Purcell Firefighters were worn slick as of Monday morning after battling grass fires Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

The biggest fire was the one Thursday that eventually had first responders evacuate residents from homes on Canadian

and Santa Fe streets in Purcell for a time.

The fire started along the Canadian River at 170th and Gallamore around 4 p.m. Wednesday but firemen were unable to access the blaze due

Perhaps it was a God thing that led Chris Wright here.

The small town boy from Shattuck who discovered his penchant of caring for others at that town's hospital while still in high school is back in another small town's hospital rediscovering the connection.

Since August 16, Chris the administrator has been chief executive officer at Purcell Municipal Hospital. And when the opportunity presents itself, Chris the RN helps care for the hospital's patients.

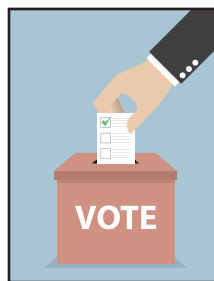

Election reminders and tips

Polls open 7-7 April 5

Polls will be open from 7 a.m. to 7 p.m. April 5, for the Board of Education General Election. McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley offers these important tips to voters—especially those who will be casting a ballot for the first time.

Mark your ballot using the example posted at your polling place and inside your ballot booth. If you make a mistake, do not try to correct it. Instead, take your ballot to the precinct officials. They will destroy the ballot and issue a new one.

You do not need to make a selection for each issue on the ballot in order for your ballot to be counted. The voting device will cast votes only for those issues which you have marked.

Ballots can be read by the voting device regardless of how

you insert the ballot into the system. If the system detects too many markings for a single office or question, an error code will appear. The voter can choose to submit the ballot as it is or request a new ballot.

If you need assistance or would like to use the audio-assisted ballot system, let a precinct official know. You do not have to show proof of a disability to use the audio-assisted ballot system.

Be sure to bring an approved form of identification. Federal and state issued photo IDs, passports, and tribal-issued, photo IDs are accepted. You may also use the voter identification card you were mailed when you registered.

If you forget your voter ID or your name is not found in the precinct registry, you may

still cast a provisional ballot by signing an affidavit. A provisional ballot is sealed in a special envelope and counted after election day, once the voter's information has been verified by the election board. Election results cannot be certified until all provisional ballots have been researched, verified, and counted.








Haley reports election officials are there to assist voters and ensure all procedures are followed on election day. If you believe a law has been violated, contact precinct or county election officials immediately. Do not wait until you leave the polling location.

Voting activity is generally slowest during the mid-morning and mid-afternoon, but the election board says lines and wait times can vary from precinct to precinct. All voters who want to cast a ballot should be in line no later than 7 p.m.

"Anyone who is in line by 7 p.m. on Tuesday and eligible to vote, will be allowed to vote," Haley confirmed.

You can locate your polling location using the State Election Board's OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp.

'Prompt and Reasonable': Why Oklahoma's public records standard breeds frustration

Oklahoma's attorney general joined top law enforcement officers in 13 other states this month in suing the Biden administration over delays in getting information under the federal Freedom of Information Act. But in Oklahoma, the state's transparency law doesn't have defined time limits for responses by state and local governments, leading to protracted delays for many requesting public records. On the flip side, those in charge of finding and providing public records have pointed to overly broad requests and inadequate staffing or funding as causes of many delays.

The state's guidance under the Oklahoma Open Records Act is a "prompt and reasonable" standard, which in practical terms can mean anything from the same day to weeks, months or even years depending on the complexity of the request.

"I think we've reached the point where everyone's frustrated," said Mark Thomas, executive vice president of the Oklahoma Press Association. "The records requestors are frustrated because seemingly simple requests take longer than they think they should or come in a format that's unusable. Records custodians are equally frustrated by requests that are vague, overly broad or sometimes detached from any perceptible purpose.

"I call it the 'CSI' effect, where you see on TV the police solving three murders in 30 minutes. People expect (that) if I make a request for five years' worth of emails, you should be able to get it to me in half an hour."

Thomas said much of the state's Open Records Act, which dates to 1985, hasn't kept pace with advances in email, video and digital storage. That has led to lawsuits like one in Custer County over whether a sheriff could email records to an out-of-state requestor or if the records should be printed and picked up in person.

Attorney General John O'Connor, who was appointed to the office in July by Gov. Kevin Stitt, joined 13 other Republican attorneys general in a lawsuit over delays in getting records from the federal government. The attorneys general want internal records of discussions over the proper use of law enforcement authorities to monitor allegations of intimidation or violence against school officials or at local school board meetings.

The federal law allows a requestor to sue the government to compel the release of records after 21 business days.

In court filings, the attorneys general said they filed Freedom of Information Act requests in late October with the Justice De-

partment, the White House and the Education Department. By early March, only the Education Department had confirmed receipt of the request and followed up for clarification, although it had yet to provide records.

Oklahoma Watch filed an open records request March 7 with the attorney general's office for a list of records requests it received since July. The attorney general has not yet fulfilled that request.

O'Connor's office currently has 50 pending requests for open records, said Rachel Roberts,



director of communications. "The overwhelming amount of pending requests were received in the past few months and the latter part of 2021," Roberts said in an email. "All 2020 files have been closed out besides one remaining outlier. Each request requires a varied amount of time depending on its nature and the scope of the search involved."

Former Attorney General Scott Pruitt, who left office in 2017 to become administrator of the Environmental Protection Agency under former President Donald Trump, was rebuked by an Oklahoma County district judge for taking more than two years to fulfill some records requests.

The case involved emails requested by the Center for Media and Democracy in 2015 between Pruitt's office and energy companies and trade associations.

"My question to you is, what

explanation do you have as a state agency for taking two years to respond and turn over any documents at all?" District Judge Aletia Haynes Timmons asked an assistant attorney general in a February 2017 hearing. Timmons ordered the release of most of the records. Pruitt's office at the time claimed some of the documents were allowed to be withheld and asked the court to privately inspect them to make sure.

Those types of delays are unsurprising to Nick Brooke, an Oklahoma City resident and data scientist who asked for emails between the Oklahoma State Department of Health and the governor's office in the early weeks of the coronavirus pandemic in 2020. Brooke sued the health department and is still waiting for all the records he requested. Brooke is representing himself in the lawsuit. (*Oklahoma Watch* featured Brooke in a story last year.)

The health department is being represented by the attorney general's office in the lawsuit and several attorneys have handled the state's case at various times. Brooke said that has caused several delays as new attorneys tried to get up to speed and find a consistent strategy.

