

In corporate limits of Purcell masks are now requested



Purcell's City Council voted unanimously Monday night to request mask wearing in the corporate limits of Purcell in an effort to battle the spread of COVID-19.

It was a special called joint meeting between the council and the Purcell Public Works Authority at the community room at city hall where the council passed the resolution calling for the wearing of masks.

The move comes as the seven day rolling average of new cases in Oklahoma is over 3,000.

To date there have been 903 confirmed cases in Purcell with nine deaths.



The council, in the resolution, said that wearing masks and social distancing helps slow the spread.

They mentioned that Purcell Municipal Hospital and others in the metro are at or near capacity and that Purcell Schools have been in virtual learning.

They also mentioned in the resolution that if you are experiencing any symptoms to stay at home.

In other business the council accepted the low bid of Elite Towers of \$249,100 for the rehabilitation of the Red Hill storage facility and accepted the low bid by D. Owen of \$409,089.10 for the final grading and detention to serve the new hospital.

Safety is the name of the game when dealing with chain saws

This is time of year many people are using chain saws for various tasks, such as cutting firewood, Christmas trees or cleaning up downed limbs from the recent ice storm. With all of these tasks, the need to insure you are safely using your chain saw is of the utmost importance.

To prepare yourself, carefully study the operator's

manual so that you're thoroughly familiar with all aspects of safe operational procedures. Before you operate a particular saw for the first time - and periodically thereafter - you should carefully review the owner's manual.

New saws come with a manual, but if lost, a copy can be obtained from the manufacturer. Manuals offer proper operating procedures as well as detailed information about

recommended maintenance practices to keep the saw running smoothly and safely.

Once the operator has honed their knowledge of the saw, the chain itself needs to be sharpened. When the chain is dull, you increase the effort needed to cut through a piece of wood. At the same time, you increase the possibility of injury to yourself and damage to the saw.

Sharpening instructions are typically outlined in the operating manual and is a relatively easy task. However, the recommended filing and depth guides are essential to assure the proper angle on the cutters and cutting depth for maximum cutting efficiency.

Whenever a chain is being sharpened, gloves should be worn, or a rag placed over the chain to protect hands from the sharpened cutters.

A sharp chain is only effective if there is proper chain tension and lubrication. Chain tension should be adjusted to ensure quick, smooth cutting action. Too loose a chain will derail, too tight a chain will bind.

A cold chain should be tightened to where the chain hangs about 1/32 of an inch away from the bar rails at the center of the bar span. Warm chains should be adjusted to about a 1/8 inch gap.

While the saw is in use, be sure to pump the oiler frequently to prolong the life of the chain. Periodically stopping the engine and pumping the oiler while pulling the saw chain around by hand will provide a good, even oiling of the chain. However, the motor needs to be turned off and the spark plug wire disconnected for this process.

Chain saws with automatic chain oilers may need an extra squirt occasionally for

proper lubrication. Many new saws do not have a manual oiler, so making sure the oiling port is functioning so that the oil is reaching the chain is recommended. The presence of smoke while the chain is operating is a good indication of lack of oil, and perhaps a dull chain.

Fashion also plays a role in safe use of chain saws. A hard hat should be worn, along with safety goggles or eye glasses, ear muffs or ear plugs, lightweight gloves, work boots or shoes and fitted clothing. Clothing should not hang loosely from the body as they might become tangled in the saw. Also, the use of nylon mesh protective leg chaps or kneepads can help protect the operator's legs.

Back-up tools such as an ax, sledgehammer, wedges, sharpening file, screwdriver and wrench for throttle and chain adjustments, as well as chain oil, a funnel and plenty of fuel should be kept handy. Readily available shovels and a fire extinguisher should also be considered. With the proper safety gear, back-up materials and a prepared saw, the operator is ready to begin cutting.

The saw should be started in an open, level surface as close to the work area as possible. Holding the saw firmly against the ground with one hand on the front handle and the inside of one knee on the rear handle, pull the starter rope briskly to give the engine a rapid spin.

Don't yank the cord out to the very end; this could damage the starter mechanism. Also, hold the grip and let the starter cord rewind evenly instead of letting it snap back. When carrying the saw, the chain should be in the rear with the muffler away from the operator's body.

When operating the saw, maintaining balance is a must. A chain saw is not forgiving when mistakes are made by its operator. A solid grip with both hands, making sure fingers and thumbs completely encircle the handle, will allow for greater control. Cut with the lower side of the saw as much as possible, this is the safest and least tiring position.

Cuts should be made with the wood near the middle of the saw. With elbows and knees slightly flexed, the saw should be operated at the side of your body so that it will not swing into your body if it suddenly kicks back. Kickback results when the saw jumps toward the operator after hitting a solid object with the front of the saw. The engine torque is transferred to the guide bar, which causes the saw to rotate in a rapid motion.

