



# High winds whip through area

## Purcell-Lexington sustain heavy tree damage

**Fatal split**

A large maple tree in the front yard at 219 W. Brule narrowly missed the home it once sheltered when strong winds split its trunk and felled it Sunday morning.

Winds, clocked in excess of 100 mph broke out windows, blew bricks off walls, shredded tree limbs and damaged two churches,

blowing through Purcell and Lexington just after 12 a.m. Sunday.

Purcell Emergency Management Director Kevin Rhoads said the National Weather Service would

not say how high the wind speed was but told him, "It was a very impressive wind field."

Rhoads said he saw radar clocking the ferocious winds over 100 mph.

Rhoads said there were no reports of hail associated with the storm that brought lightning, thunder and two inches of rain in a matter of 15-20 minutes.

"That storm got very

angry when it was about 8-10 miles southwest of town," Rhoads said.

The wind blew bricks off the east wall of the historic Love Hotel, knocked out a window and blew off some

flashing.

The pile of bricks on the ground would fill the bed of a truck.

So far this year Oklahoma City has recorded 8.89". The normal year-to-date rainfall amount is 12.16".

## A brief history behind Memorial Day

The first Decoration Day dates to May 1868.

It wasn't about picnics or camping or 3-day holiday weekends to mark the unofficial start of summer and

vacations.

Gen. John Logan, national commander of the Grand Army of the Republic, issued an order declaring May 30, 1868, a day "for the purpose of strewing with flowers or otherwise

decorating the graves of comrades who died in defense of their country during the late rebellion, and whose bodies now lie in almost every city, village and hamlet churchyard in the land."

The "late rebellion" was the Civil War, the United States' bloodiest conflict in 229 years.

Logan chose May 30 for



### Medal Program recipients

The American Legion Department of Pennsylvania created the School Award Medal Program in 1921 for the purpose of instilling character and helping perpetuate the ideals of Americanism among youth. The program went nationwide in 1926. The award is given to a boy and a girl in the graduating classes that best exemplify six qualities that define character: courage, honor, leadership, patriotism, scholarship and service. Candidates for the award are voted upon by a school's faculty and members of the candidates graduating class through a secret ballot casting. The local Legion post involved with the school makes the final selection upon receiving recommendation from students and faculty. The American Legion Post 301 in Lexington received nominations from Lexington, Purcell and Wayne High Schools this year. The awards at Lexington were given to Chloe Ille and Jesus Solis, presented by Glenn Wilder; the awards at Purcell were given to Haylee Swayze and Caylin Nimmo, presented by John Hobbs; and the awards at Wayne were given to Arizona Mae Ridgway and Cole Everett Mills, presented by Glenn Wilder. Each received a certificate and a medal with the six qualities listed on the face of the medal, and the back bears the Marine Corps motto, "Semper Fidelis" ("always faithful"). However, most recipients agree the prestige of being recognized by their peers is an honor they will cherish forever.

The City of Purcell does free brush pickup two times per year. During the remainder of the year, the City of Purcell will do brush pickup by work order only. This means that the customer has to call in to City Hall to request pickup with charges to be assessed to the customer utility account.

The charges may range from \$15 for a small load up to \$50 for a large load, this includes Christmas trees.

The garbage company, WCA, does bulk waste pickup on the fourth Monday of each month. This includes small loads of brush. The brush needs to be cut in three foot lengths and bundled with twine.

Purcell Emergency Management Director Kevin Rhoads said radar clocked the winds in excess of 100 mph that slammed into the two sister cities.


Some windows and barn doors were blown away but most of the damage was to trees and limbs.

### Addressing wasteful spending through rescissions

Every year, Congress is responsible for establishing legislation through its Appropriations Committees that will fund the federal government for the fiscal year. As a member of the House Appropriations Committee, I know that the committee is diligent to ensure that taxpayer dollars are used responsibly and for good purposes.

Reducing excessive spending and finding places where cuts can be made remains a goal of mine every year, which is critical to addressing the federal debt and long-term spending problems.

However, many government

programs have money that has been appropriated in the past but never spent. President Trump and his Administration have decided to address these unspent monies through a historic 'rescissions' package.

Rescissions authority is given to the President under the Congressional Budget and Impoundment Control Act of 1974. This act allows the President to request Congress to rescind money from previously appropriated funding.

However, Congress must create the legislative vehicle to do so.

