Maintaining old, paying for new has PMH in a bind

The most contentious agenda item at Monday's Purcell City Council and Public Works Authority meeting wasn't even up for a vote.

During the council meeting, council member Allen Eubanks took exception to an item on the PWA agenda.

That item – a request for a \$1 million short term loan from McClain Bank for Purcell Municipal Hospital – had to be tabled because a portion of the hospital sits on land not owned by the city.

That land is utilized by the hospital through a 99-year lease.

The hospital is experiencing a cash crunch because it no longer receives the revenue from the penny sales tax which voters approved in 2016 and extended through 2039 in

School shootings are a frightening – and rising – trend in this country.

Don't think so? Think again.

Between January 4 and May 24, students were targeted in 28 school shootings.

The toll was 27 dead and 57 injured.

The shootings crisscrossed the nation, reaching from Dorchester, Mass., to Yakima, Wash., and from Richfield,

Minn., to Uvalde, Texas.

Since 2018, there have been 119 school shootings, according to National Public Radio.

Could it happen here?

Purcell Public Schools Superintendent Dr. Sheli McAdoo wants to assure patrons, "Schools are one of the safest places that students can be."

## Rainfall scarce here

### Drought, triple-digit heat continues

While many parts of Oklahoma received healthy doses of rainfall during the past week, Purcell and much of McClain and southern Cleveland County came up high and dry.

Parts of northern Oklahoma received anywhere from an inch of moisture to upwards of five inches.

Norman recorded 1.12" while Purcell has scratched

and clawed for .3 of an inch.

According to the Oklahoma Mesonet, Washington recorded .33" of rain and Pauls Valley .29".

For the year here 26.35" has been recorded but next to nothing for the month of July and into August.

Additional triple-digit days are on the horizon with little or no rain forecast.

## Under control

### Rationing water working in Goldsby

Voluntary odd-even water rationing in Goldsby is working, a Town Hall spokeswoman said Tuesday.

Two weeks ago, the demand for water was so great, it far surpassed the system's ability to meet that demand.

Between the voluntary rationing based on odd and even property addresses, a break from the 100 degree-plus heat

and rains last week, the system has been able to keep up with demand.

The rationing plan allows customers with an even address to restrict watering outside from 7 to 11 a.m. and 7 to 11 p.m. on even numbered days.

Those with odd number address should restrict their watering to the same hours on odd numbered days.

## Absentee

### by mail

#### Application deadline Monday

Requests for absentee ballots by mail must be received by the McClain County Election Board no later than 5 p.m. Monday.

McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said the requests can be submitted several ways.

"In Oklahoma, no excuse is needed to vote by absentee ballot, and it's easy to apply," she said. "Voters can submit their application online, in-person, by fax, mail, or even email."

To apply online, use the OK Voter Portal at [oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp](http://oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp).

Applications are also available at the county election board or can be downloaded at [oklahoma.gov/elections](http://oklahoma.gov/elections).

Haley reminds voters that only the applicant can submit the application. It is against the law to submit an absentee ballot application for another person. Voters who submit their application in-person at the county election board will be asked to provide proof of identity.

## Bean settling in as president

### First United promotes from within

When First United Bank in Purcell had an opening for president, bank officials looked within to find the best fit.

They chose Jason Bean, a commercial loan officer here.

Bean was recruited in 2017 by his friend, Susan Tarp, when both were serving on the finance committee at First Baptist Church in Lexington.

Bean described his selection as president as evidence of First United's succession planning.

His appointment was effective in March.

"They like to promote from within," he said, explaining the pool of skilled outside candidates is limited by Purcell's proximity to Oklahoma City and Norman.

## A way to cast your ballot

### Election board assists incapacitated

Registered voters who become physically incapacitated after 5 p.m. Monday and cannot make it to the polls, still have an opportunity to cast their ballot in the August 23 primary runoff election.

McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said state law permits voters who become emergency incapacitated to vote under special provisions. She added emergency incapacitation is

something most voters don't think about.

"Voting is our constitutional right, but life happens. Injury, illness or even childbirth can prevent a voter from being able to go to the polls. That's why it's important to make sure voters know their rights in the event of an emergency," she said.

If you or someone you know becomes physically incapacitated after 5 p.m. Monday, contact the county election board as soon as possible. Election board officials will work with

Robocall crisis

Attorneys general create task force

Oklahoma Attorney General John O'Connor this week announced that Oklahoma is joining a nationwide Anti-Robocall Litigation Task Force of 50 attorneys general to investigate and take legal action against the telecommunications companies responsible for allowing illegal foreign robocalls into the United States. This bipartisan nationwide Task Force has one goal: to reduce illegal robocalls. The Task Force will focus on shutting down the providers that profit from this illegal scam traffic and refuse to take steps to mitigate scam calls. "Over 33 million scam robocalls are made to Americans every day," O'Connor said. "These scam calls include Social Security Administration fraud against seniors, Amazon scams against consumers and many other scams targeting all consumers, including some of our most vulnerable citizens." Most of this scam robocall traffic originates overseas, he continued, and the scammers stole an estimated \$29.8 billion in 2021. The Task Force has issued 20 civil investigative demands to 20 gateway providers and other entities that are allegedly responsible for a majority of foreign robocall traffic. Gateway providers that bring foreign traffic into the U.S. telephone network have a responsibility to ensure the traffic is legal, but these providers are not taking sufficient action to stop robocall traffic. In many cases, they appear to be intentionally turning a blind eye in return for steady revenue, O'Connor said. The Task Force will focus on the bad actors throughout the telecommunications industry, to help reduce the number robocalls that Oklahoma residents receive. "I am proud to join my fellow attorneys general in investigating and taking action against anyone who helps these scam-

