up," Bunn said. When the water company was boring under Bonnie a line was struck that wasn't on any city water line map. "This was a water line that wasn't fully pressured and appears to be a line to nowhere," Bunn said. The line teed off in the pasture just west of 9th, Bunn said, and apparently never utilized. A second breach of the line occurred around 10 a.m. Tuesday. That's when Purcell Water Department crews moved the line back and stabilized it. That break caused problems for Purcell Elementary and Intermediate Schools where no water was available. Some students were sent home. Mark and Jackie Suchy jumped into action and utilized their minnow transport truck to bring water to the school buildings to fill tanks so students and faculty could take bathroom breaks. The Suchys would go to their minnow farm and fill the truck up with water and then go back to the buildings that were affected by the water outage. Mrs. Suchy is the elementary school secretary who did double duty Tuesday. Water was off to much of Purcell from around 10 a.m. to about 3:30 p.m. city officials confirmed. Just as water department crews were finishing up the second breach a farmer's auger ran through a three inch line three miles west of Purcell presenting the water department with yet another challenge. "In the old days they didn't put in as many valves as we do now," Bunn said. "Now we have tracer lines where you can connect an electrode and see where the line is in the ground. The old ones don't have that."

COVID vaccine

Thursday mornings good time to check portal: Official

Cleveland County Health Department Public Information Officer Sara King reports the best day to make a reservation for a COVID vaccination is Thursday mornings. "It's a supply and demand thing," King told **The Purcell Register** earlier this week. She said she knows the portal is not ideal for every circumstance. "But people are being able to make appointments on it," King said. "The issue is simply we're notified of inventory on Tuesday. Then the vaccine is redistributed between Tuesday and Wednesday. "Then we can figure out the appointments for that week," King continued. "The federal officials communicate with the state and that how we know how many doses we have to work with." Two vehicle head-on crash in southeast McClain County

Dock diving dogs

Local Purcell facility named best in the entire nation

Bryan Landers is still pinching himself after his Oklahoma Thunder Dock Diving facility west of Purcell was deemed the sport's top facility in the nation for 2020.

The award was one of several Landers picked up while competing at the recent Dock Dogs World Championship in Dubuque, Iowa.

Only dogs which finish in the top four in each division in wild card events receive invitations to compete at the world championship.

Landers hosts a wild card

competition in May at Oklahoma Thunder Dock Diving.

His 7-year-old Labrador retriever, Thunder, came away from the world championship with a seventh place finish in the Iron Dog Division.

Final scores in the division are determined by a formula and based on each dog's performance in big air, speed retrieve and extreme vertical contests.

Thunder also placed 14th among 40 entrants in the speed retrieve.

Landers also competed in the Novice Division with a 1-year-old golden retriever, Harbor.

Although somewhat overwhelmed by the venue, Landers

said Harbor never missed a jump off the dock.

"I was happy with her," he said.

Other members of the Oklahoma Thunder Dock Diving family were also at the world competition.

With Landers handling, Kiwi, owned by LeCampbell of Norman, finished fifth in speed retrieve in the Sonic Division with a time of 5.01 seconds.

Landers said the Sonic is the fastest division and Kiwi's placement means she is the "fifth fastest dog in the world."

It doesn't appear they did a very good job of monitoring the possibility of what could unfold January 6 to fortify the Capitol Police Force to keep the building and its occupants safe.

Then came the infamous "pep talk" from their leader telling them to make their way down to the Capitol and fight.

That they did.

Protesters fought through police barricades, stormed the building and entered lawmakers' chambers.

The Electoral College certification process was stopped and Vice President Mike Pence and members of Congress were evacuated.

One civilian was shot dead and four others including a Capitol Policeman died as a result of the melee.

A second Capitol Police officer is reported to have taken his own life after he responded to the riot.

It's really very difficult to wrap your head around the entire ordeal.

Seeing those hooligans in the halls of Congress would have made my blood boil but I was too stunned seeing what was on the television screen.

