McClain County Detectives have recovered some of the items stolen from the county barn in Wayne back in December. A warrant has been issued to arrest a suspect in connection with the incidents.

Thanks to the work of two detectives, the McClain County Sheriff's Department has cracked a burglary operation in Wayne. McClain County Detectives Chris Grace and Robert Foust, working with the public via social media, solved what was apparently a pair of burglaries at the

Burglaries were reported December 10, 15 and 25 with items stolen including battery powered drills, cameras and recently installed security cameras.

Charlie Brown may have had a rough start in life, but he's clearly on Easy Street now as the 11th dog to join the household of Sheila and Daniel Taggert.

The Taggerts own Positively Purrfect at 317 W. Main. Sheila is active in PAWS (Purcell Animal Welfare Society) which is how she first met Charlie and he stole her heart.

Charlie, a pup of unknown lineage, had been surrendered at the Purcell Animal Shelter on December 20 by a couple who said they'd seen him hit by a car. The hapless canine came in with two broken legs, but a strong will to live. The shelter contacted PAWS and asked if someone with the organization could foster Charlie. Sheila agreed and arrangements were made to take Charlie to Dr. Bryan Wright at Walnut Creek Animal Hospital. "We picked him up on December 21," Sheila said X-rays of the two broken legs showed the injuries were worse than anyone expected. The injuries weren't recent, as the couple had said, but were at least 30 days old. The right front leg was fixable. But calcification around the shattered left hip had rendered the limb useless, leaving Charlie in constant pain. The only quality of life option for Charlie was amputation.





According to Lexington school superintendent Chad Hall, property owners in the district won't see an increase in their property taxes if the measure passes.

A 2006 bond issue for construction of a new high school will be retired before the new bond goes into effect, he explained.

#### **Trash Collections**

WCA will collect, haul and dispose of all Municipal Solid Waste generated and accumulated by commercial and residential units, and placed within containers by those receiving the services within the City's corporate limits and territories.





## Building safer communities

#### Congressman Tom Cole

While negotiations to fully fund the government unfortunately remain underway in the Senate, I am pleased to report that lawmakers in both chambers of Congress did recently complete work on bipartisan legislation to improve the federal justice system.

Already signed into law by the president and focused on building safer communities, the FIRST STEP Act ushers to discourage repeat criminal offenders and ensure fair sentencing.

One of the key reforms included in the comprehensive law is aimed at identifying which federal prisoners might be capable and deserving of a second chance. This is accomplished through a new system help prisoners from falling back to assess the risk and needs of each federal prisoner and help set them on the fairest and most changes to current sentenc-

forward.

To be sure, this does not mean that dangerous and violent criminals are able to walk free or serve less time for their crimes. Rather, the FIRST STEPAct seeks to keep prisoners from ending up behind bars again for the same crimes after returning to society. Further, it seeks to equip and encourage those who want to change while they serve their time.

With the goal of reducing in common sense solutions recidivism, the legislation reauthorizes several programs from the Second Chance Act of 2007. This includes educational and job training programs with proven results. The legislation also encourages prisoner participation in some faith-based programs.

on past behavior, the FIRST STEP Act makes some small

appropriate rehabilitation path ing laws. For example, the legislation addresses outdated sentences now considered too harsh under the Fair Sentencing Act.

Again, this does not mean that sentences are reduced for dangerous, violent and high-risk criminals or repeat offenders and career criminals.

While the FIRST STEP Act specifically deals with the federal correctional system, the changes will undoubtedly make a difference in the total population of incarcerated persons-that is, prisoners serving time in either a local, state or federal facility.

In Oklahoma, the rate of incarceration is particularly troubling. According to the latest report from the U.S. Bureau of Justice Statistics, Oklahoma's Along with programming to incarceration rate in 2016 was the second highest in the nation.

If you hate Dick Cheney, you'll probably get quite a bit out of this film. But if you have any shred of affection for the man, this movie will not be an enjoyable experience.



"CHIC provides quality health information from the National Library of Medicine's MedlinePlus, PubMed and Clinical Trials databases to answer health questions," she said.

CHIC pulls information from some of the same medical resources physicians themselves turn to professionally.

PubMed is a search engine full of references and abstracts on life sciences and biomedical topics. In addition, ClinicalTrials.gov is a web-based resource providing insight regarding clinical studies to patients, researchers and health care professionals.

Accessing CHIC resources is a more top-down process than seeing a physician, but the two work hand in hand.

A visit to the doctor's office often involves a patient explaining symptoms, being examined, the doctor gathering details and perhaps making a diagnosis. When using CHIC resources, a person starts with a diagnosis or condition and digs deeper into the details.

peaked at 555 in 2012 and were at their lowest -353 - in 2009.

The greatest number of criminal misdemeanor filings was 714 in 2018, well above the 10-year low of 486 in 2011.

The year 2009 was especially litigious with 891 lawsuits seeking more than \$10,000 filed. There were only 202 such lawsuits in 2014.

The high and low tallies for small claims cases occurred back-to-back - 482 in 2010 compared to 300 in 2009.

2009 was also a bad year for ending marriages with 276

Criminal felony filings couples calling it quits. It was also just one of two years when fewer couples got married than divorced.