mers and illegal robocallers," O'Connor said. "Together, we are fighting to protect our families, neighbors and loved ones in Oklahoma and across the United States from falling victim to fraud. If the telecom industry won't police itself, this Task Force will." O'Connor offered the following tips to avoid scams and unwanted calls: • Be wary of callers who specifically ask you to pay by gift card, wire transfer, or cryptocurrency. For example, the Internal Revenue Service does

not accept iTunes gift cards. • Look out for prerecorded calls from imposters posing as government agencies. Typically, the Social Security Administration does not make phone calls to individuals. • If you suspect fraudulent activity, immediately hang-up and do not provide any personal information. • Contact our Consumer Protection Division at 405-521-2029 or by email at ConsumerProtection@oag.ok.gov to file a Do Not Call or Text complaint.


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School Begins

# Avoid distractions while you are driving

Some temptations are hard to resist. For me, it can be especially challenging to turn down the last piece of chocolate cake. While driving, we typically hear a “ding” on our phone, alerting us to a text or call coming through and we sometimes feel the urgent need to check it. We know we should not, but we reason with ourselves to make an exception - just this once. So, why do we indulge in behavior we know to be wrong, dangerous and in many states, illegal? Call it hubris. According to AAA research, most people feel they are better-than-average drivers. After all, we have busy lives and are accustomed to multitasking. However, research and thousand of deaths every year prove otherwise. August is Back to School Safety Month. As a new school year begins with young drivers and school buses back on the road, I thought it would be a

good time to remind folks, including myself, of the dangers of distracted driving. The reality is using a phone while driving creates enormous potential for injuries and fatalities. Distractions take a motorist’s attention off driving, which can make a driver miss critical events, objects and cues, potentially leading to a crash. According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration, one of every 10 fatal crashes in the U.S. involves distracted driving, resulting in more than 3,000 death annually. I find this statistic heartbreaking considering so many of these accidents could easily be avoided if we would simply put down our phones while driving. Distracted driving is considered any activity diverting our attention, including texting or talking on the phone, and adjusting the navigation or entertainment system. Texting is by far one of the most dangerous distractions. Sending or reading one text

takes your eyes off the road for an average of five seconds. At 55 mph, that is like driving the length of an entire football field with your eyes closed. In addition to refraining from texting while driving, we can help keep the roads safe by moving over for first responders and other emergency vehicles. Additionally, if you see utility crews conducting work near the roadside, I would encourage you to move over when possible and give them extra space to perform their work safely. At REC, safety is foremost in everything we do - for our employees and the members of the communities we serve. We routinely remind our crews of the dangers of distracted driving and we hope you will have similar conversations with your teens who may be new to the roadways and who are especially susceptible to the lure of technology. Let us work together to keep everyone safe on the roads. Remember: the text can wait and waiting just might save a life.

(TSS), or bacterial or fungal infections, among other issues. Students have enough to worry about besides their periods — we could easily remove this stress for Oklahoma girls. States like Illinois, California, and New Hampshire have mandated that these products be made available in all public schools. These same health concerns extend to Oklahoma’s homeless and low-income women. Instead of missing school,

though, they skip work, and for hourly employees that means they don’t get paid and risk losing their job. Something must be done. There are around 850,000 Oklahoma women and girls between the ages of 12 and 44 and one in five live below the federal poverty line. Some 49 percent of our female students in grades seven to 12 attend Title I eligible schools. I’ll be sharing this information with the Senate’s tax

reform taskforce because Oklahoma women deserve better and shouldn’t have to skip school or work or be stressed and embarrassed because they can’t afford these life necessities. ment subsequently provided for segregated schools in the District of Columbia.” More interesting was the end of the Manifesto, which makes similar arguments as pro-abortion advocates today: “With the gravest concern for the explosive and dangerous condition created by this decision and inflamed by outside meddlers; We reaffirm our reliance on the Constitution as the fundamental law of the land. We decry the Supreme Court’s encroachments on rights reserved to the States and to the people, contrary

to established law and to the Constitution. We commend the motives of those States which have declared the intention to resist forced integration by any lawful means. We pledge ourselves to use all lawful means to bring about a reversal of this decision which is contrary to the Constitution and to prevent the use of force in its implementation.” Like today, the arguments are about the courts taking away the rights of the people. Please note that I am not arguing for or against abortion or calling pro-abortion advocates

the same as 1950s racists. Yet, historically speaking, we have seen similar Supreme Court decisions that brought about just as much contention and fighting about the role of the courts, especially when changing a law that has been around for so long. The Chickasaw Nation is inviting comments regarding the special supplemental nutrition program for women, infants and children (WIC).

## Childcare Stabilization Grant offers financial relief within Chickasaw Nation boundaries

The Chickasaw Nation is offering Childcare Stabilization Grants to eligible child care providers within the Chickasaw Nation service area.