I really didn't realize the impact of the events had on me until I saw night TV shots of the Capitol and monuments during a time out in the Tampa Bay versus Washington Wild Card football game.

I wanted to hide my face from looking at those beautiful images that are now tarnished. Sad.

January 6 was a very dark day for America.

Please, stop the violence

Acts of violence against a marriage partner have never saved a marriage. Violent acts toward family members have never made a family happier.

Typically, they create emotional and sometimes physical wounds that are never forgotten. Too many families have suffered because someone in the family became violent.

Violence in our communities and towns always results in pain, division and sometimes even loss of life. Violence typically brings the wrong people together to do bad things. No community, city or state needs this.

In times of war or enemy aggression against our United States, violence has been necessary. Acts of war have never been pleasant. They result in the loss of life and horrific debilitation of so many people physically and mentally. Most Americans do not want to be at war with anyone.

In years past, we have had to protect our country against those who sought to harm us. The Second Amendment gives Americans the right to bear arms and protect ourselves.

We are grateful for our military but we pray for peace. None of us want our family members actively involved in combat if it can be avoided.

This act of criminal stupidity did nothing to advance or help President Trump. If they had stopped in front of the Capitol and given speeches, yelled, screamed, waved their signs throughout the day and then gone home the results would have been better.

Terrorism never produces positive results. Destruction of the property of others and the terrorism of people are savage and criminal.

This same kind of unnecessary violence was seen in many of our cities last summer. I traveled to Cleveland, Ohio, after a march had taken place and saw the results of acts of violence. I saw almost all of downtown Cleveland boarded up.

Businesses were closed. Hotels were closed. Very few restaurants were open.

For weeks my family was afraid to stop in downtown Louisville because of the protests and disruption occurring

Unfortunate events

Dear Editor:

As a parent, I try to shield my children from harm and evil. January 6 I didn't. I wanted them to see the sedition and insurrection committed to our nation. It was a lesson in real time that words have meaning.

Your actions have consequences, and you better be prepared to face them. Many times I was at a loss to explain to my 13-year-old twins the gravity of the situation.

January 6, 2021 is the day many of our elected officials faced consequences for the first time for peddling conspiracy theories for years. It is time to stop playing politics solely for personal ambition.

COVID-19 situation

In October, Oklahoma long-term care facilities received information on how to sign up for immunizations through companies contracted with the federal government.

Late into December, many facilities still hadn't received notification on when these immunizations would be available. As residents and staff continued to become diagnosed with COVID-19, many became desperate for an ounce of hope

that they would soon receive potentially life-saving vaccinations.

I was one of those nursing home administrators who sat waiting for the pharmacy to contact us, only to learn that there was some confusion and our immunizations would not be coming.

Thankfully, my county's health department called the facility to inform us that they didn't see our building on the

contract list. Chris Munn at the Stephens County Health Department, in conjunction with the Oklahoma State Department of Health, came in and saved the day with their immunization strike team.

Every single staff member and resident who wanted to be immunized was able to do it within five days of the call. It took us three months to hear back from the federally contracted provider, but in only five

days OSDH was able to help.

I truly believe that the state and county health departments are doing the best they can to get everyone vaccinated. Like anything in life, it's not perfect; the people behind the scenes trying to make it all flow are doing so with a passion that shouldn't be questioned.

When OSDH was a few weeks ahead of schedule vaccinating and could have sat on thousands of vaccines,

catch their breath, and wait for Microsoft to finish the state's online portal for signup, they elected to push forward with vaccinations.

They were in a situation where they would have been judged for either: 1) holding onto vaccinations when people were dying, or 2) making the decision to give inoculations

I have said many times, the most important job we as legislators have is to write and pass a balanced budget because ultimately the outcome of that work impacts every single person in our state.

Because those tax dollars come from the public and in turn provide core services our citizens depend on—including schools, transportation, public safety and health care—it is our responsibility to be the best stewards possible with those dollars.

