# Baby steps

### Early stages of building new hospital

It is months away from breaking ground, but Purcell City Council and Purcell Municipal Hospital board took the first step Tuesday toward a new hospital and medical office building.

In a joint special meeting, the council gave its approval to a pre-development reimbursement agreement with Miller/Neff Development, LLC, an Oklahoma City firm.

The pre-development budget of \$170,000 covers 90 days and includes \$120,000 for preliminary architecture and engineering fees, \$30,000 for development overhead fees, \$15,000 for survey, platting and zoning permits and \$5,000 for legal services.

Hospital board president David Shirley said the board met with four development companies before settling on Miller/Neff.

He said the firm is one "we felt we could work with and the city could work with."

"We are taking the first step tonight," Shirley said.

Before council members voted to accept the agreement, Mayor Ted Cox also noted the action is "just an agreement to start the process" of getting a new hospital.

Ben Oglesby with Municipal Financial Services briefly addressed

financing the new facility.

In visiting with one bank last week, Oglesby learned this isn't a project that can be financed at a fixed rate for 20 years.

"It will probably be a fixed rate for five years and then reset every five years," he explained.

On the plus side, "there is interest out there (banks)," he continued. "People are talking about it."

Financing could be the responsibility of the city and PMH or it could be left to the developer to fund the construction.

In that case, the developer would own the hospital and medical office building and would lease it to the city which would then operate it.

All of the free-standing St. Anthony, Mercy and Integris emergency departments across the metro are developer-owned and are leased by the respective hospitals.

According to the company's website, Miller/Neff is an innovator in the state's healthcare market and developed the first freestanding emergency departments in Oklahoma.

"Our approach is characterized by an emphasis on striking yet cost-effective designs and innovative interior environments that translate to superior operational efficiencies for

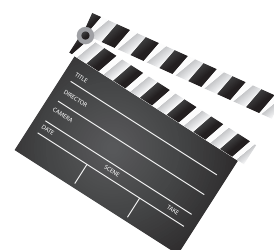

# Harboring runaway

## Norman man charged here

A 26-year-old Norman man allegedly harbored a 17-year-old female runaway and is charged in McClain County District Court as a result.

Jesse E. Zendejas is charged with contributing to the delinquency of a minor and permitting an unauthorized minor to operate a motor vehicle.

Both charges are misdemeanors.

Zendejas is free after posting \$3,000 bond.

According to an affidavit, a McClain County deputy sheriff went to Zendejas' residence on Whippoorwill Drive on the evening of January 15 after receiving word the run-

away teen was staying there. Zendejas and the girl arrived a short time later and the girl was driving.

It wasn't the first time authorities had been to the house looking for the girl. During previous visits, Zendejas and others at the home were warned the teen was a runaway and they shouldn't allow her to stay there.

When questioned, the teen told the deputy she had been at the home about a month.

When the deputy ran a check, he learned the girl didn't have a valid driver's license. Despite this, however, Zendejas allowed her to drive his vehicle, according to the affidavit.

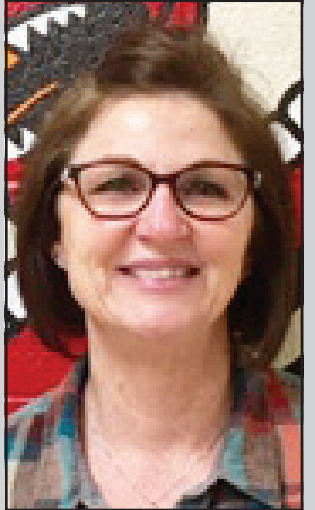

## Precinct 2 closed

### Voters to receive absentee ballots

Paoli Public Schools will close Precinct 2 for the annual school election on February 12.

Karen Haley, McClain County Election Board secretary, said state law allows a school district to close a precinct polling place if the entire precinct is not contained within the district's boundaries and if there are fewer than 100 registered voters in that part of the precinct that is inside the school district.

There are approximately seven voters in the part of Precinct 2 that is located in the Paoli school district.

Those Precinct 2 voters who have addresses inside the school district will receive an application for absentee ballots from the County Election Board.

## Oklahoma Hall of Fame offers scholarships

The Oklahoma Scholarship Competition provides an opportunity for Oklahoma high school students to earn cash scholarships and tuition grants for college.

With at least eight scholarships in each county available, students compete based on their knowledge of Oklahoma history, our people, and geography.

"This program is designed to reward Oklahoma students who have taken an interest in the rich history of our great state," said Shannon L. Rich, Oklahoma Hall of Fame and Gaylord-Pickens Museum president and CEO. "We hope that it also encourages our students to stay in state to attend college and remain here to live and work after receiving their degrees."

Individual donors and Oklahoma colleges and universities

provide the cash scholarships and tuition grants in the counties of their choice.

In addition to schools statewide offering tuition grants to students in various counties, Oklahoma City University, Oklahoma Christian University, Bacone College, Southern Nazarene University, Oklahoma Panhandle State University, Rose State College, Tulsa Community College, the University of Central Oklahoma, and the University of Science and Arts of Oklahoma have made tuition waivers available in all 77 counties.

The test will be given on Saturday, March 2, at locations statewide, including Oklahoma City, Fairview, Stillwater, Tulsa, Bartlesville, Edmond, Altus, Ada, Ardmore, McAlester, Durant, Lawton and Enid. Students in grades nine through 12 are eligible to sit for the examination, and all students must pre-register by Friday, February 15.

### Explanation of use tax:

(This is in addition to the sales tax reported monthly.) Every state with a sales tax has a companion tax for outside the state. In Oklahoma, that tax is called "use tax."

Those having purchased items for use in Oklahoma from retailers who do not collect Oklahoma sales tax, the buyer owes the state use tax on those items.

The use tax in the state was first enacted in 1937.

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# Diabetes prevention classes open to general public at no charge

The American Diabetes Association estimates that more than 14 percent of the adult population of Oklahoma has diabetes, with an additional 36 percent of the population in the prediabetes range. Rates are even higher in the Native American population.

While the disease has a long list of devastating side effects, lifestyle changes have been shown to reduce the risk of developing type 2 diabetes by up to 71 percent.

Classes teaching many of those proven lifestyle strategies are now available through the Chickasaw Nation in Ada, Ardmore, Tishomingo and Purcell.

"The classes are meant for people who have been diagnosed with prediabetes or who are at a higher risk for developing type 2 diabetes," said Lea Caufield, program coordinator of the Chickasaw

Nation Diabetes Prevention Program. "In a group setting, participants learn how to make healthier lifestyle choices that are proven to reduce the risk of them developing type 2 diabetes."

Free and open to the public, classes are led by lifestyle coaches who provide tools and support to help participants improve eating habits, increase physical activity, develop healthy coping skills and practice strategies to manage stress and setbacks.

An initial class will be held at the Chickasaw Nation Purcell Health Clinic on Tuesday, January 29, from noon to 1 p.m. A schedule of class dates will be provided at the first session.

"Along with the coaches, peers help one another attain their goals," Caufield said.

"They share anecdotal experiences with what is working for them, and what isn't. It helps participants feel connected and that others are listening."

With long-term goals and sustainability in mind, classes take place over a one-year period. The 22-session program encourages adopting balanced nutrition and activity behaviors to help lose weight.

The program will reduce the risk of developing diabetes for those already prediabetic or at high risk of developing type 2 diabetes.

### Reflections on Martin Luther King Jr.

Each year, we rightly pause to remember the life of a legendary figure in American history and courageous change agent for freedom and equality.