After the President submits his request, Congress has 45 days to act upon it. Last week,

President Trump asked Congress to rescind more than \$15 billion—the most significant request in the history of rescission.

Unfortunately, many federal programs exist without up to date authorization to continue functions and provide services. Some have fulfilled their purposes and obligations.

Because of this, many of these programs have unused funds that will not be spent and have been sitting in accounts for prolonged periods of time.

A rescissions package will support reining in excess funds and target the areas where spending should be reduced or eliminated.

President Trump's rescissions

proposal identifies programs that have excess funds that are unused or cannot be used for its original purpose.

For example, the 'Railroad Unemployment Insurance Extended Benefits' has 133 million dollars of unobligated balances since the program expired in 2012.

The 'Advanced Technology Vehicles Manufacturing Loan Program' has not extended a new loan since 2011, yet has a balance of 4.3 billion dollars in unused funds. Taking those funds back will be helpful in reducing the debt and highlights the importance of appropriating money responsibly in the future.

It is important to note that

these rescissions only target authorized and appropriated spending from previous years, and does not violate the budget agreement negotiated by the Administration and Republican leadership in both the Senate and the House in February of this year. Finding ways to properly spend federal funds is key to balancing our national budget and preventing wasteful spending.

I support President Trump's proposal to rein in wasteful spending. I look forward to working with him to move this rescissions package ahead and continue to establish responsible spending habits for our government.

### The mission for better care for our veterans

Our nation's veterans, who serve during times of war and peace, have sacrificed a great deal to keep our nation safe and protect our freedoms. It is our duty in Congress to ensure that veterans receive the care they have earned for their service to our country.

Although the Department of Veterans Affairs (VA) has the responsibility to provide a variety of services for veterans, it is also Congress' responsibility to oversee the VA and ensure they operate in the most transparent and efficient manner possible.

Congress has made it a priority to dramatically reform

the VA. The process to make changes is ongoing, and there continues to be areas in need of improvement. One of the primary obstacles that many veterans and their families face is receiving timely and accessible medical care.

Long wait times and limited access continues to be a challenge for the VA. Congress has passed bipartisan legislation annually to improve claims processing and medical treatment for veterans.

Last week, the House passed one of the most comprehensive VA reform bills to date—the VA MISSION Act of 2018. This bill will consolidate and standardize VA community care

programs and provide funding for the continuation of the VA Choice Program.

Established in 2014, the VA Choice Program expands options for medical care through a community provider, rather than at a VA hospital or facility which may be hours away. The program has had a complicated eligibility, authorization, approval, and payment process which is confusing and expensive.

Unfortunately, the VA has struggled to keep up with the demand of the Choice Program. The VA MISSION Act includes \$5.2 billion in mandatory funding to circumvent a potential access crisis in early June when

the VA predicts the Choice Program would run out of funding.

While the legislation contains numerous provisions that expand the VA's internal capacity to care for veterans in medical facilities by improving recruitment and retention programs, changes also are included for community care.

It will consolidate seven duplicative programs into one cohesive program. It removes the current 30-day, 40-mile barriers to the Choice Program and expands veteran choice and access to timely and quality care.

The intent of this legislation is to provide for shorter wait times, better care, faster payment procedures, improved

facilities, streamlined community care criteria and overall greater care for nine million veterans and their families.

This legislation is a bipartisan agreement that makes short and long-term reforms essential to the future operation and success of the VA.

Veterans should have the best care possible without the burden of bureaucratic red-tape or inadequate resources.

I was proud to support the reforms on the House floor, and now it is up to the Senate to pass this bipartisan bill. Supporting our veterans is not only the right thing to do—it is a fundamental commitment Congress must keep.

# MOVIES WITH DAVE



Personally, I didn't get much out of them, but the people in my theater seemed to just about die of laughter at every single joke.


So I guess that's what it comes down to.

I suppose if there is a binding narrative to the overall film, it's the Pope trying to live up to the saint that inspired his name, Francis of Assisi.

And from what's shown in this documentary, it seems like he does.

Pope Francis is highly supportive of the poor and even goes as far as to celebrate poverty.

He despises inequality. He strongly dislikes how humanity has treated the planet, exploiting nature for profit.

He supports immigration, especially for those forced to leave their homes and country because of terrible wars or famine.

All of these positions are great in my book, and it's nice to see someone with so much influence be this progressive and caring for the common person.

That said, I'm not sure I'd recommend people go out in droves to see this film.

