doesn't define

Mavrik Gish, 8, doesn't let his Type 1 diabetes interfere with his motocross racing. Mavrik is a second grader at Purcell Elementary School.

Type 1 diabetes is something Mavrik Gish lives with. Motocross racing is what he lives for.

The Dexcom 6 continuous glucose monitoring device that he wears in conjunction with an insulin pump makes both possible.

The 8-year-old second grader at Purcell Elementary School was diagnosed in March 2016 when he began losing weight and had a thirst that couldn't be quenched.

"He looked really peaked and had lost a lot of weight," recalled his uncle, Grant Gish.

Type 1 diabetes is an autoimmune disease that attacks the pancreas. The result is the gland stops producing insulin.

Initially he was outfitted with an earlier version of the device. But with the Dexcom 5, twice daily finger sticks to test his blood glucose were required.

The finger sticks are a fact of life for many diabetics. But that need is eliminated by the Dexcom 6.

The device's constant monitoring regulates the amount of insulin released by the pump

With no actual culinary experience to draw on, they still gave it the old pre-K try.

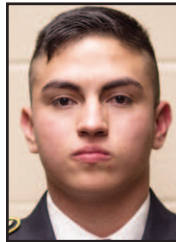

Turkey doesn't make you sleepy

The Thanksgiving feast is finished. The belt is loosened, and the Cowboys game is on TV. Like clockwork, you start to nod off in your recliner.

Most of us blame our drowsiness on the delicious turkey at the center of the holiday smorgasbord. But is there any truth to this poultry's nap-inducing reputation?

"Nope. That theory is for the birds," said Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation President Stephen Prescott, M.D.

The myth stems from the fact that turkey contains tryptophan, an amino acid essential for producing serotonin, which regulates mood and can induce sleepiness.

"But turkey doesn't have any more of the amino acid than other proteins like chicken, beef, pork or fish," said Prescott.

Still, said Prescott, the real culprits behind that afternoon

snooze may sit right next to the turkey on your Thanksgiving plate.

"Consuming carbohydrate-rich foods like dinner rolls, sweet potato casserole, mashed potatoes and stuffing causes a



chain reaction that ends with the creation of the sleep-inducing chemical called melatonin in the brain," Prescott said.

According to the American Council on Exercise, the average American takes in more than 3,000 calories during Thanksgiving dinner, including 563 grams of carbs. That's more than enough to produce a big dose of melatonin.

"You're probably entertaining kids and extended family, cooking and preparing food," said Chakravarty. "All while sleeping less than normal the night before."

"When you add in the exhaustion with the emotional relief of being finished with the meal," she said, "it would be surprising if you're not sawing logs on the sofa before sundown."

As the number of influenza-related hospitalizations continues to increase, the Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) reminds Oklahomans to get a flu shot before upcoming holiday gatherings to prevent spread of the illness.

The OSDH reports 71 hospitalizations and three deaths associated with the flu since the season began in September. The highest number of flu-related hospitalizations has occurred among those who are older than 65 years of age, as well as children younger than five, which are both groups at greater risk of experiencing severe illness

My teacher, Geneva McKelvy was called to the door.

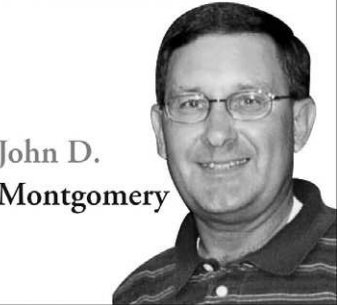
She and the principal, Harvey Engle stepped outside but we could all see them through the large glass windows that were the wall to the south.

But much to my chagrin all that was on the tube was JFK.

After lodging a complaint my father told me to watch what was on because it was history unfolding before our very eyes.

I'm still amazed at what Jackie was able to pull together in just a couple of days.

We once saw the eternal flame from upstairs at the Department of State. The nighttime view was something to behold.

Jackie sure had a good idea there.

I'm not a conspiracy theorist but I don't think we will ever know the entire truth about the events of that day.

Unmistakable threads

Existing throughout the fabric of our society are the unmistakable threads of Native American heritage. In Oklahoma, those threads are numerous and vibrant indeed.

As a member of the Chickasaw Nation, I am always proud that the month of November is set aside to draw national attention to the many contributions and significant achievements of tribal nations throughout history.