In order to promote greater transparency, openness and accountability, in the 2019 legislative session, we approved Senate Bill 1, creating LOFT—the Legislative Office of Fiscal Transparency.

I was chair of the Senate Finance Committee at that time and so I traveled to New Mexico, one of the states that has an office similar to LOFT. I sat down with their director to learn more about how their office functioned and how those efforts benefited the public.

It seemed clear our state could also greatly benefit from such an office. SB 1 was approved and signed into law and we began putting LOFT together.

LOFT's mission is to assist the Oklahoma Legislature in making informed, data-driven

decisions, not subject to politics or the emotions of the day, that will serve the citizens of Oklahoma by ensuring accountability in state government, efficient use of resources, and effective programs and services.

Its operations are overseen by a bipartisan, bicameral 14-member Legislative Oversight Committee (LOC) appointed by the President Pro Tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House.

The vision is that LOFT will provide us with timely, objective, factual, nonpartisan and easily understood information to facilitate decision-making to ensure government spending is efficient and transparent, adds value and delivers intended outcomes.

LOFT will analyze performance outcomes, identify programmatic and operational improvements, identify duplications of services across state entities, and examine the efficacy of expenditures to an entity's mission.

LOFT will also help us determine if publicly funded entities are complying with state and federal laws. This is important because if an agency is out of compliance, particularly with federal laws or regulations, it could impact funding.

The staff includes an economist who can help us, not only as we plan for the coming budget year, but long-term budget

planning. We'll be able to draw from program evaluations, independent comprehensive performance audits and special reviews and other reports to guide us in our budget work.

LOFT's first meeting of 2021 was held on January 13. Currently, LOFT is examining Oklahoma's use of the federal Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) funding. We've also asked them to look at Oklahoma's Board of Equalization that determines our budget every year.

We want to look at the process used to estimate available dollars for appropriation, and how accurate those projections are. We've also asked them to look at the Oklahoma Employment Security Commission, including best practices, software and other issues and how they impact unemployment benefits, particularly as this pandemic continues.

Although we're just in the initial stages of LOFT's work, I am excited about what we'll be able to accomplish through their research and analysis. I believe LOFT is good for taxpayers, good for legislators, and it's good for Oklahoma as a whole.

Garvin:

through an imperfect system trying to save more lives. I wouldn't want to be the one to make that call, knowing I'd be scrutinized either way.

I know it's frustrating, not being able to get a vaccination if you want one, trying to get a vaccine for someone else and not being able to schedule it, being told all the appointments are full. It's all frustrating.

But consider the fact that there are approximately 650,000 Oklahomans over the age of 65. There are roughly 2,400 people employed by OSDH. I'd say only about 20 percent (480) of those individuals are trained to give immunizations.

If those 480 people worked 24 hours a day, seven days a week, giving immunizations, and each took approximately five minutes to administer, each person would be able to give 288 immunizations daily (138,240 per day).

However, if we factor in their regular workload, paperwork

for each immunization, and their eight-hour workday, even giving that many immunizations five days a week would only allow them to administer roughly 46,000 shots a week—and that's without lunch, travel time or bathroom breaks.

My point is this will take time. We're dealing with a supply shortage, a nursing shortage, and still expecting these workers to manage their regular workload.

Simply put, I ask you to consider these points and extend a little grace over the next few weeks because OSDH is working non-stop to make the process better.

They've never given immunizations out like this in mass quantities and they're trying to figure it out as they go, just like the rest of us. If you have ideas and want to be part of the solution, contact your legislator—that's why we're here.

You can pre-register for your

vaccination at www.vaccinate.ok.gov. Currently, only health care workers, first responders and those 65 or older are eligible. After pre-registering if you're eligible to receive the vaccine, you'll be prompted to make an appointment. If not, you'll receive an email when you are eligible.

