## Woman arrested at Riverwind Casino

An Oklahoma City woman's attempt to cash a suspect \$1,490.50 check at Riverwind Casino has resulted in a felony charge in McClain County District Court.

Prosecutors charged Kala K. Hill, 35, with uttering a forged instrument.

A warrant for her arrest is outstanding.

According to an affidavit, Hill went to the casino's main cash cage on May 9 and attempted to cash the check which was dated March 13.

The casino's check cashing supervisor called the Chickasaw Nation Lighthorse Police after determining the check wasn't valid.

## Collection, Hauling and Disposal of Municipal Solid Waste Change in Collection Time

The City of Purcell has an exclusive contract with WCA of Oklahoma to collect, haul and dispose of municipal solid waste within the city's corporate limits.

Collection Time—Pick up is now the last Monday of the month beginning in October. Items are not to be put out by the curb until that weekend prior.

Bulk Waste—Brush or limbs shall be bundled in no larger than three feet x three feet bundles. No furniture larger than a pickup bed or that exceeds 75 pounds. Appliances must have refrigerator/compressor legally removed and shall not exceed 75 pounds. Yard waste such as leaves and grass clippings must be bagged. All items must be bagged and no loose items will be picked up.

Hazardous Waste—Solid waste identified or listed as a hazardous waste by the administrator of the United States Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) or so classified by any federal or State of Oklahoma statute, rule, order or regulation should not be put out for collection. This includes tire, paint or oil products.

# Free trees from Arbor Day

## Foundation members will get 10 free trees in September

back of the check, which had an unverified bank number and appeared to have been printed on a poor quality printer, according to the affidavit.

The officer questioned Hill who said she received the check after answering a job ad on Craigslist.

When asked why she waited so long to cash the check, Hill explained her bank wouldn't cash third party checks and she thought Riverwind would. She also told the officer she didn't think it strange a company would send her a check before she completed any

work for them.

She also claimed her boyfriend told her the check was real and she needed to cash it.

The officer contacted the four people, including the boyfriend, who came to the casino with Hill. All denied any knowledge of Hill attempting to cash a fraudulent check, according to the affidavit.

The officer also contacted the legal division of the New York company on the check and was told the company uses the account as a deposit only account and no checks can be issued from that account.

My right ankle felt like I had broken it but it turned out to be just a bad sprain.

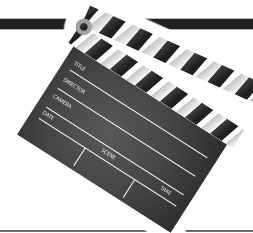
You might think the Lindsay ground crew would either fill in the holes or if they are for drainage put a grate over them.

# MOVIES WITH DAVE

I guess the single movie last week was just to give me a breather, because this time they decided to drop four films in one weekend.

We have a movie about a teenager with a gun from outer space, a mystery with a father searching for his missing daughter all set inside a computer screen, a period horror flick set in the 1940s involving a rundown 18th century estate, and a film based on one of the masterminds behind Holocaust.

Let's get right to them.

First up is "Kin."

Chased by a vengeful criminal (James Franco), the police, and a gang of otherworldly soldiers, a recently released ex-con Jimmy (Jack Reynor), and his adopted teenage brother Elijah (Myles Truitt) are forced to go on the run with a weapon of mysterious origin as their only protection.

I'm really not sure what to make of this movie.

I don't hate the concept of the story. The dynamic of two brothers on the lam, doing everything they can to avoid the cops and James Franco, has the potential to make for an interesting story.

Unfortunately one of those brothers is written as an unsympathetic, unlikable moron.

I hated Jack Reynor's character here. It seems like every time he's forced to make some kind of decision, he does the dumbest thing he can possibly think of.

In the film Reynor owes Franco \$60,000 for keeping him alive in prison for six years.

At first I thought it was a ridiculous number. But then as the movie went on and revealed what an utter buffoon Reynor's character was it all started to make sense.

He truly has a gift to do precisely the worst thing in any given situation.

Franco probably had to pay off every single guard and inmate just to prevent them all from bashing his head in for all 2000 plus days.

Frankly what Franco accom-

plished was a miracle. Keeping someone that thick headed alive for a week would be impressive, much less six years.

It's little wonder Dennis Quaid, Reynor's father in the movie, doesn't want his younger son anywhere near his halfwit dolt of a brother.

Then there's the baffling addition of sci-fi elements in this movie.