Kickback is the most dangerous of all chain saw hazards. The most common cause of kickback is that small, hid-

den limb that catches the upper quadrant of the bar nose. There are several scenarios that will cause kickback. However, the force will be increased by a dull chain, chain tension that is too loose and blind-cutting or boring with the bar nose.

Kickback is responsible for about a third of the serious injuries that occur each year with chain saws. Avoiding kickback should be a major concern of all chain saw operators.

Once the cutting is complete, there are some recommended steps to proper storage of the saw, beginning

with stopping the engine and draining the fuel tank in a safe area. Then, the engine should be restarted and run at idle to remove the remaining gas from the engine. The chain can then be removed and stored in a container of oil and the spark plug wire should also be disconnected to reduce the possibility of accidental starting.

Following these procedures allows those with tree and limb damage to clear their property back of debris in a relatively safe manner. However, even with cautious operation, the threat of injury or death still exists.

§ 106-405 Junk Vehicle on Private Property Prohibited.

No person in charge or control of any property within the city, whether as owner, tenant, occupant, lessee, or otherwise, shall allow any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked, junked, or unlicensed vehicle to remain on such property longer than seven days and no person shall leave any such vehicle on any property within the city for a longer time than seven days.

This section shall not apply with regard to a vehicle in an enclosed building, a vehicle on the premises of a business enterprise operated in a lawful place and manner when necessary to the operation of such business enterprise, or a vehicle in an appropriate storage place or depository maintained in a lawful place and manner by the city.

Jessica Garvin takes oath of office, begins first Senate term

Jessica Garvin is now officially on the job as the State Senator for District 43.

The Duncan Republican was sworn in by Oklahoma State Supreme Court Chief Justice Noma Gurich during a socially distanced ceremony at the Capitol on Tuesday.

"I am extremely grateful to the citizens of District 43 for entrusting me to be their voice in the Senate and am anxious to get to work," Garvin said. "Our state is no stranger to adversity, but this year has proven especially difficult for Oklahomans, the business community and our schools.

"The pandemic, along with lower energy prices, have us facing an estimated \$1 billion revenue hole compared to the current budget year, and we must also fund the voter-approved Medicaid expansion that could cost upwards of \$250 million a year. We must focus on issues that strengthen our economy and create jobs and much-needed revenue. I invite citizens of this district to help me work to make our great state even better," she said.

Garvin was among four senators who took the oath of office this week while other members of the Senate were sworn in last month. Garvin was unable to attend the original swearing in ceremony due to having COVID-19.

She was joined Tuesday by her husband of 11 years, Stephen, and their children, Brooks, Kollins and Tress, as well as a few close friends and family members.

Garvin will serve on the Business, Commerce and Tourism, Health and Human Services, Rules and Transportation Committees as well as the Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services.

Born in Marshall, Minn., her family moved to Oklahoma when she was around four. Garvin later attended the University of Oklahoma, obtaining a bachelor's degree in Communications with a minor in Psychology.

She is a licensed nursing home administrator and a licensed assisted living administrator. She is the co-owner and executive vice president of Bison Health Management.

In addition to serving in the Senate, Garvin will remain serving senior adults in Marlow as a nursing home and assisted living administrator.

"Oklahoma is in the middle of a health crisis that started long before the pandemic," Garvin said. "Our health care system is in disarray and we are facing a dangerous shortage of physicians and nurses statewide, but especially in rural Oklahoma.

"We also need to better address mental health and sub-

stance abuse problems, which are destroying Oklahoma families and costing the state millions each year. I'm looking forward to utilizing my healthcare experience to help address these issues in the state legislature," she concluded.

Garvin serves as vice president of the Marlow Lion's Club International and has served as a board member of the United Way of Stephens County. She previously served as community liaison for the Beautiful Day Foundation and is a member of the Chambers of Commerce for Lindsay, Duncan and Newcastle.

Garvin has also served as a committee member of the Career Pathways Program with the Duncan Area Economic Development Foundation, is a current member of Sigma Nu Women's Sorority, and has been active with Pathways to a Healthier You through Duncan Regional Hospital.

Additionally, she serves as a volunteer healthcare consultant with Duncan Community Residence and volunteers to help coach elementary through high school cheerleaders and dancers in local public school systems.

The Senate will convene for an Organizational Day on Tuesday, January 5, and session will begin on Monday, February 1.

Hallmark movies

No matter how many television channels we seem to acquire there still never seems to be anything all that great to watch.

And now for us DISH users channel 4 is off the air, further limiting what news outlets we can watch.

Even though the endings and plots are all the same, Gracie and I seem to watch Hallmark movies a great deal of the time.

A little Hallmark research turned up this:

Speaking with CNBC in 2019, Pamela Rutledge, behavioral scientist, director of the Media Psychology Research Center, and a faculty member in the Media Psychology department at Fielding Graduate University, explained that the formulaic plots and predict-

ability of the films is rewarding, especially when viewers are trying to unwind from the stress of the holiday season.

