officials we elect tell us the truth. But we don't. Anyone who has lived through a few elections can verify that politicians lie. Some lie a lot, some a little; but they do lie. That's a problem in this country's social media-soaked society. It has, in fact, taken us to the precipice in 2024.

When politicians prioritize spin over substance, the electorate becomes cynical, voter apathy sets in, and it diminishes the capacity for real change. The decisions politicians make when they are elected have profound impacts on the lives of millions of people. When they lie, it signals deeper issues such as corruption, selfish ambition, or gross incompetence.

Consider how misinformation can distort public policy. If a politician consistently lies about economic figures, climate change, or to address those issues will be flawed or ineffective. For instance, misrepresenting the state of the economy might lead to misguided fiscal policies that either overspend or cut essential services. In more extreme cases, as with public health crises, lies and misinformation can cost lives, as was evident during the COVID-19 pandemic when downplaying the seriousness of the virus led to delayed responses and higher mortality rates in some countries.

But one of the most damaging consequences of lies in politics is the erosion of public trust, a result that has accelerated over the last 10 years. Trust is the glue that holds societies together. Without it, our society crumbles.

In the current era of "alternative facts" and misinformation, public trust in government has reached all-time lows. According to the Pew Research Center, trust in the federal government has been declining for decades, with only 20 percent of Americans saying they trust the government to do what is right in 2021. This decline in trust creates a vicious cycle: when citizens do not trust their leaders, they are less likely to engage in civic activities, vote, or participate in other forms of political engagement. Politicians, in turn, feel less accountable to the public and that any of these steps will be takmore likely to act in self-interest or appease special interests.

Truthfulness from politicians is also essential for maintaining social cohesion. In diverse societies like the United States, where different groups often have competing interests and perspectives, it is crucial that political leaders speak honestly and work to bridge divides. Lies, particularly those that are divisive or scapegoat certain groups, exacerbate tensions and fuel polarization. This not only weakens the democratic process but also heightens the risk of so-

cial unrest and conflict. In such an environment, finding common ground becomes nearly impossible, and political discourse devolves into tribalism.

Lies have real-world consequences. Recently, presidential candidate Donald Trump used a bit of his debate time to claim that legal Haitian immigrants were eating people's pets in Springfield, Ohio. "In Springfield, they are

eating the dogs. The people that came in, they are eating the cats. They're eating they are eating the pets of the people that live Trump there," proclaimed dur-

ing the debate, even though the mayor of Springfield and city officials had already debunked the claim, which started with a Facebook post that the page owner herself disavowed.

The result of this lie revealed itself in the real world immediately, when threats and bomb scares shut down schools and government buildings in the city.

Trump has told numerous other corrosive and easily debunked In a game show, lying is all fun lies in the last month. CNN recently debunked 12 lies Trump has spread in the last month. He accused Kamala Harris, his opponent, of wanting to force Americans to serve in the military. Not true. He has said nothing about the draft.

> He has claimed repeatedly that Harris "had notes" to assist her in an interview. Also, not true.

> Trump has repeatedly claimed that kids are going to school in the morning and returning home with a sex-change operation. He has also claimed that Harris was of Indian heritage but recently "turned black" for political expediency. Of course, that's not true. It goes on and on. (Check out the CNN link above for the full story.)

> Restoring truthfulness in politics is no easy task, but it is essential for the health of democratic governance. Several steps can be taken to encourage more honesty from public officials.

First, there must be stronger consequences for dishonesty in public health, policies designed politics. While free speech is a constitutional right, politicians who lie to the public—especially about matters of national security, public health, or economic stability—should face sanctions, whether legal or political. Fact-checking organizations and the media have a critical role to play in holding politicians accountable for their statements, but they must remain impartial and resist the temptation to sensationalize.

Second, voters must demand higher standards from their elected officials. Civic education should be prioritized so that citizens are better equipped to recognize misinformation and make informed voting decisions. Social media platforms, which have become major conduits for political discourse, should also take greater responsibility in curbing the spread of false information.

Finally, politicians themselves must take a moral stand. The incentive to lie often stems from the belief that deception is necessary to win elections or stay in power. Leaders who choose to be truthful, even when it is politically inconvenient, can set a powerful example. In the long term, honesty fosters trust, strengthens institutions, and cultivates a more engaged and informed electorate.

I can't say that I'm optimistic en. I've been around 74 years and have watched the steady decline of political and civil discourse in this country. The advent of social media platforms has accelerated that decline, of course, but decline

Watch what is said, and then look for the truth elsewhere

There's lies, damned lies and statistics, then there's whatever you want to call what's going on in the national election cycle.

