Major power outage Large portion of Purcell out for nearly 3 hours

It wasn't a bird or a squirrel this time.

The power outage last Saturday, that affected most of central Purcell and some in the south end of town was caused by sagging pine tree limbs falling on power lines.

That caused the lines to arc and what resulted was a nearly three hour power outage from 10:35 a.m. to 1:24 p.m.

Power was out to many residential residents, all of downtown and affected businesses at least as far south as McDonalds.

There was no weather at the time of the outage but Electric Superintendent Trey Phillips said the pine tree limbs were probably weighted down from the 5.10" of rain that fell the day before.

giving. It will also provide aid in


prosecuting violators.

It is lawful in Oklahoma to burn brush, debris or trees that have been cut down but not household trash.






Prosecutors charged the 38-year-old Friday in McClain County District Court.



or logistically. We are too spread out and these decisions are too local. Consolidation would eliminate local administration and school boards. Having folks who live in our communities and know our families is critical to making the right decisions for our local schools. I will continue to support local control of our rural school districts.

What other concerns are you hearing?

Healthcare comes up a lot. District 42 has a population of around 37,000 people but we only have 3 hospitals all of which have had their financial struggles over the years. Access to quality healthcare in rural Oklahoma is an issue we face across our state. We need legislators who will develop relationships and work with our insurance companies, medical providers, and local communities to come up with creative solutions to ensure our community has access to quality dependable medical care. The loss of even one of our hospitals would most certainly result in the loss of life. Another issue voters are ready to see improve is Oklahoma incarceration rates. It's not great to be last in education but first in the number of people in prison. It's also no coincidence. Criminal justice reform will absolutely be a priority for me. Overall, our voters consistently express frustration with the chaos and lack of real leadership at our Capitol. They feel disrespected. I get it, I am right there with them. Voters are over political parties and want someone who will set that nonsense aside to get the job done. Our community is demanding transparency and accountability. They want legislators whose lights will be on and whose doors will be open.

Abandonment of Refrigerators and Iceboxes in Places Accessible to Children

Any person, firm, or corporation who abandons or discards in any place accessible to children any refrigerator, icebox, or ice chest of a capacity of one and one-half $(1\frac{1}{2})$ cubic feet or more which has an attached lid or door which may be opened or fastened shut by means of an attached latch or who, being the owner, lessee, or manager of such place, knowingly permits such abandoned or discarded refrigerator, icebox, or ice chest to remain in such condition shall be deemed negligent as a matter of law and shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

What made you decide to run for office (again):

Right?!? So I ran for this seat in 2016 but we all know how that turned out. Undeterred (or maybe just stubborn), I turned around 2 weeks later and filed for our local school board seat. I have been serving on the Blanchard School Board since early 2017. I had convinced myself that I would not run for office again for a very long time but life had other plans. In early April, individuals from across our District 42 community reached out to me asking if I would run again. I hope that's because people have seen the work we have done on our local school board and observed, first hand, my dedication to our public schools and my willingness to listen to and work with anyone willing to get involved. I am running because Oklahoma needs leaders passionate for our people. I love this community and believe that it deserves to have a voice in the decisions at our Capitol and I am willing to be that voice for our people.

As you talk to voters, what issue are most people concerned about? What can you do to fix it?

Public education is by far the issue our voters are most concerned about. We came a long way this last session by passing a historic teacher pay raise but we still have a long way to go. Our kids are still learning out of texts books from the 1990s. If your kid's classroom is nicely decorated and filled with lots of learning tools and supplies, your teacher bought those out of his or her own pocket. That's just crazy to me. I can't imagine showing up to my job and being asked to pay for my own supplies and work with outdated tools. We have to do better. I will continue to evaluate additional sources of funding and support legislation that provides additional funds to our teachers and our classrooms. On a related note, I get asked a lot about school consolidation. While consolidation may work in other areas of our state, it doesn't really work in rural Oklahoma- financially



Sadly, this film is no "Harry Potter." Not even close.

Beyond not having nearly the level of cohesive world building or sense of wonder that the "Harry Potter" franchise was dripping with, this movie lacks perhaps the most important aspect that let "Harry Potter" be the success that it was. This movie starts out much like Moore's 2004 documentary "Fahrenheit 9/11," with showing footage from election night. But instead of Moore asking "Was it all a dream? he asks "How did we get here?"

What follows though isn't just uninterrupted Trump bashing, though Moore certainly doesn't paint the President in a positive light.