“The lack of reality at all levels, from plot to production, signals that the movies are meant to be escapism entertainment,” Rutledge said.

“The genre is well-defined, and our expectations follow. This enables us to suspend

A vaccine in record time

When this year began, none of us expected to face a global pandemic that would steal hundreds of thousands of American lives, inflict unprecedented damage on our economy, disrupt business as usual and uproot life as we know it.

But although the United States certainly did not create the coronavirus crisis, our country has led in the mission to eliminate the virus and restore our way of life by seeking to deliver a vaccine in record time.

As we celebrate Christmas this week and look toward 2021, I am grateful that vaccines are already beginning to reach frontline healthcare workers and the most vulnerable in our communities, providing hope for better days ahead.

I urge you not to miss how remarkable this achievement is for our country and for humanity. Historically, delivery of a vaccine has never been completed in less than a year.

In fact, while the fastest a vaccine has been discovered and deployed is four years, the vaccine development process

usually takes as long as 10-15 years. But thanks to Operation Warp Speed (OWS), two vaccines are now ready to aid in the fight against COVID-19, with more likely to be approved for emergency use in the coming days and months.

As you might know, OWS was initiated by the Trump Administration in mid-May and established a public-private partnership between relevant federal agencies—including the Department of Health and Human Services and Department of Defense—and pharmaceutical companies.

Since it was created, OWS has not only supported some of the scientific vaccine research but it has enabled more rapid development and testing of vaccine candidates. This accelerated timeline is not from cutting corners or sacrificing safety. It is made possible by smart adaptations to the usual process.

Notably, OWS has allowed promising vaccine candidates to undergo clinical trials at essentially the same time as regulatory approval and preparation for mass production. Moreover, OWS has led to the

pre-purchase of hundreds of millions of doses. That means that once a vaccine candidate is deemed safe and effective and approved for emergency use, it can be distributed almost immediately.

Indeed, we have already begun to see this rapid distribution happen with the vaccine developed by Pfizer and BioNTech and with Moderna’s soon to follow. Because the federal government pre-purchased hundreds of millions of vaccine doses months ago, manufacturing could take place at the same time as clinical trials.

Since the testing and manufacturing steps in the process were simultaneous, that enabled the Pfizer/BioNTech vaccines to start shipping out immediately after receiving emergency use authorization (EUA) from the Food and Drug Administration (FDA).

The first doses arrived in Oklahoma just a few days later and reached Lawton’s own Comanche County Memorial Hospital, where the ultra-cold freezer necessary is available

It's nice to see Dreamworks getting back into the business of making movies on a regular basis.

For a while there it seemed like everything at Dreamworks was either on hold or in limbo. But I guess that's to be expected with a big company shakeup, as I'm sure happened after NBCUniversal acquired the animation studio back in 2016.

Even sure fire successes, like the final "How to Train Your Dragon" movie, ended up being pushed back year after year, until there was nearly a five year gap between the release of the second and third film of the series.

And our Cro-Magnon clan, the Croods, had it even worse. Their original film came out all the way back in 2013, and Dreamworks is just now releasing a sequel. That's a surprisingly sizable seven year gap.

With so much time in between movies, it can be difficult to get audiences interested in coming back for more. This is especially the case of a kids movie, where a good portion of your target audience has become teenagers in the time it took to release a follow-up.

And maybe I'm just out of touch, but I don't remember "The Croods" leaving that much of a cultural impact, unlike many of Dreamwork's other properties, like "Shrek," or even "Trolls."

Perhaps it's just because I only watched the first movie recently. I don't know.

After hearing basically nothing about "The Croods" over the past seven years, I was pleasantly surprised by how much I enjoyed it though.

The narrative may have been a little too conventional for my taste, and the comedy may have been a bit of a mixed bag, but the animation was great and the voice cast was dang near perfect.

And fortunately for fans of the first film, few though there may be, "The Croods: A New Age" is very much more of the same. Actually, to be honest, I think I enjoyed the sequel even more than the original.

All the characters from the first film are back of course.

You have Nicolas Cage as the cave family's overprotective patriarch. Emma Stone as Eep, the eldest child of the family. She's romantically involved with Guy, played by Ryan Reynolds.

Beyond that there's Ugga (Catherine Keener), the sensible yet still slightly brutish mother, Thunk (Clark Duke), their knucklehead son, Ugga's insane mother Gran (Cloris Leachman), and Sandy the baby, who's more a wild animal than an actual character.

In this film they run into another family called the Bettermans, which consist of Phil (Peter Dinklage), Hope (Leslie Mann), and their daughter Dawn (Kelly Marie Tran).

Basically, the Bettermans are a modern day family, living a more agrarian lifestyle. This is, of course, in stark contrast to the hunter-gather ways of the Croods.

This leads to a lot of tension between the families, since the Croods aren't accustomed to concepts like sleeping separately or bathing. Then there's also the fact that Phil and Hope want to set their daughter up with Guy even though he's already in a relationship with Eep.