Both sides of the aisle — a euphemism in and of itself for the divide betwixt and between the

supposed conservatives and the vehemently liberal are guilty of such things, but I find that parwith ticularly the emergency backup candi-

date Kamala Harris, it's not just lies, it's a fantasy world of stolen accomplishments wrapped up in her speeches and statements made up of word salad/succotash.

If you look at the national media, you'll only find stories making fun of Donald Trump's claim of pets being eaten by Haitian immigrants in Springfield, Ohio; you'll have to dig into social media or fun sites like Breitbart or NewsBusters to find stories on the Democrate candidate.

The control of language has long been a tool of the power-hungry elite. So many phrases, like "repeat a lie often enough, and it becomes the truth" speak to the age-old use of obfuscation to maintain power and control.

George Orwell, who's kina enjoying a renaissance lately, described it like this in an essay, "Politics and the English Language":


"The word fascism has now no meaning except in so far as it signifies 'something not desirable.' The words democracy, socialism, freedom, patriotic, realistic, justice have each of them several different meanings which cannot be reconciled with one another. In the case of a word like democracy, not only is there no agreed definition, but the attempt to make one is resisted from all sides. It is almost universally felt that when we call a country democratic we are praising it: consequently the defenders of every kind of regime claim that it is a democracy, and fear that they might have to stop using that word if it were tied down to any one meaning. Words of this kind are often used in a consciously dishonest way. That is, the person who uses them has his own private definition, but allows his hearer to think he means something quite

That goes to show you that even more than 80 years ago people were finding that obfuscation was a pretty big weapon in the arsenal of the power-hungry.

The icing on this particular cake is that we're all whinging about who said what in what way and fortifying the divisions between each other that the big picture has been forgotten.

ALWAYS AN EXCUSE

Deeply embedded in the Jewish belief system was an expectation of a Messiah who would come and deliver God's people and bring about the Kingdom of God. As the Iews endured centuries of oppression by foreign empires such as the Babylonians, the Persians, the Greeks, and, during Jesus' day, the Romans, this belief became more and more important.

The popular view was that the Messiah would be a political, military, and religious leader, but Jesus came and taught people about the Kingdom of God in a different way. He did not talk about it in political and military terms, such as insurrection against foreign oppressors and the establishment of a Jewish state, but in spiritual terms related to the love of God. He talked about inner transformation and receiving living water that would well up in the soul of a person resulting in the gift of eternal life.

With some people, Jesus boldly claimed to be the Messiah and backed up his claims with miracles. He multiplied loaves and fishes, feeding thousands from a single meal, and said, "I am the Bread of Life" (John 6:35).

He claimed to be the light of the



world, and healed blind people so they could see (e.g., John 9). He healed a man with a withered hand on the Sabbath and proclaimed Himself the Lord of the Sabbath (Matthew 12:1-14). He walked on water, demonstrating His Lordship over the natural world (John 6:19). He cast out demons, healing the mentally ill and those possessed by mysterious ailments (Matthew 4:24). He even raised people from the dead. (e.g., John 12).

He often referred to himself as "the Son of Man," which was the term Daniel 7:13-14 used to identify the coming Messiah. He outrageously claimed to be "the way, the truth, and the life" (John 10:10). He backed up his claims with miracles no one else could perform, save his disciples working under his direct authority.

Despite Jesus' teachings and miracles which demonstrating his authority as the Messiah, the vast

majority of the Jewish leadership did not believe that Jesus was the Messiah, the Son of God. Have you ever wondered why? Part of it was that some of them were stubborn legalists who loved their traditions more than they loved the truth that was being lived out in front of them. However, an even deeper reason was their own threatened self-interests.

The Jewish High Priest and the Sanhedrin (the Jewish ruling council) were in cahoots with the Roman governor. The High Priest paid a huge bribe to the Roman governor to obtain and maintain his position. The members of the Sanhedrin financed this bribe by paying their own bribes to the High Priest. The families of the Sanhedrin members and the priests gained their wealth the lucrative trade of sacrificial animals in the Jerusalem temple.

According to their religion, to be made right with God, the Jewish people had to make sacrifices in the temple, so the people impoverished themselves to buy the animal sacrifices from the families of the priests and members of the Sanhedrin at hugely inflated prices.