Across the country, there are more than 530 federally-recognized tribes. In our state alone, there are 39 sovereign nations—including 11 located right in the Fourth District.

Growing up in Oklahoma, I was indeed fortunate to live in a state rich in tribal heritage. But my upbringing greatly influenced the distinct pride I will always carry. Throughout my life, I was surrounded by family members who were actively involved in tribal affairs and who sought to preserve our unique history and culture.

My great-great-grandfather served as the clerk of the Chickasaw Supreme Court, and my great grandfather was the treasurer of the Chickasaw

Nation. My great-aunt Te Ata Thompson Fisher was a gifted actress, entertainer and Native American storyteller whose talent took her all over the world; the story of her fascinating life was recently documented in a feature film.

And my late mother, Helen Cole, was the first Native American woman ever elected to the Oklahoma State Senate.

I greatly treasure the example shown by my mother, who passed on the importance of knowing our heritage and our family's compelling history. She taught my brother and me to recognize that it was a remarkable gift to be American, but as Native Americans, we also belonged to a special and unique group of people.

Because of my background, I have always considered it a privilege and honor to represent the interests and constitutionally-given rights of tribes in the U.S. House of Representatives. Along with my Oklahoma colleague Markwayne Mullin, I am proud to be one of two Native Americans currently serving in Congress.

We will soon be joined by two others, who recently made history as the first Native American women ever elected

to Congress. Indeed, this is an impressive achievement for tribes nationwide.

While the federal government has at times had a strained relationship with Indian Country, I am encouraged that efforts have been made to repair and improve it. As a co-chair of the Native American Caucus, I have worked with my House colleagues on both sides of the aisle to advance legislation that respects tribal sovereignty and improves the lives of Native Americans.

Earlier this year, I was pleased that the House passed the Tribal Labor Sovereignty Act, which would restore authority previously afforded to tribes and respect their right to operate enterprises and govern effectively on their own lands.

This summer, the House also passed legislation that would increase funding for the Indian Health Service, as well as vital programs at the Bureau of Indian Affairs and Indian Education.

Long before the United States came to be, tribes greatly influenced the land in which we live. For generations to come, I am confident that America's tribal heritage will only become more vibrant.

Our Views



Another full weekend of movies this week. It's almost hard to keep up with them all at this time of year. There's just so many.

We have a family film about foster care adoption, the latest entry in the Wizarding World and continuing adventures of Newt Scamander, a crime thriller featuring a group of widows attempting to pull off a difficult heist, and the true story of teenage boy sent to gay conversion therapy at the age of 19.

Let's get right to the reviews.



First up

is "Instant Family."

When Pete (Mark Wahlberg) and Ellie (Rose Byrne) decide to start a family, they stumble into the world of foster care adoption. Hoping to take in one small child, they meet three siblings, including a rebellious 15 year old girl (Isabela Moner) and find themselves speeding from zero to three kids overnight.

Now, Pete and Ellie must try to learn the ropes of instant parenthood in the hopes of becoming a family.

I was so cynical about this movie going into it.

This film was originally scheduled to be released February 2019, but after the remarkable box office success of "Wonder," a feel-good family film released the weekend before Thanksgiving last year, Paramount decided to move up their own feel-good family movie to nearly the exact same release date.

I assumed Paramount was just dumping off a terrible movie in the same genre on the same weekend to maximize profits on a throwaway film.

Regardless of studio intentions with release dates though, I couldn't have been more wrong regarding the actual quality of this film.

This movie is genuinely really good.

I was expecting nothing but feel-good family fluff with a bit of slapstick thrown in here and there, but this film ended up being much more down to Earth and a lot more realistic than I had assumed.

There's a real edge to this movie that completely took me off guard.

The children in this movie have many of the issues real foster kids have to deal with.

The youngest of the siblings

(Julianna Gamiz) was clearly verbally abused and projects that same mistreatment on her poor doll.

The middle child (Gustavo Quiroz) is terrified of physical abuse and shrinks back in terror anytime there's even a hint at a raised voice.

And the oldest (Isabela Moner) absolutely hates being touched and has major deep seeded problems with personal space.

Sure, those issues were often played up for humor in the movie, but still I was surprised by how blunt and straightforward the film was with them.

And it's not just the kids, the parents felt very shockingly real as well.