The movie is more of a look at the political climate that lead to Trump coming to office and the reaction his presidency has generated.

A lot of the blame is pointed at major news organizations.

An entire segment is dedicated to how the networks used Trump's image to boost ratings. Moore ends it with a quote from the CEO at CBS that summed up Trump's candidacy quite nicely. "It may not be good for America, but it's damn good for CBS.'

But like I said, the movie isn't all about Trump. A large percentage is focused on Moore's home state of Michigan. Notably the ongoing water crisis in Flint, Michigan.

He certainly isn't a fan of Michigan's current governor Rick Snyder. He personally holds Snyder accountable for exposing thousands of children to lead poisoning, plus the outbreak of Legionnaires' disease that killed 12 people.

I thought for the most part Moore's arguments were compelling, though I didn't agree with all of his conclusions.

Plus there were a couple silly stunts, like going to the Michi-

gan State Capitol to make a citizen's arrest on the governor, or spraying the governor's lawn with a firehose hooked up to a tanker full of Flint water.

Personally I don't think antics like that help his argument much, but at least they don't make up the bulk of the film.

I think my biggest take away from the film is Moore isn't a fan of basically any established politician, Republican or Democrat.

He even goes after President Obama for prosecuting whistleblowers, numerous drone strikes, and most of all the President's actions in downplaying the water crisis in Flint.

Along with criticizing current politicians, Moore interviews a fair amount of up and coming candidates. People really passionate about changing the direction the country is headed in. A direction Moore directly compares to despotism and Nazi Germany.

All in all, "Fahrenheit 11/9" is a well edited documentary and on a whole the film is never really boring.

But like everything political, I doubt this movie will persuade anyone who disagrees with Moore's viewpoint.

Moore's definitely preaching to the choir on this one. If you're young and lean left, there's a good chance you'll leave this film emboldened and eager to vote in the upcoming election.

On the other hand if you lean right, you probably rolled your eyes the second you heard Michael Moore was releasing another documentary.


For many years I disregarded news features on the Oklahoma Depart of Human Services and their political, administrative, funding and legal problems due to my disinterest.

So, when an anonymous hacker starts posting details from the private lives of everyone in their small town of Salem, the result is absolute madness leaving Lily and her friends questioning whether they'll live through the night.

This is a wild one. It's isn't too often where I

watch a movie and 30 minutes in I still have no idea what's going on, but that was definitely the case here.

Turns out it was a bit more metaphorical than I was expecting. Usually that'd be a nonstarter for me, but I still ended up at least enjoying aspects of this film.

The real premise of the movie is basically asking one question. What if internet lynch mobs happened in real life?

Unfortunately, it's something you see happen all the time these days.

Someone online will post evidence of some wrongdoing committed by someone on social media, made up or otherwise, and followers of the accuser end up whipping themselves into a frenzy, sending hateful messages and even death threats to the person accused.

That's basically what happens in this little made up town of Salem.

Everyone is upset that their information gets leaked. These people are angry and just want blood, so all it takes is a single flimsy accusation to make the entire town go on a murderous rampage.

And beyond a slow and meandering beginning, I think the movie was executed pretty well, at least for what they were trying to accomplish.

The camera work is really creative. I absolutely love the way one of the scenes towards the end was shot. It's a home invasion scene where all teens are hanging out in the same house, while unknown to them, they're slowly being surrounded by the disgruntled townsfolk and picked off one by one. The way the camera pans around the outside and eventually through the house was just wonderfully done. And it was all seemingly shot in a one take too. All together making that scene one of the most intense and visually engaging moments in the film. I also really liked the lighting. out of a stage play with all the the spotlights drawing focus to what's important on screen. I have to say though, this film is not one for the faint of heart. It's very rare for a movie to make me feel physically nau-

Just the sheer amount of blood everywhere was staggering. Plus there's the rape scenes, which are incredibly unpleasant in their own right.

Also while the acting is fine, the characters here don't necessarily feel like real people. More like self-insert personifications of people for the audience to imagine themselves in their position. Either that or they were insane internet trolls manifested in the real world.

I get what the filmmakers were going for. The entire film is a metaphor whose purpose is to hold up a mirror on reality. But I would have prefered characters with a bit more depth.

This would be a hard film to recommend just the amount of blood and rape scenes. The fact that the whole thing is basically an analogy doesn't help much.