It was quite the racket. The Ro-

man governor got what he wanted: civil order, no insurrection, and wealth. The Jewish leaders got what they wanted: power, status, and wealth. It was a conspiracy of mutual benefit. So complete was the collusion that the Roman governor furnished the Sanhedrin with a contingent of Roman soldiers to enforce their rule over the people.

The guards served as Pilate's earpiece on the Jewish leaders' activities, and the Sanhedrin used the guards to stay in power and enforce their will and authority. There was a deep self-interest on the part of the Jewish leadership in maintaining the status quo. Jesus threatened the status quo, so their positions, wealth, and status were threatened. Jewish leaders were predisposed to reject Iesus.

Once, when the Sanhedrin sent their Roman soldiers to arrest Jesus, the soldiers became so captivated by His teaching that they came back empty-handed (John 7:45-49). Instead of being amazed at the sway of this teacher over even Roman soldiers, the Jewish leaders were outraged, accusing the soldiers of ignorance like the rest of the rabble who did not know Jewish law adequately enough to make

a judgement about who could be the Messiah.

They said that since none of them, the religious leaders and experts in the Jewish law, believed in Jesus, He could not be the Messiah, and all who did believe were damned to Hell.

Nicodemus, one of their number who had gone to Jesus secretly at night to hear Jesus out (John 3), tried to defend Jesus and His followers by asking for a hearing of Jesus and His teaching before they passed judgment on Him (John 7:50-53), but the leaders rebuked Nicodemus and derided him, saying that no prophet was to come from Galilee. Whatever Jesus did and said, they always had an excuse as to why they would not believe in

What is your excuse? You may think you have life all figured out and that you don't believe and won't believe, but isn't the matter worthy of fair consideration? What is getting in the way of your believing and considering the validity of Jesus' claims? Isn't the value of your soul worth more than any excuse you may have?

Voter registration deadline nears for November election

Eligible Texans planning to vote in the November general election have until Oct. 7 to register, Texas Secretary of State Jane Nelson reminds folks. The registration deadline applies to both early and election day voting.

"Texans have just a few short weeks left to register to vote, and I want to ensure all eligible Texans who want to make their voices heard are registered and prepared to do so," Nelson said.

Instructions on how to register to vote and how to update existing voter registrations can be found at VoteTexas.org. To be eligible to vote, you must be a U.S. citizen, a resident of the county where you register and at least 18 years old on Election Day.

Texas officials say they have scrubbed voter rolls of more than 1 million voters deemed ineligible. The routine process culls people who have moved out of state or are dead. Voters can ensure they are registered by going to the My Voter Portal on the secretary of state's website, https://teamrv-mvp.sos. texas.gov/MVP/mvp.do

Early voting begins on Oct. 21 and ends Nov. 1. The last day to apply for a



ballot by mail is Oct. 25. Election Day is Nov. 5.

Venezuelan designated terrorist organization

Gov. Greg Abbott and state officials have labeled the Venezuelan gang Tren de Aragua as a "foreign terrorist organization," the Austin American-Statesman reported.

The gang originated in Venezuela's prison system a decade ago and first operated from the state of Aragua, from which it derives its name. Its criminal activities include drug trafficking, human smuggling, kidnapping, extortion and illegal mining, according to the report. State officials believe the gang is operating in

"Our goal is to defend Texas from the growing threat of the gang," Abbott said. "We will not let them use Texas as a base of operations to terrorize our citizens."

Abbott has said El Paso is a locus of illegal activity

by members of Tren de Aragua. A law passed in 2023 to target smugglers undocumented immigrants will be used against gang members, he said.

Judge tosses Paxton suit against Bexar County

A state district judge last week threw out a lawsuit filed by Texas Attorney General Paxton Ken against Bexar County's plan to mail voter registration forms to country residents, Tribune Texas reported. Since the forms have already been mailed, District Judge Antonia Arteaga ruled the case was

Paxton sued the county to attempt to block the mailing of the forms. He asserted that the efforts in Bexar County, as well as in Harris and Travis counties, are a violation of state law and risk adding noncitizens to voter rolls. Bexar county commissioners called the claims misleading and unfounded.

Travis County has been moved to federal court, where county officials are also challenging Paxton's efforts to stop voter registration efforts. In addition, Jolt, a nonprofit that is pushing for increased

Latino participation in the electoral process, has sued Paxton after being targeted in a separate investigation into its registration efforts.

Project 2025 data shows little evidence of voter

Data compiled by the Heritage Foundation, architect of controversial 2025, indicates noncitizen voting in Texas is not a widespread problem, the Texas Newsroom reported.