The state is receiving weekly vaccine shipments and reservations can be made on Thursday mornings. Spots fill up quickly so be sure to get online early. If there are no available spots, you'll need to check back in weekly. Please be patient. Everyone who wants a vaccine will eventually get it.

Legislature approves rules for session

On January 5, lawmakers gathered for our constitutionally-required Organizational Day to approve rules for the upcoming legislative session and elect leadership.

Article V, Section 26 of the Oklahoma Constitution states that the Legislature is to meet for organizational purposes on the first Tuesday following the first Monday in January of each odd-numbered year.

What we use now as Organizational Day was originally the start of session, but a 1989 ballot initiative moved the start of session to February and designated the original start day in January as Organizational Day.

The Legislature uses Organizational Day to officially meet for the first time, during which we elect legislative leadership and develop rules.

The House reelected Speaker Charles McCall of Atoka for his third term, making him Oklahoma's longest serving House speaker. Rep. Terry O'Donnell of Catoosa was elected to serve as Speaker Pro Tempore.

In the Senate, Sen. Greg Treat

was reelected to his third term and will continue to serve as President Pro Tempore.

The House and Senate each approve or disprove the legislative rules that each chamber will abide by.

Lawmakers have the opportunity to propose their own amendments to the rules, which may be brought up for a vote to add to the other rules. When the rules are finalized, legislators vote on the rules.

Now that the rules have been approved and leadership has been elected, lawmakers are returning their focus to finalizing their bill drafts before the filing deadline.

The last day to file bills is Thursday, January 21, and session officially begins Monday, February 1.

I look forward to the start of session and continuing to work for the people of House District 42!

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Absentee change

Ballot verification rules back in effect

A temporary absentee ballot verification option which was put in place by Oklahoma legislators in 2020 has expired.

The temporary verification option was part of Senate Bill 210 and was passed in the spring in response to the COVID-19 pandemic.

The bill gave Oklahoma voters the option to include a copy of their valid ID in lieu of a notarized or witnessed signature on their absentee ballot affidavit.

Certain provisions of the bill were valid only for the 2020 election year and expired in December.

McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said voters who request absentee ballots in 2021 will receive updated absentee ballot

instructions with their balloting material.

She stressed absentee voters should read these thoroughly before placing their ballot in the mail.

According to Haley, "standard" absentee ballot affidavits must be notarized. Absentee ballot affidavits for physically handicapped voters must include the voter's signature witnessed by two people.

"In other words, voters will submit their absentee ballots the same way they did prior to Senate Bill 210," she said. "As always, we recommend voters allow themselves plenty of time to receive, vote and return their ballots."

WIC services available to qualifying individuals

The Chickasaw Nation Women, Infants and Children Supplemental Nutrition Program (WIC) extends its services to families who need encouragement and support in feeding their children.

This program offers up-to-date specialized nutrition education along with a generous food package for growing children from the prenatal period up to age five.

The program puts families' feeding concerns first and works with individuals to provide the very best for their growing children. It also helps participants improve their diet, get immunizations and health care if needed, as well as encourages women to breastfeed.

Through nutrition education, counseling, support and encouragement, the Chickasaw Nation WIC staff connects with families to assist them in improving and enhancing the quality of their lives.

Applicants may apply online at Chickasaw.net/WIC, or schedule an appointment by calling (855) 559-0985.

Services are available to anyone who meets the following guidelines:

- Is currently pregnant or breastfeeding;
- Has had a baby in the past six months or has a child up to five years of age;
- Meets WIC income guidelines; and

• Has a nutritional screening at the WIC office to determine if they are at nutritional risk.

During the COVID-19 pandemic, while the WIC offices are closed to the public, the program is serving participants and taking new applicants by phone or email.

Homeless persons will be served immediately upon request if the above criteria are met.

Funded by the United States Department of Agriculture, WIC has been serving the community for more than 30 years. Currently, the program serves the needs of more than 4,000 participants.