The grants offer financial relief to help offset unexpected business costs associated with the COVID-19 pandemic. These grants are designed to help support operation services so they may continue without limiting staff or shutting down.

“This grant has proven to be a tremendous success and wonderful opportunity for child care providers,” said Sandra Manuel, director of family assistance within the Chickasaw Nation Department of Education. “It offers them better health and safety,

improving the quality of care in their facilities.”

Manuel’s team offers providers a wide variety of assistance, including intervention services and contract employees who visit sites and help with children who have behavioral issues.

Team members offer screenings and recommendations for providers, personal protective equipment (PPE), hearing and vision screenings for the children, and up to \$50,000 in health and safety appliances. This can include new heating and air units, storm shelters, flooring, roofing, and more.

“We call each provider and ask them what they are in need of, and we offer services that fit their facilities and pro-

grams,” Manuel said.

Some providers may receive hazard pay if they were open during the COVID-19 pandemic. The grant can offer employee incentives to their workers who were at risk during the pandemic.

Manuel’s team also provides resources for training, as licensed providers need at least 20 hours of training each year. They offer \$250 for training per employee and can also pay up to three months of operational costs, including payroll, utility bills, mortgage, insurance and more.

“I had one provider call that was licensed for 74 children, but staffing was so low that she could only have 30 kids at a time. This affects their bottom dollar. So, us providing three months of operational costs is very helpful for them,” Manuel said.

Funding is made available through the U.S. federal government’s American Rescue Plan.

To be eligible for this grant, providers must be within the boundaries of the Chickasaw Nation or have contracted with the Nation’s child care assistance program.

Providers must also be state-licensed. Relative providers who are not state-licensed may be eligible for some portions of the grant.

Each provider must be regulated and registered under tribal or state law and satisfy the tribal, state and local requirements, including health and safety requirements outlined in the Child Care and Development Block Grant Act (CCDBG).

Center-based child care, group home child care, family child care or other providers of child care services for compensation may all apply for this grant.

Chickasaw Nation Family Assistance is responding to several issues that have come up for child care providers due to COVID-19.

“We changed our pay scale throughout our child care assistance program so that it is now based on enrollment, not attendance. This way they get paid even if the child is in quarantine,” Manuel said.

With the grant, a day care in Ardmore was able to expand its facilities recently by

2-3 boneless, skinless chicken breasts (chopped into bite sized pieces)

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# Hot weather garden woes

Poor flowering and misshapen or a lack of fruit on tomatoes, peppers and squash may be due to the weather, not your gardening skills.

Temperature extremes can interfere with flowering and fruit set on these and other vegetables in your garden.

We watch for and can't wait to taste that first red ripe tomato. It is certainly frustrating when we see flowers drop or the plant fails to form fruit.

Tomatoes thrive in warm sunny conditions; but temperature extremes can prevent fruiting, cause misshapen fruit, or reduce the size of the harvest.

When daytime temperatures rise above 90°F and night temperatures remain above 70° F blossom drop and poor fruit development may occur.

Combine this with low humidity and the pollen is not viable. In hot and humid conditions, the pollen is too sticky and doesn't move from the male to the female part of the flower.

Without pollination the flowers won't be fertilized, and fruit will not develop.

Cool weather can result in poor fruiting. Night temperatures below the optimum of 59° to 68°F will reduce the amount and viability of pollen that the plant produces. Less viable pollen means fewer fruit will form.

Cooler temperatures below 55°F can result in misshapen

fruit and catfacing. Fortunately, the malformed fruit is still tasty and safe to eat.

Temperature extremes also impact pepper productivity. When temperatures climb to 95°F or higher the pollen is sterile and flowers may drop.

Small fruit may also fall from the plant during such hot spells. Pepper plants also experience poor fruit set when night temperatures drop below 60°F or rise above 75° F.

Tomatoes and peppers aren't the only vegetables impacted by temperature extremes. Eggplants, a close relative to tomatoes and peppers, do not set fruit until night temperatures are above 55°F. Beans stop flowering or the flowers die when temperatures rise above 85° F.

Flowering in squash and cucumber plants is also influenced by temperature and other environmental factors. These plants produce separate male and female flowers.

The male flowers usually appear first and it is not until both the male and female flowers are present that pollination, fertilization and fruit production can occur.

Research found cool temperatures, bright sunlight, and shorter days encourage female flower production while male flowers are more prolific during warmer temperatures, less sunlight and close spacing.

Flowering on squash and cucumbers is also impacted by nitrogen fertilization. Too much can prevent female

flower formation while insufficient amounts can reduce the number of male flowers.

The simplest solution is to wait for optimum temperatures and the proper humidity levels to return. Once this happens, the plants will begin producing fruit.

If poor productivity related to the weather is a yearly problem, consider planting more heat-tolerant varieties, adjust planting times and look for more suitable growing locations.

When the harvest is delayed, extend the season with the help of row covers. These fabrics allow sunlight, air, and water through while trapping heat around the plants.

Just loosely cover plants and anchor the edges with stones, boards, or landscape stakes when frost is in the forecast. You can leave the fabric in place for the remainder of the year. Just lift it to harvest and secure the fabric when done.

If this summer's weather leaves you disappointed with the harvest, remember there is always next year.

## Culling order when forage supplies are short

Cow calf producers must constantly assess the balance of cattle inventory versus the forage resources available on the ranch to support the cattle in the herd.