You might think this would lead to some kind of awkward love triangle between Eep, Guy, and Dawn. I was worried the movie would go down this path as well. Mostly because I hate love triangles.

I think they're overused, frustrating, and it's just flat out annoying to see characters you like tear each other apart over petty romantic nonsense.

Fortunately for me, this film avoids the love triangle trap all together with one simple trick. Dawn isn't interested in Guy

romantically, or really anyone for that matter.

Instead, Dawn and Eep end up bonding as good friends, with Eep helping Dawn to break out of her shell and giving her a taste of the outside world.

Frankly, it's refreshing to see a story like this, where the girls aren't pitted against each other over some guy.

My favorite parts of the movie were just watching Eep and Dawn's unbridled eagerness whenever the two of them are together.

Their enthusiasm is infectious, which is thanks in no small part to the voice talent behind these two young women.

Emma and Kelly seemed like they're having so much fun with these characters. They just don't hold anything back, to the point where they almost sounded sarcastic. This might not have worked well with a more serious movie, but it's a silly animated film about cave people. Let them go nuts I say.

It's the same pretty much all the other characters too, especially Nicolas Cage, who couldn't have been better casted as Grug.

Honestly, I think it's a travesty that Cage hasn't found his way in more animated roles over the years. His innate intensity meshes ridiculously well with a cartoon character and I'm so glad he was able to voice Grug once again.

That's what I enjoyed so much about the first film, and why I like this movie even more. The voice actors just sound like they're having the time of their lives with these characters.

Of course a large part of why the performances here work so well is the animation itself.

One of my bigger complaints about other animated films more recently has been with lackluster facial animation. For example, "Over the Moon" from earlier this year.

These more inexperienced animation outfits may be able to create scenes with beautiful backdrops and stunning scenery, but when it comes to faces, the soul of the characters they're creating, their efforts simply fall short.

Not here though.

The faces of the Croods and the Bettermans are just as animated and lively as the voices of their real life counterparts sound.

And the fantastic animation doesn't stop with the human characters.

The locations and the creatures which inhabit this incredibly colorful vision of the prehistoric era are just flat out gorgeous, not to mention incredibly imaginative.

Don't come looking to this film for historical or evolutionary accuracy. The animals here are wild combinations which seem concocted from a fever dream. Again, this is a silly cartoon about cave people, so I'm not going to complain about the wild creature design.

What I might complain about though is the story and the comedy.

Listen, it's not a terrible narrative, but much like the first film, it treads a lot of familiar ground.

It may avoid some annoying pitfalls, like a dang love triangle, but it still doesn't stray far from what you might expect from a story about two vastly different families learning to get along.

Plus, there isn't really any depth like you might expect from a similar animated movie from Disney or Pixar.

The humor here is also a bit of a mixed bag, much like the first film.

A good portion of the jokes revolve around the characters solving or doing things that may make sense in a modern day context, but are flat out silly coming from cave people.

For instance, Thunk discovers a window inside the Betterman's home and becomes obsessed with watching "window" like

someone might be addicted to watching TV. That's the entire joke, and it's basically all his character does the entire film. That bit of comedy got run into the ground pretty quickly.

That isn't to say there aren't a few laugh-out-loud moments sprinkled throughout the film, but those bits of comedy come less from the writing and more from the performances of the actors themselves.

I don't want to be too negative here, because I really did have a genuinely fun time watching this movie.

There's a lot here to love for animation lovers young and old.

The writing may fall a little short, but the characters, the animation, and especially the voice acting are enough to earn this film a solid recommendation. As far as kids movies go this year, this is certainly one of the better ones.

The other movie this week is "Greenland."

John Garrity (Gerard Butler), his estranged wife (Morena Baccarin), and their young son (Roger Dale Floyd) embark on a perilous journey to find sanctuary as a planet-killing comet hurtles toward Earth.

Amid terrifying accounts of cities getting leveled, the Garrity's experience the best and worst in humanity all while the countdown to the global apocalypse approaches zero.

Ah, the disaster movie.

It seemed like during the late 90s and early 2000s that there was a new movie featuring an impending apocalypse released every few months.

Heck, Roland Emmerich practically made a career of it, producing films such as "Independence Day," "The Day After Tomorrow," and of course his most recent movie to destroy the earth, "2012."

And who could forget the films about an impending planet-annihilating comet or asteroid like "Deep Impact" or Michael Bay's "Armageddon."

It's an odd fascination people have, wanting to see what the end of the world might look like. It's a curiosity I share with many.

Most of the time though, these disaster films are just as much about showing humanity's response to the incoming cataclysm as they are about seeing the catastrophe itself unfold.

In fact, a lot of the time, the greatest obstacle for our main characters isn't the impending disaster itself, but other people fighting for their own survival.

This is more where "Greenland" focuses. And refreshingly, its portrayal of humanity as a whole is actually what sets the film apart the most.