Since Francis is a native Spanish speaker, most of the film's dialogue is in Spanish.

So if you don't know Spanish, you get to read subtitles for the large majority of the movie. Something I don't mind, but I know would put a lot of people off.

And like I said before, the entire movie is pretty much just the Pope talking for an hour and a half straight. I could see a lot of people finding that pretty dull.

Honestly, on the surface this whole project does appear to be a bit self-indulgent. If the Pope didn't come across as so humble, the film would look like something crafted only to stroke his ego.

Luckley Pope Francis seems like one of the most unassuming men on the planet. Even as a non-Catholic it's hard to find a single thing to dislike about the guy.

Bottomline, if you like the Pope and want to see where he stands on just about everything, this is the movie for you.

Those who don't care won't find this film all that compelling.

Everyone's favorite foul-



mouthed mutant mercenary is back.

Seeking to protect a young boy (Julian Dennison) from a time-traveling mutant from the future (Josh Brolin), Deadpool (Ryan Reynolds) gathers a team of rogue mutants to stop him.

Alright, first things first. This may be a superhero movie set in the X-Men universe, but this is not, I repeat, not a film for children.

This movie is incredibly violent. Ridiculously so. It features multiple stab-bings, bullet wounds, severed limbs, decapitation, and even a crushed skull, all in full view for the audience to see.

Don't be like the woman in my theater who decided it was a good idea to bring her baby to an R-rated movie. Please, for everyone's sake, leave the little ones at home.

Now that I have the disclaimer out of the way, let me gush about how much fun I had watching this movie.

This film, much like the first "Deadpool," feels like it was made for me.

There are so many self-aware gags and inside references to other movies here, especially comic books ones.

Joke after joke left me laughing to the point of tears. I could hardly catch my breath I was cracking up so much.

Ryan Reynolds was born for this role. He is Deadpool. Frankly I couldn't imagine anyone doing the character better.

But it's not just him. Everyone's great in this movie.

I love Deadpool's romantic relationship with Morena Baccarin's character. The two of them have so much chemistry together.

I love Julian Dennison, who plays the boy who Deadpool befriends. I've only seen him in one other movie before, "Hunt for the Wilderpeople," but man does this kid have some cometic chops. I can't wait to see him in more films.

Even the more minor characters are given plenty of time to shine. Everyone complements each other so well here.

And despite how cynical our main character is, the story still has a fair amount of heart.

Sure, most of the emotional moments get played up for laughs in the end, but the writers are still able to inject enough humanity into the characters and make them relatable.

If you enjoyed the first "Deadpool," this is an easy movie to recommend. In my opinion it's just as good, if not better than the original.

Those put off by extreme violence, foul-language, or abundant comic book references should definitely steer clear.

3 8 oz. pkgs. Philadelphia Cream Cheese, softened  
1 tsp. vanilla  
3 eggs  
1 cup whipping cream  
2 cups blueberries  
1 Tbsp. lemon zest  
Heat oven to 325°.

Combine graham cracker crumbs, 2 Tbsp. sugar and butter; press onto bottoms of 18 paper-lined muffin cups.

Beat cream cheese, vanilla and remaining sugar with mixer until blended. Add eggs, 1 at a time, mixing on low speed after each just until blended. Spoon over crusts.

Bake 25 to 30 minutes or until centers are almost set. Cool completely. Refrigerate 2 hours.

Beat whipping cream with mixer on high speed until stiff peaks form; spread onto cheesecakes. Top with blueberries and zest.

# Brazil bound

## Memorial Assembly plans return

When the Lord God makes known His plans for you, only a foolish man would ignore those plans.

The Rev. Duane Elmore, pastor of Memorial Assembly of God in Purcell, is not a foolish man.

Elmore led volunteers in the fall of 2017 on a mission trip to a tiny Brazilian village so remote that the only way to reach it was a 7-hour boat ride up the Rio Negro.

Once there, they built a new church, replacing the village's existing house of worship which was in poor condition.

"We didn't have a plan to go this year," Elmore said. "But the Lord opened the door for us. The church is paid for."

In addition to building another new church in a different village, the missionaries will bring water filters so the residents can have clean water for drinking and cooking.

They are also packing supplies for an on-site medical clinic during their stay.

Dr. Rick Schmidt isn't a member of Elmore's church, but he is the pastor's physician.

When Schmidt learned about Elmore's plans for the missionary trip, he volunteered to head the clinic.