There's a scene at one point in the film where Pete and Ellie actually discuss ways of getting rid of the kids.

Not for some lame dramatic betrayal, but to show how completely overwhelmed and trapped the two of them felt. Feelings that I'm sure many parents have experienced at times, foster kids or not.

All of this gives the movie a very grounded and authentic feel.

It doesn't surprise me one bit that the writer and director for this film, Sean Anders, is the father of three former foster children himself and that the movie features many of his own real life experiences.

But for all the realistic drama, this movie is still filled to the brim with comedy.

Again though, it's not your typical light hearted humor you find in most family comedies. It's what I would describe as foster care gallows humor.

Beware to those considering bringing young children to this movie. For a family film, there is a surprising amount of bad language. It's a realistic amount to be sure, but still a ton more than I was expecting.

At first the comedy really took me off guard. I was just surprised by how cutting and blunt everyone was. But as the movie went on and I got used to the tone, this film's style of humor really began to grow on me.

I haven't even mentioned the editing here, which is fantastic. The cuts and transitions alone benefit the storytelling so much here, and keep the film engaging and well paced throughout.

Overall, this is an easy movie to recommend. The performances are great, even from the young actors. The comedy

Next is “Fantastic Beasts: The Crimes of Grindelwald.”

After the events of the previous film, the dark wizard Grindelwald (Johnny Depp) has escaped and sets forth a plan to gather followers.

Attempting to thwart Grindelwald, Albus Dumbledore (Jude Law) enlists his former student, Newt Scamander (Eddie Redmayne), in hopes of preventing the nefarious wizard’s scheme from coming to pass.

First off, I want to say I like the Harry Potter franchise quite a bit.

Sure, I’m not a super fan by any stretch. I’ve never read any of the books, but I’ve enjoyed the movies for the most part, including the previous “Fantastic Beasts” film.

The last entry into the Wizarding World had its issues to be sure, and I know many people found it just mediocre, but at the end of the day it had a cast of really likable characters I just loved being around.

In this movie, I guess Grindelwald will become more powerful if he gets more people to follow him? And none of that will matter until the next movie? Great. Really compelling storytelling there Rowling.

It’s not just the story that falls short here though, it’s also the characters.

All the new characters I adored from the last film seem completely lost here.

Sure, it’s nice seeing old faces like Dumbledore again and Newt is still the star of the show here. But I wanted more of Tina, Jacob, & Queenie too, and the development for them is completely nonexistent in this movie.

Yes they’re there, but they might as well not be for how little they affect the plot. In fact, as much as I hate to say it, the movie would probably be better off without them cluttering up an already messy story.

The Purcell Parks & Rec Advisory Board will be hosting a public hearing regarding a grant application for adding on to the Purcell Lake walking trail.

- This grant project would continue the foot/biking/mountain biking trail around the entirety of Purcell Lake.
- This grant is administered by the Federal Highway Administration to the Federal Trails Program which is then distributed by the Oklahoma Department of Tourism
- This grant application is for the second phase of the Trails project.
- The grant would pay 80% of the cost, and the city would pay 20% of the cost.
- There will be no tax increase to fund the project.
- The trail would be 10’ wide, matching the width of the walking trail upgrade plans from Phase I.
- Phase II would extend from Chandler Park eastward towards the volleyball courts. It would then turn north following the road north and following the Purcell Lake dam, then turning west along the cemetery to the north boat ramp.
- Engineers have been consulted to begin drawing up an estimate of the overall trail and each of its phases.
- The City of Purcell has already had the grant application for Phase I of the walking trail approved which will begin in 2019.
- This grant request is due January 31st, 2019
- We would like to receive letters from the community. The letters should say why people do / do not want the trail, and how the trail will impact the city.

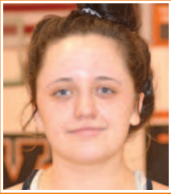

Each summer I mentor a group of OU students who go on intercultural immersion trips. Then, in the Fall semester, these students and I meet for a one-hour seminar class. We discuss the trips, process their experience, and read a few articles or case studies on human development work in disadvantaged countries.

This past summer all of my students were female, and they traveled to Uganda and Ethiopia. I received a few emails from concerned parents before the trip. Were there any major risks to their daughters? I replied that there were, mostly from traffic, and that we would take precautions to keep them safe including not driving at night.