This summer's dry and hot weather has reduced range quality and forage quantity, causing some ranchers to consider "downsizing" the cattle inventory in an effort to better match cattle and forage supplies.

The need to reduce cattle numbers on some Oklahoma ranches actually comes at a time in the cattle cycle when the prices for cows and culled replacement heifers are fair and allow for some capital investment to be used when cattle prices are considerably lower.

Therefore, it seems appropriate to examine the cow herd as

to which individuals should most appropriately be culled in the "downsizing" actions.

Below is a suggested order of culling in the face of diminishing forage supplies and a need to reduce cattle numbers to allow native ranges to regain range condition.

- Culling order
1. Open (Non-pregnant) old cows;
  2. Open replacement heifers;
  3. Old cows with unsound mouth, eyes, feet, and legs;
  4. Open cows of any age;
  5. Thin cows over 7 years of age (BCS < 4);
  6. Very late bred 2-year-olds;
  7. Healthy bred cows that are over 7 years of age;
  8. Healthy bred young cows

2- or 3-year-old; and  
9. Healthy bred 4- to 7-year-old cows.

The first two items on the list are automatic culls in any forage year. Old open cows are not worth keeping through an expensive winter season. Replacement heifers that were properly developed and mated to a fertile bull or in an well-organized AI program should be pregnant.

If they are not bred, there is a likelihood that they are reproductively unsound and should be removed from the herd while still young enough to go to the feedlot and grade choice with

# Scholarships cover tuition for Chickasaw nursing, education students

The Chickasaw Nation Higher Education Program is offering two new advantageous scholarships for students pursuing degrees in nursing or education at East Central University (ECU) in Ada, Oklahoma.

The Abeka Apisachi Nursing Scholarship is for students who are already accepted into the nursing program at ECU.

"They will do a scholarship interview with the scholarship selection committee consisting of nursing staff from the Chickasaw Nation Medical Center.

"The interview and the rest of their application will be what helps us decide who will get this scholarship for the upcoming fall semester," said Kresta Lofton, higher education manager for the Chickasaw Nation.

The Holisso Pisachi Education Scholarship is for students seeking a bachelor's degree in education at ECU.

"Nursing and education are two fields of study that are in high demand. We need nurses. We need teachers at our child care centers. Oklahoma needs teachers and nurses," Lofton added.

These scholarships are for Chickasaw students and aim to place future Chickasaw employees in the education and nursing fields. The scholarships

are competitive.

"Only two are accepted for each program. The scholarships cover the full cost of the students' tuition, their books, any fees, on-campus housing and residence life expenses," Lofton said.

The students are required to work in paid, part-time positions in either the Chickasaw Nation Department of Health or the Chickasaw Nation Department of Education, whichever field they are pursuing.

They also must maintain at least a bronze level of participation. This is a standard set by the Chickasaw Nation Recruitment and Retention Program that requires students to obtain a certain number of points by attending different events on campus or in the community.

"Having them work part time will not only open up employment opportunities for them upon graduation, but they are going to get that hands-on learning experience. They're going to be active in the Chickasaw Nation and learn more about the resources available to them," Lofton said.

The last cattle to cull or conversely the first choice to save on the ranch are those most productive 4- to 7-year-old cows that have rebred and will produce big calves next year.

# Oklahoma families being hit by skyrocketing inflation

Skyrocketing inflation is costing Oklahomans thousands of dollars, according to the state's junior senator.

U.S. Sen. James Lankford said Oklahoma families are paying more than \$7,000 for the same products that they bought a year ago in the wake of the announcement that consumer prices rose to 9.1 percent in June, the highest since 1981.

"These are policy decisions that have been made that are affecting people in my neighborhood, in my state, in my county, in the cities in my state. The newest estimate for Oklahoma is each family is paying \$7,198 more this year for the exact same products they were buying last year," said Lankford.

"Wages have not gone up for families in my state \$7,198. They're falling farther and farther behind directly because of the policies that have been put in place by this administration."

Lankford pointed out that these inflation rates are directly impacting families in Oklahoma due to wages not being increased but accompanied by a higher cost of living.

"For those individuals who live paycheck-to-paycheck, this higher inflation has forced them to cut back on their consumption. That lower consumption will dampen Gross Domestic Product, (GDP) which is the measure of the nation's income," said Benjamin Keen, a University of Oklahoma associate economics professor.

"In fact, the Atlanta Fed's

GDP now forecast for second quarter 2022 GDP is -1.2%, which indicates the U.S. economy is expected to shrink in the second quarter of 2022."

Lankford put the blame for the high inflation rate on the Biden administration saying there is a direct parallel to inflation during the Carter administration.

"The reason I am going to Saudi Arabia though is much broader it is to promote U.S. interest, promote U.S. interest, in a way that I think we have an opportunity to reassert what I think we made a mistake walking away from, out influence in the Middle East," said President Joe Biden in a press conference.

As Biden travels to Saudi Arabia this week to meet with them about increasing oil production to bring down

prices in America, Lankford pointed to President Carter doing the same in the 1970s.

"All I could think is, history is repeating itself," said Lankford.

This 9.1 percent inflation rate is a reflection of the Consumer Price Index of June and does not reflect the recent price drops in some prices such as gasoline.

"While today's headline inflation reading is unacceptably high, it is also out-of-date," said Biden in a statement.