The people the Garrity family face along their journey for survival are, for the large part, morally good.

Yes, there are a few notable exceptions. Some here do act in selfish desperation.

But when push comes to shove, the people in this film do what they can to help each other. Even while facing the unavoidable end of everything they know and love.

Perhaps it's unrealistic, and maybe it's naive of me to think that people would actually behave so selflessly during such dire circumstances. But it is how I wish humanity would act. It's definitely how I hope I would act when looking upon my own impending mortality.

As far as the narrative in this film goes, it is nice to see a disaster movie that has a more narrow focus.

Instead of 30 different main characters, like a Roland Emmerich film, this film has three.

Three perspectives at most. And none of these characters are involved in predicting Armageddon, or even trying to solve it. They're just trying to live through it.

I also like that there's less of a focus on watching famous landmarks being destroyed in this film.

Sure, you see some here and there, especially at the end. But mostly what we see is what our three main characters are capable of experiencing.

We see news reports, some video recordings, and feel the shockwaves of some far away explosions, but the film never dwells on the destruction.

In that way, the movie ends up feeling a bit more realistic. It's like we're watching the end of the world from a ground level perspective.

Now of course this is still a disaster movie. The story here plays out in much the same way as you might expect, with plenty of silliness and over dramatic moments along the way.

And sadly, the story does also suffer a little bit in the film's latter half.

Towards the end, John's father-in-law (Scott Glenn) shows up with very little introduction, yet the movie tries to focus many of its most emotional moments surrounding his character.

It's strange. It almost feels like there was originally supposed to be more scenes early featuring the father-in-law, but for whatever reason they didn't make the final cut.

The narrative acts like Glenn's character was supposed to be the emotional core of the film. Like John was striving for his father-in-law's approval the whole time, but the audience isn't shown a hint of this relationship until the film is almost over.

Because of that, the scenes with the father-in-law just completely fall flat. Honestly, if the movie couldn't dedicate more time to his character, I think the story would have been better off with Glenn's role removed entirely.

It's a shame, because beyond that one notable failing, "Greenland" is a surprisingly solid movie going experience.

Heck, it's probably Gerry Butler's best live action role in over a decade.

Bottomline, if you're looking for a disaster movie with non-stop wanton destruction, you're probably better off putting on something like Roland Emmerich's "2012."

But if you're interested in something a bit more grounded, a bit more low-key, at least as far as movies featuring an apocalypse go, then I'd say this movie is definitely worth a rental. Just wait a few months for the price to drop a little.

Busy time of year in Legislature

What a surreal and humbling experience it is to walk the hallowed halls of our magnificent state Capitol. I want to thank you all again for the incredible privilege to serve as your voice in the Oklahoma Senate.

The past month has been a whirlwind, as our freshmen class had to hit the ground running as soon as we were sworn in as senators. This is a busy time of year in the legislative process; we had to submit our bill requests by December 11.

I submitted 18 requests, but more work has to be completed before I can file these requests. I have been working with Senate staff as we research the issues, and I have until Thursday, January 21 to decide what bills I want to continue working on and file.

Several of the issues I look forward to tackling this session are relating to various disciplines in the healthcare industry. Some of these requests are for bills that other legislators have worked on in the past but felt like I would be able to "speak the language" better, due to my diverse background in healthcare systems.

Additionally, I have a few bills relating to improving small business operations and voter laws, to name a few. I

am looking forward to using my professional experience to help improve the lives of Oklahomans.

We also recently received our committee assignments. My committees include Health and Human Services, Transportation, Rules, Business, Commerce and Tourism, and the Appropriations Subcommittee on Health and Human Services.

This subcommittee is responsible for overseeing and determining the budgets for 12 state agencies including the Departments of Health, Human Services, Veterans Affairs and Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

One of the biggest issues, we'll be working on is figuring out how to fund the Medicaid expansion that was approved by voters this summer. The state question expanded Sooner Care to an additional 200,000 Oklahomans starting next year.

The expansion has an estimated annual cost to the state of between \$165 million to \$247 million. The federal government will cover the remaining expense of this massive expansion.

Besides the budget, the

Winter care for houseplants

Holidays are filled with new plants and decorations that often find our houseplants relegated to any out of the way available space. Be sure to keep your houseplants looking their best with proper winter care.

Make sure houseplants receive sufficient light now and throughout the winter. The shorter, often gray days of winter mean less light reaches our plants.

Start by moving plants to the sunniest available window. A south-facing window is usually best, but if it is obstructed by trees, awnings or shears it may be no better than an unobstructed window facing another direction.

If brightly lit locations are limited in your home, try rotating plants between high and low light areas. Switching plants every few weeks usually keeps them growing healthy.

Give the pots a turn every few weeks to ensure each side of the plant has time facing the light. This encourages even growth and discourages stems stretching toward the light.

