Relief for backed up traffic at the Interstate 35/State Highway 9 West interchange, better overall traffic flow and safety in the area are being prioritized by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation.

These goals were the focus of a public meeting held by ODOT in Goldsby on Thursday as engineers addressed interchange modifications planned for the area.

Cody Boyd, from ODOT's strategic communications division, said under the guidance of Chief Engineer Brian Taylor and District 3 Engineer Ron Brown, ODOT engineers presented some of the analysis of the interchange and the intersections and how traffic currently flows.

Then, they presented several different options which include a Divergent Diamond interchange, a single-point interchange,



Chamber hears Osborn

Labor Commissioner tells members about her office

Leslie Osborn was the keynote speaker at last Friday's monthly Heart of Oklahoma Chamber or Commerce Luncheon at Mid-America Technology Center.

Heart of Oklahoma Chamber of Commerce members know a little more about the office of Oklahoma Labor Commissioner after last Friday's luncheon at Mid-America Technology Center.

Leslie Osborn was the key note speaker at the Mexican Food luncheon, hosted by Than and Sally Maynard at Coldwell Banker Heart of Oklahoma Real Estate.

Osborn touched on a number of subjects that all fall under the responsibility of her office from insuring children in all 77 counties receive free education to inspecting every amusement ride in the state each year.

"We check every amusement ride once a year from the Tulsa State Fair to White Water to local carnivals.

"Our office is the safety agency for the State," she said. "Our office is to provide safety for citizens and safety in the work force.

Another responsibility of her office is to ensure workers in Oklahoma get paid.

"If you work in Oklahoma, we have administrative law judges that make sure employees are paid their wages.'

And, Osborn says she wants family-friendly work places.

"You've heard the saying happy wife, happy life," Osborn said. "I say happy employees are productive employees."

Of all the issues and disagreements that go on, Osborn's take on the matter is simply a lack of civility in society.

She has an application on her phone, like most politicians do, that alerts her when her name is mentioned.

"I was on "Flashpoint" one Sunday and my phone started immediately going off. By midnight I had 67 messages about my personal appearance and none about what I was talking about with Mike Turpen.

"We need to teach our children to be critical thinkers and get back to raising humans," Osborn said meaning teach them to be nice to one another.

"I quit watching the nasty news cycle three years ago and haven't missed anything," the commissioner said. "I know when there is a natural disaster or important news development from my Apple New on my phone."

She said she doesn't have to listen to the opinion of a commentator for 57 minutes out of an hourlong news cast and told of friends and even her own aunt that don't talk to her anymore due to listening to the network news.

Before she became Labor Commissioner, Osborn served 10 years as a member of the Oklahoma Legislature.

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

I glanced at them as we were sitting down but didn't give it much thought.



He also helped the settlers forge an alliance with the Wampanoag, a local tribe, which would endure for more than 50 years and tragically remains one of the sole examples of harmony between European colonists and Native Americans. (from History.com)



Elmore provided some Highway Patrol or local sherinsight and tips for dealing with deer on the move:

• Oklahoma deer are not migratory, but they do move more within their territories during seasonal changes.

• When food supplies decrease, deer may explore closer to residential areas to supplement their diets.

• Deer are less cautious about crossing roads when rutting bucks are interested in mating and does are trying to evade them.

• Normally nocturnal, deer don't follow Daylight Saving adjustments and work schedules, so don't rely on driving routines.

According to Oklahoma Highway Safety Office statistics, there were 836 deerrelated crashes on Oklahoma roads in 2020, including two fatalities. As of November this year, four people have died in deer-related crashes. Elmore suggested:

• If you hit an animal, pull to the side of the road when it's safe and make sure the vehicle isn't hazardous to drive. Use hazard lights and

Prepare farm and ranch equipment for winter storage

Trisha Gedon Extension Educator

With colder weather just around the corner, many farmers and ranchers are preparing to store machinery for the winter. Rodents will be eyeing that same machinery for another reason – as a cozy place to shelter for a few months.