Chickasaw Nation WIC benefits are issued utilizing a magnetic stripe card known as Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card. The card works just like a debit or credit card. It replaces the traditional paper check or voucher and gives families freedom of purchasing the WIC food they need with each trip to the store.

A WIC food package includes milk, cheese, yogurt, fruit juice, eggs, cereal, whole grains, canned fish, peanut butter, beans/peas, as well as fresh and frozen fruits and vegetables.

Infant foods are also offered, and formula for infants is provided if needed. Enhanced food packages are offered to breastfeeding women, and peer counselors are available to assist them in having a successful breastfeeding experience. In the summer months, the

Good money management habits begin young

Learning is a life-long process beyond reading, writing and arithmetic classes in school. It also includes money management skills, said Cindy Clampet, Oklahoma State University Extension assistant family resource management specialist.

Although Oklahoma requires students to take a personal financial literacy class to graduate from high school, Clampet said learning principles of earning, saving, protecting and investing can start even earlier at home.

“Start by giving small children money for purchases at the store. Exchanging coins for candy teaches them money has value,” Clampet said. “The next lesson is that the value of money is tied to effort or work. By paying them for extra chores – beyond what would normally be expected in the family – they learn the money represents a certain amount of work.”

It can be a real eye-opener for a child who wants a \$200 item when they realize that amount

equals 28.5 hours working in the yard for \$7 per hour. One of two things will happen in that scenario: the child will be more appreciative of the item, or they’ll decide that much effort isn’t worth it.

“Either way, the child learns that things cost money and won’t be handed over without putting forth some work,” she said.

Another way to help develop those skills is to set up a savings account at a local bank or credit union. Go with them as they make deposits; they’ll get excited when they see the balance grow.

Clampet said by the time a child is in high school, they should set up a student checking account to budget their money and pay for expenses. Student checking accounts typically have low or no fees but may come with perks such as mobile money apps and transfer options.

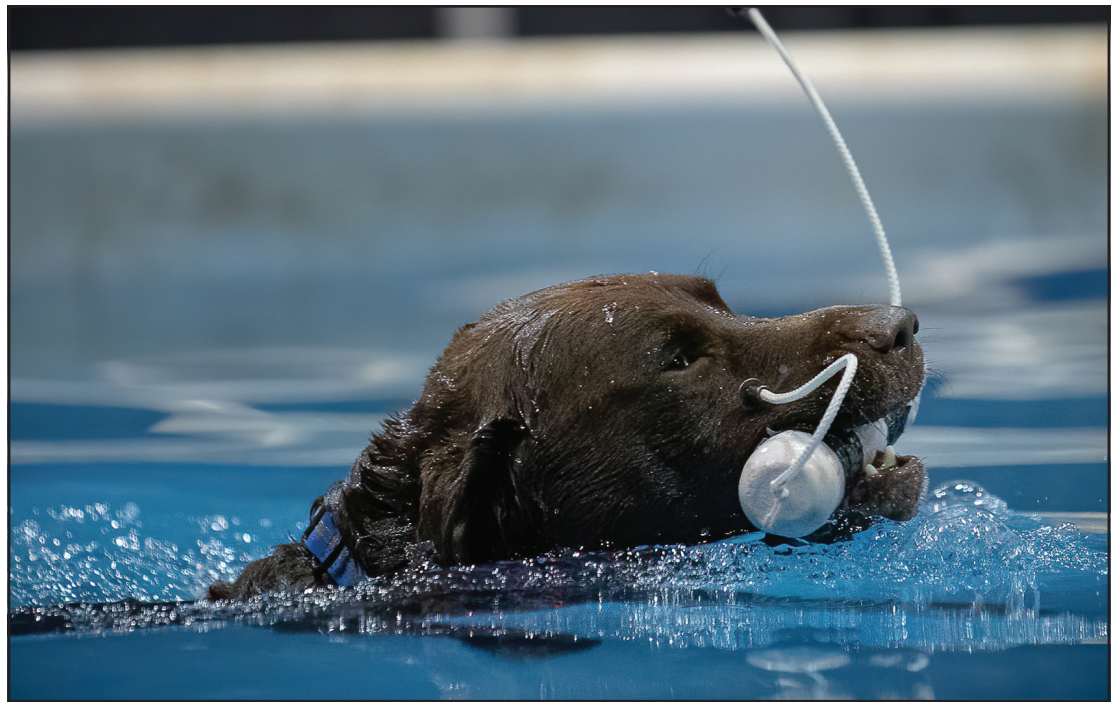
Some banks require a student’s account be linked to the parent’s account, or they require a minimum balance. Check with several banking