# Extend your cilantro harvest, enjoyment

Cilantro is a favorite ingredient in guacamole, tacos, rice dishes and of course salsa. But as summer temperatures climb, the cilantro quickly goes to seed.

This can be frustrating but using all parts of the plant or growing a heat tolerant cilantro-flavored substitute can help.

Gardeners in cooler climates can sow seeds every three to four weeks throughout the summer for continual harvests. Those with hotter summers will have the best results growing cilantro in the cooler temperatures of spring, fall and even winter. Grow cilantro in full sun or light shade as temperatures climb and moist well-drained soil for best results.

Mulching the soil to keep the roots cool and moist will help delay flowering. Avoid overwatering that can lead

to root rot.

Harvest the leaves when they are four to six inches tall and before the plants flower for the best flavor.

Harvest as needed a third of the plant at one time to allow it to keep producing or cut the whole plant back to an inch above the ground and wait for it to regrow.

Store freshly cut leaves like a bouquet of flowers in a glass of fresh water. Place in the refrigerator to use for the upcoming week. Hang leaves upside down to dry or freeze. Just wash the leaves, pat dry and place in a freezer bag or air-tight container in the freezer. Or chop up the rinsed cilantro into smaller pieces, place in ice cube trays and top with a splash of water before placing in the freezer.

As temperatures rise, the plant will flower and set seed. Do not discard it but rather look at utilizing the other parts of this plant. Enjoy the beauty and flavor of the lacy white flowers that also attract ben-

eficial insects to the garden.

After the white flowers fade, green seeds appear. Wait for the plants and seeds to turn brown when using them as coriander. Cut off the seed heads, place in a paper bag, and allow the seeds to drop to the bottom. The seeds are ground and used in breads, cakes, pickling spices, and Asian food. Store in sealed containers until ready to use.

Otherwise allow the seeds to drop to the ground in the garden and grow new cilantro plants to harvest and enjoy. Cilantro seeds sprout readily when soil temperatures are 55 to 68°F and the plants can withstand a light frost.

Don't forget to harvest the roots and use them for seasoning Thai and Vietnamese food. These taste best when harvested in fall.

In the future, consider buying seeds of slow bolting cilantro varieties like Slow-Bolt, Leisure and the 2006 All-America Selections award winner Delfino

Cilantro.

Or try growing Papalo, also known as summer cilantro, in next year's garden. It has a similar but stronger flavor than cilantro with a hint of citrus and mint and thrives in hot weather. You will only need one or two plants as this annual grows up to five feet tall and several feet wide. Harvest young leaves for the best flavor and use only 1/2 or 1/3 the amount of cilantro called for in recipes.

You may need to start your own plants from seeds if none of the garden centers in your area sell plants. Myers is the author of more than 20 gardening books, including *Small Space Gardening*.

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# Chickasaw Nation WIC Program offers benefits to area residents

The Chickasaw Nation Women, Infants and Children Supplemental Nutrition Program (WIC) extends its services to families who need encouragement and support in feeding their children.

Chickasaw Nation WIC offers nutrition education and a food package for growing children from the prenatal period up to age five. The program puts a family’s feeding concerns first and works with individuals to provide the best for their children.

It also helps participants improve their diet, get immunizations and health care if needed, and encourages breastfeeding.

Through nutrition education, counseling, support and encouragement, the Chickasaw Nation WIC staff connects with families to assist in improving and enhancing their quality of life.

Applicants can apply online at Chickasaw.net/WIC or schedule a phone appointment.

Services are available to anyone who meets the fol-

lowing guidelines: they are currently pregnant or breastfeeding, have had a baby in the past six months or have a child up to 5 years of age, meet WIC income guidelines and complete a nutritional screening at one of the WIC offices.

WIC offices offer participants virtual services and in-person appointments and are currently taking new applicants by phone, email, video conferencing and text message.

Homeless individuals are served immediately upon request if the above criteria are met.

Funded by the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), the program has been serving communities in the Chickasaw Nation for more than 30 years and is currently meeting the needs of more than 4,000 participants on a monthly basis.

Chickasaw Nation WIC food benefits utilize a magnetic stripe card known as an Electronic Benefit Transfer (EBT) card. The card works

like a debit or credit card. It replaces the traditional paper check or voucher and gives families freedom of purchasing the food they need with each trip to the store.

A WIC food package includes milk, cheese, yogurt, fruit juice, eggs, cereal, whole grains, canned fish, peanut butter, beans/peas as well as fresh and frozen fruits and vegetables. Infant foods are also offered and formula for infants is provided if needed.

Enhanced food packages are offered to breastfeeding women, and peer counselors are available to assist them in having a successful breastfeeding experience.

In the summer months, participants are eligible for Farmers’ Market Nutrition Program benefits for the purchase of fresh fruits and vegetables from authorized farmers markets and farm stands throughout the Chickasaw Nation and surrounding areas.

City treasurer Victor Lohn explained that money was diverted from hospital coffers in March when the city had to start making payments on the bond that is paying for construction of the new hospital.

The monthly payments are \$129,704.69.

Redirecting the penny sales tax monies wouldn’t have been an issue had the new hospital been able to open as planned in May.

But shortages in material and manpower have delayed the opening, now tentatively set for sometime in September.

