## Opening on tourism committee

The Purcell Tourism Committee is currently a member short and is looking for someone to fill the position of Citizen at Large.

The new member should be active in the community, eager to promote the city and can attend meetings regularly.

Meetings are held on the second Tuesday of every month at 5:15 p.m. at the City Hall Community Room unless otherwise posted.

Currently the committee has collected \$102,471.81 from the five percent lodging tax that

went into effect July of 2021.

The lodging tax is collected from overnight visitors to Purcell’s hotels, motels, RV parks and Airbnbs.

The seven member committee is working to consider the best ways to utilize lodging tax revenues to promote tourism opportunities and venues in the city. The committee has voted to add billboards on north and south bound I-35 to draw more visitors off the interstate and into Purcell. The advertising campaign will promote the city’s lodging providers, res-

taurants, site-seeing hotspots and shopping opportunities.

The committee is also looking to promote upcoming events in Purcell. Event coordinators looking for financial assistance for their event can submit an application for review.

### Swimming Pools

Permits are required prior to installation of swimming pools. There is a \$19.50 fee for above-ground and \$29.50 fee for in-ground. No permit is required for children's blow-up pools.

An outdoor swimming pool, including an in-ground, above-ground or on-ground pool, hot tub or spa, shall be surrounded by a barrier (fence) at which shall be at least 48 inches high.

According to the Center for Disease Control and Prevention, in 2009 children one to four years old have the highest drowning rates. Among children one to four years old who died from an unintentional injury, more than 30 percent died from drowning. Among children one to four years old, most drownings occurred in home swimming pools.

One factor that influences drowning risk is lack of barriers, such as fencing, which prevent children from gaining access to the pool area without a caregiver's awareness.

A four-sided isolation fence, separating the pool area from the house and yard, reduces a child's risk of drowning by 83 percent, compared to a three-sided property-line fencing.

## Update from the Capitol

More than 270 new laws are now on the books with more to come in the next couple of weeks as we race to the finish line.

In my last few articles, I've talked about my Senate bills that have been signed, but I've had some of the House bills I carried in the Senate approved by Governor Stitt as well.

HB 3040 modifies the deadline for any premium rate filing for a Medicare supplement policy and also specifies that increases will be implemented no more than once per year.

HB 4077 allows the court to dismiss an action or a motion for summary judgement if the court determines the claim is proven knowingly false and provides a definition of "knowingly false." Both of these measures will become law on

Nov. 1, 2022. There are additional House bills on his desk awaiting approval this week.

We honored some amazing Oklahomans this past week, including Rick Dawson, who is the proud owner of Rich Strike, the winner of the 2022 Kentucky Derby. If you didn't get to watch the race, I highly recommend you look it up online.

This was the second-biggest upset in the Derby's 148-year history. Rich Strike wasn't even supposed to run, but another horse dropped out the day before the race, giving him a spot in the Run for the Roses.

It was incredible to watch the 80-1 horse fly from behind, setting a record pace to claim victory in the final seconds. Mr. Dawson humbly shared how Rich Strike has changed

their lives and will allow them to support more of their favorite charitable organization, especially those that help Oklahoma military, veterans and first responders.

We wish the Dawson's and Rich Strike the best of luck as they focus on the Belmont Stakes next month.

We've also been honoring those members who will be leaving office later this year because of term limits, which only allow legislators to serve for 12 years.

### More record high energy prices

Since assuming office, President Joe Biden has waged an all-out war against North American energy, and Americans are unfortunately paying the price for his misguided actions.

The price-per-gallon of gasoline reached a national average of \$4.48 this week and is expected to continue rising for hardworking Americans unless the president and Democrats abandon their doomed strategy. It is estimated that skyrocketing gas prices are now costing the average American household nearly \$2,000 extra per year. Additionally, natural gas prices recently rose to the highest point in 13 years.

The last time natural gas prices were at this level was in the fall of 2008, and the current price represents a \$4.98 increase per unit from last year.

Not only are Americans pay-

ing more at the pump, but they are also paying more to heat and cool their homes.

While President Biden continues to blame the Russian invasion of Ukraine and domestic energy producers for the rising price of gas, do not be fooled into believing that false narrative.