institutions and compare their benefits and drawbacks.

There are some good websites that have games and apps, as well. One site, www.moneyprodigy.com, is designed for children 4-18 years old. Clampet said some of the games are as simple as putting together a puzzle of dollar bills, while others require counting coins and sums. Other games introduce the hazards of payday loans, earning money as an Uber driver or budgeting for a month.

Those who may be weary of video screen content can turn to classics such as the board games Monopoly and Life. New games that are highly recommended for teaching money skills are Act Your Wage, Franklin’s Fortune, Pay Day and Managing My Allowance.

“Take advantage of this time at home with your children. The things they learn now can be a valuable investment in their financial future,” Clampet said. “Plus, you’ll get the added benefit of spending extra time with your children and passing on your values about money.”

Apply now for mail-in ballots

Less than three weeks remain for registered voters in McClain County to apply for absentee ballots to be mailed to them for the February 9 Purcell special election and Lindsay school board primary, McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said today.

Applications for absentee ballots must be received by the county election board no later than 5 p.m. February 2 to be processed in time for the election.

Absentee voters may apply in person at the county election board office or may send their applications by mail, fax, or e-mail. An online version of the form may be filled out and submitted electronically <http://www.elections.ok.gov>.

Any registered voter eligible to vote in the election may vote by absentee ballot without stating a reason, Haley said.

However absentee voters can activate certain special conditions in the following circumstances:

Registered voters who are physically incapacitated, who care for physically incapacitated persons who cannot be left unattended or who are confined to nursing homes may apply for absentee ballots only by mail, fax, e-mail, online or via an agent who is at least 16 years of age and who is not employed by or related within the third degree of consanguinity or affinity to any person whose name ap-

pears on the ballot. Military personnel, residents of McClain County living overseas, and the spouses and dependents of each group may apply only by mail, fax or e-mail. For more information and instructions, military and overseas voters may visit the Federal Voting Assistance Program website at <http://www.fvap.gov/oklahoma>.