“We anticipated being in the new building by now,” Chris Wright, PMH chief executive officer, said.

The chief financial officer, Mary Morris, added the hospital’s estimate of needs built in expenses covering the move into the new hospital and the first four to six months.

No one could have foreseen the delays and the drain on finances.

What upset Eubanks was the city is poised to spend a similar amount – \$1,039,507 – for its 51 percent share of Main StreetScape.

Those funds, however, are budgeted and earmarked for

the downtown project and are not accessible for PMH needs.

The design will add a half-dozen parking spaces on Main Street from Canadian Avenue to 4th Avenue and will have a designated spot for food trucks by the plaza.

The result will be a classic vintage downtown.

Council member Jay Tate said the city needs to fund infrastructure first before borrowing money when the city has money in its accounts.

When it was explained to Eubanks that he couldn’t bring up a PWA matter in the council meeting and he learned the loan would be tabled, he voted for the Main StreetScape expenditure while Tate cast the lone no vote.

In other business, the council:

- approved the \$66,0038.88 purchase of a back-up generator for City Hall;
- approved the fire department ordering a new custom pumper truck at a cost not to exceed \$661,000; and
- approved an agreement with Dows Hills LLC regarding the purchase of water service and 172 water meters for a new development outside the city limits.

PWA trustees approved new water and sewer rates that will go into effect next month.

The biannual rate adjustment is tied to the consumer price index. That amount was 5.8 percent as of Dec. 31, 2021.

That amounts to a 65 cent increase for the first 999 gallons of water for city residents and \$1.06 for rural customers.

The in-town cost per 1,000 gallons up to 4,999 gallons will be \$6.42. Five additional step increases will max out at \$7.95 per 1,000 gallons over 100,000 gallons.

Rural water rates will range from an additional \$8.18 per thousand gallons to \$9.93 over 100,000 gallons.

Commercial rates will increase 93 cents to \$16.93, maxing out at \$8.23 per 1,000 gallons over 100,000 gallons.

The new residential sewer rates will be \$12.70 for the first 999 gallons while the commercial sewer rate will be \$17.99.

Those two rates will max out at \$1.32 and \$2.65 per 1,000 gallons, respectively for more than 5,000 gallons.

Trustees also:

- approved up to \$160,000 for drilling and logging three test wells;
- approved \$160,769.28 for lighting Green Avenue south of Washington Street; and
- approved \$336,575 for the purchase of a vacuum truck.

ongoing mission based largely on “the protocols that safety officials have advised are deterrents to school violence.”

Purcell Police Chief Bobby Elmore said all new officers conduct walkthroughs of the schools during training to familiarize themselves with the layout.

In addition, the department works closely with school staff on training and safety protocols.

That isn’t just talk. McAdoo said “every officer we have ever worked with knew the buildings intimately.”

Over the past three years, Purcell Schools have upgraded its safety measures through technology.

“We have locked entry ways for all buildings,” McAdoo said. “We installed fob operated back doors at the Elementary School so that students can be quickly ushered outside the building if necessary.”

The district also uses the RAVE Panic Button.

The RAVE Panic Buttons were made available to districts following an executive

order from the governor’s office three years ago.

“We have worked with Purcell Police and Fire to be connected to the RAVE app, so they receive all notifications when the button is pressed,” McAdoo said, adding RAVE is geotracked to each building location.

“This is a very instrumental tool for school safety,” she said.

Gov. Stitt’s order also covered school safety audits.

Purcell schools have undergone two safety audits in the last three years. The most recent was spring of this year.

“We update our school safety plans yearly and each school has a School Safety Committee,” the superintendent said.

In addition, administrators have been trained for rural school safety. And additional school counselors hired through a Counselor Corp grant address the need for increased mental health support.

The district’s StopIt app provides an avenue to report any concerning behavior or issue a

student may be experiencing.

The app is monitored 24/7 by StopIt, which reports immediately to the police if anything concerning is reported on the app.

BARK is another tool the district utilizes. It monitors students’ Google accounts and alerts to key words indicating bullying, violence, self-harm and other behaviors, McAdoo said.

Beginning Monday, teachers will go through safety training sessions with the police department.

That is part of a commitment by both sides to focus on safety concerns through a series of quarterly meetings.

“We will explore all options to keep our students and staff safe,” McAdoo said. “Our police department has been a tremendous partner of the school district and extremely responsive to any request for increased safety patrols or presence.

“We will continue to identify ways to strengthen safety on each campus as part of our normal operating procedures.”

“My position is do those things first that don’t need someone hired to run them,” he said. “My maintenance angle is this – is it easy to repair and can you find at least 20 people to repair it?”

The swimming beach is a prime example.

“Now so many people use it, it’s a constant deal figuring

out what to add because it’s so popular,” he said. “The beach is a low maintenance kind of project.”

When John first joined the parks board, he was staunchly against constructing a new public swimming pool.

Still, the department conducts surveys and people still want a pool.

“But is it feasible at this moment?” he asks. “I feel it will happen someday.

“I could have started this job and had an \$8 million water park across the road.”

He’s convinced it’s a blessing that wasn’t what happened.

The water park idea was turned down by voters in July 2015 and since then emotions on both sides of the issue have calmed.

“I love when people come to my office with issues and I can help with possible resolutions for those issues,” he said. “I keep my door open.”

It’s a fact that he always gets a laugh when he’s asked when he will build a pool.