Indeed, it has been his actions from the get-go that resulted in this situation. In fact, on day one of the Biden Administration, the president's first executive actions right after inauguration included the cancellation of the Keystone XL pipeline and moratoriums on new oil and gas leasing on federal lands.

In the following months, under his direction the Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) proposed outrageous new rules requiring companies to disclose "climate-related risks."

This was used not only to

push Democrats' environmental agenda through the inappropriate vehicle of securities law, but it also hurt and publicly shame American energy companies. And just recently in March, President Biden announced the largest ever release from our Strategic Petroleum Reserve (SPR).

Amounting to approximately one million barrels per day over six months, this move jeopardizes our national security since it depletes our SPR by 40 percent, the biggest release in 50 years.

To make matters worse, after gas prices reached record highs last week, the U.S. Department of the Interior announced the cancellation of three more offshore oil and gas lease sales off the coast of Alaska and in the Gulf of Mexico, totaling more than one million acres.

## Legislative work continues

As we prepare to present our state budget proposal and wrap up our legislative session, the House is continuing to send bills to the Governor's desk.

The House sent two more of my bills to the Governor. The first, House Bill 3560, updates tracts of land that may be sold by the Dept. of Mental Health and Substance Abuse Services.

House Bill 3315 removes the administrative fine as a penalty for persons under 21 who buy tobacco, nicotine, or vapor products. Instead, it requires they complete an education or tobacco use cessation program approved by the State Dept. of Health.

We also approved House Bill 3168 during Thursday's legislative session. The bill creates the Telephone Solicitation Act of 2022, which would prohibit numerous types of marketing calls and set strict parameters on when others can be made.

It explicitly outlaws telephone sales calls that do not display the originating telephone number and name on the caller ID.

Some con artists are capable of displaying a different phone number or area of origin when placing spam calls, causing more people to answer a phone call they think is from someone in their town.

The bill also prohibits sales calls before 8 a.m. and after 8 p.m. and repeated calls from the same number, as well as other bad practices.

If a sales call violates this act, an aggrieved party can initiate legal action to have a judge require the solicitor to stop, and the called party can recover actual damages or \$500, whichever is greater. HB 3168 has been sent to Governor Stitt's desk for consideration.

The Governor has also re-

ceived House Bill 1682, which specifies that the ad valorem tax exemption relating to livestock employed in support of the family will include animals owned wholly or in part by a resident or entity of another state.

I also presented a few resolutions on the House floor, which the chamber adopted unanimously. On Wednesday, I was joined by Rep. Marilyn Stark, a former nurse, to present House Resolution 1068 recognizing May 6-12 as National Nurses Week.

We both know firsthand the hard work and stress that our nurses undergo every shift, and I want to thank our nurses and other healthcare professionals in House District 42 and across the state for your dedication to patients.

I presented another resolution on Thursday to recognize the work and the importance of the American Lung Association. House Resolution 1071 recognized the second week of May as "Turquoise Takeover Week," an annual celebration by the American Lung Association to raise critical awareness of lung cancer, the nation's leading cancer killer.

In the district, I've been presenting citations to high school students in the district who completed their State Future Farmers of America Degree. It's a great honor to recognize these students' achievements as they complete their high school education and begin the next chapter in their lives.

I anticipate having news on the budget front to share with you next week. Right now, the House and Senate are very close to an agreement, and I look forward to sharing the

## Get ready Part III: After the Storm

Recovering from a disaster can be challenging and stressful. Most natural disasters happen unexpectedly and can significantly impact your mental and physical health.

Fortunately, the state of Oklahoma has excellent disaster assistance resources. Knowing how to access them makes the recovery process faster and less stressful.

This Mulready Says Get Ready Part III: After the Storm offers some general advice on steps to take after disaster strikes. Here are three important post-disaster steps to remember:

### 1. Take care of yourself and your family.

- Your first concern after a disaster is your family’s health and safety. Check for injuries and seek medical help for any injured family members.

- If the storm destroyed your home, business or personal property, know that cleaning up and repairing the damage can be physically, mentally and financially challenging.

- Let your local officials know of any damages you may have and what immediate assistance you may need such as food and shelter. You can report flooding and storm damages at damage.ok.gov.