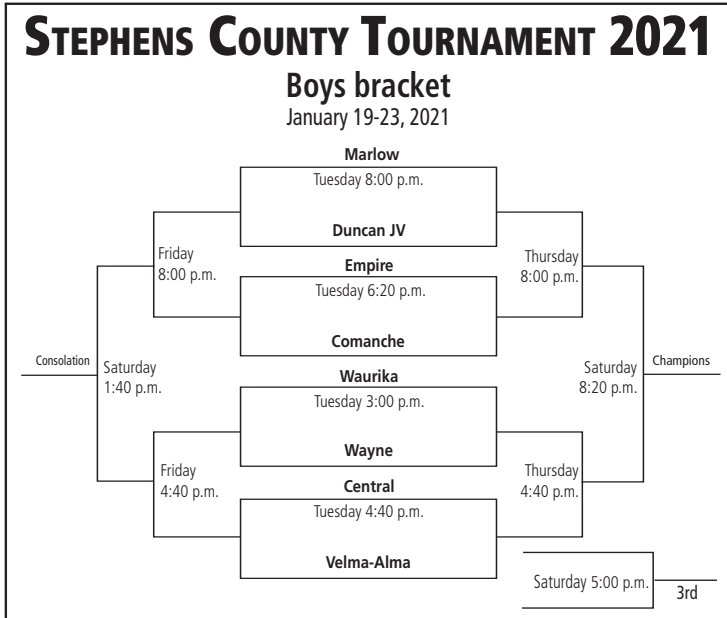
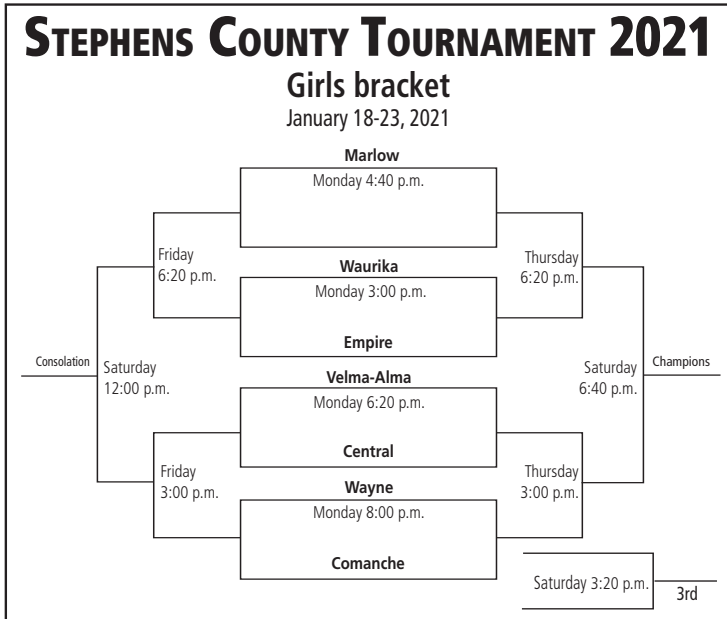

AYA walking app launches new character in "Cattlemen" series

The newest addition to the Chickasaw Nation's AYA walking app (AYA) will be "William."

Launching in January, William is the latest addition to the "Cattlemen" series of characters available for AYA. William will set walkers down new paths full of fresh points of interest.

While enjoying the physical activity of walking, users of AYA unlock cultural and historic content, such as traditional prayers, locations of cultural interest, Chickasaw words and character episodes. William is one of the many walking partners in AYA available to download on iPhone and Android devices.

Selecting walking partners from Chickasaw characters allows app users to participate in important periods of Chickasaw history. Williams' point of view of events come from the post-Removal era,

or after Chickasaws were relocated to Indian Territory.

With the Cattlemen series, paths are plotted out in Indian Territory, before Oklahoma statehood. The Cattlemen series lets users take a step back in time and explore.

"Ten years ago, in 1877, I was a student at the Chickasaw National Academy in Stonewall, Indian Territory. I was 12 years old. Many parents found it difficult to send their children away to school, but my mother was determined that I receive the best education she could provide," William says in the AYA walking app.

Other characters walk along the same route Chickasaw ancestors took during Removal to Indian Territory, a path reversed for the app from current-day Oklahoma to Mississippi. Along the way, users are acquainted with historical sites and landmarks.

Besides William, new features of AYA include a healthy tips section, updated and improved group challenges, in-depth notification settings, new items to discover, as well as performance and stability improvements.

The AYA walking app is now available for download at no cost in the Apple App Store and with Google Play. AYA also syncs to Apple Watches, Fitbits or other step tracking devices connected to Apple Health or Google Fit.

About the AYA walking app

The Chickasaw word "AYA" means "to go" or "to journey." AYA is an interactive mobile walking app designed to keep participants moving by combining physical activity with Chickasaw history and culture.

Using step-tracking technology, the interactive mobile walking app rewards users as

they move throughout their day.

The app tells a historical story through voice-acted walking partners, consisting of fictional Chickasaw characters living at important periods in Chickasaw history. Their stories unfold as users unlock new chapters with their steps.