What I really wanted to say was that there are real risks in crossing borders. These girls were crossing not just geographical borders, but also cultural borders, racial, class status, and power boundaries. The biggest risk, I wanted to write, was that your child could be profoundly changed by this experience.

The girls each kept a journal during their trip. And in the seminar class, we reflected on their range of emotions and experiences. For example, what was it like to be the only white female in a large crowd of

dark-skinned, African males? There are no street signs in Gulu, Uganda. Every street corner looks the same, with tiny little shops, and people walking amidst motorcycles and cars bustling everywhere. It is easy to feel vulnerable. But the girls noted that they were always treated with kindness and respect. Perhaps there are people in our own home country who feel vulnerable because they are in the minority? As we read in the book of Exodus: “You shall not wrong a stranger or oppress him, for you were once strangers in the land of Egypt.” (Ex. 22:21)

The girls also became keenly aware of the “personal hierarchy of power.” As has recently come to light in the United States, one can easily abuse the personal power over another, based on rank or status. The boss can abuse an employee, the professor can blackmail his student, and a priest can violate the sense of trust with his parishioner. Jesus didn’t often get angry. But here is one instance in which his anger feels very real: “Woe to the person through whom sin (with these) occurs. It would be better for him if a millstone were put around his neck and he be thrown into the sea than for him to cause one of these little ones to sin.” (Luke

17:2) These are harsh words aimed at a person who abuses his personal hierarchy of trust and power over another!

Some of the girls found themselves on the upper end of the personal hierarchy. When they first met with ladies at the Ugandan Peace conference, the women were afraid to talk openly with these “white, wealthy women from the West who spoke perfect English”. But after awhile, a kind of solidarity was created in the companionship that evolved between the girls from the West and the Ugandan women.

We don’t have to travel to Africa to take these lessons to heart. We can learn to be aware of the ones in our midst who might feel left out, because they are strangers. We can learn to be aware of personal hierarchies of power, and that we must never abuse these hierarchies of trust. We can be aware of our calling as sons and daughters of the one Father, who art in heaven.

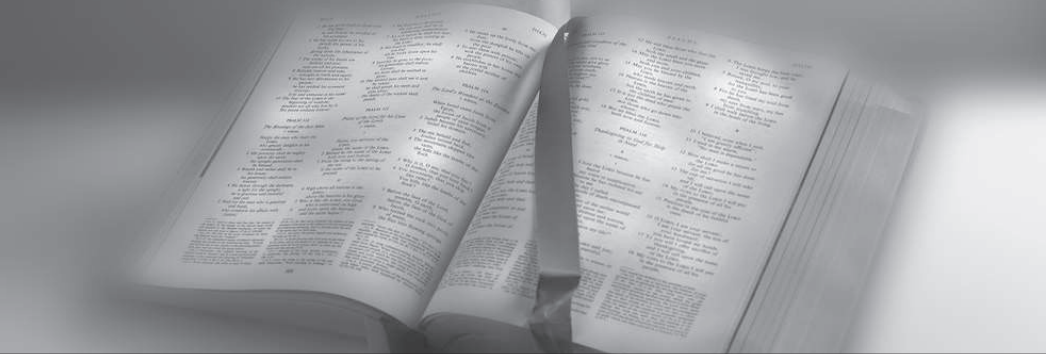
The lesson learned is that the purpose of the memorial was to remind succeeding generations of what happened there and the lessons to be learned from it.

Our offices will be closed on Thanksgiving Day, Thursday, November 22, so our volunteers can spend this holiday with their families.

As tax time is drawing closer, please consider helping us help our veterans and surviving spouses who could use a hand up. Currently we are spending \$25,000 a month to support the needs of veterans and their surviving spouses. We are doing this with the support of people like you who believe our veterans and their families are important to all of us.

We are a 501(C)(3) non-profit where your donations should be tax deductible. Another way you can help is with the donation of that running car, truck, motorcycle or tractor that can be given to a veteran or sold to raise funds for the needs of veterans.

Our Veteran of the Week is Rex Reynolds, a Korean Veteran, who served as a member of the United States Army. He makes his home in Oklahoma City.

As we gather with friends and family on this Thanksgiving Day, please say a prayer for the men and women who are serving in the military and those who have served before. Many of them will not be home for the holidays while all of us remember how we felt when we served in faraway lands. My hat goes off to every military member and veteran for their service to this great nation.

