





It's becoming a pretty impressive cinematic universe in it's own right. Sure, right now it's just two Conjuring and two Annabelle films, but Warner Bros. is also in the process of creating spin off movies featuring evils from the "The Conjuring 2," with "The Nun" and "The Crooked Man" set to release in the coming years.

In fact, the more I think about it, the more similarities I see between this series and what Marvel created with their superhero cinematic universe.

They're even doing teasers for upcoming movies after the credits now, just like Marvel.

Not that I'm complaining. While I found 2014s "Annabelle" pretty disappointing, hopefully a good sign of things good.

pany sold about 56,000 of around, but they only played one side of a 78-rpm record. Most of the music coming from a Wurlitzer 1015 bubbler wasn't Buddy Holly or Elvis Presley; it was much more likely to be Glenn Miller or Tommy Dorsey.

Jukeboxes may have saved Wurlitzer the way the Mustang saved Ford and the Caravan saved Chrysler, but if you remember B-17 being Hey Jude, Daydream Believer, or Crocodile Rock, you were probably playing it on a Seeburg. The 78 had a narrow hole that fit the spindle on record players of the day, but a 10- or 12-inch disc was a single; each side held a maximum of three to four minutes of audio. Although the 78 made the transition from shellac to vinyl, RCA Victor showed up with the 45-rpm format in the 1950s, cleverly designed with a much bigger

And that affected the jukebox business.

Seeburg introduced a jukebox that played both sides of a 45; the Wurlitzer could play only one side of a 78. And because the 78s were bigger, a Wurlitzer held only 20 songs, while early Seeburgs held 50 records – 100 songs – and later models had twice that capacity. And that's the difference between the Seeburg Wall-O-Matic 100 and the Seeburg Wall-O-Matic 200, although neither of those is really a jukebox; the Wall-O-Matic was a music selector, a device connected to a jukebox that allowed customers to select and pay for music without ever leaving their seats. It was also the most brilliant innovation the music-on-demand industry had seen to date.

Fall armyworms on the move

Numerous reports are coming in from Eastern and Southern Oklahoma that fall armyworms are feeding on bermudagrass and may be ready to damage seedling wheat when planted.

Fall armyworms are caterpillars that directly damage many crops including sorghum heads, fescue and bermudagrass pastures, seedling wheat, soybeans and residential lawns.

name because they generally occur in greater numbers in the fall, and they have a tendency to move in large numbers and "march" to their next meal. Mc-Clain County wheat producers should be on the lookout for this insect from emergence to the first killing frost.

dwelling, "climbing cutworm" caterpillars. Mature fall armyworms measure 1-1/2 inches long. Their body color can to black.

When looking for them, pay particular attention to their head

Small larvae do not eat through the leaf tissue, but instead, scrape off all of the green tissue and leave a clear membrane that gives the leaf a "window pane" appearance. Larger larvae can feed vo-Fall armyworms get their raciously on newly emerged leaves, chewing completely through them.

When large larvae are present, significant damage can occur in a relatively short period of time. If you took all of the food they eat during their larval stage, 70 percent of it would be consumed in the sixth or last Fall armyworms are surface instars (stage of growth).

Scout for fall armyworms every few days after emergence by examining plants in several locations within the field. Fall range from green, to brown armyworms are most active in the morning or late afternoon. Inspect some plants that are showing evidence of injury, and

capsule and the presence of a look for small caterpillars in the whorl of the wheat seedling.

When scouting, look at plants along the field margin as well as in the interior, because they often move in from road ditches and weedy areas. The suggested treatment threshold in seedling wheat is two to three larvae per linear foot of row.

More often than not, economically damaging numbers do not occur in Oklahoma. But, with the right weather conditions, they can build up and cause problems. If they occur on wheat this fall as predicted, it will be the third year in a row that damaging numbers have been present.

Fall armyworms are most easily controlled when they are small (less than 1/2 inch). Several insecticides are registered for control of fall armyworm in wheat. Carefully read and follow all label restrictions for application and grazing restrictions. Make food safety a priority this fall

During the busy fall season, water, let stand for a few minwhether you're preparing a packed lunch for your child, a weeknight dinner for the family, or a tailgate feast for the whole crew, make sure you prevent foodborne illness by following USDA's four steps to food safety: Clean, Separate, Cook and Chill.

Clean: Wash your hands and cooking surfaces before and after handling food. Wash fruits and vegetables before eating, cutting, or cooking. Make sure lunch boxes and coolers are clean before packing.

Separate: Avoid cross contamination. Don't let raw meat, poultry, or egg products come in contact with fruits, vegetables, or prepared foods. Never put cooked food on a plate or tray that held raw meat or poultry.

