

"I'm taking time to review the articles," said Horn. "They just came out [Tuesday] morning. We're dealing with some very serious and important issues here, and I want to make sure that I take everything into account."

National Republican Congressional Committee Deputy Communications Director Bob Salera said that by trying to impeach the President, Democrats are hurting themselves because they aren't focusing on issues other than impeachment.

"The Democrats are throwing away their majority by focusing on impeachment instead of getting things done on issues like health care and the USMCA," said Salera.

The Oklahoma Democratic Party president Alicia Andrews said Horn is doing many things outside of impeachment. She also said she supports Horn's decision to take time to deliberate.

"When the people of District five voted, they weren't voting for impeachment, they were voting for representation," said Andrews. "She's gone to DC and she's actually doing things that directly impact the lives of Oklahomans."

Andrews said Horn has been instrumental in making sure drug prices are lowered and ensuring better living conditions for military families.

Also this week, the House passed a trade agreement between the United States, Mexico and Canada. Every House member representing Oklahoma supported the trade deal. Senators Inhofe and Lankford also have spoken out in support of the USMCA.

"That's a big win for American business and certainly for agriculture, including Oklahoma agriculture," said Congressman Tom Cole (R-Okla) after the win.

Danny and Ginger Jackson, who own the business, reported they were following an older model Chevrolet truck and that the occupants had been in their office without permission.

Though they lost the truck on a back road, the couple told the dispatcher the truck driver was Henderson, a former employee.

When the couple returned to the business, they told Goines they'd received an alert on the phone that something had activated the camera in the office.

When they checked the video, they saw Henderson take something from the desk drawer.

Henderson reportedly was then seen to unlock a cabinet and remove money.

While they were driving to the business, they saw Henderson walking along the road toward his parked truck.

Henderson spotted the couple and ran to the truck where Scofield, identified as his girlfriend, was waiting.

He drove away with the Jacksons following.

According to Danny Jackson, Henderson was let go that morning.

The business had been experiencing cash losses for about two weeks, according to the affidavit.

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

> I've seen many attribute this unsettling look as simply being "bad CGI," but I'd argue that most of the visual effects revolving around digital cat fur are actually quite well done here.

> It isn't an issue of lazy, incompatant, or even rushed visual effects artists.

> No amount of extra time would make the look of these cats palatable to my eye. There's no saving it. The design of these felines at their core are simply revolting.

All of these characters occupy this odd uncanny visual space. These monstrosities don't quite look human, yet disturbingly they're too human like for comfort. It's an effect I found impossible to overcome in my mind, even over the span of nearly two hours.

Things only get worse as the film tries to make these humanoid cats appear cat size when compared to their environment.

Impeachment is not a political weapon

While history was made in the United States a couple of weeks ao, it was sadly done so as a result of hyper partisan politics and Democrats' longtime dislike of President Donald Trump.

Though Speaker Nancy Pelosi declared an impeachment inquiry in the U.S. House of Representatives was underway earlier this fall, sparks first flew the moment the president was elected and caught fire when Democrats took control of the House this Congress, setting off politically-motivated and fruitless investigations into the Trump Administration.

The Oklahoma Republican recognized parties. Party and Oklahoma Libertarian Party have notified Secretary Ziriax that they will close their primaries to Independent voters.

"This means, there is no change for unaffiliated voters in voters that state law prohibits 2020. As has been the case for the past two years, Independent voters may continue to vote in Democratic Party primaries, but not in Republican or Libertarian primaries," Ziriax said.

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





Scenes are often filled with uncomfortable closeups, much like "Good Time." So much so it can be disorienting at times. Yet the Safdie brothers have a rare talent for taking visual pandemonium and distilling it into this spellbinding intensity that I find impossible to look away from

It's like what Paul Greengrass tries to do in his movies, but here it actually works.

As for Adam Sandler, I think this might actually be my favorite role I've ever seen him in. Though to be honest, I was never much into his comedic work. So if you have a particular love for "Billy Madison" your mileage may vary.

Still, I don't mean the comment as backhanded praise. He really is quite good here. In fact, I'd say he was perfectly cast.

For Sandler's character Howard, absolutely nothing ever seems to go his way. An especially bad thing considering he's a compulsive gambler.

Just when you think something might finally be going his way for once, things somehow end up getting ten times worse.

The entire film seems like a downward spiral for Howard. One where he's trying to manage his own failing marriage, a

his jewelry store, his past gambling debts, and his insatiable desire to keep putting money that isn't his on the line.

He's a character that stresses you out just from watching his life play out. It's a kind of be nearly as courageous in the anxiety I appreciate in a movie though.

novel b y Louisa May Alcott, this film follows the lives of four sisters, Jo (Saoirse Ronan), Amy (Florence Pugh), Beth

(Eliza Scanlen), and Meg (Emma Watson), as they come of age in America in the aftermath of the Civil War. Though all very different from each other, the March sis-

ters stand by each other through difficult and changing times. I have to admit, I really didn't know much about the story of

Little Women before going into this movie. Of course I've heard the title mentioned here and there before, but it was never a tale

that interested me. That all changed when I heard Greta Gerwig, Academy Award nominated director and screenwriter for 2017's "Lady Bird," was hired by Sony Pictures to create her take on the classic book.

And the news got even better when it was announced that Oscar nominated actors Saoirse Ronan, from "Lady Bird," and Timothée Chalamet, from "Call Me by Your Name," were cast in starring roles. And not only that, but Laura Dern, Emma Watson, and Meryl Streep were thrown in for good measure.