- For non-emergency disaster or health and human service information, please contact your local 2-1-1. Services are available 24 hours a day.

### 2. Contact your insurance agent as soon as possible.

- Document all your damages before you clean up. Take photos or videos and make a list. Check out our free Home Inventory Checklist if you haven’t created a home inventory.

- Save all your receipts for post-damage repair and clean-up.

- Contact your insurance agent to start the claims process as soon as possible.

- Work with your adjuster and complete proof of loss to support your claim.

### 3. Be aware of post-disaster fraud and scams.

- Do not give any personal information such as Social Security or bank account numbers unless you are sure it is safe. Local officials, state and federal workers like FEMA inspectors never need this information to provide services.

- Watch out for people going door-to-door or calling homeowners claiming to be building contractors. These could be scam artists, especially if they ask for financial information.

- Report suspicious activity to local authorities and the FEMA Disaster Fraud Hotline at 1-866-720-5721. You can also contact the Oklahoma Insurance Department’s Anti-Fraud Unit at fraudstoppers@oid.ok.gov or 1-800-522-0071.

inflation.

Beginning May 18, the government contract with fitness giant Peloton, under efforts from the House Center for Well-Being, will be offered to the estimated 10,000 people on staff working for the House of Representatives and about 2,300 Capitol Police officers.

If that happens, the contract cost is a \$10,000 up front pay-

ment to Peloton, plus an extra \$10 per month charge for each staffer or officer who utilizes the benefit. If 12,000 staffers took advantage of the benefit, it would cost taxpayers \$120,000 a month.

For other Americans, a Peloton All-Access Membership costs \$39 per month and a Peloton App Membership costs \$12.99 per month.

## Budget negotiations

House and Senate budget leaders are in the process of negotiating the final details of the state budget. We’ve also given the governor’s office a chance to weigh in.

We should begin seeing budget bills in the Joint Committee on Appropriations & Budget this week before considering the measures on the House floor.

The state budget is a product of more than a year’s worth of work. After we appropriate funds for the fiscal year, which starts July 1, we turn our focus to the next year, examining final revenue reports and adjusting our estimates for the future.

Each fall, A&B subcommittees hear from agencies, commissions and boards under their purview that detail how previous year’s funding was spent and present initial requests for the next fiscal year.

In January each year, we hold public meetings to hear from the six agencies that receive the most in state funding.

In February each year, we get the final amount approved to appropriate for the next fiscal year from the state Board of Equalization. Then the carving up of revenue between core government services begins.

Last year, we appropriated 47.2 percent of the budget to education, followed by 19.9 percent to public health, 9.6 percent to human services, 8.7 percent to transportation, 7.9 percent to public safety, 2.2 percent each to judiciary and general government, 1.4 percent to natural resources, 0.7 percent to finance, and 2 percent to other.

We also saved \$1.5 billion from previous years’ cash reserves and from general revenue and other savings mechanisms built into statute.

This year, we have authority to appropriate a record-high \$10.4 billion, \$1.3 billion of

that, however, is one-time, nonrecurring cash that should either be spent on one-time projects or saved. My guess is we will do some of both.

State revenue continues to be strong - \$1 billion in April alone this year. But with inflation and oil and gas prices at near-record highs and as well as federal relief funding that at some point will dry up, it makes sense for us to be conservative in our spending.

House members also would like to return some money to taxpayers this year if we can get agreement between the Senate and the governor.

I can’t release specifics on the budget until the appropriations bills are publicly posted, but I do believe we’ll be able to meet many needs this year as well as continue our strong record on saving money.

The Legislature must sine die no later than 5 p.m. May 27. We want to leave time to respond to governor vetoes on the budget if needed. That means the budget should be complete this week.

I’ll keep you posted.

**Dale K. Graham Veterans Foundation**

One of the reasons our foundation has been successful helping veterans and surviving spouses is our evidence-based claims process we implemented many years ago.

The VADeveloped Disability Benefits Questionnaire is used by medical providers to evaluate veteran claims for service-connection of a disability and to evaluate the severity of a disability. This system has been very beneficial in helping veterans to receive the VA benefits they are eligible for.