They give the younger brother an amazingly powerful gun pretty early on in the movie, but he does absolutely nothing with it until the movie's nearly halfway over.

I was wondering if it was even going to amount to anything, until the younger brother is finally forced to use the space gun to prevent his idiot sibling from getting his face rearranged.

Plus, as if the cops and a murderous James Franco wasn't enough to worry about, there's also a couple masked futuristic looking soldiers after the brothers too.

Not to worry though, they matter even less to the overall plot than the space gun does.

Honestly, the sci-fi aspects were so badly incorporated they could have removed the space gun, mixed pleather clad soldiers, and told the same basic story without losing much of anything.

That is at least, up until the bizarre twist ending.

I don't want to spoil the details, but the final scene is so poorly set up and so out of left field, I felt like I had whiplash afterwards.

Not only that, but it shamelessly teases a sequel to this trainwreck of a film. As if anyone wants to see the continuing adventures of space gun boy and his bonehead brother.

If I had anything positive to say about this movie, I guess the cinematography is above average, at least if you like a ton of narrow-focused closeups.

Also the background music was surprisingly decent for movie this sub-par.

Neither element make it worth spending a single dime to see this film though.

Don't be fooled by the futuristic looking poster. If you're looking for sci-fi entertainment, you will leave this movie very disappointed.

"Kin" is rated PG-13.

After David Kim's (John Cho) 16-year-old daughter Margot (Michelle La)

goes missing, a local investigation is opened and a detective is assigned to the case.

Desperate for any leads, David breaks into Margot's laptop, but while trying to piece together his daughter's whereabouts, he discovers how little he actually knew about his own child.

This is the second film I've seen in five weeks where the entire movie is set on computer screens.

I have to admit, after sitting through both "Unfriended" and its recent sequel "Unfriended: Dark Web," I didn't really have terribly high hopes for yet another movie set on someone's laptop.

Sure, I enjoyed both "Unfriended" films for what they were, incredibly dumb, poorly acted movies, with a shocking attention to detail when it comes to technology.

Well I'm happy to report that my low expectations were completely obliterated by this film.

This movie is sensational. The first thing the film does is hit you with a heartbreaking montage of Margot growing up, all shown inside a Windows XP PC, including period accurate websites and software.

Just like in "Unfriended," the level of detail they go into on the computer side of things is incredible, but here they actually match the well thought out setting with some solid cinematography to go along with it.

You aren't just staring at the screen, you're being sucked in.

Just like in every other movie, camera work is vital to show the audience what to focus on. It's amazing how even simple pans, zooms, and transitions can enhance or change the feeling of a scene.

I was shocked how captivated I was by this film.

A large amount of credit for that goes to John Cho, who is absolutely fantastic here.

There's so much emotion packed into his performance, you can't help but feel for him.

Sometimes it takes seeing it all written out in front of you to notice the kind of fool you'd be making of yourself if you actually sent it.

I loved the experience of this movie from beginning to end.

It takes the setting of "Unfriended" and creates something 1000 times more compelling out of it.

If you're dying for a good mystery that keeps you guessing up until the very last minute, this film is a must see.

Don't let the fact that the whole film takes place entirely on someone's computer screen prevent you from checking it out

This is the movie to see this weekend. I don't even care if you read my other reviews. If you aren't watching "Searching," you're missing out.

"Searching" is rated PG-13.

Third is "The Little Stranger."

Set the late 1940s, this film follows Dr. Faraday (Domhnall Gleeson), a respectable country doctor called to see a patient at Hundreds Hall, an 18th century estate Faraday has admired since he was a boy.

Home to the Ayres family for two centuries, the estate is now in decline, and its inhabitants (Ruth Wilson, Will Poulter, and Charlotte Rampling) are haunted by something more

ominous than a dying way of life.

This sounds like the premise to a horror movie, right?

That's the impression I got from the trailer too.

It has the ominous music, a creepy old house, talk of a haunting, serving bells ringing for no reason, mysterious writing on the walls.

Definitely sounds like a horror movie.

So it really threw me off when this movie ended up feeling more like a historical drama like "Downton Abbey" rather than anything remotely scary.

Yes, the horror elements are there. On paper this sounds like a horror movie, but the presentation is nothing of the sort.

It's not that "The Little Stranger" fails to be scary like so many other poorly conceived horror films are, it's that it's not even trying to be.

I'm honestly not quite sure what to make of it. The film isn't even terribly unsettling beyond a couple bloody scenes here and there.