"It's gotten to the point where I'm trying to make it clear to the court how thoroughly I'm getting jerked around," Brooke said. "This whole process, they've tried to delay and delay and delay."

The next hearing in his case is April 19. Brooke said he expects the state to appeal if it loses but questions why a state agency is fighting so hard to withhold records.

"To them, I probably look like a crank, and if I was working on an attorney's schedule, this would not be very high up on my list," he said. "But that was also the point because I was hoping to fly under the radar. I do think

Incapacitated voters may still vote

Registered voters who become physically incapacitated after 5 p.m. March 29 and cannot make it to the polls still have an opportunity to cast their ballot. McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said that state law permits voters who become incapacitated after 5 p.m. March 29 to vote under special provisions. Haley said emergency incapacitation is something most voters don't think about.

"Voting is our constitutional right, but life happens. Injury, illness, or even childbirth can prevent a voter from being able to go to the polls. That's why it's important to make sure voters know their rights in the event of an emergency," Haley said. If you or someone you know does fall into this category, contact the election board as soon as possible. Haley says election board officials will work with you to make sure you have all

of the necessary information to cast your ballot. Forms and information can also be found on the Oklahoma State Election Board website at oklahoma.gov/elections. The county election board is located at 121 N 2nd, Purcell and is open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Monday through Friday. Site Address - Section R319

R319. 1 Address Numbers. Buildings shall have approved address numbers, building numbers or approved building identification placed in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers shall be Arabic numbers or alphabetical letters. Numbers shall be a minimum of 4 inches (102 mm) high with a minimum stroke width of ½ inch (12.7 mm). Where access is by means of a private road and the building address cannot be viewed from the public way, a monument, pole or other sign or means shall be used to identify the structure. Garvin:

the Oklahoma State Bureau of Narcotics and Dangerous Drugs (OBND) under DPS next year.

This has been in the works for many years and would help these agencies be more efficient by better utilizing and sharing their resources and improving collaboration.

The bill will also create a Mental Wellness Division to provide much-needed services and programs for public safety personnel. This line of work can take a tremendous mental toll on employees and their families, and we want to ensure that both are supported.

Other legislation would require the Commissioner of Public Safety to keep legislative leaders informed about the manpower needs of the OHP to ensure there are enough troopers on the force to meet state needs.

We'll also be considering an OHP pay raise bill, along with one allowing the Attorney General to cross-deputize police officers or any officer deputized by the county sheriff or a designee subject to an interlocal governmental agreement with the AG's Office to combine city, county, and state law enforcement efforts and to encourage cooperation between them.

We'll be voting on creating an Oklahoma Red Heart Award for municipal firefighters and an Oklahoma Blue Heart Award for those law enforcement and public safety members who sustain serious injuries in the line of duty.

Another bill would allow school districts to offer an elective course in law enforcement to high school juniors and seniors to help them decide if it might be a possible career for them. Finally, there is legislation to protect retired peace officers from doxing, including online threats, intimidation, or harassment.

These are just a handful of the many legislative bills to help improve public safety in our state as well as support and protect these heroes.

Get ready Part I: Before the storm

In Oklahoma, natural disasters are a tragic reality. Every year, disasters disrupt different parts of our state, leaving behind lasting effects on Oklahomans and property. After a disaster, many in our community need help and first responders may not be able to assist right away.

That is why it's important to Get Ready now. You and your family can take simple steps to Get Ready for emergencies and mitigate your risks. Here are some very easy but essential things you can do to Get Ready.

Document Your Property

One of the most important things you can do before a storm hits is to make a home inventory. Keep a detailed record of your valuable belongings to help you recover and file a claim more quickly.

Take photos or videos to record your belongings and write down descriptions. Take photos or videos of the inside and outside of your home, including spaces like closets and cabinet interiors.

Keep your inventory somewhere away from your home (i.e. safe deposit box, virtual cloud), where it can be accessed after a disaster.

Review Your Insurance

Disasters are a matter of when not if. Understand the risks you may face and talk to your agent to ensure that you have the insurance coverage you need for your property.

For example, a standard homeowners policy does not cover floods, and you may need a separate wind and hail policy if you live in tornado-prone areas.

It's also important to prepare your property before the storm hits. Sometimes it is not the

storm that directly causes the damage to your home but your possessions that are not secured in your yard.

Cut down or trim trees that may be in danger of falling on your home. Secure outdoor objects that could blow away or cause damage.

Make a Plan

Lastly, having a plan in place and knowing how you will respond to the storm can make a significant impact. Be sure to have flashlights, food, water and a weather radio ready at all times.

Know how you'll contact one another and reconnect if separated. Establish a family meeting place that's familiar and easy to find and practice that plan regularly.

Sign up for your community's alert and warning systems and make sure you understand what these alerts and warnings mean.

Records:

this is a very important issue to resolve. State agencies are jerking reporters around about this all the time and it needs to stop."

Thomas, with the press association, said he's hoping to convene several working groups this summer and fall to work on refining the processes for open records requests to present to lawmakers ahead of the 2023 legislative session. Participants would include members of the public, lawmakers, cities, counties, schools and government transparency groups.

"It'll be messy. But I think everybody who's going to get around the table has to think differently than we do now," Thomas said. "Public records are a public good. The basic standard of why we need and

have public records shouldn't change, but the process by which we request and receive them needs to be modernized."

He said several bills limiting access to public records in this year's session have been put aside after objections from the public or the media. They include a pair of bills proposed by Sen. Tom Dugger, R-Stillwater. Senate Bill 1272 would have increased fees charged for public records. SB 1256 would have curtailed access to some law enforcement records.

Last week, Rep. Jim Grego, a Wilburton Republican, said he wouldn't pursue House Bill 3475, which would have allowed records custodians to deny requests if they decided they were "excessively disruptive."

"Transparency has no letter behind its name," Thomas said. "Government is not them versus us. The government is us; we are a self-governing people. It's a hard problem, but it's a problem we're just going to have to try and solve because everybody's getting increasingly frustrated."

Tighten biosecurity to prevent avian influenza

The U.S. Department of Agriculture has announced highly pathogenic avian influenza (HPAI) has been detected in backyard chicken flocks, commercial chicken operations or wild bird flocks in at least 12 states.

The virus primarily infects birds and requires rapid response.

Oklahoma has not had a positive case of HPAI detected at this time.

Officials at the Oklahoma Department of Agriculture, Food and Forestry are working closely with Oklahoma State University Extension specialists and educators as well as veterinarians to monitor the situation and keep poultry growers informed on how best to prevent infection.