Though Martin Luther King Jr. emerged in the midst of societal tension and conflict, his message and approach was one that sought to erase division, racism and hatred.

Without question, King set an incredible example of leadership, and he clearly recognized the tremendous weight of his calling.

While he always spoke with unapologetic conviction, King also demonstrated that tactics matter for bringing real and lasting change.

Like others, I am always inspired by King's powerful "I Have a Dream" speech, which was delivered in 1963 on the steps of the Lincoln Memorial in our nation's capital.

His words thundered with truth and vision, calling on the nation to "rise up and live out the true meaning of its creed" and recognize that "all men are created equal."

King played a defining role during the civil rights movement. He forcefully and rightfully condemned discrimination and segregation on the basis of race, and he affirmed that the "American dream" belonged to citizens of every background.

But it was the nonviolent approach he encouraged against racial injustice and prejudice that ultimately started to change minds and hearts.

While obvious problems still remain today, real strides were taken to work out some of the issues as a result of King's call to act on the "high plane of dignity and discipline."

There is nothing quite like seeing and hearing someone

of such significance in person. When I reflect on King's life, I am grateful for the memory of seeing him when I was studying at Grinnell College in October 1967.

Several months later, I was stunned and saddened to hear of his tragic death.

Having already lived through President John F. Kennedy's assassination, it was a crushing blow felt across my college campus and nationwide.

While King dedicated his life to peacefully securing civil rights and freedoms, the upset surrounding his death unfortunately set off riots and acts of violence – something he would not have wanted for success of the movement.

During a time when Americans are divided on many things, it is worth reflecting on someone who brought us together, pointed us to the better angels of our nature and liberated our history.

So without any further delay, let's finally get to those reviews.

First up is "On The Basis Of Sex."

Inspired by a true story, this film follows young lawyer and future Supreme Court Justice Ruth Bader Ginsburg (Felicity Jones), and her struggles for equal rights.

Teamed up with her husband Marty Ginsburg (Armie Hammer), a fellow attorney, the two of them bring a groundbreaking case before the U.S. Court of Appeals and in so doing attempt to overturn a century of gender discrimination.

2018 was quite the eventful year film wise for Ruth Bader Ginsburg.

Though it's just now being shown in theaters in Oklahoma, this is yet another movie that's technically a 2018 release.

Plus, in addition to this dramatized telling of Ginsburg's life, the Associate Justice also had a very well received documentary released about herself earlier in the year titled "RBG," a film I unfortunately haven't had the opportunity to check out yet.

Frankly, I'm quite happy for it.

For someone like me who wasn't alive while these influential men and women were making their marks on history, it's nice to see movies like this one, and "Marshall" back in 2017, that show a portion of these Supreme Court Justice's lives and the accomplishments that lead them to holding a seat on the highest court in the land.

And this movie does a great

job showcasing just that.

Mostly notably in the performance that Felicity Jones gives as Ginsburg.

The amount of sheer nonsense Ginsburg had to put up with, solely because she's a woman, was pretty staggering.

Infuriating moments like the Dean of Harvard Law asking the female law students "Why are you at Harvard Law School, taking the place of a man?" and Ginsburg herself being rejected at law firms post graduation solely because of her gender, despite being the top of her class.

Through it all though, Ginsburg holds remarkable poise and keeps this wonderful earnest enthusiasm despite all the mud flung her way.

Jones does a wonderful job portraying that person. It's almost impossible not to get caught up in her sheer passion while watching the film. Her performance was definitely the biggest highlight of the movie for me.

For better or worse though, the story itself is a bit on the formulaic side, with a majority of the plot being focused on a single case. One where the law discriminated on the basis of sex against a man.

Anyone who's seen a courtroom drama before won't find the overall story all that surprising, but it's well told, easy to follow, and in the end is quite moving.

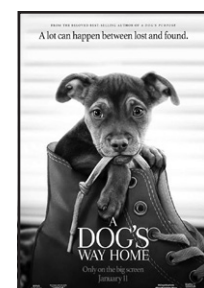
If I had a complaint, I think the people Ginsburg is fighting against, those vying for the status quo, do seem a bit like cartoon villains at times. But in the film's defense, I doubt anyone could come across as anything remotely reasonable with beliefs so anti-equality.

At least not to anyone with a modern day perspective.

All in all, this is a fine film with an interesting story and a brilliant lead performance. If you have any interest in Ruth Bader Ginsburg and wish to see at least a small portion of what made her a woman of such renown, this is an easy movie to recommend.

sets off on a 400-mile journey to get back to the safety and security of the place she calls home.

Along the way, she meets a series of new friends and manages to bring a little bit of comfort and joy to their lives.

When I saw “A Dog’s Purpose” back in 2017 I could have never imagined we were seeing the birth of a new movie franchise.

Not only do we have this movie, which doesn’t have anything to do with the last film in the series besides featuring the same writer and a talking dog, we’re also getting a true sequel to “A Dog’s Purpose” titled “A Dog’s Journey” set to release this May.

If I didn’t know better I’d say it’s almost like they’re laying plans for A Dog’s cinematic universe, since the first one performed so well at the box office.

I guess that’ll teach me to ever doubt people’s adoration for a good old fashioned talking dog film.

Oddly enough, though they both share a writer in W. Bruce Cameron, the two films come from completely different production companies and have two separate studios footing the bill, with Universal holding the rights to “A Dog’s Purpose” and “A Dog’s Way Home” being a Sony production.

Unfortunately though, a change in studio doesn’t equal an improvement in quality and “A Dog’s Way Home” ends up being the same kind of sentimental schlock the last film was.

Let’s start with the voice acting.

Bryce Dallas Howard not only does the voice of Bella, the main character in the film, she also plays the role of narrator, meaning a large majority of this movie revolves around her performance.

To be clear I don’t have any issue with Howard herself. I think she’s a fine enough actress and she’s been great in many other roles.

That said, her performance in this movie made me want to rip my ears off.

It’s like her voice was one step above baby talk. The same tone of voice you would use for telling a bedtime story to a child.

And it wasn’t just the condescending high pitched tone of her performance that drove me insane. The dialogue itself was so cloying and saccharine it made me feel like I was drowning in a olympic swimming pool filled with maple syrup.

It was just painful. Maybe very young children would enjoy a performance this patronizing, but it just made me wish the movie would hurry up and end.

The storytelling here is also subpar and ridiculously predictable.

If you’ve seen “Homeward Bound” you’ve more or less seen this film.

The only major differences in this film being a longer setup for the journey home, lower quality voice acting, and instead of using a seesaw to fling a mountain lion into a river, Bella decides to actually befriend the cougar in this movie.

Let’s talk about that cougar for a second.

In “Homeward Bound” the filmmakers used clever editing techniques and tricks of the camera to make it seem like the pets were in danger while confronting a number of real wild animals, but they never once actually put the dogs in harm’s way.

This film forgoes any film-making techniques and just makes all the wild animals computer generated, the most notable of which being Bella’s cougar pal.

I’ll admit, the giant cat looks pretty decent during night time

scenes. If the cougar had only been shown in the dark I might have even thought it was real.

Daytime is a completely different story though, and in winter, when there’s snow on the ground, that cat sticks out like a sore thumb.

I know this film doesn’t have the biggest budget, and there’s only so much even the most talented animators can do with those kind of strict limitations, but it’s like they didn’t even try to make it blend in.

Like they knew their audience wouldn’t care about the giant fake looking kitty cat, so they might as well not put any effort behind it.