Cook raw beef, pork, lamb and veal steaks, chops, roasts, and fish to a minimum internal temperature of 145°F and let them rest for three minutes before eating.

> When cooking raw ground beef, pork, lamb, and veal, make sure the meat reaches a minimum internal temperature of 160°F.

> Egg dishes should also be cooked to a safe minimum internal temperature of 160°F. All poultry should be cooked to a safe minimum internal temperature of 165°F.

> Chill: When packing food, use an insulated lunchbox or cooler and at least two cold sources, such as freezer packs. Discard any perishable foods that were left at room temperature longer than two hours (one hour in temperatures above 90°F).

Lunch Packing Tips:

If the lunch contains perishable food items like luncheon meats, eggs, cheese, or yogurt, make sure to pack it with at least two cold sources, such as freezer packs.

Harmful bacteria multiply rapidly so perishable food transported without a cold source won't stay safe long.

Frozen juice boxes or water can also be used as freezer packs. Freeze these items overnight and use with at least one other freezer pack. By lunchtime, the liquids should be thawed and ready to drink.

If packing a hot lunch, like soup, chili, or stew, use an insulated container to keep it hot. Fill the container with boiling

If packing a child's lunch the night before, parents should leave it in the refrigerator overnight. The meal will stay cold longer because everything will be refrigerator temperature when it is placed in the lunchbox.

Eating and Disposal Tips:

Teach children to properly wash their hands before eating lunch. If running water isn't available, pack disposable wipes for cleaning hands before and after eating.

After lunch, children should discard all leftover food and used food packaging.

Friot also ordered Barnes to not call for medical assistance complete three years of supervised release at the end of 51 months. The judge also imposed a \$10,000 fine, payable immediately.

Barnes had faced a maximum penalty of life imprisonment and a \$250,000 fine.

In October 2016, a federal grand jury indicted Barnes on deprivation of rights under color of law in the death of Kory Wilson, a jail inmate, more than three years prior.

Waiving his right to a jury trial, Barnes pled guilty on repeatedly asked for his insulin. he died on June 21.

As jail administrator, Barnes U.S. District Judge Stephen had directed the staff they could for an inmate without his permission.

> Wilson, a Type 1 diabetic, was booked into the jail on June 16,2013, as a pre-trial detainee.

> In the days following, Wilson never received insulin or other medication for his diabetes, nor was he seen or treated by a doctor.

> According to a federal lawsuit filed in August 2014 by Wilson's estate, Wilson informed jail staff at booking that he was insulin-dependent and

His requests, along with those of family members, were ignored, according to the lawsuit.

When a blood test showed Wilson's glucose level dangerously elevated at 329 and the prisoner asked to be taken to the hospital, a supervisor instead instructed staff to give him water.

It wasn't until June 19 after Wilson lost consciousness that the staff called an ambulance.

Wilson arrived at Purcell Municipal Hospital with a glucose level of 889.

He was transferred to Norman Regional Hospital, where

According to the head coach, the team's hitting will be something they will continue to work on, but he was pleased overall



Recently one of the homeless veterans we helped several years ago to receive a 50% percent service connected disability went to a local organization in the eastern part of Oklahoma to ask for an increase in his VA rating. As no evidence was submitted to support his request to VA, he received a notice of a proposed reduction in his VA benefits. When he called me, I gave him the name of a doctor who might be able to fill out a VA Disability Benefits Questionnaire (DBQ) to be used as evidence to support our request to reconsider. I'm pleased to report that instead of having a reduction his rating was increased to 70 percent. He told me he went to that local group because it was a two-hour drive to us. Needless to say, he won't be going back to the other place.

It is my opinion that the VA Disability Benefits Questionnaire gives veterans an opportunity to support their request service connection of a new disability or to be used as evidence for an increase. I have had veterans who submitted a VA DBQ form from their medical provider for service connection of a disability that was approved solely on the DBQ evidence sent in with their 21-526 EZ application for VA benefits. Some claims will always be denied no matter what type of evidence is sent in with their application.

One of the most difficult types of claims to service connect is back or leg injuries. Most veterans did not seek medical treatment when an injury occurred that did not require stitches. They would just get up and keep going no matter how much pain they were in. Another reason they did not seek treatment was when they were in the field no one was there to help.



opening chapters of Romans, we have seen Paul – with the authority of an apostle – lowering the gavel on the Gentiles regarding the common sins of the Roman world, lest they are or should consider dabbling in them again themselves in any way (1:18-32).

