Hospital, city future secured

Purcell voters gave city officials and the administration and board at Purcell Municipal Hospital what they were asking for on Tuesday.

The penny sales tax earmarked for PMH will remain in place until Dec. 31, 2039. The vote for a 20year extension was 905 in favor to 237 against.

And another penny sales tax to fund capital improvements in Purcell was extended for 15 years until Sept. 30, 2040. That vote was 737 for to 401 against.

McClain County's only hospital was in a cash flow crisis and facing closure in 2016 when voters first approved a three-year penny sales tax solely for the hospital.

That revenue has been a lifesaver for the hospital.

Kem Scully, chief executive officer at the hospital, expressed her gratitude to the people of Purcell for once more turning out in support of the hospital.

"Thank you to all who voiced their support of our hospital. Once again, we are humbled by the outpouring of support we have received from the citizens of Purcell," she said.

"Our goal at Purcell Municipal Hospital is to be good stewards of the money we receive as we seek to enrich the health and lives of the communities we serve through individualized, compassionate, and exceptional care. Again, thank you for allowing us to continue to serve you by trusting us with your health care needs."

Pain equates to bobcat attack

About a week ago, I woke up in the night with a sharp pain running down my arm.

My first thought was: The Big One.

Turned out it wasn't. It was the old familiar can't-get-comfortable-in-any-position bee-stinging pain of a pinched nerve. Several of you are wincing in remembrance of your own pinched nerves. We feel each other's pain.

I figured I'd give it a few days to see if it would go away and to delay receiving any possible diagnosis that would involve surgery.

But it didn't go away and, in fact, got bad enough to make sleep difficult. It hurt to type, to take pictures and to drive, which is how I

spend 85 percent of my waking time. So, Monday morning I was on the phone with the clinic, where the nice lady suggested I go to the emergency room, where

machines would be nearby for x-rays and whatnot. I am the product of a generation that grew up thinking you went to the emergency room if you were squirting blood or had broken bones, so I apologized to three or four people for being there without a gaping wound.

"I'd have to be here anyway," said a nurse. "You might as well entertain me."

I stifled the urge to juggle some gauze and did as I was told, which mostly involved sticking my finger in a monitor and waiting for someone who could fix the pinched nerve.

One of the attendants asked me to rate the pain from 1 to 10, with 10 being eaten by a bear. My pain matched what I imagined a bobcat attack would generate, so I said: "5 or 6."

I got a shot in the arm and prescriptions for industrial strength Ibuprofen and muscle relaxers.

The shot and the Ibuprofen made absolutely no difference on their own. The bobcat was still attacking.

Then I took the muscle relaxer.

Oooohhh, yeah.

Goodbye, Mr. Bobcat.





Mr. use the VA Disability Benefits Questionnaires (DBQ) that includes the evidence to support the veteran's application for service connection of a disability. We also use that same form when we ask the VA for an increased rating of a service-connected disability. One of the problems we see is that some veterans will use their E-Benefits account to file for a re-evaluation of a serviceconnected disability without realizing that by doing so their rating may be reduced. Last week I received a rat-

ing from the VA on a veteran who was reduced from a 70 percent to 10 percent rating after the veteran had filed their own claim. One of the things I suggest is never to ask to be reevaluated for any hearing loss rating over 30 percent percent. Many veterans who do file for an increase on that disability could see their rating reduced. The VA rating schedule located in CFR 38 parts 0 thru 17 shows the minimum and maximum for most every increase in a rating for a disability not knowing that it is already at the maximum rating level. We try to review every rating that a veteran has before filing for re-evaluation of current disability.

As a VA Accredited Claims Agent, I receive a copy of all the correspondence that the VA sends to those who represented. This enables us to know if we are providing the appropriate evidence in support of each



Of the VA rating decisions, I received last week, 35 veterans received a 100 percent rating for their service-connected disabilities. Those veterans ranged in age from their early 20s to the late 80s. I want every veteran to receive all of the VA benefits for which they are eligible. The veterans who receive that rating may also be eligible for the Champ VA Medical insurance for their spouse and dependents. Another provides educational benefits to their dependents. The VA educational benefits for dependents of veterans who rated 100 percent can equate to more than \$1,000 per month for each dependent. We encourage all veterans who are rated at that amount to visit us for more information about educational benefits.

Those 35 veterans will receive a combined annual income from the VA of \$995,101 per year for their serviceconnected disabilities. We received 37 rating letters for our veterans rated 10-90 percent and this group of veterans will receive a combined annual income of \$577,362 per year. Those who receive a 30 percent or higher rating will be eligible for an increased amount for each dependent they have.

One of the missions we take very seriously at our Veterans Foundation is our transportation service we provide to veterans who are unable to drive or do not have anyone to take them to their VA appointments. Last week the drivers worked 95 hours and logged 1,756 miles transporting 37 passengers. Several of these veterans require the use of our a food sack.

they are wheelchair bound. As we continue to grow there will be a need to add another driver or two to continue meeting the increased demand for this service. There are many veterans in our community who are not aware we provide transportation to our location and to the VA Hospital so please pass the word.

I want to take this opportunity to express my appreciation to those of you who are helping us to make a difference in the lives of our veterans and their families. As a 501(c)(3)we are not funded by anyone other than the men and women who we help and any grants we may receive. Currently, we are spending more than \$25,000 each month in direct support to the men and women who have served our nation in the military.

We also have our donor program where cars, trucks, motorcycles and other items are donated to us so that we may give them to veterans or their families in need or sell them to raise funds to support the needs of veterans. As a non-profit, these donations may be tax deductible on your tax returns.