All that sounds like a recipe for greatness, regardless of what the story's about. And luckily it turned out it was.

The story here covers two seperate, yet pivotal points in these young women's lives, and the film periodically cuts both periods throughout.

Pre-adulthood, when the March sisters are still living at home, and a few years later with the March sisters trying their hardest to make their fledgling childhood dreams come true, all to varying results.

This method of storytelling can be a little disorientating at times. Sometimes it took me a moment to figure out which period of the story I was watching.

But the filmmakers used this style of editing to their advantage, and it certainly made a couple key moments near the end of the movie land with more impact. Of course the stars of the

show here are our four leading ladies. Each of them has this wonderful genuine air about them. It's impossible not to find them somewhat relatable in one way or another.

I absolutely loved it when the four of them were together under the same roof.

They have this wonderful

chaotic chemistry together. When they're talking, their very matter-of-fact period dialogue comes flying at you a mile a minute. It's like a whirlwind

wherever they go.

But the thing I found most genuine is the way they thought about themselves, and each other, later on in life.

They're all so disappointed in their own lives, and funnily enough they have an inferiority complex to one another. Each of them think they're a failure compared to their seemingly more talented and successful

As someone with an older brother and two sisters of their own, it's a feeling I find incredibly relatable.

Overall, I liked this film quite a bit.

I don't think I loved it as much as I anticipated considering the pedigree of the cast and crew, but not because of any glaring flaw I can pin down. I think it just might be a genre I have more difficulty enjoying

I could see some being put off by the flowery 19th century inspired dialogue, and the editing style may leave a few audiences confused for a second or two, but I would hardly call either aspect detrimental to the enjoyment of watching this movie.

If you love Little Women this is an adaptation of the story I can recommend without reservation.

there was quite a bit of effort in how every scene was frame. Not just the action, but also in the more emotional character moments too.


Even though the story here is pretty cliche, and you can see most pivotal scenes coming a mile away, I have to give credit where credit's due.





payment systems," Sherman

McClain Bank has safeguards in place to protect customers from debit card fraud.

"We have dollar limits on all of our cards," Sherman confirmed. "We utilize a fraud unit that monitors debit card activity 24/7 and notifies our customers when warranted.

"We also have regular audits to test our systems," Sherman continued. "We are proactive to reissue cards to prevent fraud and to minimize losses."

In the issue of December 26, the bank executive said all affected customers were notified.

"No one lost any money and this was not a data breach," Sherman said. "Unfortunately, there were some erroneous and untruthful social media posts about the situation.

"So the bank made a simple and clear statement on social media and television media picked up on the post and made a story of it. With our safeguards in place, we had already contacted our customers."


By the time television picked up the story without contacting any McClain Bank officer, the situation was already resolved.

"We appreciate our loyal customers and the opportunity to serve them," Sherman concluded.

Happy New Year from all of us at Dale K. Graham Veterans Foundation!

As we approach the end of another year, I am happy to tell you our Foundation is growing more than I could have ever imagined. Currently, we are assisting 150 veterans and family members each Tuesday and Thursday morning in Norman.

We have leased the building next door to enable us to add more volunteers which will in turn increase the number of people we serve each day we are open.

We have been approved by the Board of Veterans Appeals to host video/conference hearings at our Norman location with the BVA judges in Washington, D.C. for the men and women we represent. Previously, we were driving to the Regional VA Office in Muskogee, Oklahoma (6 hour round-trip) or to the Oklahoma City Vet Center. This approval truly makes a difference and saves us and our veterans time and money.

In 2019, over 1,300 of our veterans have been approved for 100 percent disability rating. Our foundation has helped over 25,000 veterans and their family members apply for benefits throughout the years. We set a goal in early 2019 to have 1,200 approved and we surpassed that goal!

We have partnered with Navy Federal Credit Union, Tinker Federal Credit Union, counselors from the Oklahoma City and Lawton Vet Centers, and Legal Aid to ensure each veteran receives the assistance they need. Personnel from these organizations are available each Tuesday and Thursday morning.

We have veterans traveling to see us from 49 U.S. States and six other countries. The veterans who have traveled the longest distance this year were from Kenya, Africa, and Beijing, China. It is amazing how far word of mouth about our organization reaches. We have never paid for advertisement of our services, because as you know we are free to all and do not ever charge for what we do.

The following changes are happening soon:

Some Blue Water Veterans' service-connected disabilities presumptive to Agent Orange exposure should be approved starting January 2020. This is going to affect tens of thousands of veterans who were previously denied benefits. If you or someone you know is a Blue Water Veteran and have previously been denied, please come see us as soon as possible. Surviving spouses are encouraged to return to us to follow up on possible benefits, too.

The Department of Veterans Affairs has prioritized the Appeals Program from the old Legacy Appeals to a modern system. They are currently working to reduce the backlog of veterans appeals (Notice of Disagreement).



They are desperate to escape the place that was once home but can be no longer. Violence has shattered their lives. They are marked by their tribe, their language, their social class, and their poverty.

Or consider the family that is crammed into a truck or car with far too many miles on it. His job has relocated to somewhere else. So they're on the move to find work and maybe settle into the life every parent wants for their children.

Perhaps the "journey" is traveled not along a rocky road but within a broken heart - trying to find one's way as a single parent after a spouse's death or divorce, taking on a world difficult enough for a couple let alone a single woman or man. The journey is a painful juggling of emotions and practicalities in the course of a night that seems will never see the dawn.

The emotion that carries all displaced peoples along on this dangerous journey is hope. It is hope for someplace safe to