His stock answer: “When I get all the stuff on that erase board done.”

The large board dominates one wall of his office in the

Multipurpose Center and is a day-to-day, month-by-month listing of projects underway and/or anticipated.

John wants to see more people enjoying what Purcell has to offer, especially the lake.

“People have gotten so disconnected from the outside and nature, it is terrifying to them,” he said. “That’s what is hard – to see people terrified of everything.”

Jessie is very interested in insects and the outdoors, John said, while Bradley is more into engineering.


“I always encourage them to go outside,” he said.



## Warrior Nation Wellness Station

Washington Public Schools has joined forces with South Central Medical Center, introducing the Warrior Nation Wellness Station.

This health center is a primary care clinic based on or near the school campus. It combines primary care, mental health care, nutrition education, health education, and health promotion.

Being seen by the school-based health care center does not change your primary care provider (PCP) to the school-based clinic unless you want that change to occur.

The school-based health clinic will be able to do well child exams, asthma management, medication refills, give orders for physical therapy or imaging, diabetes care, well woman exams (for faculty), sports physicals, bus physicals, draw labs, and acute visits such as rashes, bug bites, ear pain, injuries, concussions, fever, vomiting, and sore throat, etc.

The school-based health care system will have in-office ability to test for strep, mono, RSV, flu, covid, h-pylori, A1c, lead, urine, hemoglobin, and lipids. Washington graduate, Malori Lawrence, will be the medical professional on duty. Our goal is to make health care more accessible to students, allowing them to miss less school and allowing parents and teachers the ability not to miss work as often.

## Dale K. Graham Veterans Foundation

I would like to start this weekly newsletter off with a note of appreciation to all of the veterans who are paying it forward.

As many of you know our Veterans Foundation is a 501-3C non-profit that provides assistance to all veterans and their families. Our primary mission is to assist veterans to receive the VA benefits that they are eligible for.

We are teaming up with Lancaster Consulting to host a free Federal Resume Writing Workshop on August 15. The workshop will go over the ins and outs of applying for positions in the US federal government and is open to clients and non-clients of the Foundation. The workshop will be held on August 15 from 8:30-10 a.m.

Each week we receive the same VA decision letters as the veterans who we represent. By reviewing each VA decision, we are able to know exactly how and why each veteran's claim was approved or denied.

Last week we had 12 veterans who received a 100 percent disability rating for their service-connected conditions. These men and women will be eligible for the Oklahoma property tax exemption on their primary residence. They will also be eligible for the sales tax exemption along with several other state benefits.

Twenty-five veterans received a VA disability rating from 10 to 90 percent for their service-connected disabilities. Congratulations to each one of you.

We do not yet have the official changes for the new VA ratings for hearing loss, tinnitus, sleep apnea and mental health conditions such as PTSD, Depression, or other types of mental conditions. From what we have heard so far is sleep apnea, hearing loss and tinnitus may go away or be severely limited on a rating for any of those conditions.

From where I'm sitting, I think every veteran should consider filing a claim now for any of those conditions listed above before it's too late. During the last 20 years we have helped countless veterans to obtain VA benefits for each of those disabilities.

As always, we need more volunteers to assist us in improving the lives of our veterans and their families. We have hundreds of thousands of veterans and surviving spouses in our state who need our help to receive the VA benefits that they are eligible for.

“He’s holding me account-


able. We make a great duo,” Jones said.

### Landscaping tips to conserve water

While it does help to have a green thumb, keeping a landscape irrigated is key in successful gardening. The amount and frequency that gardeners water can make a big difference in plant health. These factors also have an impact on the pocketbook.

Oklahoma is experiencing extreme summer temperatures this year, which can lead gardeners to turn on those outside spigots more often, said David Hillock, Oklahoma State University Extension consumer horticulturist.

“Some parts of Oklahoma received a fair amount of rain early in the season, but we’re still facing serious drought con-

ditions across much of the state as we head into the second half of the summer,” Hillock said.

“Couple that with record-high temperatures, gardeners need to be aware of water usage and conservation this gardening season. Some cities implement water conservation measures to conserve water during the hot summer months, so proper, efficient watering is important,” he said.

When the temperature is high and the humidity is low, plants need plenty of water. It’s healthier for plants to be watered deeply, but infrequently. Generally, 1 inch of water per week is recommended, preferably in one application, but that isn’t always achievable because the soil does not absorb

the water as fast as it is being distributed.

Hillock said to avoid runoff, watering may need to be done in stages. Irrigate to the point of puddling, then turn the water off and let it soak in for several hours. Then try to put the rest of the water on later that day or the next day.

In this heat, and depending on the soil type, gardeners may have to apply two to three inches per week.

“Allowing the water to soak into the ground and letting the soil dry out a little between watering forces plants to produce strong, deep roots. Just because the top of the soil feels

# Tate named Composer-in-Residence at the University of Oklahoma School of Music

Internationally acclaimed composer Jerod Impichchaachaaha’ Tate, citizen of the Chickasaw Nation in Oklahoma, has been named Composer-in-Residence at the University of Oklahoma School of Music for the spring 2023 season.

During his April 2023 residency, Tate will present lectures, engage with classes, teach students, and collaborate with the University of Oklahoma Symphony Orchestra.