And sadly they’re probably right

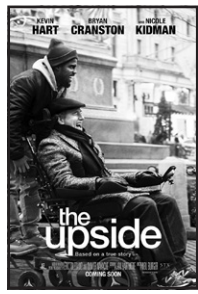
I doubt many people going to see this movie care about the technical aspects of it. They’re looking for a sweet happy film with a tearjerker ending, and this film delivers just that.

Personally though, it felt more sappy and emotionally manipulative than anything. Not only does the movie feature a cute dog reunite with her owner, but they also throw in a few United States veterans to pull at the audience’s more patriotic heartstrings. At the end of the day though, this clearly isn’t a movie meant for me. At least not at my age. My four-year-old doggy loving self probably would have loved it though.

If you have a kid who loves animals, or if you’re just a huge unabashed dog lover, this is an easy movie to recommend. Those who enjoy a bit more effort and substance behind their feel good films should probably look elsewhere though.

“A Dog’s Way Home” is rated PG.

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Third this week is “The Upside.”

Inspired by a true story, this film follows Phil (Bryan Cranston), a depressed billionaire paralyzed from the neck down, who feels his life is no longer worth living.

To help him with his day to day routine, he hires Dell (Kevin Hart), a paroled convict, trying to reconnect with his estranged wife. What begins as a professional relationship develops into a friendship as Dell helps his grouchy employer see the joy in living.

How lovely. Another tale of a film stuck in production limbo for years. Back in 2011, in addition to buying the U.S. distribution rights of “The Intouchables,” a critically acclaimed French film based on the true story of a paralyzed Philippe Pozzo di Borgo and his caregiver Abdel Sellou, The Weinstein Company also acquired the rights to remake “The Intouchables” in English.

Years go by, directors come and go, and after considering multiple leads including Colin Firth, Chris Rock, Jamie Foxx, Idris Elba, and Chris Tucker they finally settle on Bryan Cranston and Kevin Hart with Neil Burger all set to direct.

By 2017 the film was finally done and had its premiere at the Toronto International Film Festival on September 8. Everything was hunky-dory and the movie was all set to release March 2018.

Then #MeToo happened. The Weinstein Company was annihilated after numerous reports of Harvey Weinstein’s sexual abuse allegations, leading to a complete shutdown of the production company.

But like many companies with poor public image, The Weinstein Company didn’t really go away. It was reborn under a new name.

A Dallas-based equity firm

named Lantern Capital Partners bought the shamed company’s assets, including this film, and formed Lantern Entertainment.

Finally, after nearly eight years in production purgatory, “The Upside” was at last released to audiences.

So was it worth all the drama to get this movie produced? Is one of the last remnants of Harvey Weinstein’s legacy actually worth seeing despite the man himself allegedly being a real life monster?

Well, surprisingly yes. In fact I enjoyed this movie quite a bit more than I was expecting to.

Frankly, I was shocked how funny it was.

I know Kevin Hart and Bryan Cranston both have the comedic chops to carry a film from their past work, but I couldn’t help but feel a little wary after some of their more recent comedies like Hart’s “Night School” and Cranston’s “Why Him?”

Thankfully though, the two of them work wonderfully together.

The chemistry between Hart and Cranston is just so fun to watch. Some of the most hilarious parts are just watching Cranston’s face as he tries not to crack up at something Hart’s character said or did.

This movie also has a remarkably high number of puns, jokes that play on words, and most remarkable of all, those puns end up being some of the funniest parts of the film.

Unfortunately, the story itself leaves a bit more to be desired.

The plot kind of feels like one big cliché and there’s just something about the story doesn’t quite click together. All this leads to an ending that feels more tacked on than anything earned.

Despite those issues though, I ended up having a great time. I’m not saying the film isn’t rough around the edges, and it certainly won’t be winning any awards, but the talent of Hart and especially Cranston really shines through here.

If you’re in the market for a heartfelt comedy with a lot of laughs, you can do much worse than checking out this film.

“The Upside” is rated PG-13.

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Last this week is “Glass.”

In this sequel to “Unbreakable” and “Split,” David Dunn (Bruce Willis), Elijah Price a.k.a. Mr. Glass (Samuel L. Jackson), plus Kevin Wendell Crumb (James McAvoy) and the multiple identities who reside within are all back.

Following the conclusion of “Split,” Glass finds Dunn pursuing Crumb’s superhuman figure of The Beast in a series of escalating encounters, while the shadowy presence of Mr. Glass emerges as an orchestrator who holds secrets critical to both men.

Oh M. Night Shyamalan. On one hand he’s given us great movies like “The Sixth Sense,” “Unbreakable,” and “Split.” On the other hand he’s responsible for utter garbage. Films like “Lady in the Water,” “After Earth” and worse of all “The Last Airbender.”

The man might be the most consistently inconsistent director in the filmmaking business right now.

For every great movie, he’s made one its complete opposite, terrible in every way. You never quite know what kind of quality you’re in for with a Shyamalan flick.

So which Shyamalan did we get this time around? Is it the captivating storyteller or is it the Hollywood hack we’ve

come to know all too often?

Well there’s one side of Shyamalan I haven’t mentioned yet. The mediocre one.

The guy who makes movies with good moments and interesting concepts, but in the end they don’t quite land because sloppy execution. Think “The Village.”

That’s where “Glass” lands unfortunately.

Like I said though, there’s still quite a bit to like here. Most of all being the performances.

James McAvoy might not come across quite as sinister here as he did in “Split,” but he’s still giving his all for this bizarre and remarkably compelling character.

It’s just so fun to watch him slip in and out of all these different personalities, each with their own unique mannerisms and ways of speaking. It’s almost like watching a one man play. His performance is easily the best part of this movie.

But he isn’t the only one who shines here. Sam Jackson is back reprising a role from over 18 years ago and it’s like the man stopped being Mr. Glass. If fact, I think he’s better than ever.

When it comes to villains, there’s nothing I love more than a mastermind. Someone who outsmarts everyone, all while making his foes feel like they had the upper hand the entire time.

Luckily for me, Jackson definitely delivers, and is finally given a chance to show the true genius of Mr. Glass.

Bruce Willis is also here, and he’s...well he’s Bruce Willis playing Bruce Willis. But Bruce Willis makes for a fine Bruce Willis, and who doesn’t love Bruce Willis, so who am I to complain about Bruce Willis?

Like I said before though this movie definitely has its issues, and sadly the story doesn’t quite live up to the fantastic characters which happen to occupy it.

It just feels so sloppy. The plot here lost me from the very beginning.

I’ll try to be as vague as possible and avoid details, but if you’re someone who prefers to go into movies completely blind you might stop reading here and skip to my conclusion.

First the film tries to make us believe a fact which is completely at odds with the previous two movies in the series. Something entirely unbelievable

able which would altogether undermine everything these movies have worked towards.

The movie ends up spending over half its runtime on this assumption that would totally undercut the message of the first film, “Unbreakable.” I knew from the very beginning, either the audience was being told something completely false, or Shyamalan was actively trying to ruin his legacy. Either way it didn’t make for a particularly satisfying narrative.

Eventually more twists are revealed, one of which seemed like an ill conceived, half baked contrivance to connect the two previous films closer together.

## Bill filing for 2019 legislative session

Thursday was the deadline for filing bills to be considered during the 2019 legislative session. Together, the legislature will consider just over 2,800 bills and joint resolutions. Sen. Paul Scott, R-Duncan, filed 22 bills for the upcoming session. His final bills were filed Thursday afternoon.

“I’m often asked how I decide what legislation I will introduce to be heard during session. I get a majority of the ideas from the people of Senate District 43 and the others come from organizations and state agencies.

