# Water leaks close courthouse

Two separate leaks blamed on ground shifting

Ground shifts at the bottom of Depot Hill and one at Fourth and Monroe limited water supply to numerous businesses and homes Wednesday.

The lack of water forced employees at the McClain County Courthouse to abandon ship about 12:15 p.m. when the water was out.

The water leak at Depot Hill surfaced about 7 a.m. with the one at Fourth and Monroe presenting itself about 10 a.m., Water Department Supervisor Steve Mayer said.

McClain County Sheriff said when the water went out at the courthouse county employees were forced to

leave their workplace.

Sheriff Don Hewett said the water came back on about 1:25 but by then all the employees had departed.

"The Purcell Fire Department was gracious enough to bring a brush truck full of water to the jail's sally port so we were able to allow our prisoners to use the bathroom," Hewett said. "When we lose water at the jail it is a major concern."

When water service was restored, Hewett and his staff was in the process of procuring bottled water for the inmates.

# Pedestrian fatality

Victim pinned between semi, track hoe

A Purcell man was killed Saturday morning at an oil lease three miles east of Ninnekah.

Jessie Ray Martinez, 28, suffered internal injuries when he was pinned between a parked Freightliner semi and a track hoe that was unloading mud from the tractor-trailer.

The accident occurred at approximately 10:15 a.m.

on the private property oil lease off of Grady County Road 1420.

Oklahoma Highway Patrol Trooper Tyler Shelby reported the semi tractortrailer was legally parked when Martinez, a pedestrian, walked to the back of the semi and was pinned.

The Doosan track hoe was operated by another Purcell man, Armando Olguin, 40. He was not injured.

Martinez was transported by McClain County EMS to Grady County Memorial Hospital in Chickasha where he was pronounced dead at approximately 11:23 a.m.

Assisting Shelby at the scene were OHP Lt. Kerry Massie and Troopers Spencer Schmille, Michael Brady and David Miner, as well as Grady County Sheriff's Department.





Now more people are being asked to volunteer as local mediators.

Kathy King, Early Settlement/Central Program director, is seeking individuals in Mc-Clain and Cleveland counties who are willing to train to be local volunteer mediators.

King said the local mediators give their time and effort in helping parties settle disputes and resolve conflict in a peaceful manner while aiming towards a "win-win" outcome where all parties involved are satisfied and everyone's needs are met.

Volunteering can be a very rewarding act and helps the parties involved move on with their lives and makes the community a more peaceful place, she added.

Each year dozens of Oklahomans become certified Early Settlement Mediation, Administrative Office of the default.aspx.

Early Settlement trains people all around Oklahoma to the local court.

The mediators receive outstanding training, along with the mentorship necessary to become competent and successful in resolving conflicts, King continued..

A two-day training session has been scheduled for January 8 and 9 in Norman.

The training is free. However, applicants must be willing to commit to 20 hours of volunteering for the Early Settlement program in the local district court.

Many volunteers have continued with the program for several years due to volunteers reporting that mediating is a personally rewarding and lifechanging experience.

There has been a kidnapping at Our Lady of Victory Catholic


It is the most vile swiping of anything that could possibly be stolen.

A week had passed since Bascomb Finch made his ill-fated appearance on Raymond Cooper's radio show, but the story of his "drunken display" was still the talk of the town, thanks to Raymond Cooper and Iris Long.

The "Special Edition" of Raymond's Valley Patriot had filled racks around the downtown area at 9 a.m. Tuesday morning. Iris thought it was interesting to call the issue "special" since the Patriot advertised itself as a weekly newspaper. Just like a lot of Cooper's shenanigans, it was unusual for the paper to follow any regular schedule. He was lucky to get a new issue out twice a month.

As usual, Cooper didn't hold back any of his feelings. The headline on the front page alone was almost enough to tell his version of the A.J. Fryerson story:

#### A.J. Story Falls Apart as Lone Witness Admits to Drinking Problem

Iris Long felt sure, rightly so, Cooper had cooked up the entire "drunken Bascomb" story, but as usual, Raymond had his listeners and readers eating out of the palm of his hand.

Raymond was certain he had put the Fryerson story to rest, once and for all. His live interview with the sole witness to the lone alleged appearance of A.J. Fryerson put the matter to rest for good, as far as Cooper was concerned. What he didn't realize, however, was Iris Long had something up her sleeve, as well. Being a journalist for five decades had created a sixth sense in Iris. She knew to cross every "t" and dot every "i." She also knew to be ready for any surprise that might come her way.