Consider supplementing natural light with artificial light when light is limited. Newer styles that clip onto pots, are mounted on the wall, or tucked into furniture grade stands make them attractive and easier to use. And now LED plant lights are more affordable, longer lasting and use less energy.

Humidity is the other winter stress. Many of our houseplants are tropical and require higher humidity than our homes provide. As we turn up the heat, the humidity declines.

Boost the humidity around your plants by displaying them together. As one plant loses moisture, the others will benefit.

Add a gravel tray for additional humidity.

Fill a tray or saucer with pebbles and water. Then set the plant on the pebbles elevated above the water. As the water evaporates, it increases humidity around the plant.

Adjust your watering schedule to fit the conditions in your home. Always water thoroughly but only as needed. Use your finger to check the soil moisture below the soil surface. Water moisture-loving plants, like Moon Valley Pilea, when the top few inches are barely moist.

Allow the top few inches of soil to dry for cacti and succulents. And always pour off excess water that collects in the saucer. Or use gravel trays to capture the excess water, eliminating this task.

Most houseplants do fine in the same temperatures we prefer. They do not tolerate drafts of hot air from heat vents or cold air from windows and doors. Move plants as needed to avoid drafty locations.

Never trap houseplants between the curtain or blinds and the window. The temperature can be significantly colder, resulting in injury and even death of some plants. Place plants on a table near the window or windowsill extension, leaving room to close the window coverings at night.

Wait until spring to fertilize. Plants do not need as many nutrients when their growth is limited by less-than-ideal winter conditions.

As the outdoor growing conditions improve with longer days and brighter light, so do those indoors.

You will be rewarded with healthier, more attractive plants when giving them the care they need this winter. And as you tend your indoor garden, you will help fight the winter blues.

Roe receives COVID-19 vaccine

State Rep. Cynthia Roe today received the first dose of Moderna's COVID-19 vaccine December 22.

Roe received the vaccine through her duties as a nurse practitioner in Pauls Valley, a role she has continually held while also serving as state representative for House District 42.

"I received my first dose of the Moderna COVID-19 vaccine today," Roe said. "With the uncertainty of this virus and not knowing how long I will have antibodies from my previous infection, after much discussion with some of my physician peers, including an infectious disease specialist, I decided it was in the best

interest of the people I care for in the healthcare arena to be protected further. That is the basis of my decision for taking the vaccine."

She tested positive for COVID-19 in late June. Roe has 37 years of nursing experience and serves as vice-chair of the House Public Health Committee.

The first doses of the COVID-19 vaccine are reserved for frontline healthcare professionals and nursing home staff and residents. Doses will be available to government officials and the general public at a later date. A timeline of Oklahoma Health Department's vaccine distribution plan is available here.

Voter registration Application deadline January 15

January 15 will be the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the February 9 Board of Education Primary in Dibble and Newcastle.

McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said persons who are United States citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 18 years old may apply to become registered voters.

Those who aren't registered or need to change their registration may apply by filling out and mailing an Oklahoma Voter Registration Application form in time for it to be post-marked no later than midnight January 15.

Haley said applications post-marked after that time will be accepted and processed, but not until after February 9.

The County Election Board

responds in writing to every person who submits an application for voter registration. The response is either a voter identification card listing the new voter's precinct number and polling place location or a letter explaining the reason(s) the application for voter registration was not approved.

Haley said any person who has submitted a voter registration application and who has not received a response within 30 days should contact the County Election Board office.

Oklahoma Voter Registration Application forms are available at the County Election Board office located in the McClain County Courthouse and at most post offices, tag agencies and public libraries in the county.

legislature is also constitutionally required to redraw district lines for state legislative and congressional districts based on the population results of the 2020 Census. A bipartisan committee of House and Senate members has been appointed and are holding public town hall meetings throughout the state.

I was able to attend the town hall in Chickasha last week and was excited to see so many Oklahomans participating in the process of redistricting. It's important to have public input in this process as it impacts how Oklahomans are represented at the state and federal levels.

on Tuesday, January 5, to officially vote on our leadership team, approve the rules for the 58th Legislature and take care of some other office matters.



A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PURCELL ("PURCELL") CONCERNING THE WEARING OF MASKS WITHIN THE CORPORATE LIMITS OF PURCELL

WHEREAS, it is readily apparent that COVID-19 cases are increasing in our community, state, and nation; and

WHEREAS, the wearing of masks has shown to slow the rate of infection; and

WHEREAS, hospitals are not able to take new patients due to overloads caused by the Covid-19 Pandemic, including Purcell Municipal Hospital which is near capacity limits; and

WHEREAS, Purcell Public Schools is struggling to find ways to have in classroom attendance and has been conducting school by virtual learning only since mid-November; and

WHEREAS, wearing masks, social distancing, and sanitizing could potentially save others from a difficult illness and maybe the life of a loved one; and

WHEREAS, if we as a community do not do something, we may find ourselves being shut down or greatly impacted by state or federal order due to the pandemic overloading our systems.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PURCELL AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Purcell City Council requests every visitor to the City, and every resident of the City, to wear a mask when social distancing is not feasible, and if indoors,

Select the right tool for the pruning task

By Melinda Myers

Deadheading, trimming, and pruning are part of growing and maintaining a beautiful and productive garden and landscape. Make sure you are outfitted with the right tool for the job. Matching the tool to the pruning task will help ensure a proper cut, reduce hand fatigue, and allow you to work longer.