Also staffing it will be Fred Green of Washington and Elmore's daughter, Sarah.

Green is an EMT with the Norman Fire Department and Sarah Elmore is a nurse who works at the Purcell Clinic.

They will be part of an 18-member crew from Memorial Assembly of God.

The crew ranges in age from 21 to mid-60s. Fifteen of the volunteers were on the 2017 mission trip.

Elmore said airfare is about \$600 per person higher this year than in 2017. Round-trip plane tickets from Oklahoma City to Manaus, Brazil, are projected to cost between \$1,500 and \$1,600 per person.

The team will depart September 17 and return September 23.

The church will sponsor a concert and meal June 1 to raise money for the water filters and medical supplies, as well as to cover a portion of the travel expenses.

Elmore said The Lesters will sing in a free concert at 7 p.m. After the concert, a free meal of loaded baked potatoes will be served, followed by a dessert auction.

He added there will probably be a collection during the concert, as well.

"Everybody is excited about going again," he said. "They feel the Lord opened the door."

The mission team will be working with a missionary who was given a vision to build 100 new churches along the Amazon River and its tributaries.

Elmore said they won't know until they arrive in Brazil whether they will return to the Rio Negro or to a location on the Amazon.

Whatever the destination, he expects a 6- to 8-hour boat ride to the village from Manaus.

# Contemporary Chickasaw Art Exhibition opens June 7 at OU

The Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art on the University of Oklahoma Norman campus serves as the first venue for a new traveling exhibition of fresh Native American artwork. Visual Voices: Contemporary Chickasaw Art features more than five dozen works by emerging Chickasaw artists and opens with complimentary, public festivities at 7 p.m. Thursday, June 7.

After a presentation featuring the curator and select artists from the exhibition, visitors are invited to explore the new exhibition. Complimentary valet parking will be available to the public.

"Visual Voices: Contemporary Chickasaw Art offers celebratory and mysterious, thought-provoking and critical two-dimensional and three-dimensional works, including abstract and experimental contemporary Chickasaw art," said Manuela Well-Off-Man, exhibition curator. "This traveling exhibition offers an opportunity to view recent works by leading and emerging artists of the Chickasaw Nation."

According to Well-Off-Man, the artworks analyze the complex relationship between contemporary Chickasaw life and rich tribal history and culture. Each artist demonstrates a personal approach.

Many of the artists are inspired by traditional Chickasaw ele-

ments of design and render them using contemporary materials and aesthetics to create an innovative visual language.

Others investigate tribal stories, belief systems or family histories and traditions, and how these relate to present-day Chickasaw life.

"From oil and watercolor to textiles and metals, glass, bronze and other materials, the artworks of 15 featured Chickasaw artists in this exhibition are unique, intrinsically Southeastern and distinctive in design among today's contemporary tribal artists," Well-Off-Man said. "They are rising contemporary voices on an aesthetic landscape of 21st-century American Indian art."

With more than 65 artworks reflecting a wide variety of themes, techniques and methods, the exhibition finds balance in the artists' strong connection to tribal identity as well as his or her distinctly individual and cultural roots.

"Visual Voices provides the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art a unique opportunity to collaborate with contemporary artists from the Chickasaw Nation, whose cultural legacy lives on through the artistic endeavors of these featured artists," said Mark White, the museum's Wylodean and Bill Saxon director.

"The included artists helped to develop the exhibition and

organized it loosely around themes that the artists consider central to contemporary Chickasaw life, such as Chickasaw history, traditional beliefs and designs, and issues of identity, both personal and cultural," he concluded.

Visual Voices: Contemporary Chickasaw Art is made possible by grants provided by the Chickasaw Nation and the National Endowment for the Arts, and by assistance from The American Indian Cultural Center and Museum.

The exhibition remains on display through September 9 before it opens again next year at the Mississippi Museum of Art in Jackson and the Institute of American Indian Arts Museum of Contemporary Native Arts in Santa Fe.

A family day is scheduled from 1 to 4 p.m. Sunday, June 17, at the Fred Jones Jr. Museum of Art that features stomp-dancing, storytelling and art projects presented by the Chickasaw Cultural Center.

# How to avoid insect-borne diseases

With temperatures on the rise, insects are once again spreading disease. And it's happening faster than it ever has before.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention reports that the number of Americans infected by Lyme disease, West Nile virus and other insect-borne illnesses has more than tripled since 2004, jumping from 27,388 cases to more than 96,000 in 2016.