“For example, I often experience issues within my own profession that give me ideas on how to improve our medical services in Oklahoma,” said Scott. “If there’s an issue that you feel needs to be addressed in the legislature, please contact me. Good communication is a key element in running efficient state government that takes care of the needs of its citizens.”

• SB 781 Private Courier Carry – addresses the problem

of companies like Uber and Lift that have agreements banning their drivers from being allowed to carry a legal firearm in their private vehicle. This prohibition also applies to passengers.

This bill provides clear language supporting the driver and a legal civil recourse for the illegal act. Uber and Lift are liberal companies out of California trying to restrict gun rights in Oklahoma.

• SB 893 reinstates an income tax deduction for fostering children. Individuals must foster a minimum of six months to be eligible for the deduction.

• SB 891 creates a sales tax exemption for hearing aids. This was a request by the Silver Haired Legislature.

• SB 896 Title 47 - County Improvements for Road and Bridges (CIRB) - increases the cap on revenue flowing to the CIRB Fund from \$120 million to \$150 million. This was a request bill from the Oklahoma County Commissioners. (Funding for county roads and bridges is not funded

by ODOT.)

• SB 955 creates the Radiologic Technologists Licensure Act. After Jan. 1, 2021, anyone who is not a licensed practitioner as defined in Section 2 of this act who performs fluoroscopy, nuclear medicine technology, radiation therapy or radiography or other radiologic technology or radiation therapy procedures for medical diagnostic or therapeutic purposes as determined by the State Board of Medical Licensure and Supervision, shall be licensed by the Board.

• SB 968 creates a criminal liability for any state employee who creates or possesses appropriated public funds which are not reported to the Legislature, or that are not designed for a particular purpose by a federal grant or state statute.

They will be charged with felony embezzlement and face up to a \$500 fine, one to 20 years in prison and will be disqualified from ever holding public office.

These voters also may vote by absentee ballot at the County Election Board office from 8 a.m. until 6 p.m. February 7 or February 8.

Any registered voter in Precinct 2 who believes that he or she may reside in the Paoli school district and who has not yet received an absentee ballot application should contact the election board.

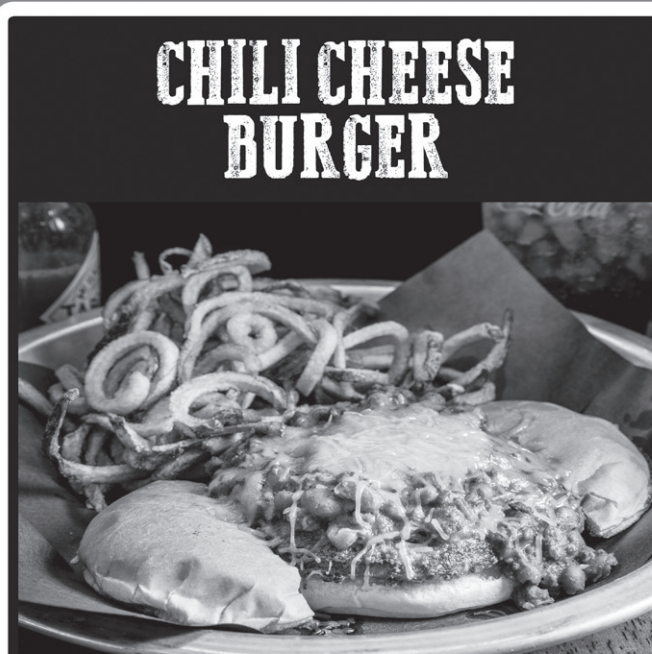

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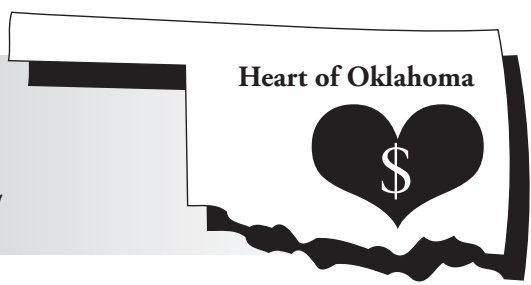
# A month of gains, losses

This month the Oklahoma Tax Commission gave back \$164,563,429 in sales tax revenue to the state's municipalities. That compares to \$153,649,066 returned a year

ago. Cities and towns also shared in a use tax disbursement totaling \$23,910,502. The returns are based on sales from November 16-30

and estimated sales from December 1-15. Counties received \$28,803,038 and \$4,667,029 in sales and use taxes, respectively.

## Is stomach 'flu' really the flu?

Stomach bugs are making the rounds in the Sooner State this winter, bringing with them nausea, vomiting, diarrhea, abdominal cramping and general misery.

Many refer to this type of illness as "stomach flu," but is it really the flu?

"No," said Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation immunologist Hal Scofield, M.D. "Although some may call it stomach 'flu,' it actually has nothing to do with the influenza virus."

More accurately called gastroenteritis, contagious stomach illness is most often caused by two viruses, rotavirus or norovirus. Diarrhea and vomiting, the most common symptoms, typically last about 24 hours.

Influenza, on the other hand, affects the respiratory system. "Flu causes cough, sore throat and runny nose, as well as

severe body aches and fever, often over 101 degrees," said OMRF immunologist Eliza Chakravarty, M.D. "The stomach flu has none of those except maybe a fever, but it will be low-grade."

Gastroenteritis is generally not as serious as influenza, which kills tens of thousands in the U.S. each year, said Scofield. "A stomach virus may make you feel worse at the beginning, but it's over fairly quickly and is considerably less lethal than the flu."

Still, that doesn't mean gastroenteritis isn't dangerous, warned Scofield. The biggest risk is dehydration as a result of diarrhea and vomiting, coupled with the inability to keep down any fluids.

"Dehydration is dangerous and can set in very quickly, especially in infants and young children," said Scofield. "Ba-

bies can't tell you how thirsty they are, so parents need to be on alert, because dehydration can turn deadly in severe cases."

Doctors suggest parents look for signs in infants like a sunken soft spot on the top of the head, crying with no tears, dry mouth, no wet diapers for six hours and unusual sleepiness or lack of responsiveness.

Scofield has spent considerable time studying medical history, but he's not sure when or how gastroenteritis picked up the "flu" label. "Maybe because it comes around the same time of year as the flu?"

Whatever you call them, stomach bugs are worth avoiding. "Wash your hands and stay away from those who are sick if you can," Scofield said. "Because if you come down with a stomach virus, the only cure is to ride it out."

"Henry Flad, Mr. Eads' first assistant, recommended using cantilever construction sitting on top of the piers and abutments to support the spans. ## Treating lice: A wintertime threat

The cold of winter doesn't stop all the external parasites that can torment livestock. While flies and ticks are mainly warm-weather pests, we still have lice to contend with in the winter.

Lice are wingless insects that live on the skin of various species, including horses, cattle, sheep, goats and, of course, humans. Lice are spread by direct contact between animals but are species specific. In other words, lice cannot be transmitted across species.

Lice on cattle cannot affect a horse, sheep or goat and vice versa. And the best news: lice that affect livestock cannot infest humans.

There are two main families of lice — biting (or chewing) and sucking lice.

Biting lice feed on skin and skin secretions, while sucking lice have a long, piercing mouthpiece that allows them to draw and feed on blood.

Lice infestations cause intense itching. Livestock can spend a tremendous amount of time rubbing and licking in an effort to alleviate their discomfort. They can spend so much time doing this that it affects their feed intake, feed efficiency, weight gain and growth, which can result in a significant financial hit for the enterprise.

Further, because of their ability to drain blood, sucking lice can cause severe anemia and devastate young calves.