Of his appointment, Tate says, “It is my life passion to thrive with my Oklahoma and Native communities. This appointment allows me to bring the best of myself to my own people and I am deeply honored and grateful for this opportunity.”

Jerod Impichchaachaaha’ Tate is a classical composer, citizen of the Chickasaw Nation in Oklahoma, and is dedicated to the development of American Indian classical composition.

**The Washington Post** raves that “Tate is rare as an American Indian composer of classical music. Rarer still is his ability to effectively infuse classical music with American Indian nationalism.”

Tate is a 2022 Chickasaw Hall of Fame inductee, a 2022 Distinguished Alumni Award recipient from The Cleveland Institute of Music and was appointed 2021 Cultural Ambassador for the U. S. Department of State. He is Guest Composer, conductor, and pianist for San Francisco Symphony’s Currents Program, Thunder Song: American Indian Musical Cultures, and was recently Guest Composer for Metropolitan Museum of Art’s Balcony Bar Program, Home with ETHEL and Friends, featuring his commissioned work Pisachi (Reveal) for String Quartet.

His commissioned works have been performed by the National Symphony Orchestra, San Francisco Symphony and Chorus, Dallas Symphony Orchestra, Detroit Symphony Orchestra, Minnesota Orchestra, Buffalo Philharmonic Orchestra, Oklahoma City Philharmonic, Winnipeg Symphony Orchestra, South Dakota Symphony Orchestra, Colorado Ballet, Canterbury Voices, Dale Warland Singers, Santa Fe Desert Chorale and Santa Fe Chamber Music Festival.

Recent commissions include Shell Shaker: A Chickasaw Opera for Mount Holyoke Symphony Orchestra, Ghost of the White Deer Concerto for Bassoon and Orchestra for Dallas Symphony Orchestra, and Hózhó (Navajo Strong) and Íthánali (I Know) for White Snake Opera Company. His music was recently featured on the HBO series “Westworld.”

Tate has held Composer-in-Residence positions for Music Alive, a national residency program of the League of American Orchestras and New Music USA, the Joyce Foundation/ American Composers Forum, Oklahoma City’s NewView Summer Academy, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation and Grand Canyon Music Festival Native American Composer Apprentice Project.

Tate was the founding composition instructor for the Chickasaw Summer Arts Academy and has taught composition to American Indian high

school students in Minneapolis, the Hopi, Navajo, and Lummi reservations and Native students in Toronto.

Tate is a three-time commissioned recipient from the American Composers Forum, a Chamber Music America’s Classical Commissioning Program recipient, a Cleveland Institute of Music Alumni Achievement Award recipient, a governor-appointed Creativity Ambassador for the State of Oklahoma and an Emmy Award-winner for his work on the Oklahoma Educational Television Authority documentary, “The Science of Composing.” In addition to his work based upon his

Chickasaw culture, Tate has worked with the music and language of multiple tribes, such as Choctaw, Navajo, Cherokee, Ojibway, Creek, Pechanga, Comanche, Lakota, Hopi, Tlingit, Lenape, Tongva, Shawnee, Caddo, Ute, Aleut, Shoshone, Cree, Paiute, and Salish/Kootenai.

Tate earned his Bachelor of Music in Piano Performance from Northwestern University, where he studied with Dr. Donald Isaak, and his Master of Music in Piano Performance and Composition from The Cleveland Institute of Music, where he studied with Elizabeth Pastor and Dr. Donald Erb. He has performed as First

Keyboard on the Broadway national tours of *Les Misérables* and *Miss Saigon* and been a guest pianist and accompanist for the Colorado Ballet, Hartford Ballet, and numerous ballet and dance companies.

Tate’s middle name, Impichchaachaaha’, means “his high corncrib” and is his inherited traditional Chickasaw house name. A corncrib is a small hut used for the storage of corn and other vegetables. In traditional Chickasaw culture, the corncrib was built high off the ground on stilts to keep its contents safe from foraging animals.

## Water:

dry doesn’t mean the plants are ready for a drink, but it will depend on your soil type so be sure to occasionally check deeper in the soil,” he said.

“Slight wilting of plants can be an indicator that they need more water, but it can also be an indicator of too much water, so occasionally check the soil several inches deep before applying more water, especially if the plant does

not perk up after watering,” Hillock said.

Mornings are the best time to irrigate because the temperatures are cooler and the winds are lighter so there is less loss through evaporation or being blown away.

Watering in the mornings prepares plants to get through the hot day.

Mulch is a great addition to a garden. It also can be used

in containers. Mulch helps the soil retain moisture, whether gardeners are hand watering or the plants are getting natural moisture through rain.

Mulch also helps prevent erosion and controls weeds. It’s available in several forms and colors, which will add visual interest to the landscape.

“Gardeners who have an irrigation system will benefit from installing a rain sensor.

A rain sensor turns off the irrigation system during and immediately following a rain event,” Hillock said. “This helps cut down on water usage, which affects your wallet. Also, make sure the sprinkler heads only water vegetation. There’s no need to water the sidewalk or driveway.”

Avoid heavy pruning in the summertime as it stimulates growth, and the plants will

require more water. Keep in mind mature plants and trees require less water because they already have a deep root system.

“Gardening can be challenging under the best circumstances, but especially during drought conditions,” Hillock said. “Proper watering will help keep your landscape healthy and conserve water at the same time.”
