Purcell Superintendent Jason Midkiff has hit the ground running after passage last Tuesday of the \$29.945 million bond issue.

Voters in the school district passed the measure to construct a \$17.965 junior high, \$11.005 million for improvements to Conger Field, \$300,000 for technology equipment and band uniforms, 758-314 or 70.71 percent and the measure for \$675,000 transportation, 793-288 or

"Some had come five to six miles by canoe," Elmore said. "It was really fulfilling."

Memorial Assembly of God had purchased about 60 water filters in advance of the mission trip and those were sent by boat to the village.

Elmore and his volunteers gave those to families attending the dedication.

"The people were very grateful," Elmore said.





The most vulnerable children in the State of Oklahoma are now at the mercy of would-be abusers due to lack of funding from the State of Oklahoma.


The Oklahoma State Department of health announced it will cut funding for nine child abuse prevention programs and 25 community health centers by November 15.

According to the Oklahoma State Department of Health, 544 families were affected by the deep cuts that came about with the lack of funding from the State Legislature.

The programs that were cut include Oklahoma County: Parent Promise, affecting 71 families and the Latino Community Development Agency, 55 families.

Also, Tulsa County: Parent Child Center of Tulsa that affected 117 families.

The Southwest Region: Great Plains Youth and Family Service, 46 families and Frontline Family Services, 45 families.

The Northeast Region: Helpin-Crisis, 60 families and Northern Oklahoma Youth Services, 40 families.

The Northwest Region: Northwest Family Services, 40 families.

to know little ones will not be protected from people that are either mentally unstable or crack from pressures on the job or at home and become violent.

Two parents were arrested after nurses found maggots crawling out of wounds, feces in their ears and skeletal, malnourished bodies.

Then there is the case of Kelsey Smith-Briggs where she was seen in video limping with casts on various parts of her body and ended up dying at the home of her biological mother.

That case was ruled a homicide.

I could give you more examples but they are all simply disgusting.

My heart goes out to all the affected people, especially the children.

From the author: Looking back at the first 100 weeks

Kevin Slimp's The Good Folks of Lennox Valley

If you have been reading "The Good Folks of Lennox Valley" since the first installment, I know how you are going to respond to the following question: "Can you believe it has been 100 weeks?"

First, you'll take a breath. Next, you will ask yourself, "Has it really been that long?"

These weeks, months and years have flown by, and as I sat at my desk to write the 100th installment, I felt it was a good time to share some of my favorite memories from these two years.

When I first began writing the story of my hometown, my plan was to focus on the lives of the folks who made up the membership of the four churches on Bearden's Corner. In Week One's story, titled "My Hometown," we learned of the four churches and their various responses to being just down the street from the infamous Hoffbrau, the only restaurant to serve beer in The Valley. This installment also introduced the character of Sarah Hyden-Smith, whose introduction led to several emails from female clergypersons stretching from California to Tennessee, most saying they were sure I was writing their personal stories.

I have also received a lot of emails from folks who were certain I was writing about their hometowns. I remember one such message from Mountain City, Tennessee. The writer explained the near-cancellation of Lennox Valley's July 4 fireworks, in response to the local Baptist church's fear they would interfere with proper reverence for the Lord's Day, actually happened in her hometown.

For many readers, Raymond Cooper was both a villain and a favorite character. I've lost count of the emails I've received, sharing stories of radio station owners in small towns throughout America who were spitting images of Raymond.

I believe my favorite line - or at least the one that made me laugh the hardest - was when Cooper asked the local chaplain to come to the stage to say a prayer of healing for his followers who were bemoaning the plight of the election count. That's when he heard Jessie, Hoffbrau waitress, moan, "Good Lord!"

I still laugh at Raymond's response: "Do you hear that, Chaplain? They're starting

without you!"

Now and again, I still visit the church of Brother Jacob, who preaches near my current home. The story of his sermon on Psalm 50, verse 9, brought a lot of response. Using his paraphrased version of the Bible instead of the "approved" Lutheran Study Bible, his sermon theme, "I shall take no bull from you," was a favorite among readers.

If I were forced to select a favorite character, it would be a toss-up between Iris Long and Marvin Walsh. To me, Iris represents small town news-

paper publishers everywhere. She is fiercely honest, concerned about her community, and works an incredible number of hours to make sure every word she writes is true. The real Marvin Walsh was one of the

funniest men I ever knew. Every time he shouts something in our story, I hear Marvin's voice in my memory. Along the way, we have been introduced to

Maxine Miller, author of "Rumor Has It," and Beatrice Justice, who speaks in Bible verses.