Lice thrive in winter. Their survival and transmission is enhanced by long-hair coats and huddling behavior.

The first indications of lice infestations in livestock are excessive rubbing (on things such as fence posts and buildings) and licking. Remember that healthy cattle naturally groom daily, licking their sides and upweeping the hair.

Lice, however, will induce rubbing and licking to the point of removing hair and damaging the skin beneath. The extreme grooming can produce hairballs, which can cause obstructions in the stomach and intestines of infested animals. Patchy hair loss typically starts on the neck and back, extending down the sides of the body and legs. Animals should be examined along the topline to look for the lice or their eggs, which are most easily seen on black hair.

Veterinarians do the Scotch tape test, where they stick a piece of tape onto the animal to pick up any lice that are present. Examining the lice on that tape under a microscope shows

the mouthpiece and identifies the offending lice as biting or sucking. Classifying the lice found helps guide treatment.

The animal itself serves as the only source of food for lice, and a louse cannot survive off the animal for more than a day or so. Therefore, the primary focus for control of these parasites is the animal rather than the environment.

Caveats to this include situations where cattle may be sharing tack or bedding, as happens with exhibition animals. Moving a halter from one animal to another or placing an animal in a stall just vacated by another animal are examples of how transmission occurs aside from animal-to-animal contact.

Products to control lice include dusts, sprays, pour-ons and charges for back rubbers. Consider the number of animals, the facilities they're in, labor available to apply the solution and the cost when selecting the treatment.

No treatment kills the eggs, so a repeat treatment is necessary once the eggs have hatched. This second treatment, two to three weeks after the first, helps break the life cycle and stops future generations from coming. All animals in the group need to be treated, regardless of how many are showing signs of infestation. Be sure to follow the manufacturer's instructions for product use and follow all withdrawal times.

Some injectable and pour-on dewormers, like ivermectin and its cousins doramectin and moxidectin, also kill lice. In the wintertime, worm control is not a high priority because the conditions are not right for transmission. Treatment with dewormers when transmission is low encourages the development of drug-resistant worms.

In addition, injectable products only kill sucking lice — biting lice do not ingest blood, which contains the drug.

Several years ago, I was called to look at a group of stocker calves that were losing their hair and scratching constantly.

This group had been given an injectable dewormer with activity against sucking lice and yet they were showing clear signs of lice.

We ran a few through the chute and did the Scotch tape test. When we looked under the microscope, they were all biting lice. Because the anti-lice medication was in the blood, it wasn't getting to the lice.

We recommended that all the calves be put through the chute and poured with an insecticide. The problem cleared. For all these reasons, I generally

recommend wintertime lice control using pure insecticide products applied topically in some fashion, saving your dewormers (and their associated cost) for timely use in the spring and fall.

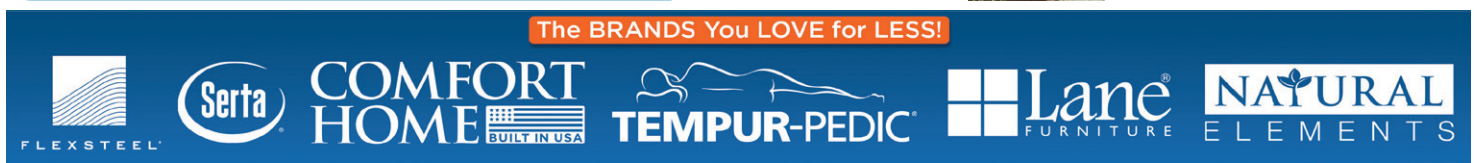
The free trees are part of the Foundation's Trees for America campaign.

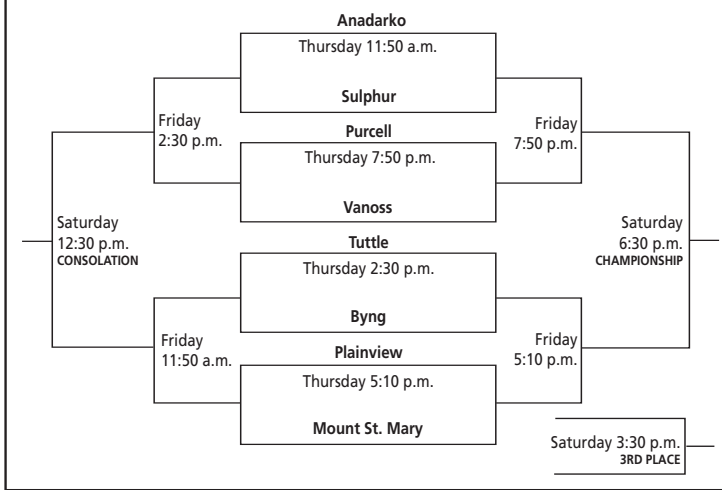

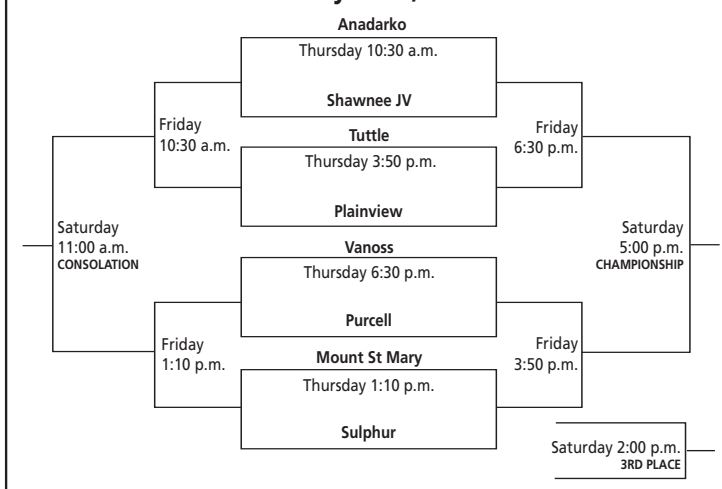

## Our Lady of Victory Catholic Church

The book of Judith is set in a time when Israel was conquered by an outside invader, the Assyrian army. The Jewish people stubbornly resist, but eventually they are held captive in a large town outside of Jerusalem. The army cuts off the water supply and the people begin to suffer greatly. Their king, Uzziah, promises the people that God will deliver them in five days.

Judith is a widow in the town, a very devout person, and well respected. She goes to the Jewish king and scolds him. She says to him: "It is not right that you make promises for God. It is not right to put God to the test. You cannot understand the human heart or the human mind. How can you possibly know the mind of God and understand his plan?" (Judith 8) Eventually, Judith is given a crucial role to help set the people free from the enemy.

This story reminds me that we, too, cannot know the mind of God. We cannot force God's hand to work when we want it to work. We cannot force the movement of the Holy Spirit that will blow where it will and under its own design and wisdom.

If we could control God, then he wouldn't really be God. If we could control the Spirit, then it wouldn't really be a spirit. It would be like trying to catch the reflection of light in our hands, as we did when we were children.

When we celebrate the sacraments, we hope that God's grace will flow in abundance at the time of our celebration. God's grace is, yes, present at the time of the sacrament. But it may be a long time before the sacrament reaches its full effect in the life of a believer.

I was ordained on July 19, 1986, at St. Louis Church in

Austin, Texas. At that time, I had many of the skills necessary to be a good priest. I had the desire and was open to God's graces. But I did not fall in love with the priesthood until much later, until I was working with the Jesuit fathers in Mobile, Alabama. It was there that I decided once and for all that I will be a priest forever in the line of Melchizedek, and I live now fully and completely for this vocation.