Since most pruning cuts in the garden and landscape are between 1/4" and 3/4", a bypass hand pruner is a must. These pruners have two sharp blades like scissors, making a clean cut that closes quickly. This helps reduce the risk of insects and disease moving in and harming your plants.

Avoid hand-held pruners that are too heavy or open too wide for your hand size. Those with a spring action return help reduce hand fatigue as long as the opening matches the size of your hand.

Make sure the pruner does not open wider than your hand can easily grip. Select a tool that fits in your hand, is comfortable, has an ergonomic grip and is easy to control.

Matching your pruner to your hand size is as important as matching it to the cutting job. Opting for an oversized pruner to make larger cuts can lead to hand fatigue, frustration, and improper cuts. Measure the width across the palm of your hand at the base of your fingers. Next, measure the height from the middle of the base of your hand to the tip of your middle finger.

A pruner rated for 1/2" cuts is a good match for those with small hands less than 3 1/2" wide and 6 1/4" high. If your hands measure 3 1/2 to 4" wide and 6 1/2 to 8" high, you may want to purchase a 3/4" pruner. Those with larger hands should do fine with a 1" hand-held pruner.

But size is one factor to con-

sider. Hand strength also influences the diameter of the stems you will be able to cut. Just because a tool is rated for 3/4" doesn't mean everyone will be able to apply the needed pressure to make such a large cut.

Invest in tools with compound levers or ratchets when you need a mechanical advantage to make cutting easier.

When the job is too big for you or the tool, select one better suited to the task. Employ a bypass lopper like Corona Tool's ComfortGel SL 3164D with tactile handles.

Loppers have long handles that give you greater leverage and extend your reach. This extra reach makes it easier to prune all parts of small trees, shrubs, and roses.

Invest in a foldable pruning RazorTOOTH Saw (coronatoolsusa.com) with a pull stroke cutting action and ergonomic handle. You'll be able to make cuts fast and easy and

minimize hand fatigue. Foldable saws allow you to tuck the blade into the handle for safekeeping and reduce storage space.

Saws are useful tools for cutting larger branches on trees and shrubs that you can safely prune. Although I am a certified arborist, I only prune small trees and shrubs.

I save big tree work for my colleagues that climb, have the equipment and training to do the job safely.

Winter care for tree, shrubs and perennials in containers

As you prepare your landscape for winter don't overlook the trees, shrubs and perennials you have growing in containers. These need extra protection to help them survive winter temperatures.

The small amount of soil in container gardens does not always provide sufficient insulation. The roots are more exposed to temperature extremes.

Extremely cold temperatures can damage or kill the roots and even the plant.

Plants rated at least one zone hardier than your zone can usually survive when left outside for winter. Just make sure your containers will also tolerate the challenging winter weather.

Here are a couple strategies for helping your other containers through the winter. Select the one that best fits your landscape space and gardening style.

Those in apartments or with limited space may need help from their gardening friends.

Move containers to a sheltered location. Place them close together for added insulation. Then surround this with annual pots of flowers and vegetables to further insulate the roots. Wait until spring to empty and compost the annual plants.

Or cover the pots with woodchips or surround them with bags of leaves, potting mix or bales of straw. Add another layer of insulation by piling snow that is free of deicing salt over the pots throughout the winter.

Any plants growing in nursery pots or plastic containers can be overwintered in a vacant section of the garden. Sink the pots in the

ground and make sure the pot is covered and surrounded by soil. Water if needed.

Then lift the plants in spring and set them in a decorative container to enjoy throughout the growing season.

An unheated garage also provides a suitable location for overwintering container gardens. Heated garages are usually too warm and plants will begin to grow. With a lack of sufficient sunlight, they usually struggle through the winter and often die.

Place the plants away from the overhead garage door and add a bit of insulation. This protects the roots when the temperatures plummet.

Water your stored containers whenever the soil is thawed and dry. A scoop of snow that is free of deicing salt works well. Just toss a scoop on each pot. When the temperatures rise the snow melts and waters the pots.

Dry soil during a winter thaw is the usual cause of death when pots are stored this way.

If space allows, you may decide to plant those trees, shrubs and perennials growing in containers into the garden each fall.

You will eliminate this overwintering task and have a great excuse for buying new plants next spring.

Conley to lead nationwide trauma-informed legislative committee

State Rep. Sherrie Conley recently was selected to co-chair a nationwide bipartisan committee for trauma-informed legislators. House Speaker Charles McCall made the announcement.