All characters are voiced by Chickasaw talent. Original characters include Mah Wah Ta, voiced by Monica Peoples; Eliza, voiced by Cameron Mitchell; Solomon, voiced by Ace Greenwood; Akanowa, voiced by Virginia Bolen; Hikatabby, voiced by Vincent Baptiste and Olle Belle voiced by Amy Darnell.

The youth sponsored our men's Chili Cook-Off following worship. Many stayed to enjoy good fellowship and food.

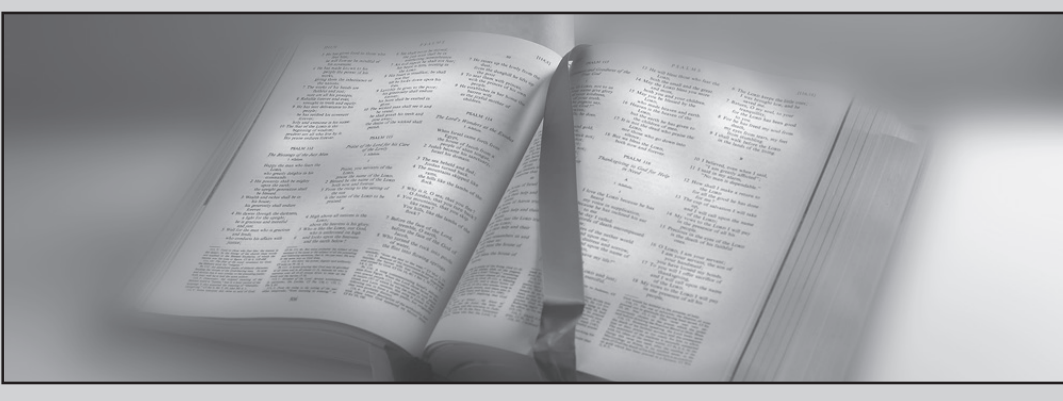

Lexington United Methodist Food Bank report

As a good steward of resources used to feed hungry people, we are required to account for how the food we oversee is given out. Our stock is supplied through the Regional Food Bank of Oklahoma.

In 2020 we fed 438 families. There were three months that we didn't have our regular Saturday Give-A-Ways, but hungry people were still fed by making appointments for picking up food. The number of lives we touched in 2020, even with smaller numbers for three months, was 2,032.

We don't require anything of attendees except to be hungry. We don't require you to prove income, to live in a certain town, or to attend a certain church. There's no question that, if you don't already have a church home, we'd love for you to visit with us. We just don't want anyone to be without food.

As many of you know, we assign a certain number of "points" for each family or household that registers. At this time, it is 100 points. The

person who has registered for the family can then select what foods they want using those points. We don't have pre-packed boxes because we realize that people sometimes have intolerances or allergies to foods and that they can't eat certain food.

There are enough good and healthy foods for anyone who is hungry to choose from. We have frozen foods (meat, cheese, fruit, vegetables), canned vegetables and fruits, canned meats, dried staples (beans of all types, rice, pasta), dried fruit (raisins, prunes, sometimes others), fruit juice, packages of stew or chili, some snacks, and other miscellaneous items. All of the foods have point values assigned to them. Then checkers add up the points for the items.

We have volunteers to help people carry out their shopping, as well as those who check people out. Unfortunately, the process is a little slower since we are preserving social distancing. We are asking people to wear

masks, and we do provide hand sanitizer.

We are always on the lookout for volunteers to help with the Food Bank, either helping unload the shipments, helping stock, and helping on Give-A-Way Saturdays. Any potential volunteers should contact Food Bank Manager Robin Cook through the church at 527-3506.

The next Food Bank Give-Away will be held Saturday, January 16, from 12 to 4 p.m. Again, we are asking that everyone wear masks to protect each other and to pay attention to social distancing. Masks can be provided if you do not have one. Hand sanitizer will also be available. The process of distribution is a little slower because of social distancing, but as long as you arrive by 4 p.m., you will be able to pick up food.