I think it must be the same in marriage. The young couple is excited and giddy with love on their wedding day. But they don't really become married until they have been through a few years of struggles in their marriage, maybe have had a few arguments and learned how to resolve them as a couple. The seal of their marriage bond may happen only years later as they both become more mature.

We are right now preparing young people for Confirmation. They are in ninth and 10th grade and are 15-16 years old. There are many changes happening in their lives right now. Very few of them can say in a mature way "I want to follow Jesus in the Catholic Church as long as I live." They can certainly be open to the Holy Spirit and will receive some graces of discernment. But it may take more time for them to discover their particular gift from the Holy Spirit.

Some of them will be gifted teachers. Some will discover the gift of healing and become a doctor or nurse. Many will discover the gift of understanding a variety of peoples, the gift of tolerance and acceptance. Many of them will discover the gift of service to others. Most of them will be blessed with a faith that comes only through trial and times of darkness.

St. Therese of Lisieux tells

this story of when she was a little girl. Her mother had died, so her father was raising five children. One Christmas Eve, she overheard her father telling someone "This will be the last Christmas that we will get gifts for Therese. She is getting older now, and besides we can't afford to buy so many Christmas gifts anymore."

When she heard this, Therese thought to herself "I can either be angry and disappointed, or I can accept it and enjoy this last year of gifts." She chose to do the latter. She accepted the decision of her father completely and settled in to enjoy the Christmas with him.

Later she realized that this was one of the turning points in her life. It was a moment of discovering the Spirit of calm acceptance, of embracing a disappointment with grace, and it was a gift that she could treasure the rest of her life. She discovered the joy of self-forgetfulness and added, "I felt, in a word, charity enter my heart, the need to forget myself to make others happy."

We don't know when the gifts of the Spirit will be revealed to us. We only know and trust that they will, because it is the same God of love working in each one of us.

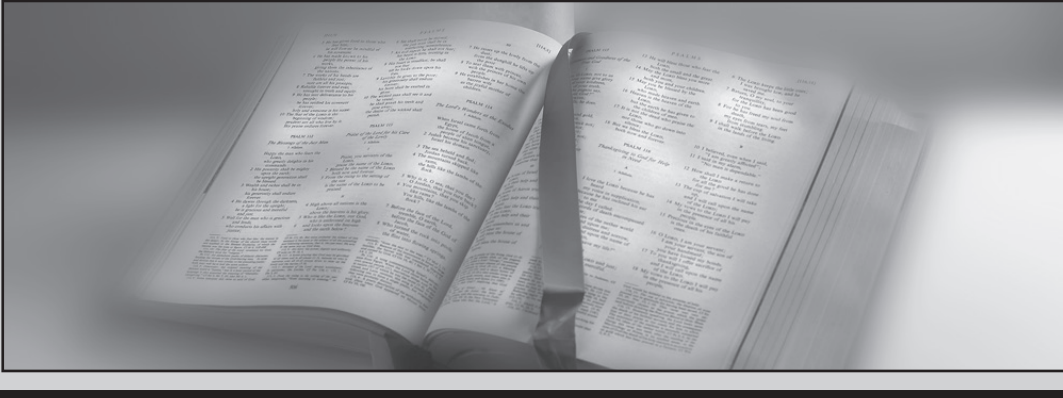

We hosted a wonderful concert given by The Archer Family Vocal Edition this past Sunday afternoon. They are a family group of six children plus their father who play and sing a wide variety of traditional gospel songs and hymns accompanied by live music. Each member of the group plays a number of instruments including piano, keyboard, guitars, banjo, ukulele, melodicas, recorder, flute, harmonica, trumpets, autoharp and various percussion instruments.

Pastor David Cook has started a sermon series on the apostles. He began with Peter, who was originally a fisherman from the village of Bethsaida in Galilee. His brother Andrew was also an apostle. New Testament tradition holds that Peter confessed Jesus was the Messiah as part of Jesus's inner circle, denied knowing Jesus three times, preached on the day of Pentecost, and was crucified in Rome under Emperor Nero. It is said that he was crucified

upside down at his own request, since he saw himself unworthy to be crucified in the same way as Jesus.

The New Testament includes two letters attributed to Peter. Some believe they were written by different people; they may have been written by a secretary or even the messenger who delivered the letters. 1 Peter is thought to be written earlier than 2 Peter and talks of the persecution of the early Christians by the Roman government. They are thought to have been written between 65-68 AD since Peter was martyred by Nero around 68 AD.

The Christians described as persecuted could refer to those only in Rome, but might possibly include those in Asia Minor since the letter is addressed to Jewish Christians in the regions of Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia and Bithynia. While the new Christians have encountered oppression and hostility from locals, Peter advises them to maintain loyalty to both their religion and the Roman Empire.

He advises them to remain steadfast and persist under persecution; attend to the practical duties of a holy life by following the example of Christ; and closes with counsel to pastors and the people in the letter's

last chapter.

In 2 Peter, the author presents himself as Peter the Apostle and may have written the letter during his time as Bishop of Rome or Bishop of Antioch, though neither title is used in the epistle. He describes himself as an eyewitness to Jesus' ministry. It criticizes "false teachers" who distort the authentic, apostolic tradition, and predicts judgment for them. 2 Peter explains that God has delayed the Second Coming of Christ so that more people will have the chance to reject evil and find salvation.

Peter's advice is good for us too: follow Jesus as our example; live without losing faith and without bitterness; remember to stand fast on the word of God; and hold on to the hope of Jesus return in the near future. In the meantime, let us work to return to a kinder and more loving society that many of us came to know in the past.

We practice "Open Hearts... Open Minds... Open Doors..." We are a community of recovering sinners--you don't have to be perfect to join with us. If a man were on the fence on the matter, there is little doubt he would have been convinced to throw in with the atheists before the night was over.

But one old gray-haired woman on the back row was not on the fence, and she was less than impressed with the infidel's presentation. About halfway through, she had heard all she wanted to hear. Abruptly, she stood up at her seat up by the back wall. Softly, she began to sing that old hymn that Christians have sung through the ages: "Stand up, stand up for Jesus, ye soldiers of the cross ..."

The speaker noted the distraction, but he ignored the woman and just raised his voice a little higher and continued his assault on this silly idea of a God. Pretty soon, though, the woman raised her voice a little; and, before you knew it, a man from a few rows in front of her stood up and began singing with her.

## Washington OK. Dale K. Graham Veteran's Foundation

As a VA Accredited Claims Agent for more than 21,000 veterans and surviving spouses, some of their VA claims will be denied. Our next step is to challenge that ruling three times. When this doesn't work, and the claim is denied, a Notice of Disagreement will be filed to start the appeal process.

As the claim works its way through the VA appeals system, some claims will end up at the Board of Veterans Affairs. The BVA will then schedule us for a video conference before a VA Administrative Law Judge who will preside at a local hearing via a link to their office in Washington, DC.

Until recently, these hearings were held in Muskogee requiring both the veterans or surviving spouses to travel as well as our volunteers. Around trip from Norman to Muskogee involved around six hours in travel time alone. The hearings were brief and spanned less than 30 minutes.

Our Veteran of the Week is Henry Gowan who served honorably during the Korean War.

We had another busy week assisting veterans and the surviving spouses. Our volunteers helped more than 300 with their claims and questions. People ask us every day why and how do we continue to do so much for veterans and their families. Our answer is always the same: it's because if we don't help our brothers and sisters chances are no one else will. I believe the men and women who volunteer with us know what the young men and women returning from active duty have faced.