The DBQ’s can be used to support almost all disabilities except for claims for the service-connection of Hearing Loss and Tinnitus. We use an Audiologist who can evaluate veterans hearing loss using the Maryland CC recorded words list to determine speech discrimination.

A Nexus is also required linking the noise exposure they were exposed to in the military to the veteran’s hearing loss and tinnitus they suffer from today.

One of our most difficult tasks we have is helping a surviving spouse to receive VA benefits when their veteran did not file any claims for benefits.

When a veteran is receiving VA compensation for a disability and it is listed on their Death Certificate as a primary cause of death or a contributing condition, the spouse and dependents are eligible to receive DIC benefits from VA. Of course, if the conditions are not listed as the primary or secondary cause of death an amended death certificate can be requested from the medical person who signed the death certificate.

Many times, the attending physician will not have access to the veterans medical records or their VA rating decisions. There is no guarantee that person who signed the original will agree to request an amended death certificate. In Oklahoma a request to amend must be sent to the Oklahoma Health Department Vital Statistics section by the attending physician.

Last week we had 14 veterans who were awarded a 100 percent rating for their service-connected disabilities. These Oklahoma veterans will receive the following state benefits reduced auto tags, property tax exemption on their primary residence along with sales tax exemption and other types of state benefits.

We are also proud to say that 43 of the veterans we represent received VA disability ratings from 10 to 90 percent for their service-connected disabilities.

For those of you who do not have any open VA claims one can be started by calling VA at 1-800-827-1000 and telling the agent that you want to start a claim. This will give a veteran or surviving a start date for benefits and will give them one year to submit a fully developed claim.

We are a 501c-3 Non-Profit organization and there is never a charge for the services we provide to veterans and their families.

We do accept financial contributions to be used to support veterans and this organization. We also accept donations of wheelchairs and other types of handicap equipment that can be given to other veterans or their families. Other items that we accept are cars, trucks, motorcycles, or items that can be given to veterans or sold to raise funds.

I believe that being a volunteer with our organization is not only good for veterans and surviving spouses it is also the best therapy for you. We do change lives every time our volunteers help one of the people who have served in our country’s military. Volunteer applications are available on our website for your convenience. Training is available online or in person on a weekly basis. Since going digital, our volunteers can work from anywhere or at our location at 1233 West Lindsay in Norman. Help us give back to the heroes who fought to give us our freedoms.

We are open to active clients Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to noon each day.

Remember the hidden pictures that were popular a few years ago? The picture was an abstract thing but if you stared at it for a while, you would see something like a lion or a person.

Saying memorized prayers, like the Rosary for example, is like looking at those pictures.

You are not concentrating on the words you are saying but you are in a state of readiness to see what is hidden.

Teachers talk about this when students have an “ah ha” moment. But we, God’s students, are even happier because we say, “I got it! I understand!”

There is only one miracle in the New Testament that is told in all four gospels: the Feeding of the 5,000. The references are in Matthew 4:13-21, Mark 6: 31-44, Luke 9:12-17, and John 6:1-14. The readings vary, and John gives more detail. There is another miracle with loaves and fish, but it is described only in Matthew 15:32-39 and Mark 8:1-9.

Our story begins with Jesus having heard about the death of John the Baptist who was his

kinsman. He has taken a boat withdrawn to a solitary area. People heard where he was going and followed him on foot. Jesus landed on the shore and saw the crowd, about 5,000 men. (The women and children weren’t counted, but they probably added thousands more people, maybe even up to 20,000.) He had compassion on them and healed the sick among them.

As it was getting toward evening, the disciples asked Jesus to send them away from the remote area so they could go to the villages and buy food. Jesus told the disciples that there was no need to send them away: the disciples could feed them. But the disciples had no food and didn’t have enough money to buy bread to feed everyone.

There was a boy in the crowd

who had five barley loaves and two fish. He wasn’t sure how it might help, but in faith, the boy brought his food to Jesus. Jesus asked the crowd to sit, took the bread, blessed it, and started distributing the bread and fish.

All ate until their hunger was satisfied, men, women and children. Jesus then asked the disciples to take baskets through the crown to gather the leftover pieces of bread, so that nothing was wasted. There was enough bread pieces left to fill 12 large baskets!