One writer suggested, "Your story probably caused more people to pick up their Bibles than anything anyone else has done this week."

A.J. Fryerson, the man who complains about everything, came onto the scene in Week 60. This character is the direct result of someone I knew who complained about literally everything. I was certain, when the time was right, A.J. would appear in our story.

Except for Raymond, the character that probably drew more response than any other was Juliet Stoughton. It seems a lot of readers related to the story of Juliet and her soulmate, who left her for another soulmate. Friends who have read my recent book, "The Good Folks of Lennox Valley," often tell me they love the conversation that takes place in the last chapter between Juliet and her former soulmate, Chris Roadhouse. For whatever reason, that was probably the hardest story line to write.

From a federal agency causing egg prices to soar, to the lovable and inept Mayor "Silver Tongue" Dick Bland, to a radio host who tried to use his celebrity status to sway an election, in the end the good folks of The Valley always seem to discover the real truth.

I have many stories yet to share about the good folks of my hometown. Thank you for tagging along for the first 100.

Fall leaves have many different uses

Extension Ag Educator

As the weather begins to cool down in Oklahoma, many people around the state are wondering what to do with all the leaves that are falling from the trees. There are lots of options that are environmentally friendly.

Homeowners have many more options for disposing of leaves besides raking them into piles in which neighborhood children can play. Bagging them and hauling them to the dump not only takes up valuable landfill space, but it also wastes a valuable garden

One easy way to get rid of leaves is to simply rake them into your perennial beds and use them as winter mulch. Use your judgment in how many leaves to use.

Smaller leaves generally won't suffocate your plants, but larger ones, such as sycamore leaves, might be too much for the plants.

Homeowners who have a compost pile can compost the leaves along with other garden material. No special container is needed. Simply create a pile in an out-of-the-way place and fill it with leaves and other plant material. You can use wire, panels, blocks or other material to hold the material in a pile.

One of the easiest ways to clear the yard of leaves is to mow them. Homeowners should do this when the leaves are dry and before they build up too deep. The chopped leaves return valuable organic matter and nutrients to the soil. Mowers with bag attachments can capture the chopped leaves and then they can be distributed as needed.

If the amount of leaves in the yard seems insurmountable, consider buying or renting a

vacuum-shredder. This process is much more effective than blowing the leaves around with a regular leaf blower.

Vacuum-shredders suck up the leaves, chop them and collect them in a bag. These leaves can be used in the same manner as leaves captured in the lawnmower bag.

If you decide to use the vacuum-shredder option, make sure the leaves are dry.

Shredders, blowers and choppers work most effectively when the leaves are dry. If they're too wet, the machines will clog.

Homeowners who live on a wooded property or acreage may have a better opportunity to dispose of the leaves. Be sure to keep in mind that too many leaves scattered in one area can suffocate existing plants. Use

good judgment and spread out the leaves as much as possible.


In spite of the many ways leaves can be used in the garden, if your leaves have been infected with disease, it is better to get rid of or destroy the leaves rather than use them in the garden. Diseases can over winter on debris and re-infect plants the following year.

So, in order to reduce the chance of diseases from reoccurring, remove them from the garden. Sanitation is a simple yet very effective gardening practice.

The colors of the variety of leaves adds beauty to the fall season, but once the leaves hit the ground, homeowners should get to work and utilize the leaves for other gardening

The impact of cats on native wildlife species

The internet supplies endless amounts of cute kitty videos. A kitten batting around a ball of yarn, a cat chasing a feather duster and fat, grumpy cats lying on their backs have generated many smiles from people throughout the world.

Those same animals, however, are decimating native wildlife populations. Freeranging domestic cats, from feral cats to outdoor house cats, are linked to 63 wildlife extinctions spanning the globe, as they feast on birds, lizards, amphibians and small mammals.

Researchers from Oklahoma State University's Department of Natural Resources Ecology and Management and the Smithsonian Migratory Bird Center recently came together to study how cats are impacting mainland wildlife populations.

Study authors Scott Loss, NREM assistant professor, and Pete Marra, director of SMBC, are studying the impact of cats on wildlife to support science-based conservation and cat population management.

Their research findings, published in the latest issue of Frontiers in Ecology and the Environment, help fill in some gaps previously undiscovered through single studies.