Many of them are scarred both physically and emotionally from things that occurred to them and their buddies. No one is going to reach out to them to offer encouragement or any type of support. I believe our volunteers are the reason veterans from 48 states and four countries are traveling to Norman. Each day we receive calls from veterans who were injured in the military and denied benefits. My answer to all of them is to visit us, and we may be able to help them receive approval for VA benefits.

Last week I received the following rating decisions from the Department of Veterans Affairs for the men and women represented. Sixteen veterans were awarded a 100 percent rating for their service-connected disabilities. They will receive a combined annual income of \$630,647 per year and are also eligible for several other federal and state benefits such as property tax exemption on their primary residence, sales tax exemption, reduced auto tags, and other benefits. Forty-seven veterans were awarded service-connection of their disabilities ranging from 10-90 percent. They will receive an annual combined amount of \$775,927 per year.

One of the things we have not written about lately are the benefits for a helpless child of a veteran rated at 100 percent. If a dependent became disabled before their 18th birthday, they might qualify for payments as a helpless child. We encourage veterans who have a child who might be eligible visit us any Tuesday or Thursday morning. One of the presumptive diseases for children of a male veteran who served in Vietnam is Spina-Bifida. Female veterans who served there have a longer list of presumptive conditions for which their children may qualify.

One of the reasons we encourage all veterans to apply for benefits is the high cost of medical care. Did you know that most veterans do not qualify for VA Health Care unless they have a service-connected disability or are living below the poverty level? Over the

last 20 years, we have helped tens of thousands of veterans to qualify for VA Healthcare by assisting them to receive a service-connected disability rating. Even if a veteran only receives a zero percent service connection that opens the door to VA health care. This service-connection makes a huge difference for veterans who have no other options for medical care. In other words that 10 percent rating for Tinnitus might save your life someday if you needed medical attention and could not afford it.

For those of you who would like to support our Veterans Foundation, we are a 501(c)(3) non-profit so your donations should be tax deductible. Since all of us are volunteers most of the money we receive goes for support of veterans and their families. We also accept the donation of cars, trucks, motorcycles, tractors, wheelchairs and other types of handicapped equipment that can be given to veterans, and their families or sold to raise operational funds.

The surviving spouses who visit us each week are a very important part of what we do. Many of them will visit us for the first time not knowing if they are eligible to receive VA benefits based on their veteran's military service. For those whose veteran was receiving VA benefits, it is usually easier to service-connect their death. Surviving spouses of veterans who served where there were presumptive diseases caused by Agent Orange, Camp Leguine or served in the Gulf War may

qualify if one of the presumptive diseases is listed on the veterans death certificate. As always, we encourage all surviving spouses to visit with one of our surviving spouse specialists.

Several organizations have services at our location each week. Legal Aid for veterans is available each Thursday morning. We also have counselors from the Vet Center here to help you each Tuesday and Thursday morning and answer questions about their services.

We are available every Tuesday and Thursday mornings at the 1268 North Interstate Drive in Norman. We open the doors by 5:30 a.m. and we begin working as soon as volunteers have their computers ready. We stop taking clients at 8 a.m. and urge you to arrive as early as possible.

This Public Notice is promulgated pursuant to the requirements of Section 25(e)(5) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended (herein "Code") and Regulation 1.25-7T thereto.

OVERVIEW OF MORTGAGE CREDIT CERTIFICATE PROGRAM The McClain County Economic Development Authority (herein "Authority") has authorized a Program for qualified home buyers within the County whereby such Authority will issue Qualified Mortgage Credit Certificates to such qualifying Home Buyers within the County which will enable them to receive an annual federal income tax credit with respect to their federal income taxes so long as the original mortgage is on the home and the Homeowner continues to live in the home for which the Mortgage Credit Certificate was issued. The Authority has entered into a contract with the MCC Administration Corporation ("Program Administrator") to administer the program. This tax credit is a dollar-for-dollar reduction in the qualifying Homeowner's federal income tax due, not just a deduction from gross income. An explanation of the eligibility requirements for this Mortgage Credit Certificate is contained within this notice and you should review it carefully to see if you qualify.

AMOUNT OF QUALIFYING HOME BUYER'S FEDERAL INCOME TAX CREDIT A holder of a Qualified Mortgage Credit Certificate issued by the Authority under the Program is entitled to a federal income tax credit equaling 50% of the interest paid on the certified indebtedness amount up to \$100,000 on the holder's home loan during that particular tax year in question. However, such qualifying Home Buyer Certificate holder is limited by Federal law to a \$2,000 per year income tax credit. Therefore, for example, if the holder paid \$4,000 of interest on the certified indebtedness amount up to \$100,000 on his or her home loan during the applicable tax year, then such holder would receive an income tax credit of \$2,000 (that is, 50% of \$4,000) and such Certificate holder would thus pay \$2,000 less in federal income taxes for the particular tax year than without the Mortgage Credit Certificate, subject to certain adjustments. The amount of tax credit will vary depending on the interest rate on each loan and is limited to 50% of the interest paid on the first \$100,000 of the home loan which is the certified indebtedness amount and a maximum of \$2,000 per year. See the certified indebtedness amount on each individual certificate.

HOW AND WHERE TO APPLY FOR THE MORTGAGE CREDIT CERTIFICATE The Mortgage Credit Certificate Program is available to persons who are purchasing a home and obtaining a loan thereon for a house in the County which is to be used as his or her principal residence. Therefore, one should apply for the Program at the Mortgage Lender of the applicant's

choice, however, such lending institution need not be located within the County. If the Mortgage Lender you contact does not have information concerning the Program, such information can be obtained by contacting MCC Administration Corporation at (405) 364-6565 or P.O. Box 1568, Norman, Oklahoma 73070. Therefore, a Home Buyer should contact a bank, savings and loan association or other mortgage lender to apply for a loan and work with the lending officer of such institution and the Program Administrator. Upon qualifying for a Mortgage Credit Certificate, such instrument will be issued by the Program Administrator. Thereafter, the Home Buyer will file a copy of the Certificate with IRS Form 8396 and IRS Form 1040. The Homeowner should thereafter be able to claim this credit every year as long as he or she lives in the home and is paying on the mortgage.

DURATION OF THE MORTGAGE CREDIT CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

Persons may obtain Mortgage Credit Certificates under the Program until December 31, 2020. Persons receiving MCC's may be required to rebate to the Federal Government a portion of the federal subsidy represented by such tax credit upon resale of the related residence within the first nine years of the loan. The MCC Program will remain until December 31, 2020, or until the maximum amount of MCC's available through the Program have been issued.

FEATURES AND LIMITATIONS ON CREDIT

A Mortgage Credit Certificate holder is allowed to take the tax credit each tax year, so long as he/she continues to live in the home for which the Mortgage Credit Certificate was issued. In addition to the tax credit, a Mortgage Credit Certificate holder is still able to take the standard mortgage interest deduction. That deduction is limited, however, to the mortgage interest paid during the year minus the amount of the tax credit for that year. For instance, if the Home Buyer paid \$4,000 of mortgage interest on the certified indebtedness amount for the year and receives a \$2,000 MCC tax credit, the taxpayer can also deduct \$2,000 (\$4,000-\$2,000) of mortgage interest from gross income for the year. If a holder's tax liability is less than the amount of the credit for the year, it may be possible for the unused portion of the tax credit to be carried forward.

COSTS OF MORTGAGE CREDIT CERTIFICATES

The Homeowner must pay a one-time Mortgage Credit Certificate origination fee of \$1,000 to the Program Administrator at the time of the closing of the loan. There will also be an annual Program administration fee of \$180 per year, and collected by the Program Administrator on a monthly basis from the Homeowner. The annual fee of \$180 is fixed for the first seven years of the loan, but may be increased annually thereafter by the Program Administrator but not to exceed 5% per year.