The USDA has confirmed cases of HPAI in Missouri and

Kansas, and the states' close proximity to Oklahoma has animal health officials on alert. The spread of HPAI from birds to other species, including humans, is rare and results from extensive direct contact.

Barry Whitworth, DVM, OSU Extension southeast area food and animal quality health specialist, said although the virus has been detected in all four bird migratory flight zones, HPAI can still be prevented with strong biosecurity measures.

"With past outbreaks, a breakdown in biosecurity was one of the main reasons the virus spread from one operation to another," Whitworth said. "If farms and backyard poultry owners stick to biosecurity protocol, it should reduce their chances of having issues with avian influenza."

Flu respiratory symptoms in birds could include coughing,

sneezing, watery eyes, discharge from nasal passages or even neurological signs, such as the inability to walk or a head tilt.

Whitworth said the most obvious signal is the rapid increase of birds getting sick or dying in a short amount of time. Unexplained sudden deaths should be reported immediately.

"Call somebody, whether it's your local veterinarian, your county Extension office or ODAFF," he said. "Vets and Extension educators are going to notify ODAFF as quickly as possible."

If the state veterinarian receives a call about a sick bird or birds, a disease investigation will be initiated at no cost to the poultry owner.

"A response to the problem will depend on the findings of

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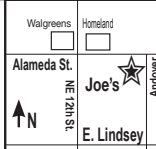

the investigation.” Whitworth said. “One backyard poultry operation in the panhandle would be handled differently than a commercial farm in Ottawa or Adair County.”

Owners and managers of backyard flocks can prevent transmission from wild geese and other birds by preventing their chickens from having contact with wild birds.

Another recommendation is to cover chicken coops with a roof or tarp to prevent the entry of fecal matter from wild birds that fly overhead.

Whitworth and other OSU Extension specialists are supporting ODAFF’s efforts to promote public webinars and distribute information where poultry is sold or exchanged.

More than 50 million birds were depopulated during the last national HPAI outbreak of 2014-15, and although the U.S. is currently not experiencing infection rates at that level, Whitworth said state and federal animal health officials are taking the necessary precautions to prevent another significant event.

While poultry is safe to consume, the economic impact of HPAI on the poultry industry can be devastating.

“Whether you’re a backyard poultry owner or a commercial farmer, dealing with animals dying in large numbers is tough,” he said. “The main thing to emphasize is practicing biosecurity.”

OSU Extension offers a fact sheet with biosecurity practices and disease information as well as a backyard chicken online course.

OSU Extension uses research-based information to help all Oklahomans solve local issues and concerns, promote leadership and manage resources wisely throughout the state’s 77 counties. Most information is available at little to no cost.

D. Owen disputes city manager

D. Owen Construction has disputed what Purcell City Manager Dale Bunn told the Purcell Public Works Authority and City Council at their February 24 meeting.

In that meeting Bunn told the city council and PPWA that D. Owen Construction LLC ignored repeated requests for compaction testing on the roadbed on three sides of the hospital.

D. Owen has countered with this response.

“Based on the accusation by Dale Bunn, compaction reports for the entire hospital site were sent to Dale Bunn (City Manager), Glenn Sullivan (City Engineer), and Kenneth Sullivan (City Engineer) via email on 8/19/2021 at 5:20 PM and resent to the following via email on 8/27/2021 at 5:02 PM. Email documentation can be

provided upon request.

D. Owen further stated “Presentation of facts:

“PPWA called an onsite meeting with D. Owen Construction LLC representatives onsite on 02/11/2022 at 11 AM. During the meeting, PPWA’s representatives accused D. Owen Construction LLC of not providing the compaction tests and D. Owen Construction LLC’s representatives affirmed the compaction reports were sent on 08/19/2021 at 5:20 PM to Dale Bunn, Glenn Sullivan, and Kenneth Sullivan and 08/27/2021 at 5:02 PM to Dale Bunn, Glenn Sullivan, and Kenneth Sullivan. PPWA’s representatives claimed the compaction was incorrect and inadequate. D. Owen Construction LLC’s representatives denied the claims. D. Owen Construction LLC’s repre-

sentatives came to the mutual agreement that D. Owen Construction LLC would be a cooperative trade partner to help and correct what PPWA claimed was wrong. PPWA could not provide solutions to correct the work and denied answering the questions proposed by D. Owen Construction LLC’s representatives. D. Owen Construction LLC’s representative said they would provide equipment and manpower to perform test pits that were proposed by the geotechnical specialist onsite right after the meeting to test compaction, but PPWA’s representatives declined to have those performed. D. Owen Construction LLC gave PPWA a timeline to correct the work PPWA claimed was inadequate, but PPWA declined to provide the explanations on what they wanted to be done.”