At least it's nothing close to something like "Hereditary," which came out earlier this year.

To me this film feels more like a melancholy lamenting the death of old British estates like Hundreds Hall.

The house is visibly decaying and it's like its residents are crumbling along with it.

But instead of deteriorating outwardly, the poor Ayres family is decaying mentally.

Surprisingly though, despite not being all that scary of a horror movie or even terribly eventful, I found myself enjoying the film more than I thought I would.

Yes, the pace is slow. Incredibly slow at times in fact, but it was still strangely compelling.

The characters are interesting, the performances are respectable, and the mystery behind what's actually happening at Hundreds Hall kept me curious to see what would happen next.

And later on the movie does start doing a bit more conventional horror stuff. Not much, but there's a couple scenes here and there.

Plus the film has above average cinematography. Lots of

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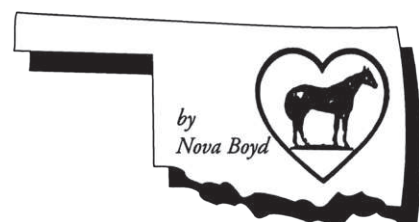

## 2018 American Paint Horse Association Youth World Show

APHA successfully concluded the 2018 Youth World Championship Show after 10 days of premier competition for Youth age 18 and under and their American Paint Horses.

The event took place at the Will Rogers Memorial Center in Fort Worth, Texas, June 25-July 8 in conjunction with the Appaloosa World Championship Youth Show, the APHA Youth World Games, the Western Horseman Fence & Boxing Challenge, the inaugural Ranch Work Championship and the ACHA Cowtown Cutting.

This year, the Youth World Show offered more than \$110,000 in scholarship prizes to AjPHA members competing at the show. Included were scholarships for top finishers in 86 world championship performance and halter classes, along with scholarships for randomly selected entries and other special events. All this came in addition to the customary prizes awarded at the show, such as trophy buckles and saddles. Scholarship money was provided by the American Paint Horse Foundation, as well as private donations from APHA members and Paint community supporters.

With the chance at some wonderful incentives, nearly 1,200 entries and 249 horses from 32 U.S. states and Canada attended the show. Each world championship class paid out \$1,300 in scholarships. Several areas saw growth in entries over the 2017 show: Youth halter classes grew by 65 percent; solid-Paint bred halter classes were up 75 percent, and solid Paint-bred performance classes grew by 108 percent, just to name a few.

The Western Horseman Fence and Boxing Challenge took place July 5-6 and presented a unique opportunity for cow horse and ranch horse competitors to exhibit in cow work only. This exciting event featured \$5,000 in added money plus jackpotted entry fees, which were paid out in a 4D format modeled after the barrel racing divisional payout system. The event, which was open to all breeds of horses and all ages of exhibitors, attracted 73 entries and paid out a total of \$8,425.

This year, another fun and lucrative event was added for those looking to compete in cow and ranch horse events: the inaugural \$10,000-Added Ranch Work Championship, sponsored by Classic Equine. This all-breed, all-ages event took place July 7 and paid out a total of \$13,550 with 71 entries. The Ranch Work Championship paid out in a 3D format, similar to the Fence and Boxing Challenge. The response was extremely positive and happy exhibitors left planning their return next year.

Also returning this year was the popular ACHA/APHA Cowtown Cutting. The all-breed, all-age event, which is approved by the American Cutting Horse Association and APHA, took place July 7-9 and attracted 291 entries and paid

out \$31,358.

I looked through these special classes and did not see any names from our area. For the Paint Youth World Show, I only saw one name, Lauren Gralla, daughter of Todd Gralla, Gralla Farms, Norman. She has definite ties to this area, as her grandfather, Stan Gralla, Gralla Farms and Gralla Architects, lived just east of Lexington for many years, raising and showing champion Paint horses and designing equine facilities all over the world, as does Todd Gralla today, who continues the architecture business and continues to raise great paint horses, but does it from Norman.

"Nothin', I just didn't like the way he was lookin' at me, just like I don't like the way you're lookin' at me! And if I thought I could do it, I'd shove your face into something!"

The teacher stiffened, but

a quick look from the principal stopped the teacher. The principal contemplated the child for a moment and then quietly said, "Today, my young student, is the day you learn about grace."

"Grace? Isn't that what you old people do before you sit down to eat? I don't need none of your stinkin' grace." "Oh, but you do." The principal studied the young man's face and whispered, "Oh yes, you truly do..."