Raymond wasn't as educated as Iris in the ways of print journalism. While Long followed all the traditional journalistic standards, Cooper flew by the seat of his pants. Iris would never print a story without a minimum of two sources. Cooper saw sources as an obstacle and often ran stories that were no more than his own version of reality. Nonetheless, his readers and listeners hung on Cooper's every word, believing them to be inspired by someone, or something, greater than Raymond himself.

As readers followed the story from Page 1 to the "jump" on Page 8, Marvin Walsh and Farley Puckett hurried out of their booth and made a hasty exit from the diner.

It took most folks a while before reading the

story about the upcoming party at the Methodist church. But when folks finally got around to that story, they noticed another valuable piece of information they could have easily missed in the excitement over the A.J. revelation. Raymond was perhaps the only resident of



Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted and processed, but not until after February 13.

The response is either a voter identification card listing the new voter's precinct number and polling place location or a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application for voter registration was not approved.

Haley said any person who has submitted a voter registration application and who has not received a response within 30 days should contact the County Election Board office.

Oklahoma Voter Registration Application forms are available at the County Election Board office located in the McClain County Courthouse and at most post offices, tag agencies and public libraries in the county. Applications also are available at www.elections.ok.gov.



During the last 30 years that I have been helping veterans receive benefits, we have found that the easiest way to obtain a service-connected disability is to file a claim for service-connection of hearing loss and tinnitus.

In 2002 there was an article printed in the Federal Register that stated if a member of the military worked in a hazardous noise job while on active duty that hearing loss and tinnitus were presumptive to their military service. Since that time, we have helped more than 50,000 veterans submit a VA clainmfor service-connection of those disabilities. VA has approved most of those we helped with hearing loss and tinnitus and they now receive compensation for those disabilities.

When a veteran visits us for the first time, we will file VA Form 21-0966 Intent to File. This form will give the veteran a start date of the following month for benefits. If we are going to file a hearing loss and tinnitus claim for them, we will ask them to go to an audiologist who can administer a VA Hearing Test and give their history of noise exposure in the military. After the veteran has evidence for that kind of claim or any other claim, we will attach it to a VA form 21-526EZ application for benefits and send it to the VA.

Currently, the VA will make a decision to approve or deny

Christians fought against Christians. The British and French soldiers (who were Christian) fought against German soldiers (who were also Christian). This cousin has an addiction to pain medicine. This niece married outside of the Church. That sister is overweight and her health is declining. Some subjects we can't talk about, because there would arise too much emotion, even anger.

During the First World War, problems with one another. The best we can hope for is to sing a few Christmas songs, like "Silent Night," and imagine what it would be like if we were all at peace.

But it is precisely in such

imperfect families that we the fighting stopped for one hearthe voice of our Heavenly Father. The book of Sirach gives us a few lessons on living as a family – the father should honor his wife and his children. Likewise, the children should honor their parents, even into old age. "Take care of your father when he is old. .. Even if his mind fails, be considerate of him. Revile him not all the days of his life. Kindness to a father will not

> be forgotten." (Sir. 3:12-13) As parents become older, they become like children again. We may need to help them get dressed, help them eat their food, help them to bathe. We may even need to scold them when they are doing something harmful. But we must do these things with reverence and honor towards

In Paul's letter to the Colossians, Paul is speaking not just to one family, but to the whole church community (Col. 3:12-14). We are bound together also – not by blood, but by our common baptism. We have the same spiritual Father, we have the same Mother Mary, and we are God's children by adoption - brothers and sisters in Christ. Fulton Sheen was an American Catholic bishop who preached on the radio and television many years ago, in the middle of the last century. He is sometimes called the first televangelist.

Archbishop Sheen said this: "Our Lord spent three hours redeeming us, three years teaching us, and 30 years in obeying his parents, so that a rebellious, proud, independent world might know the value of obedience." Three hours redeeming us as

he hung upon the Cross. Three years teaching us as he walked the pathways of Galilee. And for 30 years as a child and young man, he was learning how to obey his parents and his Father in prayer.

Our families are not perfect. And they are certainly not Holy. But there is holiness within them. There is goodness within them. And we can still learn obedience within them. Like Jesus, we must learn first to obey - to be obedient to our parents, to our spouse, to our religious superior, to our vocation, to our conscience. Only then can we truly hear the voice of the Father.