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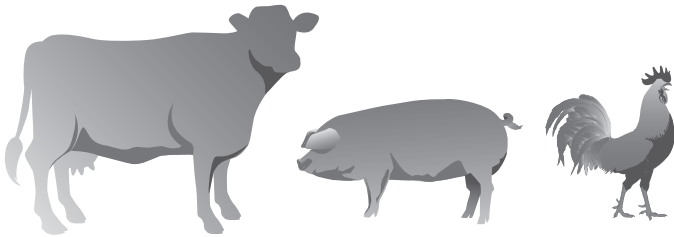
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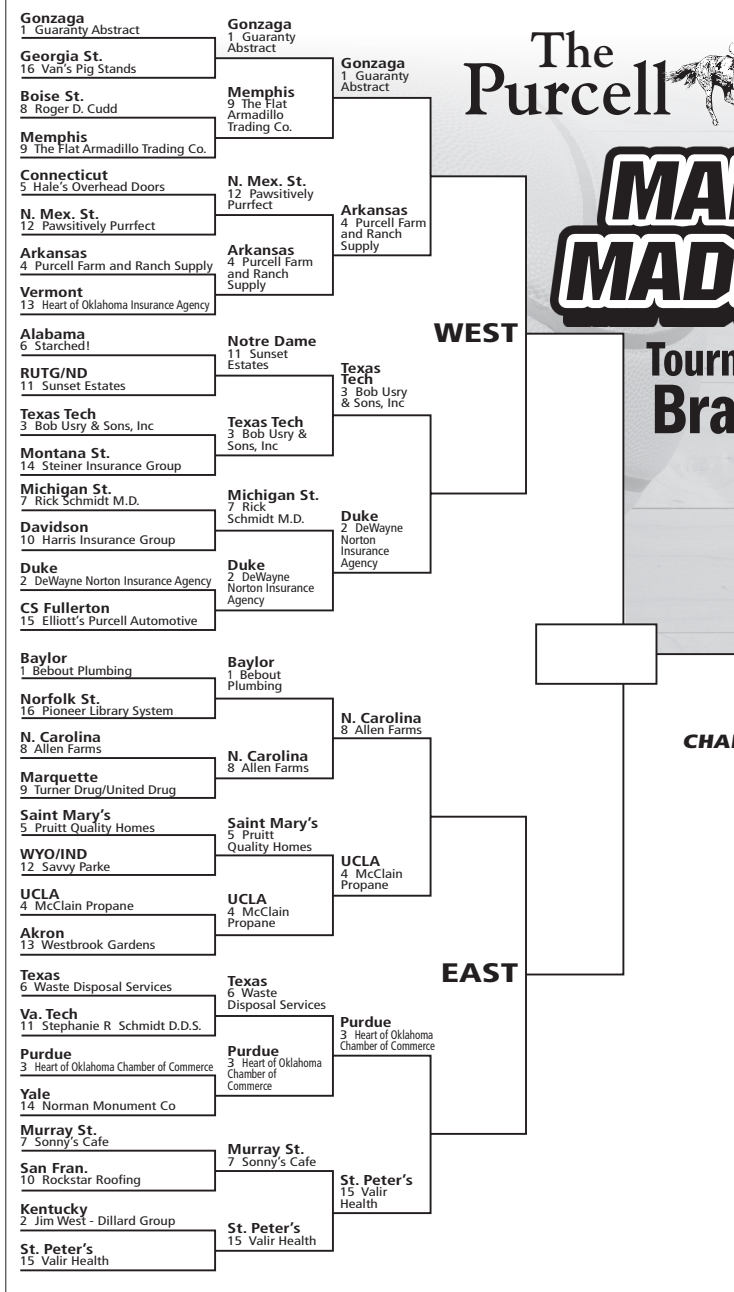
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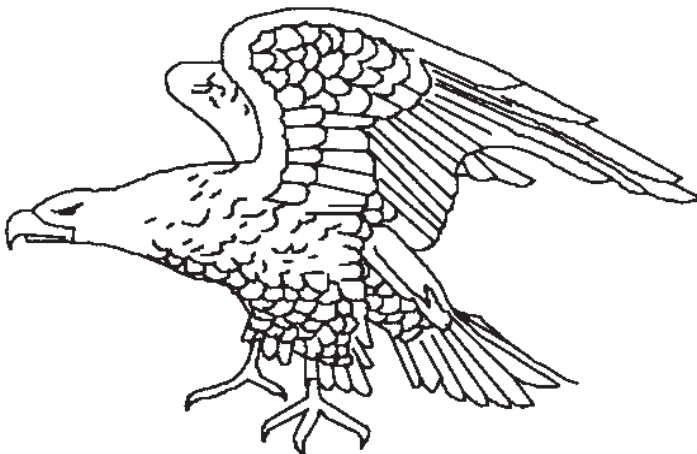

Thomas appointed Literary Arts division executive for Chickasaw Nation

Governor Bill Anoatubby has
appointed Chickasaw citizen
Joe Thomas executive officer
of Literary Arts.

“Joe Thomas understands the
important role literary arts play
in revitalizing and promoting
Chickasaw culture,” Govern-
nor Anoatubby said. “He has
the education, experience and
skills to successfully lead the
new Literary Arts division.”

Thomas began his career in
the Chickasaw Nation in 2013
as a grant writer. He quickly
rose to the position of special
assistant and advisor to the
Secretary of the Department of
Culture and Humanities.

As the executive officer of the
recently established division
of Literary Arts, Thomas will
oversee the Tribal Library and
Chickasaw Press, both provid-
ing opportunities to learn about
Chickasaw culture and history
through literary works.

“The division of Literary
Arts supports the mission of
the Chickasaw Nation by fur-
ther enhancing the lives of our
Chickasaw people by owning
our history and sharing it with
them in a variety of ways;
fiction, nonfiction, scholarly
work, poetry, student curricula,
magazines, journals, comic
books, etc.,” Thomas said.

The Chickasaw Press is the
first Native American tribal
press of its kind. It provides an
outlet for Chickasaw authors,
academics and culture bear-
ers to generate and publish
research and scholarship about
Chickasaw history and culture,
making such scholarship ac-
cessible to Chickasaw people.

The Tribal Library provides a
circulation of books, including
fiction, periodicals, children's
books, biographies, histories,
magazines and general refer-
ence materials, in addition to
audiobooks and DVDs.

As a scholar, Thomas may
be most excited about the op-
portunity his department allows
for him to build curriculum to
be taught at public schools.

“The division oversees the
development of Chickasaw
Student Curricula,” Thomas
said. “Working with educa-
tors, researchers, historians,
anthropologists, archaeologists
and tribal elders, the student

curricula provide educators
opportunities to teach Chicka-
saw culture and history within
their classrooms that directly
coincide with Oklahoma Social
Studies standards.”

Thomas received a bach-
elor's degree in Native Ameri-
can Studies from the University
of Oklahoma. He earned a mas-
ter's degree in Native American
Leadership from Southeastern
Oklahoma State University in
2015.

Southeastern recognized him
as a summa cum laude gradu-
ate, a honorary title used to
signify a degree that was earned
“with highest distinction.”

Thomas is a recipient of ion-
Oklahoma NextGen Under 30.
He has attended the Chickasaw
Leadership Academy, gradu-
ated from the Schnake Turnbo
Frank Leadership Academy
and is a Dale Carnegie Lead-
ership graduate, among other
leadership organizations.

Active in the Native Ameri-
can community, Thomas is
chair of the Chickasaw Aca-
demic Standards Committee.
He is also the Department of
Culture and Humanities repre-
sentative and committee mem-
ber to the Chickasaw Nation
Institutional Review Board.

Thomas enjoys teaching oth-
ers about his culture.

“It feels surreal to be ap-
pointed to this position,”
Thomas said. “I am thrilled and
grateful for the opportunity to
serve in this new role under
Governor Anoatubby's leader-
ship and Secretary Lisa John's
leadership. Both have greatly
influenced my life, through
educational opportunities and
support that have contributed to
my desire and commitment to
the Chickasaw people, history
and culture.”

In his free time, Thomas is
an avid bowler and competi-
tive volleyball player. He has
traveled to many countries, in-
cluding Thailand, Philippines,
China, Ireland, the Netherlands
and Mexico.