According to Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation President Stephen Prescott, M.D., climate change appears to be a key driver for this trend.

"In the southern U.S. and Gulf Coast, we are seeing real changes in the types of mosquitoes that can survive there," said Prescott. "More parts of the country look increasingly like the climate in Brazil and other tropical areas, so diseases we previously only associated with those places are now here, even in Oklahoma."

Other contributing factors include the increase in global travel, a return of forestation in urban areas and suburbs, and a lack of new vaccines to combat the new threats, said Prescott.

In Oklahoma, the most common insect-borne diseases are West Nile virus, which is spread by mosquitoes, and Rocky Mountain spotted fever, which ticks pass from animals to humans.

"There are a lot of bad diseases here in Oklahoma already, and many more could be on the way. Some of them you might not even have heard of yet, like chikungunya or dengue," said Prescott. "These can do serious damage to your health, and we need to be prepared for their arrival."

So, how do you protect yourself?

The best defense, Prescott said, is to keep insects off your skin. "Whether you wear long sleeves and pants, use an insect repellent with DEET, or both, you are taking a crucial step," he said.

Using insect repellent, said Prescott, doesn't pose a risk. "There is no evidence that regular application in this circumstance is detrimental to your health. It represents far less risk than getting bitten by an infected insect."

He also suggests limiting outdoor activities around dusk and dawn, when insect activity is at its highest.

If you're outdoors in the early mornings or evenings, avoid walking through grass, where you're most likely to attract mosquitoes and ticks.

To help control insect populations, Prescott recommends dumping out flower pots that contain excess water and making sure gutters or storm drains aren't full or clogged. Routinely change water in bird baths and pet water bowls, too, he said.

"The best advice I can give is this: do whatever it takes to avoid getting bitten by mosquitoes," said Prescott.

An avid pilot, he owned his own Cessna airplane and insisted on trying out his inventions himself in his own plane before passing the design along to others. He loved all animals, especially cats, and spent his life collecting and caring for strays, both domesticated and feral.

He was preceded in death by his parents, Zach and Jonnie Estes; his aunt, Mary Estes Lieberman; and his grandparents, Lamar and Annie Mae Estes, and Red and Bea Mims, all of whom he was very close to.

He is survived by his sister, Polly J. Estes of California, whom he cared for and tried to protect her whole life. Paul taught her how to fly, how to shoot, and he even taught her calculus when she was still in grade school because he was just too excited to wait to share the magic of math with her. When the family moved while Polly was little, Paul took time off from college to help her adjust to the new town because she was afraid she wouldn't have anyone to play with her. That is how kind and empathetic he was, even as a young man. Later, he used to surprise her by flying up to see her in college and taking her and her roommates out for dinners and to go flying. He loved the mountains and looking for geodes. He spent his entire life trying to help others, and specifically trying to invent machines that would improve the lives of people living in third world countries.

Tragically, three separate, traumatic head injuries over the years slowly robbed him of the life he deserved, so he would be the first to encourage everyone to wear a helmet when engaging in any kind of potentially dangerous activity, even if it's just riding a bicycle.

A graveside service was held on Tuesday, May 22, 2018 at 1 p.m. at Arlington Memory Gardens, 3400 N. Midwest Blvd, Midwest City, OK, 73141, (405) 427-2453. The cemetery is near Tinker Air Force Base, so Paul can spend eternity admiring the jets flying overhead. 

## Wind:

Owners Jerry and Elaine Butler live in an apartment in the building.

"I heard something but there was a lot going on," Jerry Butler said.

Rhoads said a building attached to Joel Milner's business was blown onto Green Avenue.

At least four plate glass windows at Heartland Customs were blown out.

Owner Ron Page said he and others were down at the shop at 3 a.m. cleaning before they could find plywood to seal and secure the building.

The devilish winds tore the roof off Deveraux Law Firm and ripped a barn door off Rhoads' barn, hurling it 75 yards away.

The Lexington General Assembly and Church of the First Born and Grace Chapel were damaged. Also, a few

residences sustained minor damage, according to City Manager Chris Coker.

Residents in Lexington lost power for about six hours, Coker said.

"It was mainly due to having to shut down part of the lines to fix the rest of it," Coker said.

Coker said city crews will be picking up brush for free starting this week.

"The school had a lot of tree damage," he continued. "Tree damage was the main thing."

Windows on at least one Purcell Main Street building were also broken out.