"There are dozens of nooks and crannies under the hood of a piece of farm machinery that are attractive to many rodent species," said Kevin Shelton, Oklahoma State University Extension associate specialist and coordinator of OSU's Pesticide Safety Education Program. "However, the last thing you want to do is provide an efficiency apartment to these rodents for the winter. The wiring harness is appealing and is a readily available chew toy, which will cause lots of problems next spring."

Shelton said the easiest thing to do to deter rodents is to simply raise the hood "Avoid placing baits where while machinery is stored in a barn or shed. This allows light in and makes the engine compartment less attractive. However, this may not be appropriate for outside storage due rain, wind and snow.to

Baits and traps also are options in developing a control program. Tips include:

• Snap traps are one of the oldest types of traps and usually provide a quick death to the rodent. Mice typically have small territories, so traps must be placed within their range to be effective.

They can be placed under around," he said.

a vehicle hood and inside the cab and glove box. Be sure to place snap traps where pets don't have access.

• Live-catch traps are rodent stations that can be baited with a food attractant or rodenticide. Some may have snap traps or glue boards inside.

• Because rodents are naturally inquisitive, sticky traps or glue boards work well.

• Mice are nibblers, so putting a little bait in several bait stations will help increase consumption. Use several kinds of bait until a preference is detected, then use that one until feeding stops. Always use an enclosed bait station, and never place them where children or pets can have access.

"While application of toxic baits is a viable method of rodent control, it's important for people to be aware of where they are baiting and with what," Shelton said. non-target animals are likely to come in contact."

Natural predators are playing their own part in pest control as well. Snakes, both venomous and nonvenomous, house and barn cats, foxes and bobcats are effective rodent killers. So are birds such as hawks, owls and even roadrunners.

"It won't be long until rodents are looking for a new home for the winter. Keeping these tips in mind will help ensure your equipment is in good shape when spring rolls



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



Gifting spring blooms

Give the gift of spring this monthly for 3, 6 or 12 months. winter to gardeners and non- Just water when the potting gardeners alike. A pot of tulips, daffodils or other spring flowering bulbs is sure to brighten a dreary winter day and elevate the recipient's mood.

Spring flowering bulbs need 12 to 15 weeks of 35 to 45 degree temperatures to initiate flowering.

Bulbs planted in the fall, receive the chill they need, and add

welcome color to spring gardens. Those in warmer climates, typically zones 8, 9 and 10, need a different approach. In those areas, low chill bulbs that don't need as long a cold period or pre-cooled bulbs are grown. The pre-cooled bulbs also sold as pre-chilled, have received the needed cold period and can be grown like annuals.

No matter where you garden, spring flowering bulbs can be chilled in a spare refrigerator. Keep bulbs away from apples and pears. These fruits give off ethylene gas, a natural hormone that does not harm people, but can hasten ripening and interfere with flowering.

Check the pots occasionally and water when needed to keep the soil slightly moist, but not soggy wet.

Some friends and family may appreciate a DIY bulb forcing kit as their gift. Spring flowering bulbs, potting mix, and a container with drainage holes are all that is needed.

Provide directions for assembly, suggestions for providing the cold treatment if needed and proper care.

Others may prefer a gift that requires minimal care like Gardener's Supply Company's Months of Bloom. Order once

and these pre-planted bulb gardens are delivered to the recipient

mix starts to dry and enjoy watching the spring flowering bulbs sprout, grow and flower.

Keep spring flowering bulb gardens in a cool, bright location to extend their bloom time. Once the plants are done blooming, you can add them to the compost pile.

For those that prefer to enjoy them a second season and beyond, provide some post-flowering care. Remove the faded flowers and move the container to a sunny window.

Keep watering thoroughly whenever the top few inches of soil begin to dry. Pour off any excess water that collects in the saucer to prevent root rot and apply a dilute solution of any flowering houseplant fertilizer. Once the leaves turn yellow

and die or the soil in the garden warms and the danger of frost has passed, you can move them into the garden. Tulips and hyacinths perform

best in sunny areas with welldrained soils. These bulbs tend to flourish for a year or two and then produce few or no flowers. Daffodils and grape hyacinths

grow in sun or shade and a variety of soil types. These tend to be long lived as they grow and spread over time.