A database maintained since 2017 houses state data since 2005. Only three instances of noncitizens casting ballots have been found since 2012, the database indicates.

The Heritage Foundation has recently sounded alarm bells about potential noncitizen voting the upcoming general election. The American Immigration Council cited the foundation's own data as proof that noncitizen voting is not a widespread problem.

"The lessons to take from Heritage's own database are that noncitizen voting is not a serious problem and that to the extent rare cases occur, they would be best addressed by better training government workers to immigration recognize

documents and follow procedure," wrote Aaron Reichlin-Melnick, a senior fellow at the council.

PUC urged to more closely vet plant loan applicants

Public Utility Commission has drawn criticism after initially approving a power plant project in the Rio Grande Valley for a company whose CEO was convicted of embezzlement seven years earlier.

The application has since been canceled, the Texas Standard reported. Earlier this month, the Senate Finance Committee grilled agency leaders, who are tasked with approving loans out of a \$5 billion fund approved by lawmakers to boost the state's power grid.

"The role of organization has changed dramatically," Sen. Paul Bettencourt, R-Houston, told PUC Chair Thomas Gleeson. "We're expecting more from you. You're not just a [electricity] rate organization anymore."

Gleeson said the PUC would review its processes and has penalized Deloitte, the firm hired to administer the Texas Energy Fund, by cutting its contract by 10 percent. The agency is under pressure to finish loaning the \$5 billion by the end of 2025, according to the legislation.

Time for flu, COVID-19 vaccines

Autumn has officially arrived, which means it's the season to consider booster shots for the flu, COVID-19 and other immunizations, such as shingles or pneumonia. The Statesman reported healthcare providers say it's OK to get both the flu and COVID-19 shots at the same time, but people should first check with their healthcare provider.

The federal Food and Drug Administration has approved three updated COVID-19 boosters, and the agency urges people of all ages to get vaccinated. The vaccines typically become effective in two weeks, healthcare authorities say. Most insurance plans cover the cost of the vaccines.



Hunting carts used for different kind of shots

I remember well my introduction to what I refer to as electric hunting buggies. The correct name would be EZ Go electric golf carts converted for use in the field other than the smooth riding surfaces of a golf course.

Well over a decade ago, I began visiting with Ken Blackstock who owned Plano Golf Carts in Plano for many years. Ken and his brother Robert left Ken's current headquarters in Nevada, Texas, loaded with one of their very rugged converted golf carts on a trailer and pulled it out to my place to put it through its paces. I remember telling my newfound friends that if the buggy performed as well as it looked, I had great plans for it.

With big tires, a bed that converts to an extra seat, high performance 10 hp electric engine, front storage bin and a heavy duty adjustable controller, the buggy setting in my yard was everything I had envisioned. But how would it perform. I weighed a couple hundred pounds, and I was the lightest of our little

test group. With about 500 pounds of lead batteries for power close to 700 pounds of testers onboard, we headed about a mile from my home to some rough country that I hunted at the time.

Ken allowed me to drive

and on the asphalt road, I could feel the torque generated by the oversized engine. Once we entered the property, a series of old gravel pits that had been dug back in the 60s, the versatility of a machine that was once used



for transporting golfers around on a manicured golf course became evident.

Even with a load of more than a thousand pounds of batteries and testers, the buggy easily negotiated the slopes created by an excavator many years prior when the area was mined for sand and gravel.

During that fall and winter, my hunting buggy transported me to and from my close to home hunting area on many trips and helped me haul everything from corn for feeders to the Snap Lock Hunting Blinds that I hunted from. It was also a lifesaver (and back saver) when it was time to transport wild hogs and deer out of some

pretty rough country. I learned my buggy was perfect for negotiating dry terrain but it definitely was not designed to be used for mudding. I learned to steer clear of muddy areas but carried a winch onboard which I occasionally had to use when I got a little too brave and attempted to plough through deep mud.

About this time, a buddy and I began outfitting archery elk and bear hunts in the mountains of northern Colorado. We had to negotiate a pretty steep road for about a mile in route to the higher elevations where we often encountered game.

My partner had hunted with me on my buggy here in Texas and was quiet impressed. He soon purchased his own buggy from Ken and we began towing our quiet electric hunting machines all the way near the Wyoming border each fall. They performed flawlessly for the seven years we used them up there and allowed us to approach our hunting ar-

eas quietly. Once, when Ken and Robert came up to hunt with us, we loaded a bear that Robert had arrowed on the buggy and four of us rode our hunting cart a good mile through a rough winding mountain trail back to camp. That had to be the ultimate acid test for

the converted golf cart. Fast forward to last week. Ken and Robert again pulled a hunting buggy out to my place for a test run. As they pulled trailer with buggy strapped down into my yard, I was getting a bit of déjà vu. Lots had transpired since that test run many years ago, including some huge advances in golf cart technology.