"Our review shows overwhelming evidence that, beyond causing island extinctions, where there were no native predators, and massive numbers of mainland wildlife deaths, cats can exert multiple types of harmful impacts on mainland wildlife species that are reflected at the population level," Loss said.

Based on their literature review, the researchers summarize two main direct effects and two main indirect effects of cats on wildlife populations. The first direct effect, predation, by which cats directly kill and remove individuals from the population has some obvious evidence.

At least 14 observational studies show that cat predation is a substantial source of mortality at the population level for mainland wildlife. In addition, an experimental study in Australia compared two separate populations of small, native rodents for a two-year period. One population was fenced off, not allowing any feline predators. The other was open and fair game.

"This experimental study provides the most convincing evidence yet that cats can cause population declines for mainland wildlife," Loss said. "In areas where cats could not access, the population persisted the whole two years of the study. For the areas where cats could access, the populations declined to extinction in both cases."

The second main direct effect of cats on mainland wildlife populations flies a little more under the radar. Toxoplasmosis, according to the Mayo Clinic, is a disease that results from infection

with the Toxoplasma gondii parasite. It is the motivation behind recommending pregnant women should not clean out litter boxes or garden, because it can be transmitted from infected cat feces, and can be deadly to humans and also to wildlife. Direct mortality from Toxo-

plasma infection has led to population declines in some cases, especially for marsupials, marine mammals, such as sea otters, and tropical primates.

"Indirect effects of Toxoplasma infection are even more surprising. For example, past research in California showed that infected sea otters were more likely to be attacked by sharks," Loss said. "This suggests the pathogen alters otter behavior in a way that makes them more vulnerable to predation, leading to additional mortality that could affect their population."

Finally, cats also can inflict population impacts indirectly through fear. Just the presence of a predator alters prey species' behavior, movements or reproduction in ways that affect wildlife populations.

Notably, one population modeling study showed that fear-induced reduction of bird reproductive output is capable of significantly reducing bird populations, even with low levels of direct predation.

"Based on our comprehensive review of research from around the world, there is now overwhelming evidence that cats impact populations of mainland wildlife in several ways," Marra said. "If we hope to protect native species globally, it is essential that we start implementing more effective management of cats, including keeping owned cats on a leash or indoors and removing unowned cats from outdoor environments."

Veterans who are approved for service-connected disabilities may receive payments from \$133 to \$3,000 each month depending on the severity of their disabilities. Surviving Spouses approved for DIC (after service-connection of the cause of veteran's death is established) may receive from \$1,250 to \$1,500 per month.

Based on several factors, Pension benefits may be payable to some veterans or surviving spouses. One of the necessary elements requires the veteran to have served in the military, at least one day during a wartime period. Income, medical expenses, and assets are also determining factors on eligibility for Pension benefits. CCC monarch effort cited by state association

The Chickasaw Nation has been recognized by the Oklahoma Museums Association (OMA) for conservation initiamonarch butterflies.

The award was presented to (CCC) during OMA's annual conference in mid-September.

First place in the OMA Conservation and Preservation category went to the CCC for work done by its horticulture and environmental experts.

For about three years, they have prepared specialized garden plots to attract monarchs and other butterfly species.

Efforts also enable bees and other pollinators to thrive as gardens offer nectar-rich flora specifically aimed at attracting them.

Monarch Watch focuses on tives to preserve and protect monarch butterflies, habitat and fall migration. Last year, members of the

the Chickasaw Cultural Center tribes gathered at the CCC to construct a "hoop" house. The structure allows monarchs and other butterflies a place of sanctuary. Milkweed and nectar plants are planted inside to help sustain them on their spring and fall migrations

Several plots have been prepared in the Tishomingo National Wildlife Refuge and throughout the Chickasaw Nation. Each is filled with plants aimed at increasing the population of monarchs.

The Chickasaw Nation and plants. When the eggs hatch, enters the chrysalis stage. After 28 to 38 days, a magnificent monarch butterfly emerges.

> Milkweed is key to survival. Monarchs will only lay eggs on milkweed plants. Once prevalent throughout the Plains, milkweed is scarce due to human activity and monarch populations have plunged over the past 20 years.

> The Chickasaw Cultural Center in Sulphur has introduced more than 600,000 guests to Chickasaw culture, heritage and tradition since opening in 2010.

The Oklahoma Museums Association is a nonprofit charitable organization founded in 1972 as the primary source of information and professional development for Oklahoma's 500 museums, historic sites, historic houses, living history museums, The orange, white and black tribal cultural centers and other creatures lay eggs on milkweed museum-related institutions.