Thomas enjoys spending
time with his family and
friends.

He is the son of Billy Joe
and Carolen Thomas and the
grandson of the late Joe and
Ona Factor Thomas.

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Lawmakers again stifle debate on applying open records law to themselves

Lawmakers’ emails to lobbyists, calendars, call logs and other records that could give the public insight into the bills they craft are set to remain secret for at least another year.

A bill that would’ve ended Oklahoma’s status as one of a handful of states that allows the legislature to exempt itself from open records and meeting laws quietly, and with little fanfare, failed to clear a key legislative deadline.

Hopes for House Bill 3525 faded when a GOP-led House committee did not give the proposal a hearing by the March 4 cut-off date.

The proposal from Minority Leader Rep. Emily Virgin, D-Norman, would have ended a decades-old exemption that allowed the Legislature to ignore the open records and meeting laws that city councils, county commissioners, school boards and other state governing bodies must follow.

In addition to opening the records to public scrutiny, the bill would have required legislative committees to publish meeting agendas, blocked lawmakers from voting on measures while in closed caucus sessions and opened a more formal way for the public to comment on bills.

“I think my experience in the Legislature has shown me that it’s really hard for me to keep up with the legislation that we are moving through the process,” said Virgin, who after 12 years, will be term-limited after this year. “And what that tells me is that it would be even harder for folks at home to keep up with what we are doing.”

Many Proposals, Little Debate

Such proposals have been introduced before in the Legislature.

An Oklahoma Watch review of bill filings over the past decade found at least seven bills introduced that would remove the blanket open meeting and records exemption.

Only one received any type of vote. A 2012 proposal passed out of committee, 8-3, but failed to get a vote in the full House or Senate.

Since then, both Republicans and Democrats have



continued to push proposals that have generated little discussion at the Capitol beyond a few mentions in the media.

Joey Senat, an open government and media law expert at Oklahoma State University, said he believes few in the public are aware of the Legislature’s rare exemption. Lawmakers also don’t want to make their job more difficult or open themselves to more public scrutiny.

“You know it’s a lot easier to operate in secret,” he said. “It’s easier to have your backroom deals or work out deals in the hallway instead of having real discussion in front of the public or letting the public see your written correspondence to lobbyists and other lawmakers.”

Senat said open government proposals traditionally have seen high public support. He pointed to a 2012 SoonerPoll survey that found 85 percent of likely Oklahoma voters polled said they

would support the legislation to remove the open records and meeting exemption for the Legislature. Only 7.8 percent said they opposed the legislation and 7.2 percent had no opinion.

But even getting legislative leaders to comment on the idea can be difficult.

Senate Pro Tem Greg Treat, R-Oklahoma City, House Speaker Charles McCall, R-Atoka, did not return requests for comment from Oklahoma Watch. Rep. Jeff Boatman, R-Tulsa, who chairs the House Committee on Government Modernization that could have heard Virgin’s bill this year also did not respond to an interview request.

Legislative leaders previously have raised concerns about their communication with their constituents being made public, potentially slowing the legislative process and increasing costs. (Still, some past proposals specifically exempted those records.)

Members of both parties have opposed changes in the past.

Democrat Rodger Randle, who was the state Senate leader when the Oklahoma Open Records Act was passed in 1985, was later quoted in the **Oklahoman** saying that the legislative exemption is necessary “to allow policymakers an opportunity to freely debate options in the process of coming up with a proposal.” When he was asked by the paper why lawmakers never included themselves in that act, he reportedly chuckled and said, “we are not a dumb group.”

As Oklahoma Resists Changes, Other States Take Different Action

According to a 2018 survey by the nonprofit investigative news project MuckRock, Oklahoma is just one of four states that do not subject their legislatures to public records

laws. The others: Iowa, Minnesota and Massachusetts.

A recent paper in the *Journal of Civic Information* found that as many states have updated their open records and meeting laws in recent years, Oklahoma remains in the “minority” of states that have not.

The study found that while most permit some basic level of access to legislative records, 38 states have now adopted statutes permitting access to legislative access. Some states even allow “unrestricted” access.

The paper goes on to conclude that, “the clear trend is to provide access to legislative branch records and, in cases of textual ambiguity, to favor public access.”

“It’s definitely been a hot issue in some states,” said Ryan Mulvey, one of the authors of the study who is also counsel at the Cause of Action Institute, a Virginia-based nonprofit group.

Mulvey said legal challenges or ambiguity about some laws have prompted

states to clarify or expand what records can be made public. Some have crafted compromise legislation offering to keep private certain records, such as emails to constituents, he said.

It’s increasingly difficult for lawmakers to oppose closing off all records, Mulvey said.

“That’s a hard policy to oppose,” he said. “And it’s a left, right and center winner to talk about politically. So when you get these moments when it becomes an issue it’s hard to be on the side of ‘no, we are not going to do this.’”

Mulvey added that public pressure from the media, open advocates or others can also compel states to act.

Senat said lawmakers’ views on transparency and open government often change when they take office. That’s why he helped launch an “open government pledge” several years back when he was with Freedom of Information Oklahoma.

That has largely fallen by the wayside. Only a cou-

ple sitting lawmakers have signed the pledge in recent years. Senat said he hopes this election season, the media and other transparency advocates work to bring up the issue and then hold lawmakers accountable if they get elected.

If lawmakers continue to resist changes, Senat said voters always have the citizen-led ballot initiative process to try to change the law themselves.

“I’m not optimistic (about changes) unless we decide to put the energy and effort into it,” he said. “But it’s not going to happen on its own, I’m sure of that.”

How to Read Your Valuation Increase and Why did you Receive One?

Valuation increase notices were mailed out March 9th, 2022.

Fair Cash Value (Market): This is your annual Market Value for your property. This value is what keeps up with current market trends. It can go up or down each year, as much or as less, according to the Market. This is what your property could sell for if placed on the market. There is no cap on this value.
68 O.S. § 2802 (19)

Taxable Fair Cash Value (Capped) Preceding Year : This is the property value you were capped at last year, 2021. This is what your taxes were based on in 2021.

Taxable Fair Cash Value (Capped) Current Year: This is the property value you are going to be capped at in 2022, and what your taxes will be based on this fall when tax statements come out. This value should be no greater than 5% than the preceding year’s capped value. If your property values increased MORE THAN 5%, this is due to an improvement made on your property OR you are the new buyer of the property, the cap was removed and you went to full fair cash value of the property. If your property values went down or remained the same for 2022, you DID NOT receive one of these.