The boy continued to glare as the principal continued, "Grace, in its short definition, is unmerited favor. You cannot earn it. It is a gift and is always freely given. It means that you will not be getting what you so richly deserve."

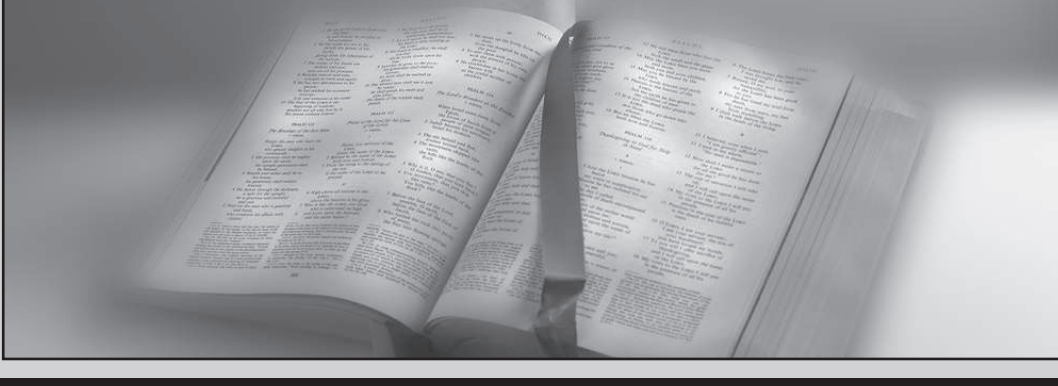

## Lexington Westside Church of Christ

Welcome again, friends, to the “front porch.” Last week in this place we re-visited that generation of Israelites who would finally escape the bondage of a cruel Egypt.

Under the leadership of Moses, they had taken their leave of their evil taskmasters and the profane Pharaoh, left Egypt, crossed the Red Sea, received God’s Law as well as His instructions on the building of that tabernacle they would need for their journey, and are now a step or two from going back home.

They are almost home. That was the title of this past Lord’s Day study, “Almost Home.” The moment we wrote that title on the chalkboard, we knew that there was something ominous-sounding in the title. Almost.

I am not sure anything good ever comes from “almost.”

Oh, their journey gets off to an encouraging start, especially on the part of our Lord. God makes a great promise to His people that He would be with them. He has taken a keen interest in His people – though frail sometimes we are – and makes divine provisions for their well-being.

God reminds them of the covenant He had made with them a long time ago, through Abraham. He shows them that He would be an ever-present God, going both before them and behind them with a pillar of cloud and of fire, and lead

them across this Red Sea, even with the murderous Egyptian army chasing them relentlessly.

And when those fickle people begin to doubt, Moses stretches the rod over the waters of the Sea and shouts a resolute command to that entire generation gathered at the sea: “Stand still, and see the salvation of the Lord.”

Stand still, you doubting people! God has brought us this far. He will take us home.

Sure enough, the Lord does take them home. That entire generation of unbelievers – for unbelievers are what they are at the very core – watch a powerful east wind reach down to the depth of that crimson water, push it back as if it was nothing more than a puddle in the yard, and provide a path of dry ground a mile wide for the Israelites to walk over.

Isn’t it the way of the Lord for Him to pave the way for us and then say, “Now, just walk across!” We know, from this account and a hundred others, that when God makes a contract, He will keep His end of the bargain—every time! He has promised the Israelites a return to the land of promise, and He keeps His promises, always.

In only a matter of a few months, the Israelites come, finally, to the edge of Canaan, a stone’s throw away. Moses takes twelve men, one from each of the 12 tribes of Israel, and sends them over into Canaan to spy out the land. Can

you imagine the send-off of these twelve discoverers as they head out? And can you imagine the celebration when someone sees the men coming home a few weeks later, with the evidence of the fruitfulness of that land over their shoulders? (Numbers 13:27).

If we had never read or heard this story, we would think that the people at that very moment would fortify their faith, rally around those dozen handpicked men, shout out their thanksgiving to the good God who had brought them thus far, gather their weapons of war, and, within a few days, head out to re-take their land.

We would think that – if not for the fact we know something ominous about people: People tend to do things the hard way more often than the easy. People are far more likely to choose dubious doubt over fortified faith. So, friends, meet this generation of Israelites who are not unlike most people.