As is often the case, I

had prepared a barbeque dinner for us and a great friend that lives down the road offered his ranch as a test ground for the new 'buggy' setting on the trailer. After setting up 'camp' in the shade of a huge pecan tree, we began putting Ken's new conversion buggy through its paces. With one lightweight lithium battery as power, the weight of the 500 pounds of lead batteries was eliminated, no longer was the oversized electric engine necessary.

"We've set these buggies up for use on a basic Texas deer lease." said Ken. "It is designed for transportation on the deer lease, transporting hunters and game to and from camp as well as other deer lease tasks such as hauling corn for feeders, etc. The lithium battery is a huge improvement over the old style lead batteries. They charge in half the time of lead acid batteries and are basically trouble free. No longer is it necessary to continually be checking water levels in the old style batteries or cleaning posts. By making adjustments to the controller to facilitate hill climbing, the units are more than adequate for the terrain encountered on most Texas leases." We began our test with

a basic deer lease chore, filling a corn feeder. With

corn in the bed of the buggy and two guys totaling about 450 pounds we headed out to the first feeder which was suspended from a large limb on a pecan. We backed the buggy up under the feeder, stood in the bed on the back and easily filled the It was then time to put

the buggy to the real test of climbing what I considered a pretty steep hill, actually two of them. A slough traverses the

perimeter of my buddy's ranch. From the top of the bank down to the water is at least 40 feet and the slope is an estimated 30 degrees. With our group of testers watching closely, Ken drove the buggy down one of the slopes, crossed about 10 inches of running water and up the other bank at about half throttle.

him and the buggy easily negotiated the slope with the two of us onboard. Back at camp to enjoy a tasty smoked pork, pinto bean and potato salad lunch with a buggy still had several miles of battery life left. I was completely sold on

I later hopped on with

the versatility and power of the converted golf cart. At less than half the cost of a factory model with a 3 year warranty on the lithium battery and 3-month warranty on the buggy, this might just be the best deal available on a very serviceable machine tailor made for the deer lease. Habitat and Angler Access Program enhances freshwater fishing

AUSTIN - Texas Parks and Wildlife Department's Habitat and Angler Access Program supplies funding for projects that develop and increase shoreline and bank fishing access as well as restore and enhance fish habitat in Texas' public inland waters.

The HAAP is looking for project ideas and proposals for the third round of funding for fiscal years 2026-2027. Potential partners are required to contact, discuss and develop project ideas, as well as draft and submit project proposals in coordination with TPWD Inland Fisheries Biolo-

"The Habitat and Angler Access Program is an exciting opportunity for us to collaborate and support partners interested in expanding fishing opportunities and bettering the quality of fisheries for Texans," said Michael Homer Jr., fisheries biologist for the TPWD Inland Fisheries Division. "The program is intended to identify and implement projects with the highest potential to enhance freshwater fisheries resources and improve bank and shoreline access in public waters."

Since 2023, the program has supported 32 projects with more than \$1 million of funding from the sale of freshwater fishing licenses and over \$1.9 million of matching support from partners. HAAP enables the TPWD Inland Fisheries Division to support habitat and angler access improvement projects conducted with eligible partners such as other agencies, local municipalities, water authorities, educational institutions, angler groups and other non-profit organizations.

Funding is used to support individual fish habitat improvement and angler access projects

on public ponds, reservoirs, streams and rivers. Example habitat projects include bank and shoreline stabilization projects, installation of erosion control features, deployment of habitat structures, native vegetation plantings, as well as dredging excessive silt and organic materials from reservoirs that have high potential for quality fisheries development.

Bank or shoreline-based angler access projects that could be supported through HAAP include the development or improvement of fishing piers, installation of fish attracting features (e.g., underwater dock lighting and habitat structures), the creation of jetties, as well as the construction of non-motorized boat launches for kayaks, canoes and other small watercraft for fishing access.

Luttrell introduces Service Dogs Assisting Veterans Act

WASHINGTON, D.C. — In recognition of National Suicide Prevention Month and National Service Dog Month, Rep. Morgan Luttrell, R-Texas, Chairman of Disability Assistance and Memorial Affairs Subcommittee on House Veterans' Affairs Committee, introduced the Service Dogs Assisting Veterans Act in the U.S. House of Representatives.