Article X, 8B of the Oklahoma Constitution (along with accompanying State Statutes) prevents you from getting a percentage raise larger the **3%** (homestead and ag properties) or **5%** (commercial and other properties) unless you add an improvement/value to your property, or you purchase the property in that tax year. These incremental raises continue UNTIL your property reaches the Fair Cash/Market Value. **Fair Cash Value** = The price at which a willing buyer would purchase the property and a willing seller would sell the property if both parties are knowledgeable about property and if neither party is under any undue pressure.

That staging area was moved to property just east of Bravo’s which was later moved to the train depot where they stayed until the blaze was brought under control around 7 p.m. Firefighters were on the fire from around 10:30 a.m. to 7 p.m. when an estimated 1,800 acres of grassland and cedar trees were torched. “I thought we had a good game plan when we staged near Wayne,” Cypert said. “But that quickly changed and we moved to just east of Bravos and then moved to the depot hill. It was at the James C. Nance Memorial Bridge that assistant chief Rocky Claunch launched a plan to have tankers on the bridge to bring massive amounts of water when the fire finally reached the bridge. Claunch stationed four large

tanker trucks on the bridge for the maneuver. Claunch said thanks to dozer work by David Spector and Derrick Neal, fire trucks were able to maneuver around and eventually put the fire out some 200 yards north of the bridge. “They pushed the vegetation back and cut us some trails north of the bridge where we could get trucks in there,” Claunch said. “Otherwise, we could have lost it again.” Fire crews from Wayne, Payne, Lexington, Slaughter-ville, Cedar Country, Washing-ton, Noble and Goldsby helped battle the blaze. The Chickasaw Nation provided a drone at one point to give firemen a better understanding of what they were up against. City Manager Dale Bunn praised the efforts of all in-volved keeping the fire from getting into town. “Chief Cypert and Assistant Chief Claunch performed a tactical move they should teach at fire fighting school,” Bunn

said. “They used tankers pour-ing water from the bridge onto the path of the fire. They had brush trucks under the bridge waiting for the flames. “Michael Minor set up his manned Water Department teams for tanker refill sites at hydrants at the bottom of Depot Hill and the corner of the bridge at Canadian. “Police Chief Bobby Elmore and Assistant Chief James Bolling controlled traffic and closed the bridge while tankers were on it,” Bunn continued. “The street department blocked eastbound traffic at Washington and Main and southbound at Washington,” Bunn said. There were no reported inju-ries and no structures lost in the big blaze last Thursday. Cypert said his crews were back under the bridge Friday morning from around 9:30 to 11 a.m. putting out spot fires.

Firefighters from Dibble and Rosedale helped later on down near Wayne, Cypert said. The origin of the fire remains unknown. While firemen were attack-ing the big blaze they were also called to a fire on Horse Avenue and to a hit and run scene at mile marker 86.5. Firefighters were back at Wayne for three to four hours Friday still working on the big fire. Smoke could still be detected Monday morning five days after the fire started. Purcell Fighters responded to a grass fire in the Cole area Sunday. They joined fire teams from Blanchard, Cole, Dibble, Goldsby, Newcastle, Payne and Rosedale. Purcell was also called out to a dumpster fire on Sunday. A welcome and much needed downpour of rain fell (1.80”) on the area Monday.

role and officially started March 1,” said Chris Wright, chief executive officer at the hospital. “This is a very positive change and is very patient-focused.” Wright heralded what he described as the “best care possible in their (residents’) own backyard.” Team Health will provide the highest care possible to the community and surrounding area, he added. Saint Anthony’s is a Level 2. “Everyone in Purcell who needs care will be able to seek it here and not have to out outside,” Wood said. “We can perform any emergency life-saving treatment and diagnosis.” While some services aren’t available at PMH, Wood said

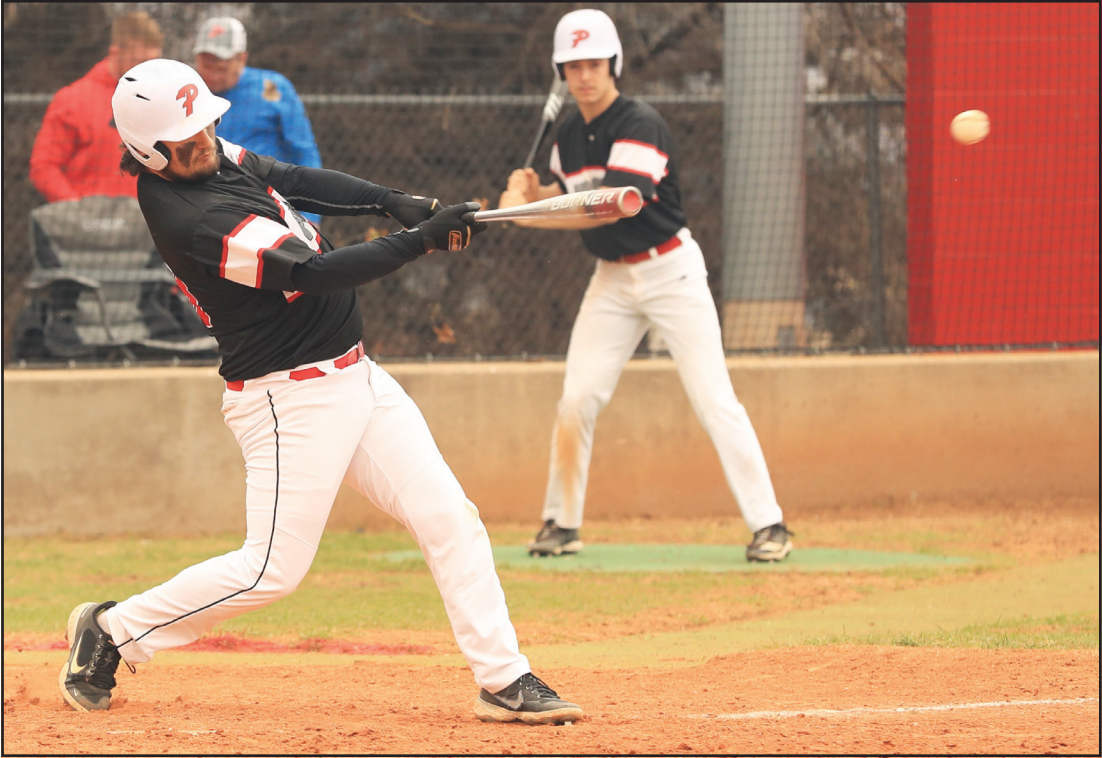

Bring a bit of spring indoors

Many gardeners are busy pruning shrubs to remove winter damage, control the size, or provide a bit of shaping before the season is well under way.