I guess if you love gory movies, enjoy films with heavy feminist undertones, and don't mind watching a movie whose entire plot is metaphorical, this will be right up your alley.

Sadly, for this film's sake, I can't imagine there's too many people who fit that description. "Assassination Nation" is

Perhaps they think this is a clumsily made movie with a horribly mishmashed plot and poorly developed unengaging characters.

It's even possible that critics don't enjoying watching a film that takes a sick pleasure in toying with the emotions of its audience by throwing in as much shock value as possible for zero purpose.

Maybe this is just a genuinely terrible film. One that no one else should have to suffer though.



Bebout, the paramedic, and Hunter Thomas, the EMT, left Purcell on September 11 and were back home eight days later.

They were staged in a small town outside Raleigh, N.C., Wadley said.

Florence was widely regarded as a monster hurricane as it tracked across the western Atlantic Ocean.

But much of its fury was spent before landfall.

"It was downgraded to a Category 1," Wadley said.

He added the two-man crew had expected to assist in rescues as Florence moved inland with record rainfall and flooding.

"But the state had already got most of that taken care of before our ambulance got here," Wadley added.

North Carolina officials began releasing the ambulances and other emergency responders on September 18.

Because the Wadley crew was among those who had traveled the farthest, they were among the first released to return home.

Driving straight through, they were back in Purcell on September 19.

This wasn't the first time Wadley's EMS have responded to a hurricane.

Wadley ambulances and personnel were dispatched to assist in 2008 when Hurricane Ike hit Galveston and in 2002 when Hurricane Gustav hammered the East Coast.

"If you are going to be a minister, you will meet a lot of people. Some will succeed and some won't," he said. "I'm not the smartest guy in the world, but at least I keep trying."

In a lifetime of lives touched and souls saved, Wayne is proud that he's never been fired or "run off" from a church.

And over the decades, he's amassed a "treasure trove" copies of all the funerals he's ever preached.

There have been a lot.

He also recalls the big mission trip where he accompanied a choir to New York City.

"We sang all the way from here to New York," he said.



> Think of when he touches the pen to the scroll for the first time; and when he picks the pen up, look at these immortal words that have been stamped on the page: "In the beginning was the Word ... '

Without apology or qualification, he declares the greatest truth man would ever know. No college, university, lab, or lecture hall would ever consider a theme that matches John's. John will write until what we

an "Amen" with finality to his script (John 21:25).

I wonder how many disciples would come to John's room – with their own pen in hand and a scroll – to sit for long hours during the day or night to copy meticulously every word of the gospel, not one jot or tittle omitted. 



Health officials remind Oklahomans to continue mosquito precautions

While the season for West Nile virus (WNV) has been mild compared to previous years, the Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) encourages residents to take precautions to reduce the risk of contracting WNV, a mosquito-borne illness.

So far in 2018, the OSDH reports there are seven confirmed cases of WNV disease with one case leading to a death. Five cases have occurred among Oklahomans older than 50 years of age. Most cases have been reported during the months of August and September.

Although relatively mild temperatures and heavy rainfall have contributed to a milder WNV season, health officials are reminding the public that mosquitoes often spread the virus through October and it is important to take precautions to prevent getting bitten by an infected weather pattern is dry.

Precautions to prevent mosquito bites include:

• Use an insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, or IR3535 on exposed skin and clothing when going outdoors, particularly between dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are more likely to bite. Insect repellent with permethrin should be used on clothing only. Always follow instructions when applying repellent.

 Avoid spraying repellent on a child's hands, eyes, mouth or irritated skin. Adults should apply repellent to their hands and then apply to a child's face. Products containing DEET may be used on children older than 2 months of age.

• Protect infants by putting a mosquito net over infant carriers and strollers.

• Avoid outdoor activities when Culex mosquitoes are most active in the early mornso mosquitoes don't have a place to breed.

• Clean leaves and debris from rain gutters regularly to ensure they are not clogged. Repair any leaking faucets

or irrigation systems. Symptoms of WNV vary widely depending on a person's risk for more severe disease that involves the central nervous system.

Some may experience sudden onset of fever, headache, dizziness, and muscle weakness and recover within one to three weeks while others develop life-threatening meningitis or encephalitis causing confusion, stupor, paralysis or a coma.

Long-lasting complications of WNV disease can include difficulty concentrating, migraine headaches, extreme muscle weakness and tremors, and paralysis of a limb.