As a brother in the Roman congregation stands up to read Paul's letter before the assembly, the Christians of Jewish descent must have gloated during the reprimanding of these Gentile Christians.

Then the apostle – perhaps with a lifting of the pen and a deep breath – turns his attention to the Jews, lowering the gavel on them with a "bang!":

"...you are inexcusable, O man," Paul writes, "whoever you are who judge, for in whatever you judge another you condemn yourself; for you who judge practice the same things. ... And do you think this, O man, you who judge those practicing such things, and doing the same, that you will escape the judgment of God?" (2:3, 5).

"Do you think this?" he says. In other words: "What are you thinking, brethren?"

Here you sit in these pews, listening to the reading of this epistle, thinking you are in such good shape and far more righteous than these pitiful Gentiles who do not have any of Abraham's blood flowing in them. You sit up high on a pedestal and judge them. How well do you really think this kind of behavior, this selfrighteousness, this judging,

If Paul's reprimanding of In our recent studies in the any wayward Gentile Christian was a stern talk, this is a tongue-lashing! Paul knows for the gospel to have its full effect – for it to have its power to save uncompromisingly – these foolish ways of thinking have to be exposed and removed.

And Paul is just beginning. A bit later he resorts to a cutting sarcasm, saying, in essence:

"So, you are going to rest in the law, since you are such knowledgeable people. Oh, you are knowledgeable - I'll give you that - and you do know how to tell people how they ought to live. You are good at showing them the things 'that are more excellent,' and you are quite the 'guide of the blind' and an 'instructor of the foolish,' but you are forgetting something: You are forgetting that you are as guilty as they are. You do the same things, have the same attitudes, maybe worse" (See 2:17-21).

Again, brethren: What are you thinking?

Then, Paul in his skilled manner of persuasion, takes away their unspoken argument of, "Don't forget that we are of the circumcision," even before they can articulate it. Paul knows that, to them, this outward action of circumcision was, in a sense, their "once-saved-always-saved, get-out-of-jail-free" card. (He once used it himself.)

Paul says, "Do you think circumcision is your savior? Don't you know that if the uncircumcised – that is, these Gentiles who sit over on the other side of the building is going set with God? What obey the law and 'write it on are you thinking? Surely you their hearts' (2:14-15) that their org

uncircumcision trumps your circumcision every time!'

Then he gives his powerful closing argument: "For he is not a Jew who is one outwardly," Paul writes "nor is circumcision that which is outward in the flesh; but he is a Jew who is one inwardly; and circumcision is that of the heart, in the Spirit, not in the letter ..." (2:28-29).

"Do you want to be right with God, brethren?" Paul is saying. If so, get rid of your self-righteous, entitled attitude, and stop leaning on these outward shows of righteousness you think will get you to heaven. Start working on making a real, true, genuine, humble, serving-of-others inward change. Start way down inside your heart, and you can get things right with the true Judge of the world, the one who reads clearly every man's heart. If you want to see heaven, you Christians will have to make some serious changes down deep."

Some 2000 years later, we read this scathing reprimand by the apostle, and we can't help but think: How can these Christians back then miss the boat so badly? How can they think they are better, more righteous, than the next person, putting themselves high on a pedestal? Why, what a pitiful attitude! They deserved Paul's tongue-lashing! Why, how could anybody accept such a self-righteous, judgmental, entitled attitude!

And Paul, hearing our response, would say today, I am sure:

"Brethren, what are you thinking?"

Whether we like it or not, we numerous examples of people fabricating made-up stories about one or another candidate, untruths that were sent out to sway or repel voters. Here are some tips about avoiding "fake

First, make sure that the source - e.g., the URL (web) address - is legitimate. Does it look odd? Second, does the article make you mad? False reports often target emotions. If common sense tells you it might not be true, then it may not be.

Third, see if other major news outlets are reporting the same thing. Fourth, if still in doubt, look at fact-checking sites, such as FactCheck.org. Finally, do not share news until you are sure it is accurate.

We sin against the Eight Commandment when we are accomplices to spreading lies. As Jesus said to the Jews who did not believe in him, Satan is the "father of lies." (John 8:44)

As disciples of Jesus, we seek only the truth because the truth "will set us free" (John 8:32). Get in the habit of seeking only legitimate balanced news sources, such as National Public Radio (NPR) and the Wall Street Journal newspaper. For television news, consider the PBS News Hour. Editorials may be slanted, but the news reporting is balanced and ac-

As Christians, we must seek the truth in all things, even when the truth challenges our deeply-held assumptions. Life is hard enough when everyone seeks the truth! Let us not complicate it any further.