Before you decide to apply for a Mortgage Credit Certificate there are several features of Mortgage Credit Certificates that you should keep in mind. First, the tax credit is only available as long as you continue to live in the house financed in connection with the Mortgage Credit Certificate. You are required to notify the Program

Administrator when you move and/or refinance your house. When you move, the Certificate is automatically revoked and you are no longer entitled to the tax credit. If you refinance your home, the Certificate will be revoked unless you make arrangements ahead of time with the Administrator to qualify the refinance for a reissuance of the Mortgage Credit Certificate. Call the Administrator for details. Second, a Mortgage Credit Certificate may be transferable. For information in regard to this, contact the Program Administrator before you sell the home. Third, if you make any misrepresentations about your eligibility for the Program you risk serious consequences. Your Mortgage Credit Certificate may be revoked as a result of the misrepresentation. Further, a misrepresentation may result in a fine of up to \$10,000 in addition to any criminal penalties imposed by law.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENT OF THE MORTGAGE CREDIT CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

In order to qualify for the Program, Federal Law requires that a Home Buyer satisfy each of the following guidelines:

1. First Time Home Buyer Requirement (The Three Year Requirement): The Program and federal law require that MCC's be issued only to "first time home buyers", unless the home lays within a "targeted area". Since McClain County is an all "non-targeted area", the first time homebuyer requirement applies to all MCC's issued in McClain County. The First Time Home Buyer requirement is that the home buyer have had no present ownership interest in a principal residence at any time during the three year period prior to the date on which the mortgage on the home is executed.

2. Targeted Area Set Aside Requirement: At least twenty percent (20%) of the tax credit provided by MCC's will be devoted to residences located within Targeted Areas of the County for at least one year after the date MCC's are first made available. Since all of McClain County is a "non-targeted area", the set aside requirement does not apply.

3. Home Buyer Income Requirement: Federal law imposes a "family income" limit on home buyers receiving MCC's. "Family income" is the anticipated total income from all sources received by the family head and spouse (even if temporarily absent) and by each additional member of the family, including salary and wages, as well as overtime, dividends, housing allowances, alimony, public assistance, social security, unemployment compensation and investment income and profits for the 12-month period beginning the date of the issuance of the MCC to the Home Buyer, exclusive of income that is temporary, non-recurring or sporadic. An income work sheet making determination of "family income" which is signed by the Home Buyer is attached and included within the sworn affidavit of the Home Buyer.

The Program income limits are as follows:

Non-Target Area  
Family of 2 or less; \$69,400  
Family of 3 or more; \$79,810

4. Purchase Price: Federal Law imposes certain purchase price limitations. The maximum purchase price limitations are as follows:

New House; Existing House  
Non-target Area  
\$276,025; \$276,025

5. Principal Residence: Federal Law requires that the Home

Buyer must occupy the home as a principal residence within 60 days after the financing is provided. A principal residence is a home occupied primarily for residential purposes. A principal residence does not include a home used as an investment property, as a recreation home or a home 15% or more of the total area of which is used in a trade or business. Further, if the Home Owner ceases to use the residence as his principal residence for a period in excess of twelve (12) months, no deduction shall be allowed for mortgage interest accruing after the first day in such twelve month period.

6. Single Family Home: The residence financed must be a one-family residence. This includes a detached home, one unit of a duplex, a townhouse or condominium unit. Manufactured housing or mobile homes qualify only if the unit has at least 400 square feet of living space, if it is more than 102 inches wide, if it is permanently affixed to the real property and is not classified as personal property under Oklahoma law. Land adjoining the home is considered part of the home only if it maintains the home's livability and is not, other than incidentally, a source of income to the owner. The purchase price includes all amounts paid for the home including the cost of completion. For example, you may not agree to pay extra for a refrigerator or drapes so that the stated purchase price is low enough to qualify. The purchase price does not include legitimate settlement and financing costs or the value of the land if you have owned it for more than two years before beginning construction of the home.

7. New Mortgage: The mortgage loan financed in connection with issuance of a Mortgage Credit Certificate must be a new mortgage and may not replace a prior mortgage of the Certificate holder on the home (whether or not previously repaid).

8. Program Area: In order to be eligible for a Certificate, the home financed under the Program must be located within this County.

9. Prohibited Loans: Under the Program, any type of loan will qualify with two exceptions. First, a loan from a lender who is considered to be a "related person" to the Home Owner for tax purposes will not qualify. Second, a loan funded from the proceeds of a tax-exempt bond issue will not qualify.

10. First Come, First Served Nature of Program: Under the Program, Mortgage Credit Certificates will be issued to eligible Home Buyers on a first come, first served basis. Only loans closed on or after March 25, 2019, are eligible for the Program. MCC's must be issued by December 31, 2020.

11. Non-Discriminatory Nature of Program: The Program will be administered without regard to race, sex or national origin or other applicable Federal parameters prescribed by law relating to discrimination.

## Voter registration

Deadline

February 8 for election

February 8 is the last day to apply for voter registration to be eligible to vote in the March 5 McClain County election.

McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said the requirements for registering are that the individual is a U.S. citizen, Oklahoma resident and at least 18 years old.

Those who have never been registered to vote, who aren't currently registered in their county of residence or who need to change their registration information may apply.

They need to fill out and mail an Oklahoma Voter Registration Application in time for it to be postmarked no later than midnight February 8.

Applications postmarked after that deadline will still be accepted and processed, but won't be approved until after March 5.

The county election board responds in writing to every person who submits an application, Haley said.

The response is either a voter identification card listing the new voter's precinct number and polling place or a letter explaining why the application wasn't approved.

Anyone who has submitted a voter registration application and who hasn't received a response within 30 days should contact the county election board office in the McClain County Courthouse.

Application forms are available at the county election board, as well as most post offices, tag agencies and public libraries in the county, Haley said.

## SafeTALK trains listeners to help others

Chickasaw Nation Prevention Services is offering suicide alertness training through SafeTALK classes. The half-day class will prepare participants to identify individuals struggling with thoughts of suicide and connect them with lifesaving intervention resources.

More than 30 community members attended the first SafeTALK class at the Chickasaw Nation's Tishomingo Health Clinic.

People with thoughts of suicide often invite others, either directly or indirectly, to help them stay safe. With proper training, alert aides know how to use these opportunities to support those in need and become a valuable resource to identify and avert suicide risks.

"People thinking about suicide want to talk about their problems," Deanna Carpitche, a certified SafeTALK representative with Chickasaw Nation, said.

"They often feel alone – that they don't have anyone that will listen. The SafeTALK class prepares people to listen, and teaches them how to recognize the warning signs of those contemplating suicide and who to contact once someone has

opened up to them," she said.

SafeTalk classes will be held at the Chickasaw Nation Purcell Area Office, 1801 S. Green Ave., in Purcell on Tuesday, March 26, from 8:30 a.m. to noon or from 1-4:30 p.m. and at the Chickasaw Nation North Regional Training Center, 400 N.W. 32nd St., in Newcastle on Wednesday, February 13, from 1-4:30 p.m.

SafeTALK classes offered through the Chickasaw Nation are free and open to anyone 15 or older. SafeTALK classes provide first responders, students, teachers, community volunteers, military personnel, and public and private employees many of the same skills used by professional caregivers such as social workers and counselors.

The SafeTALK class provides a universal model for training that has been used in more than 20 countries. Licensed behavioral health therapists may be able to receive continuing education units for attending a SafeTALK class.