In today’s world just a little more than one percent of our citizens will serve in the US Military. To me that says that 99 percent of the people in our country are depending on that one percent to preserve our way of life. We certainly owe each veteran a thank you for their service.

We provide our services to veterans and their families at no charge each Tuesday and Thursday morning in Norman at 1268 North Interstate Drive. On an average week there will be more than 300 veterans and surviving spouses assisted with their claims for VA benefits. Veterans who are approved for service-connection of a disability will receive from 10 percent up to 100 percent based on the

severity of their conditions. The amount of compensation can range from around \$135 per month to \$3,000 a month.

The VA will make the determination to approve or to disapprove all veteran’s applications for benefits. Our organization only guides veterans and encourages them to obtain evidence from their medical providers that may support their claims for benefits. The reason that so many veterans and surviving spouses visit us is our reputation for helping veterans and their families when others have failed.

During the past year we have provided our services to thousands of veterans and their families at no charge to anyone. As a non-profit we operate on donations from veterans along with grants that we receive from business or other entities. We do not receive any funds from government either Federal or State.

There are many older veterans and surviving spouses who are trying to live on less than \$1,000 per month. Most of them never dreamed they would ever apply for VA benefits to help pay for the basic necessities such as food and housing. Every week we see men and women who are homeless or are sleeping on the couch of friends or family members. One of the things I learned many years ago is that if a person has enough money for food and a place to stay, they are less likely to consider suicide or drugs. Our veterans deserve everything we can do for them as many of them are never the same emotionally or physically after serving in the military.

Last week there were 290 veterans and surviving spouses assisted with their VA claims and questions. Our drivers transported many of them and logged 84 hours travelling a record 1,658 miles or twenty-seven passengers.

One the most common questions veterans have for us is “Is my spouse going to eligible to receive VA benefits after I’m gone.” First, the surviving spouse could receive benefits

if the veteran dies from a service-connected disability or one that is presumptive to their military service. The service-connected or presumptive disability must be listed on the death certificate as primary cause of death or listed as a contributing factor. Second, the surviving spouse and dependents could receive benefits if the veteran was receiving a 100% rating for 10 years or more. Third, a surviving spouse could receive Pension benefits depending on when the veteran served, length of service and the surviving spouse’s income. Income for pension is based on the combined amount of money that everyone in the house receives.

As a VA Accredited Claims Agent, I’m copied on all of the rating decisions veterans and surviving spouses receive from VA. This enables us the ability to review every VA decision and to follow up with the veteran or spouse with what their next thing they need to do to keep their claims on track.

Last week we received 16 rating decisions with a 100 percent rating for service-connected disabilities. These men and women will receive an annual combined amount of \$301,255 per year. If you were recently awarded a service-connected disability you may be eligible for other Oklahoma State benefits.

One surviving spouse was approved for DIC and will receive \$19,212 per year. As always, we encourage all veterans and surviving spouses of veterans to stop by for a visit with our triage folks who will help to determine if you may be eligible for VA benefits. Please remember we are volunteers who want to help our veterans and their families receive the VA benefits for which they are eligible.

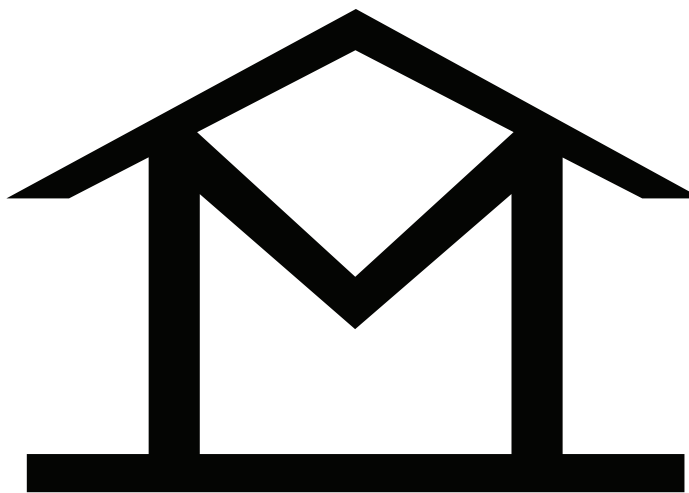