Electric power was a major issue following the storm.

Power was out to most of Purcell from about 12:40 a.m. Sunday until 12:05 p.m. Sunday.

Some areas were restored just after noon while some didn't get power until 10:45 p.m.

As of press time Tuesday an estimated 12 homes in Purcell were still without power.

"My understanding is that those 12 homes need an electrician to come in and make repairs and then we will come in right behind them to provide electric service," City Manager Dale Bunn said Tuesday.

Bunn said the major outage was caused by trees in the electric lines and downed power poles.

Citizens are required to put their brush and tree limbs out by the curb so city crews can begin the task of cleaning up the giant piles of brush.

Rhoads had one rule with regards to the pickup.

"Only tree limbs and brush will be picked up," he said. "The piles cannot contain any metal or lumber such as 2x4s. It has to be brush and limbs."

what it wasn't—the anniversary of any particular battle.

That first Decoration Day saw some 5,000 participants decorating the graves of 20,000 Union and Confederate soldiers buried at Arlington National Cemetery.

All northern states had recognized the holiday by 1890, while southerners honored Confederate dead on different days.

That tradition continues. Texas honors its Confederate war dead on January 19. The date is April 26 in Alabama, Florida, Georgia and Mississippi; May 10 in South Carolina and June 3 in Louisiana and Tennessee.

Decoration Day has been known as Memorial Day since 1882.

In the aftermath of World War I, the emphasis shifted from just the Civil War fallen to honoring all Americans who died fighting in any war.

It first became a federal holiday 99 years after Logan's General Order No. 11.

But Congress couldn't resist tinkering with Logan's vision.

On June 28, 1968, they passed a law confirming May 30 as the official Memorial Day holiday while concurrently dictating federal employees' paid Memorial Day holiday would be the last Monday in May.

They extended that decision to the remainder of the country with the passage in 1971 of the National Holiday Act.

A Congressional resolution in December 2000 created a "National Moment of Remembrance" at 3 p.m. local time on Memorial Day.

At that time, Americans are supposed to "voluntarily and informally observe in their own way a moment of remembrance and respect, pausing from whatever they are doing for a moment of silence or listening to 'Taps.'"

The Purcell Police Department Honor Guard will fire volleys in a salute to the fallen veterans.

Honor guard members are Lt. Kevin Austin, Sgt. Scott

Stephens and Officer Josh Van Oort.

There will also be recorded music.

Attending last year's service were about 40 to 50 people. Tate is hoping for a larger turnout this year.

"It is better advertised this year," he said, including through social media.

## Lights shine brighter

### Lex schools reap electricity rebate

The City of Lexington and its power supplier, the Oklahoma Municipal Power Authority, have presented a check for \$9,338 to Lexington Public Schools for recent energy efficiency improvements throughout the district.

The rebates were presented as part of the Demand and Energy Efficiency Program administered by OMPA.

The rebate was given because fixtures were upgraded to high-efficiency LED lighting in school buildings.

The enhancements are expected to reduce the district's

energy demand by 149.81 kilowatts.

DEEP assists OMPA's 42 members with their qualified customers to reduce electric service energy demand and costs.


The program provides rebates to commercial and industrial customers—including schools and government buildings—which implement retrofits that reduce their demand at peak times.

Projects include changing out lighting, HVAC, refrigeration, commercial food service equipment, pumps and motors

for more energy-efficient equipment.

These energy improvements help OMPA delay the time in which it needs to add expensive generation capacity.

The program passed a threshold in 2017 with more than \$1 million being handed out during its 7-year-plus history. The reduction of peak demand since the inception of the program comes out to a rebate total of just \$153 dollars per kilowatt, well below the cost-per-kilowatt for building new generation.

## Our Lady of Victory Catholic Church

Last Sunday, the Easter season closed with the celebration of Pentecost. The disciples had come to Jerusalem, 50 days after the discovery of the empty tomb, to celebrate the Jewish feast of spring harvest as described in Exodus 34:22. Jesus had, presumably, left them, and they were afraid of the consequences of facing life on their own in the midst of hostile Jewish authorities.

In his atmosphere of fear and timidity, they prayed together and went about the business of replacing Judas with one of their own, Matthias, who also had known Jesus. And suddenly there came a "mighty wind that filled the whole room" (Acts 2). The Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, and the Church was born – now not out of fear, but out of energy and fullness and enthusiasm!

