If anyone tells you sales tax in Purcell is the highest in the state, don't listen.

They are wrong.

The sales tax in Purcell is 10 percent, of which one tenth - a penny - isearmarked solely to support Purcell Municipal Hospital.

Another penny is earmarked for capital improvements in the city.

The other 9 cents is divided thus: 4 cents to the City of Purcell including a penny tax specifically for capital improvements, a half-cent to Mc-Clain County and 4-1/2 cents to the state.

> Voters here will be asked August 28 to extend the hospital sales tax 20 years through Dec. 31, 2039 and also approve 15 more years of the capital improvements sales tax. That would push the expiration of that sales tax

With assistance from Lexington Fire Department, the blaze was extinguished.



July is an important month for native pastures

Bradley Secraw Agriculture/4-H Educator

Native prairie and bermuda grass may be the two most common types of pastures and hay fields in central Oklahoma, but they are very different from when it comes to management.

To maximize productivity over the long-term, native prairie needs more rest at different times and a higher residual stubble height than bermudagrass.

Also, being predominantly bunch grasses, native prairie may require years to recover bermudagrass in comparison can recover from more quickly. July is the time when native

grasses enter their reproductive stage and begin to prepare for the following year.

This also includes not grazing from severe overgrazing that the same area of pasture at the same time two years in a row.




Friday topped that day with it hitting 110 for a brief time before cooling off to a mere 107 at quitting time.

Because of that the characters always have Skype, Facebook, or some kind of YouTube video open at all times.



The National Cowbov & Western Heritage Museum is open from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. librarysystem.org.



However, a voter must be registered and reside at an address within the geographical boundaries of a school district or municipality to vote in those elections.

> • Military personnel, county residents residing overseas and their spouses and dependents are eligible to receive absentee ballots. These voters may apply only by mail, fax or email. Military members should contact their unit's voting service officer for forms and information. Other Oklahoma residents living overseas can receive the same materials from any U.S. military installation, embassy, consulate or online at http://www.fvap. gov/oklahoma.

Jamie is survived by his beloved wife, Cindy,of the home; mom, Delores Givens; sister, Lourinda, and two sons, Garret and Greyson.


Fellow officer and friend, Lawrence Nichols of the Dallas Police Department said, "Jamie was larger than life. Everyone loved him."



As there are always more than we can accommodate, please remember that we start helping veterans by at least 5:30 a.m. and we are usually full before 7 a.m. After we reach our capacity, the only time we accept visitors is if they traveled a great distance to reach us.

> We've had visitors from all 77 counties in Oklahoma and from 45 other states. What surprises me is that we have only been in Norman a few years and already assisted more than 19,000 veterans and surviving spouses with their VA claims and questions.

Over the many years, we have been helping veterans and surviving spouses we have found evidence-based claims means it is likely a request for service-connection of a disability or an increase will be approved. Far too many veterans whose claims are filed at other places will be denied because no evidence was provided.

Many veterans who have outstanding appeals will receive a RAMP letter. This is a new program and provides a way for the VA to settle claims that have been in the appeals process for an extended period. For those of you who receive one of these letters, please bring it in and we will review it with you to determine whether Last week our drivers donated that would be the best course of 71 hours driving 19 veterans action for your claim. The VA has already approved several of those that we represented there a few months ago. When we travel to VA hearings, I do not want to go there without evidence from the veteran's medical provider that supports our request for serviceconnection of a disability. Last week there were 14 veterans we represent awarded service-connected disabilities. This group of veterans will receive an annual combined dollar amount of \$538,794 per year. We pride ourselves in being able to assist veterans and surviving spouses receive the VA benefits for which they

are eligible. We set a record in the next category. Fifty-five veterans received VA disability ratings from 10-90 percent for their service-connected disabilities caused by or aggravated by their military service. Our volunteers working on the claims for surviving spouses are doing everything possible to help them receive VA benefits. I have found that it is much easier to help the surviving spouses whose veteran filed for and received VA benefits. Usually applying for DIC is going to be the best option. To receive this benefit, the veteran must have been rated at the 100 percent rating for 10 years or died from a presumptive condition to their military service.

Another way is if the veteran's service-connected disability is listed as the primary or a contributing condition to their death. Many times, it is possible to amend the veterans death certificate to reflect the presumptive or the contributing factor of a service-connected disability. For questions about surviving spouse benefits please visit with one of our volunteers who specialize in this service.

Our drivers are staying very busy transporting veterans to their VA medical appointments and to our location for help with their VA claims. Each week they are transporting from eight to 15 veterans to their appointments. Our handicap accessible wheelchair van has proven to be a great tool to transport our wheelchair confined veterans.

Like any young animal, Kali learned through play. The keepers would take Kali out into his snowy yard and give him balls or stuffed toys. They gave him a big tub of water so that he could learn how to swim. Boxes were placed to encourage him to climb in and out of things, building strength in his legs. With so much play time, Kali took lots of naps. Solid foods like salmon and bear chow, a kibble made specifically for bears, were added to his diet. He grew bigger, stronger, and more confident

The keepers treasured their play sessions with the cub but knew it could not last forever. Soon, Kali would be too big and powerful to share a space with people. And there's only so much a polar bear cub can learn from humans. It is best to learn how to be a polar bear from another polar bear.







March 6, 1980: Rachel gets to meet her little brother, Steven Malachi. Mal, whose name we borrowed from my high school friend Mal Taylor. Mal has