Our next Food Give Away will be Saturday, December 18, from 12 to 4 p.m. This is the Saturday before Christmas. subject of Hope. Each Sunday of Advent is associated with the coming birth of the Christ child. Sometimes there are different "emotions" for the same Sunday. For example, the first Sunday can also have readings Many mainstream Protestant reflecting the prophets (espechurches display candles in cially Isaiah) or faithfulness.

To emphasize the season of waiting and watching, one such reading is taken from Matthew 24:36—44 "Stay awake! Be ready! The Human One is coming, but about that day and hour no one knows-neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father knows. Keep awake, for you do not know on what day your Lord is coming. Therefore, be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

We light the first purple candle of Advent to remind us to stay vigilant. In darkness we lose direction, and lighting a candle helps us find our way. In the dimness, we cannot see where we have been or where we are going. A single candle, flickering brightly, helps us find the path again.

Spanish-language signs and billboards line many streets, such as Southwest 29th Street, where the number of Hispanicowned bakeries, restaurants, mechanic shops and other businesses have significantly

increased over the past decade. Oklahoma's Hispanic population grew more than any other demographic group over the last 10 years, with Oklahoma City's southwest side fueling much of the growth. The increase in population and economic activity has buoyed hopes that Hispanics, a group long under-represented in Oklahoma politics, would finally see their political capital

But now the GOP-led Legislature is on the verge of passing its congressional redistricting plan, which critics say would mute the group's growing political, and largely Democratic,

State Rep. Jose Cruz, D-Oklahoma City, said the proposed maps, which would move thousands from the heavily Hispanic southwest side of the city from the politically competitive 5th Congressional District to the firmly Republican 3rd Congressional District, show "blatant partisanship" from Republicans, who have been in charge of the redistricting process.

"It sends a message to our constituents: 'It doesn't matter what you think as long as we're in charge," he said. Amid Growth, Political

Debating Oklahoma's Redistricting Plan

State House Rep. Ryan Martinez, R-Edmond, who chairs the Legislature's joint Select Committee on Redistricting, refuted suggestions that lawmakers unfairly carved out the Hispanic population to make their map work.

Asked what Hispanic representation is going to look like in Oklahoma over the next decade during a press conference this month, Martinez said "we don't take race into account."

But the proposed map cuts the number of Hispanics in District 5 in half — from 153,173 to 78,218. Democratic lawmakers say the move is an attempt to dilute the largely Democratic Hispanic vote in the area and solidify Republican congressional incumbents.

"The group that benefits the most from these new lines is the GOP," said Rep. Forrest Bennett, D-Oklahoma City, who represents State House District 92, an area that extends from the city's downtown core to the southside. "I don't know how else to say it. At the national level, they are trying

themselves as best they can to retake the House."

Representation for Hispanic Oklahomans in the state's congressional delegation was far from the only concern raised in interviews with state legislators, attorneys and business people who live and work in south Oklahoma City.

Some expressed concern over how cutting their community into three districts instead of two — Cole has represented portions of south Oklahoma City since 2002 — would affect Hispanic voter participation. Others shared a historic feeling of being forgotten by the greater metro area that has not dissipated even in the face of explosive growth in Oklahomans identifying themselves as Hispanic.

The state's population grew by 208,002 people since 2010 67 percent of whom identify as Hispanic.

State Sen. Michael Brooks, D-Oklahoma City, attributes that growth to a relatively new southwest OKC immigrant community "that's put down roots and now is growing generationally, through birthright."

"Over the past 20 years, with (redistricting maps) and lots of other initiatives, there has been more of a uniting of the urban core than I've ever seen in my life and I was born on the City," he said.

Though Brooks said it's un fortunate the southside is going to be split up, he sees a positive sign for the future.

"Projecting out, if (population trends) continue the way they are, gerrymandering may be more difficult just because the (Hispanic) population may be spread out over the entire state," he said.