And so we celebrate the beginning of the Church, the birthday of the Church. But where is it found, the Church? Jesus said "Wherever two or three are gathered in my name, there am I in the midst of them." Or we might say that the Church lives wherever the Kingdom of God is present and the will of God is being fulfilled.

Therefore, when bishops meet with the Pope in Rome, they pray together. There is the Church. When a small group of people gather together in someone's home to grieve over the death of a loved one and

to pray the rosary, there is the Church. When the youth group travels on a mission trip to experience a new culture and to work in the name of Jesus, there is the Church.

When Catholic Charities send supplies and volunteers to help victims who have been impacted by a tornado, there is the Church. The Church is the miracle that appears whenever two or three people are gathered in the name of Jesus to do the will of God on earth – to bring peace and justice among peoples.

What are the qualities of the Church that make it special? Here are just a few. First, the Church doesn't exist for itself only. It exists in service to the Kingdom of God, in order to bring about God's reign to the earth.

In other words, our mission is to build ourselves up within the Church walls only so that we can build the Kingdom of God outside the Church walls. Our mission is, little by little, to change the world.

Second, our emphasis should be on inclusivity rather than exclusivity. That is, we welcome those people that we see only a few times a year, at Easter, at Christmas, or at First Communion. We welcome them because the Holy Spirit is active in their lives as well.

And third, as Church we reimagine ourselves according to the age in which we live. When the Church began, it was thought to be a Jewish

faith, one which nonetheless believed the Messiah had come. At the first Council in Jerusalem (Acts 15) it was decided that Gentiles (non-Jews) could also be members of the Church.

With the conversion of Constantine, a persecuted Church now suddenly became a "mainstream" Church, and again the theology of who we are had to readjust. This was the Second Age of the Church. We are now in the Third Age of the Church – the global Church – in which we are no longer a European church with a Western mindset, but are open to the lived experiences of God in all peoples and cultures.

If there were no Church, the world would be a very sad place indeed. It would be as if we locked the doors upon the risen Christ, who had no place to dwell within. But the risen Christ does live. He lives in the hearts of each of us, his faithful ones. He lives in the Church. Happy Birthday, Church!

We are grateful for all the catechists who taught our children this past year!

Good week to all: Welcome to the "front porch."

Do you know one of the most misunderstood subjects in the Word of God? You may find it hard to believe, but it is obedience.

Really, the world – both in the Bible days and in our day – often has a difficult time understanding what it means to obey the Lord. We could understand this if it were a child whose mom tells her to go clean her room. A child might come up with any number of ways around the command: What does "clean" really mean? Or: Mom said "my" room, which means that I can clean it any way I want.

We understand the silliness of such a way of thinking, but we also must understand the fallacy of thinking that way toward the Word of God.

Yet, in the Bible, we see many examples of men or women who think they can put a personal spin on God's commands.

One of the great examples of such a man is Naaman from over in fifth chapter of Second Kings. He comes to the Lord with a great need, but he is

surprised by the remedy the Lord prescribes.

You may remember Naaman. He is a notable man in the Syrian army and a great warrior and leader. But he has a problem: He is a leper.

A young Israelite maiden who had been captured by the Syrians is the servant for Naaman's wife. One day the young lady tells Mrs. Naaman that if her husband could only see the prophet in Samaria he could be healed. As soon as Naaman hears this, he rushes to the king of Syria and tells him the good news. The king immediately sends him to Israel, preceded by a letter to the king of Israel expressing his desire for him to heal Naaman.

Of course, that's just the first example of wrong thinking, because the king of Israel has long ago lost touch with the Lord. In fact, the king gets mad and assumes the king of Syria is trying to pick another fight with him.

But word of all of these events comes to Elisha, and

he tells the king to send Naaman on down the road to him when he arrives. Elisha, God's man, knows some things about healing, of course.

Soon, Naaman and his caravan pull in front of Elisha's house. But Elisha does a strange thing. He doesn't even bother to come out and recognize the great and well-respected Naaman. He merely sends his servant Gehazi out to tell Naaman this:

"Go wash yourself seven times in the Jordan, and your flesh will be restored and you will be cleansed" (2 Kings 5:10).

Yes, Naaman, all you have to do to be healed is go down to the Jordan and dip seven times.

Now, what do you think Naaman does? Do you think he jumps up into his chariot and heads in a bee-line to obey that command?

Well, we'll see next week, Lord willing, on our next visit here on the "front porch."