The committee of trauma-informed legislators is one of the proposed initiatives of the Campaign for Trauma-Informed Policy and Practice (CTIPP), a national trauma-informed advocacy organization. The purpose of creating the committee is to promote state trauma-informed legislation.

Conley, a Republican, has been invited to co-chair alongside New York Assemblyman Andrew Hevesi, a Democrat. Both lawmakers served as co-panelists last week during the National Conference of State Legislatures webinar on Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACEs). A spokesman for CTIPP said having Republican and Democrat co-chairs makes it clear this is a bipartisan committee.

"Rep. Conley has devoted much of her career to helping students and families over-

come the effects of Adverse Childhood Experiences so they can thrive and enjoy bright futures," McCall said. "It's an honor to announce her invitation to serve in this pivotal role to both be an advocate at the national level and to bring what she learns back home to help Oklahomans."

Conley said, "This is a fantastic opportunity for me to learn from others in the nation about policy and practices which are key to helping people overcome the effects of Adverse Childhood Experiences and to bring that knowledge back to Oklahoma. I'm also excited to bring the work we've started here in Oklahoma on this matter to the national forefront. It is an incredible honor to be asked to help lead in this way."

Trauma-informed legislation has been introduced in at least 29 states, covering a range of approaches to promote trauma-informed policies and practices.

develop our parks and city into something that our community can really enjoy and be proud of. I love it when an idea for a project is talked about and people get excited, and that momentum turns into something new in the parks. In the past few years we have added the swimming beach, the disc golf course, revamped the lake trail and built basketball courts.

Watching people of all ages enjoying what we have to offer is a great. I get an added kick with projects that are low maintenance, fiscally responsible, and give us a long return on investment. Purcell has a ton of potential and it's so rewarding every time I can help show someone that.

Q: Five years ago did you see yourself working as Parks & Recreation director for Purcell?

A: Not at all, not even in the

slightest. In 2015 I was running my shop working crazy hours trying to fix computers and electronics for my customers. Gardening and nature have been hobbies of mine, so a community garden was an idea that I thought was something to think about.

My favorite trips are taking my wife Katie to large cities (OKC, Little Rock, Grapevine) and visiting their downtown areas to eat way too much food and walking around exploring. The veteran Warrior coach said the game was actually decided in the last two minutes of the first half.

“It was 110 percent my fault,” Beller said. “They scored with under a minute to play and we tried to get some things going and fumbled. They scooped it up and that resulted in another Patriot score.

“Last week it paid off and this week it didn’t,” the coach said. “That honestly proved to be the difference in the game because we out-scored them in the second half.”



House plumbing needs warm approach

Winter temperatures can lead to frozen pipes in the home and even bigger problems if the pipes burst, said Gina Peek, interim associate dean and Oklahoma State University Extension housing and consumer specialist.

"Freezing water creates a lot of pressure inside the pipe, which in turn can cause the pipe to burst. This can lead to serious flooding, especially if it happens when no one is home or at night when everyone is asleep," Peek said. "Your best prevention method is to keep the pipes warm enough to stay above the freezing point."

Peek shared several inexpensive tips to help avoid breakage and serious water damage:

- Keep the heat on: For those planning vacation time away from home, the thermostat doesn't have to be set as high as when people are around. Even as low as 50 degrees is still warm enough for pipes.
- Keep cabinet doors open: Pipes often are located in

cabinets against an outside wall, so keeping those doors can help heat circulation. Open room doors can also make a difference.

- Allow faucets to drip: The same drip-drip-dripping that can be so frustrating when you're trying to sleep provides pressure relief for a cold pipe system. If a faucet is served by both hot and cold water pipes, open both taps slightly. A single-handle faucet should be set to warm.

- Seal up cracks and holes: Check pipes in the home, and seal gaps with caulk or spray foam around holes where pipes run through walls or floors. Be sure to check outside faucets, too, and seal those gaps.

- Apply heating tape: Heating tape works much like an electric blanket, supplying heat directly to the pipe. This is a great option for short sections of pipe that are at high risk of freezing.

There are two types of heating tape – products that turn on and off automatically and those that must be manually adjusted. Be sure to follow

manufacturer's directions.

- Add insulation: Pipes in areas such as a garage, basement or attic can benefit from an extra layer. Pipes often can be fitted with foam rubber or fiberglass sleeves.

- Protect outside faucets: Water spigots and faucets exposed directly to the weather can be especially vulnerable.

Protective covers can be found at most home improvement stores.

Also be sure to disconnect water hoses and fill any gaps around the faucet.

"If you discover a frozen pipe in your home, shut off the water supply to the house immediately. You may be able to slowly thaw the pipe by wrapping it in towels soaked in hot water," Peek said. "If you can't quickly thaw the pipe, aren't able to locate the frozen pipe or if a pipe has burst, contact a licensed plumber as soon as possible."