Even before we note their faithless response, we remind ourselves this week not to carry their attitude and faithlessness out the door with us as we go about. Instead, let us take what God has promised, tuck it away safely down deep in our hearts, and set out to win whatever spiritual battles we encounter. Blessings to all of you this week in that endeavor.

The chief said the professional work performed by Cpl. Rick Adkins, Cpl. John Albertson and Officer Josh Van Ort saved the life.

Officer Van Ort pulled the child from the murky pool water and began chest compressions while Cpl. Adkins did rescue breathing and Cpl. Albertson kept an open airway.

In appreciation of their

efforts about 80-100 Purcell Little League football players that were teammates of the victim's brother last year, coaches, parents and others personally shook the hands of the three officers.

Also at the meeting, council members approved three units for the police department, two interceptor utility vehicles for \$34,594 each and a ford F150 pursuit pickup for \$34,164 from Bob Moore Ford using the state bidding pricing.

## AC miscreant

No receipt, no refund

A Purcell woman's changing story about a window air conditioner at Walmart didn't ring true with store officials, police or prosecutors.

Now Sarah E. Sabatino, 23, is charged in McClain County District Court with obtaining cash or merchandise by false pretenses and larceny of merchandise from a retailer.

An arrest warrant is outstanding.

According to an affidavit, Sabatino went to the Walmart here on July 8, picked up a GE 5000 window air conditioner valued at \$116 from an aisle display and took it to customer service.

There she allegedly tried to

return it for a refund, telling the clerk she left her receipt at home.

She received no refund, but surveillance video showed her walking out of the store with the air conditioner.

Police posted screen shots from the video on social media on July 13. The next evening Sabatino, who identified herself as Sarah Davis, posted the air conditioner was paid for earlier by a friend who told her to go to Walmart, pick it up and take it to customer service where she was to identify herself and get permission to take it.

However, Sabatino refused to name the friend and police later found the air conditioner installed at her home in the 800 block of South Santa Fe.

# Tips:

beginning any meal preparations. Wash kitchen work surfaces and utensils with hot, soapy water immediately after they have been in contact with raw meat or poultry.

Soap is just as essential in your kitchen as your cooking pans and spatulas.

It’s a good idea to have

separate cutting boards for fruits and vegetables and meat and poultry. However, never wash raw poultry. This spreads germs around the kitchen and isn’t a food safety step.

It is important to recognize the symptoms of salmonella. Symptoms include abdominal cramps and tenderness, fever

and diarrhea.

Keep in mind these symptoms do not show up immediately. A child might show these symptoms of gastroenteritis in a range of 12 to 72 hours.

While you need to be careful with food preparation for everyone in your household, be especially vigilant when

preparing food for younger children.

Children under the age of four are 4-1/2 times more likely to acquire bacterial infections from food compared to adults.

Taking the time to follow these guidelines will help ensure everyone stays healthy.

# Tough loss to Anadarko

Lexington hopes to bounce back with Dibble up next

Lexington knew Anadarko would be a tough foe in its first game of the 2018 football season. The Warriors jumped up to Class 4A this year. Meanwhile, Lexington dropped down to Class 2A.

The difference was unmistakable. The Warriors beat the 'Dawgs, 44-8, last Friday at Anadarko. The Warriors are now 2-0 while Lex began the season 0-1.

Anadarko already had a 30-7 win over the Harrah Panthers under its belt. Lexington head coach Dale Berglan said the Warriors would be a difficult opponent before last Friday's contest.

"They beat Harrah and they will be tough," Berglan said before Friday's game. "It's the same old Anadarko. They are big and physical up front, both offensively and defensively. They are very well coached on both sides of the ball. In all of my years of coaching, I have never seen a team run a counter play as well as Anadarko does - year in and year out."

The Warriors proved Berglan's assessment correct. "Defensively, our mentality is bend but don't break," he said. "Through the first quarter, we did just that by making a few nice stops that kept the Warriors out of the end zone. Offensively, though, we could not get anything going."

In the second quarter, Anadarko started to heat things up. "The second quarter started off going back and forth until Anadarko was able to punch in a 4-yard run," Berglan said. He was referring to junior running back A.J. Davis, who punched the ball in from four yards out.

Then, the Warriors ran a two-point conversion, making the score 8-0 in favor of Anadarko with about nine minutes to go before halftime.

Anadarko struck again before the halftime whistle. "Midway

through, Anadarko picked off a tipped slant route and returned it for a 55-yard touchdown," Berglan said, referring to an interception that led to more Warriors' points. Again, Anadarko ran a two-point conversion for a 16-0 lead.