'Looking For Different Things On the Ballot'

The growth in Oklahoma's Hispanic population beyond its urban cores is visible in Canadian County, which led state counties with a 110 percent increase followed by Logan (84.5) and Payne (79.7).

Still, Brooks said the Hispanic and Latino culture in south Oklahoma City is distinctive.

"I think there's a greater concentration of Latino entrepreneurs starting their own business on the southwest side of Oklahoma City that you don't see in most parts of western Oklahoma," he said. "You don't see, you know, the depth and breadth of entrepreneurship that we see on the southside."

At a press conference earlier this month, State House Speaker Charles McCall, R-Atoka, responded to a question about what people in southwest

mon with those in Guymon, a small town in the panhandle, with his own question.

"What language do you think is the predominant language in Guymon Public Schools?" he said. "It's Spanish. Not English."

Texas County, where Guymon is located, saw a 25% increase in its Hispanic population since 2010, making just over half of the population in the county Hispanic. The growth can largely be attributed to the establishment of Seaboard Foods, the nation's fourth largest pork processor in the 1990s. Seaboard created the opportunity for Latinos to settle and start families in the area.

Cruz, one of four Hispanics in the state Legislature, said the people in Guymon have different, rural needs. He said it was not the GOP's goal to lump central Oklahoma Latinos populations in with those in the panhandle.

'While that's what it looks like that's definitely not the reason why and definitely not the goal in mind," he said, pointing out that other towns in the 3rd District such as Altus, Enid and Woodward have small Latino populations.

Both Cruz and Bennett emphasized the diversity of perspective within Latino communities. A 2020 poll from the Pew Research Center found southwest side of Oklahoma that about 62% of Latinos of the Hispanic community identify with or lean toward the have been appointed to city and Democratic Party, while 34% state boards and commissions identify with or lean toward the Republican Party.

> Even how people self identify is hardly uniform. The U.S. Census Bureau defines Hispanics or Latino "as a person of Cuban, Mexican, Puerto Rican, South or Central American, or other Spanish culture or origin regardless of race.

> Though Bennett said his Hispanic constituents' issues are a lot more similar to everyone else's: They want jobs, they want safe communities," he points out that U.S. Rep. Lucas normally runs for re-election on rural issues. Efforts to reach Lucas, which included multiple voice messages left with his Yukon and Washington, D.C. offices, were unsuccessful.

> "The needs of the people in Guymon and Osage County are important, or they matter just as much as the needs of the people in the southside of Oklahoma City, but they are different and look for different things on the ballot," he said.

'An Egregious Move'

Javier Hernandez, an immigration attorney based in Oklahoma City said votingaged Hispanics in the state can vary in their participation in elections and the political

to make sure that they position Oklahoma City have in comprocess. Some are politicians, engaged business owners and activists, he said. Others "don't know or don't care for politics."

"I'm thinking about people who become U.S. citizens, but only care to become U.S. citizens for immigration purposes, to help their families or to potentially travel safely without being denied entry because they're still permanent residents," Hernandez said.

The percentage of constituents who research ballot issues and candidates varies according to demands on their time, Cruz said.

"South Oklahoma City is home to hard-working people," he said. "People working blue collar jobs. They work twoto-three jobs. They make less, so they have to work more to provide for their families.

"Even for English-speaking voters, figuring out what the ballot means, who the candidates are, what the state questions mean, that's hard work."

Bennett said it comes down to a sense of belonging. Though the population in Oklahoma City's southside is exploding, its "political power is not there yet because the participation rate isn't there yet. A big part of that is because they have regularly felt forgotten by the rest of the city."

After feeling left out for decades, Cruz said south Oklahoma City residents and members in recent years, allowing them to see themselves in municipal government.

"People are finally starting to feel like they can share their concerns with their elected officials, knowing that they will be taken seriously," he said. "Progress has been made to bring our city together.

"These congressional maps, however, tear us apart. The people that drew these maps behind closed doors looked at Oklahoma City and asked 'what community lacks the political power and acumen to oppose such an egregious move?' And they chose mine."