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

'Strong' passwords a key to protection in a digital world

It is one of the oldest areas of concern in the digital age: creating passwords that the user can remember and yet are as secure as possible.

"It doesn't matter if you live in the most urban of cities or deep in the heart of rural America, recent news of companies whose databases of stored passwords have been compromised reminds us that no password is unimportant," said Cynthia Hobbs, computer specialist with Oklahoma State University's Division of Agricultural Sciences and Natural Resources.

Oh, most people get it, in theory. After all, billions of people shop, read email, scan social media, review credit card transactions and check bank accounts through websites and smartphone apps. Through it all, users are encouraged to create as secure a password as possible.

But what exactly constitutes the industry recommended level of security? According to Google, "strong" passwords contain a mix of letters, numbers and symbols.

"An eight-character password with numbers, symbols and mixed-case letters is harder to guess because it has 30,000 times as many possible combinations than an eight-character password with only lower case letters," Hobbs said.

Great advice, but it has also led to user annoyance, often issued against oneself for failing to remember each unique "strong" password.

"If you create a password from a mix of random characters, you may find yourself having to write them down to ensure you don't forget it," Hobbs said. "What hap-

pens if somebody stumbles across your reminder note to yourself?"

Instead, Hobbs believes users should heed advice from StaySafeOnline, a resource site from the National Cyber Security Alliance. StaySafe-Online recommends a user to "focus on sentences or phrases that you like to think about and are easy to remember."

Hobbs said some people like to use lyrics of favorite songs instead of random characters. For example, if using the OSU Alma Mater, one might choose the first letter of the opening lyrics "Proud And Immortal Bright Shines Your Name." One can then strengthen the password further by including both capitalized and lowercase letters, numbers and perhaps even a symbol if allowed.

"PalbsyN2017 is a strong password and yet easier to remember than just randomly assigned characters, in part because it has a connection to you but is not one anyone trying to illegally access your account is likely to consider," Hobbs said. "Keep in mind, when adding a number to your password it is best to avoid using a number obviously associated with you such as an anniversary or birthday."

Another recommended practice for securing one's accounts and passwords is to enable two-factor authentication, which adds a layer to your login process. Many sites, such as Google, Apple and credit card companies, now use this feature either as an option or as a mandatory practice.

"For example, if I log into my Gmail account from a new device, I receive a text message with a code I must enter before I can access my email," Hobbs said.

What about high-powered

hackers who use computers to decrypt passwords as opposed to the "guess and type" method? To compromise a password, hackers use a variety of tools: dictionary words, other compromised passwords by the same user on other accounts and information gathered on the user from social

media sites and online forums. "Often, hackers will use brute force methods to compromise an account's password," Hobbs said. "These methods use software and fast computers to attempt access to your account. Even with a fast computer, intelligent software and a fast internet connection, you can make their process incredibly time consuming with mixing both upper- and lower-case letters with a special character."

For example, research indicates an eight-character password made of only lower case letters would take 2.4 days to process but using six lower case letters, one upper case letter and an asterisk, it would take 2.1 centuries to process.

In short, while following the practices listed above is not a guarantee against personal information being compromised it will make things more difficult for cyber criminals.

"It is important you do what you can reasonably do as your online security should always be a priority," Hobbs said. "It is far easier to protect yourself now than after your data has been compromised."

October is National Cyber Security Awareness Month.

Collateral is foreclosed; that all the defendants interest in the Collateral be adjudged subject, inferior and junior to the Plaintiff's interest and that the Plaintiff be awarded sole possession of the Collateral. Judgment will further be taken against you allowing

the Plaintiff to have caused to be issued an Order for Delivery of the collateral pursuant to 12 O.S. Sec. 1571 et seg., and that the defendants be restrained from concealing, damaging, destroying, transferring, encumbering, altering or removing the Collateral from the County pending a hearing, and for such other relief as is proper; including a judgment against Defendant Delynna Marie Kelley in the sum of \$36,683.24, plus accrued interest in the amount of \$3,132.85 as of July 20, 2017; and continuing to accrue at the contract rate from March 7, 2017 until paid; late charges as set forth in the Contract; a reasonable attorney's fee; insurance advances by the Plaintiff, if any; and all expenses necessary to protect the property and realize upon the security interest and all costs of this action; all of which you will take due notice.