This legislation would require the Secretary of Veterans Affairs to award grants to nonprofit organizations to assist with programs to provide service dogs to eligible veterans. This bill includes training for the service dog and also extends the availability of this program to other veteran disabilities, such as blind, deaf, TBI, military sexual trauma, paralysis and PTSD.

"As veterans fight to survive the invisible wounds of war, it's been my priority to do everything possible to ensure veterans have access to every mental health resource out there," Luttrell said. "Long after our veterans have left the battlefield, service dogs play an invaluable role in supporting the men and women who fought for our freedoms. The legislation I introduced provides another tool in the toolbox for wounded vets when they return home by providing the resources to raise, train, and place service

dogs with more veterans. Meeting the needs of our veterans is not something I take lightly, and I'll continue to work to provide them the best care."

"Service dogs have a proven track record of providing life-saving assistance to Veterans," said K9s For Warriors Vice President of Government & External Affairs Bill McCabe. "The SAVES Act will ultimately put more service dogs in the hands of Veterans in critical need, allowing them to regain their independence and reintegrate into civilian life. We applaud this bipartisan, bicameral effort and urge Congress to pass this important legislation without delay."

It is estimated that upwards of 20 percent of Iraq and Afghanistan war veterans suffer from post-traumatic stress disorder, and more than 450,000 service members have been diagnosed

with at least one traumatic brain injury over the past two decades.

As a result, these veterans suffer from alarmingly high rates of depression, anxiety, joblessness, homelessness, and substance use disorders. Far too often, they resort to taking their own lives, with nearly 20 veterans dying by suicide each day.

Today, there are tens of thousands of service dogs across the United States assisting veterans with a wide-range of disabilities and ailments. A service dog is defined as a dog which have been specifically trained to conduct actions for a person suffering from a disability. These can include seeing eye dogs, seizure alert and response dogs, and actions to assist individuals suffering from mental health conditions such as Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder.

As the demand for alternative treatment modalities increases, the bipartisan, bicameral Service Dogs Assisting Veterans (SAVES) Act directs the Secretary of the Veterans Affairs to establish a grant program at the Veterans Health Administration to award funds, on a competitive basis, to accredited nonprofit organizations that provide highly trained service dogs to eligible Veterans suffering from blindness, visual, or mobility impairments, loss of hearing, post-traumatic stress disorder, traumatic brain injury, and/or military sexual trauma,

free of charge.

Nonprofit organizations would be required to submit an application to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs that includes a description of the training that will be provided by the organization to eligible veterans; the training of dogs that will serve as service dogs; the aftercare services that the organization will provide for the service dogs and eligible veteran, and the plan for publicizing the availability of service dogs for veterans free of charge.

To ensure the highest of standards, approved nonprofits must also have experience working directly with veterans and adhere to Assistance Dogs International (ADI) standards or another widely recognized accreditation that the Secretary determines has standards that meet or exceed ADI.

Several veterans organizations have endorsed this legislation, including: Americas Warrior Partnership (AWP), Blinded Veterans Association, Chief Warrant & Warrant Officers Association of the US Coast Guard, Dog Tag Buddies, HunterSeven Foundation, Iraq & Afghanistan Veterans of America, Jewish War Veterans of America, Kayas K9s, K9s For Warriors, National Military Families Association, Non-Commissioned Officers Association, Paralyzed Veterans of America, Pet Advocacy Network, Semper K9 Assistance Dogs, The American Legion, The Independence Fund, Tragedy Assistance Program for Survivors, The Enlisted Association, Veterans of Foreign Wars, and Vietnam Veterans of America.

Luttrell also announced the passage of the Veterans Compensation Cost-of-Living Adjustment Act of 2024, a critical piece of legislation aimed at supporting America's veterans and their families. The bill, which passed with bipartisan support, ensures that veterans receiving compensation for service-connected disabilities, as well as the survivors of certain veterans, will see an increase in their benefits to match the rising cost of living.

"Our veterans gave everything to defend our freedoms, and it is our duty to ensure they receive the care and compensation they deserve. The passage of the Veterans Compensation COLA Act of 2024 is a testament to our ongoing commitment to America's heroes and their families," Luttrell said.

Effective Dec. 1, this adjustment will provide financial relief to veterans by aligning their benefits with the cost-of-living increase that Social Security beneficiaries receive. The Veterans COLA Act ensures that veterans and their families do not fall behind economically as inflation impacts households across the county, recognizing the sacrifices they have made for our nation.
