The City of Purcell is protesting a recent FCC ruling which allows companies to put their hardware on city utility poles without the city's permission.

A joint resolution stating the opposition was approved at Monday's city council meeting after city manager Dale Bunn told the council under the ruling small cell technology companies have a green light to use the electric poles in the city without asking consent or making compensation.

Council members were concerned about possible liability if a company's employee is injured climbing

Lifesaving spray

Opiates hit close to home

Two Purcell police officers found a 19-year-old man overdosed on opiates and not breathing when they stopped for a motorist assist on I-35 Thanksgiving day.

They were tipped off by the man's pinpoint pupils.

And because of recent training they'd received, they knew exactly how to respond.

Cpl. James Albertson and Officer Michael Smith quickly administered Narcan, a nasal spray, to counter the effects of the drug.

Within seconds, the man was moving and awake.

He was transported to Purcell Municipal Hospital where he told the doctor he had been chewing on a fentanyl patch and swallowed it.

Lt. James Bolling of the police department shared video of the lifesaving encounter at Monday's Purcell City Council meeting.

Bolling said Oklahoma now leads the nation in the number of children who use non-prescribed drugs.

Also, one person died in the state every day due to an opiate overdose.

It is impossible to come to the record this majestic moment; writings of the blessed apostle John without feeling a deep sense of spirituality welling up in us. Of all of the apostles, John likely walked with the Lord longer than any, both in his physical walk with Jesus as well as his spiritual walk in the years after the Lord's ascension. John not only walks with

Jesus, but he stands beside Him when no other apostle can find the courage to stay close to their Master. As I pondered these thoughts as we entered into a renewed study in John's epistles, I could not help but remember that scene where John stands beside the Lord at his last hour. I had forgotten which of the gospel evangelists

and, when I checked, I was not surprised at all that it was John himself. Listen again to John's description of this poignant scene from the shadow of the

"When Jesus therefore saw his mother, and the disciple standing by, whom he loved, he saith unto his mother, Woman, behold thy son! Then saith he to the disciple, Behold thy mother! And from that hour that disciple took her unto his own home" (John 19:26-27).

What a beautiful moment in John's life! What a reward, too, for having the courage to make his way to Calvary! We cannot

But we know that even that earthly scene is not our last acquaintance with John, for we see him and feel his deep spirit of love in the three epistles and, then, in the closing book

By the time John writes these truly an "elder," his age probably only a few years shy of a hundred years. He has walked

help but love John's reference with the Lord now for over to himself in that scene, speak-half a century. He has preached from Judea to Asia Minor, and perhaps even into Europe. With such a physical and spiritual relationship with the Lord for so long, it is no wonder that one of John's favorite themes is that of fellowship, for he enjoys as sweet of an association with the Lord as any disciple who

He opens the benediction of the first epistle declaring the profound fellowship he and many others enjoyed with the Lord Jesus. How blessed he feels! Many years before he had heard Him with eagerness, he saw Him daily, He "gazed" upon Him intently, and He even handled Him (1 John 1:1), perhaps referring to the occasion when Jesus tells the disciples to handle him so they will know that He is real (Luke 24:39).

What more, friends, could we ask of a gospel writer than such a man, one who has handled the Lord physically, one who has stood beside Him in the darkest hour, one who has walked with Him for half a century, epistles and Revelation, He is and, especially, one "whom

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
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
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