What are some of the lessons here? First, Jesus had compassion on those who had followed him, seeking healing. He was concerned for the whole

kept his focus up ahead at the goal he had set. On those days when we find ourselves looking back too much, we can open up the book of Philippians and be reminded, quickly, that looking back won't do anything for you except make you run into a tree or something.

I have one more, and a story, too: Perhaps many love Philip-pians because it lays out for us (without preaching or lecturing) exactly what a Christian life looks like. In short, it shows us what it means to be excel-lent. You go out in life, says the apostle to the Philippians, and you prove the things that are excellent. You be excellent in your attitudes of peace and joy and in your positive way of looking at things; and you carry yourself every day with excel-lence. You can't read this book without desiring it. No way.

The minute I starting studying Philippians again and thought of the 'excellence' theme, a story from long ago came to mind. Before I started teaching in 1984, I had to visit a school to observe a classroom and see what a good English classroom looked like. My assignment was Wheatley High School, an inner-city school in Houston. I walked into the classroom early one morning; and the teacher -- a middle-aged white lady who seemed a little out of place in a school of mostly minority stu-dents -- greeted me nicely and gave me a seat near the door. Soon the bell rang, and the kids hurriedly and noisily made their way down the hallway; one by one about thirty of them made their way into the room, all greeted cordially by the well-dressed, professional-looking teacher.

As soon as the bell to start class rang, the teacher -- I don't remember her name, unfortu-nately -- began to teach. With her grammar book in her hand, she taught as she walked up and down the aisle and then, in a flash, would make her way to the chalkboard to illustrate a point. A student often would raise a hand to ask a question, and the teacher honored that question as if it were the most important question she'd heard all week; and she answered it with flu-ency and respect. The further the class the went along, the more I thought the teacher may not be human at all. I thought she must be a robot -- until near the end of the class. That was when she paused, almost as if to take a breath for the first time, looked over at me, and gave me a lovely smile. I knew she was real after all.

Through the years I thought back to that teacher and wish I could walk into her classroom again, even after walking into my own thousands of times. She taught me something that I never forgot, and I'm still impacted by it today. She taught me what excellence looks like in a class-room. I sought to achieve that excellence; but I found it to be a very high standard. On my best days, perhaps I came close. But I always knew I always had to press toward that mark with all I had if I ever wanted to be in the same class as the teacher from Wheatley High School, 1982.

When you read the book of Philippians -- by the way -- you are looking at that Wheatley High School teacher, too. You are seeing excellence at its best -- and the Apostle Paul is the teacher who is instructing our class.

time? Come to 631 East Ash in Lexington this Saturday. There may not be a crowd of 20,000 people, or 5,000, or even 500, but whoever is there will be fed. We may not have barley loaves and fish, but there will be meats (canned and frozen), vegetables (frozen and canned), fruit (dried and canned), pasta, beans, cereal, etc. — lots of food that can feed hungry people.

We fed approximately 2,500 people last year, a little less than the years before because of the way we needed to quarantine

in place to avoid Covid-19. A couple of years before, we DID feed 5,000. This year we may be feeding more for the various reasons impacting our society.

So, if you need either a little help with food or maybe you need more help, come to the Food Bank. If it can get you through a couple of weeks, there are other food sources in the area.

Rescue Nutrition is down-town in Lexington; the Assem-bly of God in Purcell distributes food. Check with the First

Baptist Church in Purcell, they have clothing and medical care, so they may have food available too. Ask at the church you at-tend, they may be able to help.

We don't require you to at-tend our church in order to get food. We distribute food that comes from the Regional Food Bank (RFB). It doesn't matter where you live, or what your income is. In order to give an accounting to RFB, we do have to have your name and some other information, but it is not done in order to prevent people

from getting food.

We know there are people out there that could use help, especially some of our seniors and elders. Many say that there are others who need the food more desperately, but there is plenty of food for all.

Remember the story of the 5,000: God uses each of us to bless others. Nothing is too big for God to care about and to take care of. Compassion and kindness: that's the example that Jesus gave for us to imitate and to follow.