Save some of the branches or cut a few from spring flowering shrubs to brighten your indoors.

You'll enjoy the added spring color provided by branches of forsythia, quince, pussy willows, and other spring flowering shrubs for bouquets and arrangements.

Use a pair of sharp bypass pruners with two sharp blades that cut like scissors. These make clean cuts allowing the wound to close quickly and reducing the risk of insects and diseases moving in.

Start by removing crossing or winter damaged branches. This helps manage plant growth while harvesting some stems for your enjoyment. Look for stems at least 12" long with lots of flowers or buds to maximize flowering.

Make cuts above a healthy outward bud, where a branch joins another branch or just above ground level.

Combine planned renewal pruning with a bit of indoor enjoyment. Remove a few of the older stems of forsythia, lilac, and other multi-stemmed spring flowering shrubs back to ground level.

This encourages new growth at the base of the plant. Cut the larger branches down to a useable size for your indoor enjoyment.

Then finish any needed pruning after the plants put on their spring display so they can form new flower buds next spring. Avoid severe pruning that can result in excess growth. Removing no more

than one fourth of the total growth will result in more even growth.

Repeat as needed for the next year or two to reduce the size and improve the beauty of overgrown plants.

Harvest stems for forcing on a sunny day or when temperatures are above freezing for better results. Don't smash the stems as often recommended.

Instead make one or more slits in a crosshatch or star pattern on the bottom of the stems before placing them in water immediately after cutting.

If possible, submerge the whole stems in a tub of water overnight. This encourages the stems and buds to absorb water and break dormancy.

Set the stems in a bucket of cool water, about 60° to 65°F, in a bright but indirectly lit location after soaking overnight or immediately after pruning. Mist the stems as often as possible the first few days or place a plastic bag over the stems to boost humidity and prevent the buds from dropping.

Change the water every two or three days making sure the cut ends of the stems are always in the water.

The buds should start swelling and flowers start to appear



in several weeks. Cut the stems to the needed length and use them in flower arrangements.

They look great mixed with spring flowering bulbs, greens and other spring flowers from your garden or florist. Or display them in a vase all on their own.

Continue cutting and forcing a variety of branches over time for continuous indoor bloom. Prolong their beauty by moving the flowering stems and flower arrangements to a cooler location at night.

Make notes on what worked well in spring arrangements to help you plan for next year. Whether you force them into bloom or harvest when in bloom, you will enjoy the added spring color indoors.

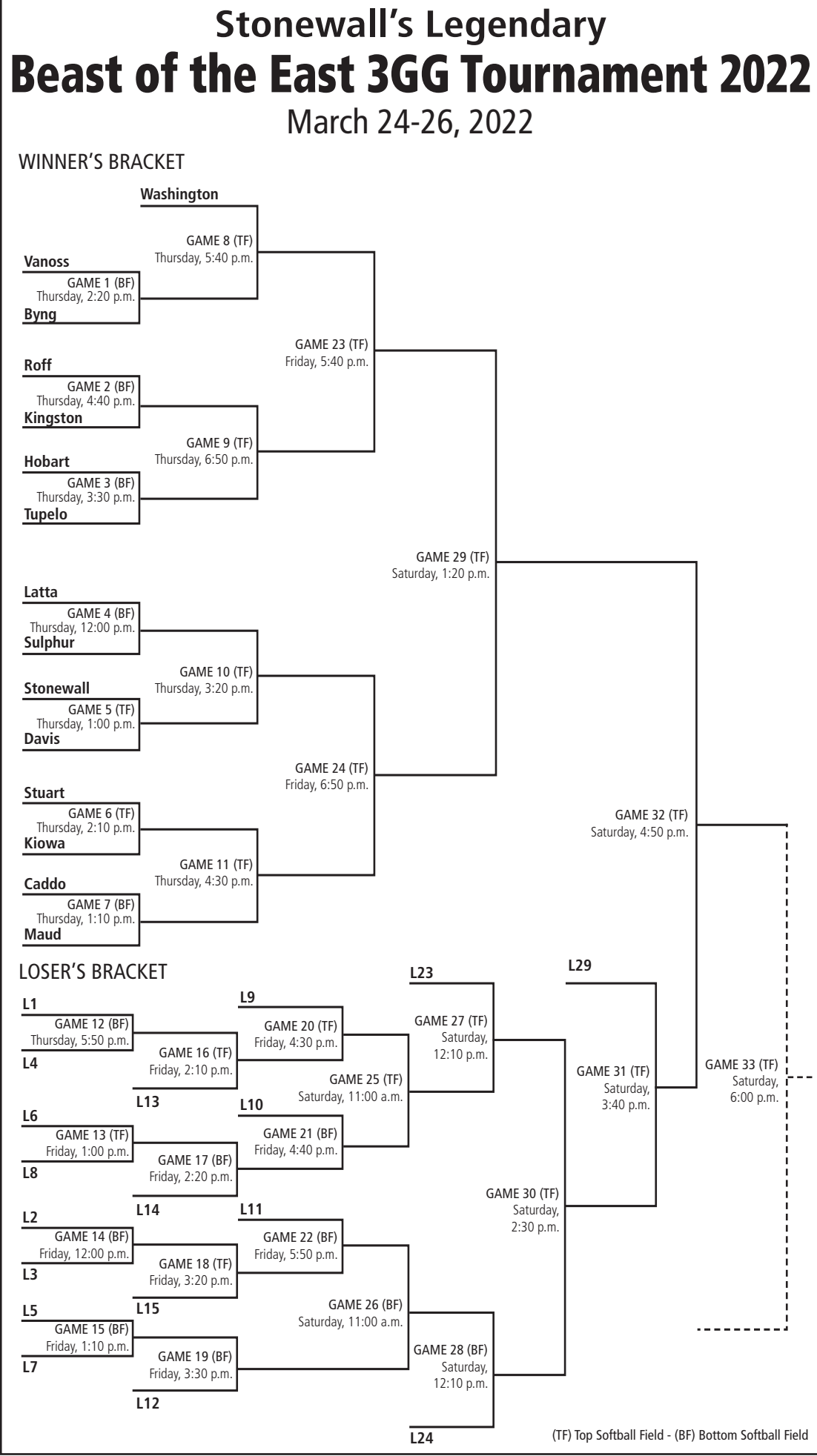

March 27, 2022 is the fourth Sunday of Lent. It is a season of penance, reflection, and fasting which prepares us for Christ's Resurrection on Easter Sunday, through which we attain redemption.