> In 2009, there were only 137 marriage licenses issued (also the fewest total in 10 years).In 2010,218 couples sought to end their marriages while 203 took out marriage licenses.

> The low number for dissolutions was 159 in 2018.



## Start fresh in 2019

The holidays are over, and you may have, or perhaps not yet, gotten all the decorations stored away. For many, the new year is a chance to start with a clean slate. When is a better time than right now to make your home new and fresh again?

> As many of you know, we are assisting veterans and spouses from 48 states and six countries. It seems to me that we need to help others to set up an evidenced-based claims system in some of the other states in this country.

The state where we have a high number of veterans and surviving spouses needing our assistance is Texas. Most of them are coming from the Dallas and Fort Worth areas with another large group traveling from San Antonio and Houston. As we offer free services delivered by trained, caring volunteers, I'm sure we will continue to be very busy in the coming years. We also offer free transportation to veterans' medical appointments or to visit us. Last week our drivers spent 58 hours traveling 1,117 miles to transport 17 veterans As a VA Accredited Claims Agent, I receive a copy of the VA rating decisions on everyone I represent. This enables us to review each decision VA makes and to send a letter to veterans and surviving spouses suggesting what their next step should be. The biggest benefit of having the VA Accreditation is the ability to review all the veteran's service records online. Last week when I was reviewing a rating decision for a veteran whose claim for a back injury was denied, I checked his service medical records in the VA computer where a Line of Duty classification was issued in 1975 for his back injury. Needless to say, we filed a CUE (clear and unmistakable era) on the denial of service-connection of his back injury. The VA does not have the personnel or time to We also have our Wish List review all the medical records

to them. It's up to the veteran to become proactive in their claims process.

One of the things we encourage veterans and spouses to do is to request their service and medical records from St. Louis, Mo., using a Form 180. We also suggest veterans order their complete Claims File from VA which we routinely do by using a VA Form 21-4138.

Last week I received the following VA rating decisions. Twenty-one veterans received a 100 percent disability rating for their service-connected disabilities. They will receive a combined total annual amount of \$836,010 per year. Twenty-eight veterans were awarded disability rating from 10-90 percent for their serviceconnected disabilities. These veterans will receive an annual combined amount of \$494,081 per year. We send notification letters to each person in these groups explaining some of the other benefits for which they may be eligible and suggest they return for a follow-up visit.

Carrying the 'Can' Spirit into 2019 Welcome to the first "front porch" visit of 2019. It is funny that, as I sat down to write, I looked back at some previous columns and found one about Caleb, dated Jan. 1, 2016. I suppose the first of the year and the spirit of Caleb kind of go together.

When you sit and talk about Caleb, we also have to talk about those unbelievable unbelieving Israelites with whom Caleb has to deal. I say "unbelievable" because of how absolutely faithless they prove to be, when they just as well could have been faithful. Their pitiful, flailing faithlessness, really, is nothing short of unbelievable. I don't know a better word for it.

But Caleb stands out as a ray of light amidst that dark generation. He is one of the world's great "Can" men. We read of our share of "cannot" men in the Bible – We see many of those kinds of folks around us every day - but to find a "Can-man" such as Caleb is a rarity.

'm not sure I've ever encountered a more positive, determined, faithful, encouraging, purpose-driven, God-fearing man than Caleb. That description may sound extraordinary, but this Caleb is an extraordinary man!

When the 12 spies in Moses' day go over to spy out the land of Canaan and come back with a glowing report, you would think that such an occasion would end in an immediate God-driven assault on their enemies, resulting in a resounding victory and a return home to the Promised Land.

You would think.

But we know things don't always go the way we think they should. This Israelite generation looks at the giants over in Canaan, then looks at how puny they are in comparison, and says, "Why, we're nothing but grasshoppers," and the whole generation tucks its tail and runs (Numbers 13:33).

This scared, "let's just give up" attitude infuriates Caleb, the great man of faith; and it perplexes the great warrior Joshua standing alongside of him, too. They had never seen such faithlessness just come out of the woodwork unimpeded the way it does that day.

Oh, Caleb stands up and delivers one of the greatest "halftime" speeches you've ever heard, the theme being, "Listen, fellas, we CAN do this. We can win this battle! Don't you know that God is on our side? Don't you know that we cannot fail with God with us!"

But halftime speeches only work if the players are willing to borrow the courage of the orator standing before them and go out to the field and lay everything they have on the line. But these Israelites aren't even going to leave the locker room to take the field for the second half.

As a result, our two heroes must endure four grueling decades longing for the Promised Land. But they never give up, through it all. Caleb will be 85 years old before he ever sees the Promised Land, and Joshua is close to the same.

But the battle, as we know, does not go always to the swift. It is he who is determined who wins the prize, and there are no men in the Bible more determined. After nearly half a century, they eventually will cross over the Jordan River into Canaan.

So, today–Determine to cross over into 2019 with Caleb's vibrant spirit burning deep in your heart. And when someone comes along this year - and they will - and says, "Nah, we can't do that. It just won't work."

You will be well-prepared to say, "Oh, no sir, that's where you're wrong. We can do it, and – with the Lord's fighting beside us - we will."