Down 16-0, Lexington's Mason Hamm picked off a pass and had a nice return into Warriorterritory. "However we could not take advantage of the momentum shift and ended the

"The offense was sparked by a few key plays by Jaylen Cottrell, Toby Prevost and Andre Ibarra," Berglan said. "That allowed us to get the ball moving and finally get into the end zone on a Prevost run."

"A pass to Cottrell for the conversion put us down 30-8. Unfortunately, Anadarko returned the kickoff for a touchdown and later added one more to seal the victory for them."

Davis returned the ensuing kickoff after Lex's touchdown for 95 yards. Another two-point conversion made it 38-8. Novotny then ran the ball for 35 yards for a score. After the two-point conversion failed, Anadarko was left with a 44-8 win.

Berglan knew that Anadarko would be a tough opener for his squad. "Anadarko does a fantastic job of teaching the spread and I've watched it through the years," Berglan said.

"That's what they hang their hats on," he added. "It presents some misdirection and as soon as you start loading the box up to stop the run, they'll turn around and hit you with their passing game. It's very difficult. They have a great quarterback who is an outstanding runner who also has the ability to throw the football. He's a real dual-threat guy."

Even though it wasn't a district game, Berglan said his 'Dawgs were disappointed in defeat.

"Although non-district games don't have any bearing on the playoffs, we would be lying to say that we didn't care if we lost," Berglan said. "We were able to look at some spots and see what personnel changes need to be made. We had some bright spots and some periods of soft play. We must be more physical and eliminate mistakes this coming week."

Berglan has no second-thoughts of playing a team in the season opener like Anadarko, who is two classes above Lex this year.

"They have had such a strong program over the years," Berglan said. "But, we're firm believers that in order to get better, you have to play a better schedule."

Now, it's on to the Dibble Demons for Lexington's home opener at 7 p.m. on Friday on Veterans Night. The Demons were shut out last week, 14-0, by Minco in their season opener. Dibble was 8-4 last year before losing to Millwood, 42-0, in the Class 2A playoffs.

"Dibble is a very talented team that played one of Class A's top teams in Minco to a 14-0 loss," Berglan said. "It took Minco until late in the fourth to make its two scores. They will be aggressive defensively and spread the ball out offensively. It will take a complete game by us to get by the Demons."

first half down, 16-0," Berglan said.

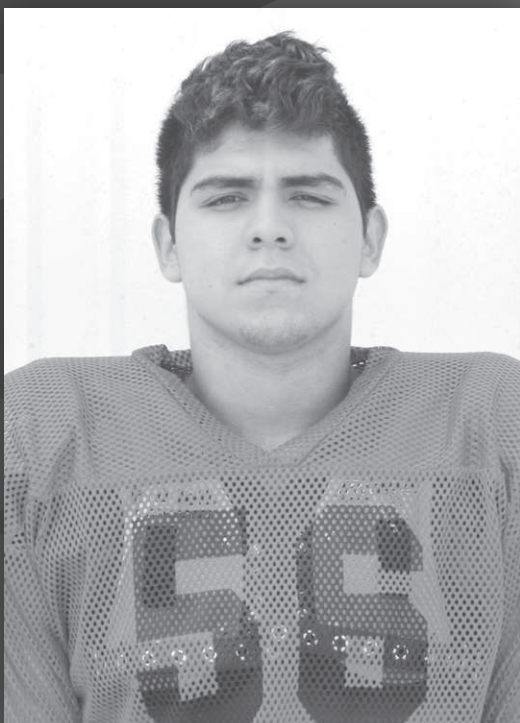

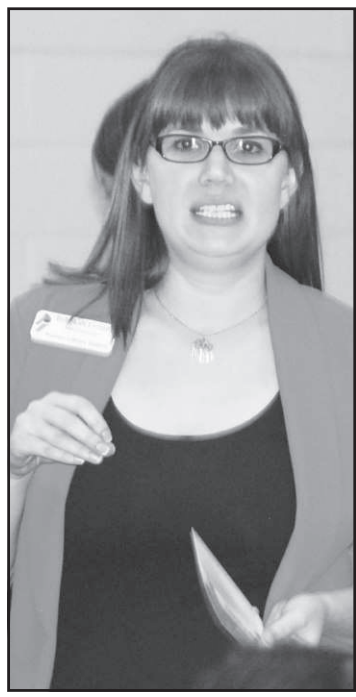