This week's Gospel reading is Luke 15:1-3, 11-32. In this reading, Jesus tells a parable about two sons. Remember, parables are stories with a moral teaching.

Then he took his "inheritance" and went to a far country. He squandered his fortune.

Then a famine came and he was starving. He thought, "the animals under my father's table eat scraps better than what I have. I will go back to my father and ask to become one of his servants." When he returns his father sees him from a far distance and runs

to greet him with embraces, even before the son can say his regrets. Not only that, he calls for fine clothes and a party to celebrate the return.

The older brother complained to the father. He said he had been serving the father for years and wasn't even allowed to have a merry time with his friends. The father told the older son, "You have always been with me and everything I have is yours. Your brother was dead and has come to life again. He was lost and now is found."

For years this parable disturbed me. I could certainly see the older brother's point of view. After all, this seemed very unfair. The older son did what was expected of him, and the younger brother returns and is treated to fine things.

This is where we must focus on the moral teaching. When we serve our Father, we receive blessings each day. But the Father wants all to be included. Thus, He is jubilant when a lost one returns to His kingdom.

This parable makes it clear

The Hard Part’s Walking, Not Running!

Very good week to all! Thanks so much for taking a little time to join us for our “front porch” visit.

A scripture that has long inspired me is over in the fortieth chapter of Isaiah. You may know Isaiah 40:31 well: “But they that wait upon the Lord shall renew their strength; they shall mount up with wings as eagles; they shall run, and not be weary; and they shall walk, and not faint.”

In the three millennia since Isaiah penned those eloquent words, how many people have gathered inspiration from this majestic image: an eagle soaring high above the difficulties and “mundaneness” far below! We can all relate.

While we held that beautiful image close for many years through many of life’s sunlit mornings, and some dark, stormy nights, too, some time ago I was blessed to hear an Alabama preacher who passed through town pull this scripture up as his text. I must say that I was a little ashamed by the time he finished, because he unfolded a far more vivid picture of the passage than I had ever seen before.

Through the years, I guess I never really got past that eagle soaring so majestically in the sky. To me that was the glory of the verse. I liked the rest of Isaiah’s soothing passage, too, but it did seem a bit anti-climactic. My voice always seemed to trail off when I got to the “run and not being weary, and walk and not faint” part. It just doesn’t have the resounding ring as “mounting up with wings as eagles. “

But this Alabama preacher made me swoon down a little from my sky-view and see the rest of the verse. I’m glad he did.

It will always be true that when we wait upon the Lord, we really can soar with wings as eagles. Those are the times of adversity. When the storm comes, the eagle, who seems to love the storm, just steps it up a notch and soars higher. The surging wind underneath his powerful wings propels him above the storm. That’s beautiful, and I think most of us, like the mighty eagle, are equipped to soar so high when the storms come.

But life is more than that. Life, sometimes, requires “running.” We have to be able to run with the opportunities that come our way. When opportunities come, most of the Lord’s people I know are well able to buckle their chinstraps, go to work, and proceed through lunch and supper and never look at the clock. That thought seems to be what the great prophet has in mind when he says we must “run and not be weary.” Working tirelessly is how we wait upon the Lord in great opportunistic moments. See the book of Acts.

We have to like that part, too, but I learned from the Alabama preacher that the best part of the sublime scripture is yet to come.

We can “soar” like the eagle and “run” and not even get tired during times of adversity and opportunity, but the “walking” part is the hardest part. The “walking” is that everyday life routine: wiping runny noses and tying shoe laces and mopping the floors and driving into work in traffic and meeting deadlines and putting band aids on scraped knees and teaching a class at 8:30 when you didn’t get to bed until 1 – as well as plodding tirelessly through the scriptures in search for its truth.

This part of life, really, may be the hardest of all! Ironically, it actually is easier to wait upon the Lord during the storm and during a great opportunity He has placed before us. Learning to stay life’s course day in and day out, come what may: There’s the Christian life’s greatest challenge!

That difficult daily grind that is required in “waiting upon the Lord” is what Isaiah, no doubt, has in mind when he says, let us “walk and not faint.”

While it’s hard, we cannot help but like this section of Isaiah 40:31, too, because it’s real. It speaks to us right where we are. We sit down to read and meditate on the prophet’s great message for a moment; then, with a smile and a sigh – we jump up to attend to the crisis that’s calling out from the other room. That’s life.

Now, thanks to the Alabama preacher, Isaiah 40:31 means more to me than ever. The more I think about its great practical, day-in and day-out message, I think that, if there is room, I would like to have it inscribed majestically on my tombstone one of these days. Not that there’s any hurry. We can wait another 30 or 40 years, if it’s all the same. I’m sure the Lord wants to see a bit more ‘walking and not fainting’ before that day comes!

Dale K. Graham Veterans Foundation

March 20 our Foundation helped dedicate a new flag pole at the Washington Public School Softball field in Washington. We appreciate Lane Steele for heading up this service project along with brother, Nate. We also appreciate the school administration, coaches, and players for their support of the veteran community.

Last week we were able to help two Korean war veterans file their first claim for VA benefits. As both were exposed to many types of acoustic trauma during their service from gunfire, artillery and other types of loud noise they should qualify for the service-connection of hearing loss and tinnitus.

When a veteran is approved for service-connection of hearing loss and tinnitus he or she will receive a 10 percent rating

for the tinnitus. Hearing loss is rated from 0 percent to 100 percent depending on the veteran's pure tone decibel along with their speech discrimination using a Maryland CC word discrimination test.

Over the many years we have been assisting veterans with their claims and questions hearing loss and tinnitus are the most frequent disabilities that are approved by VA. As I remember when we were in the military all of us suffered from hearing loss and tinnitus from the firing of weapons and the other types of acoustic trauma we were exposed to on a daily basis.

The only people I knew who had hearing protection were the people who worked on the flight line. The only thing we had on the rifle range was maybe a cigarette filter to be used as an ear plug. Thankfully, times have changed for today's service members.

Sometimes the families of veterans who we served will give us power wheelchairs, scooters and other handicapped equipment that we can give to other veterans who are in need of these types of items. We have several of our volunteers who will pick up these types of items or they can be dropped off at our location in Norman at 1233 West Lindsay.

If you have been unable to register in our system to start a claim for VA benefits. The work around is to call 1-800-827-1000. When the agent answers tell them you would like to start a claim. This will give you a start date of the following month and give you one year to submit a fully developed claim.

If your claim is approved, payment will begin on the
