Editor's note: Answering The Purcell Register's five questions this week is Kendal Sacchieri, McClain County Assessor.

Q: Has the assessor's job been what you expected?

A: Yes and no. I did understand the basics of how property would be valued and assessed in my county, I knew the formulas, I knew my market and how to properly apply it across the board.

I didn't however, realize what all taxable assets were umbrellaed under the Assessor's responsibility to value. For example, oil and gas, personal property, wind energy (McClain County does not have Wind currently), cell towers, billboards and then of course, the newest of items, marijuana.

That has been a huge undertaking and is requiring a lot of time and resources that the Assessor's office did not have before this industry began to pop up in Oklahoma. There was also a lot of "I didn't know's" that occurred after I took office, such as the state switching our appraisal softwares, a new

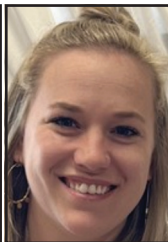

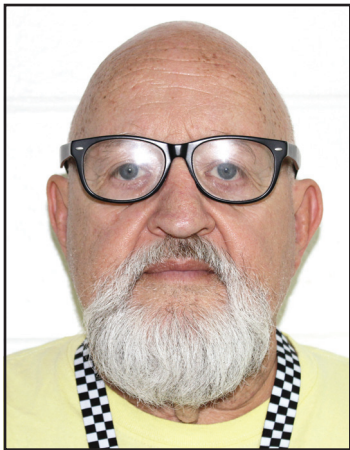

Fire truck

Motion explained

The Purcell Fire Department’s request for the city council to approve the purchase of a custom pumper truck fire engine at a price not to exceed \$661,000 was conditionally approved by all five council members at the August 1 meeting.

The motion stipulated the approval was contingent on a report from the city attorney and city manager that Purcell acted lawfully in bypassing bids since Heartland Fire Trucks LLC is a sole source manufacturer.

City attorney Greg Dixon is still researching the issue, according to city manager Dale Bunn.

Early voting

Option opens Thursday, August 18

Three days of early voting in the August 23 primary runoff election will begin August 18 at the McClain County Community Center, 1721 Hardcastle Blvd.

McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said early voting is open to all voters.

“You do not need to provide an excuse to vote early. Oklahoma allows early voting

for all elections conducted through the State Election Board—from school board and municipal elections to state and federal elections. This is a great option for those who will be out of town on Election Day or who want to avoid long lines,” she said.

Early voting hours are 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. Thursday, August 18, and Friday, August 19, and 8 a.m. to 2 p.m.

Saturday, August 20. Haley reminds voters early voting is not available at polling locations.

Regulations for Garage Sales

1. A resident may have one garage sale per calendar quarter. A permit must be obtained from City Hall or each sale. A sale may be held for up to three consecutive days. There are no rain checks.

2. A garage sale permit fee of \$5 must be paid for each garage sale held.

3. Your garage sale permit must be displayed at the site designated on the permit.

4. Garage sale signs may not be placed on the city street right-of-way, on any utility pole or street sign, in the center median, or on any private property without the permission of property owner.

5. All signs must be removed within 48 hours after the sale.

6. If you have any questions, call the City of Purcell at 405-527-6561 daytime from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m.

If you have questions for the Oklahoma Tax Commission, call them at 405-521-3274.

Violation of any of these regulations may result in revocation of your permit and a fine.

I remember listening to his records on repeat, trying to teach myself to play them on my guitar. Then, even though we lived in town, I went through a phase where I wanted a leather belt with my name stamped on the back, just like all the real cowboys and cowgirls.

I remember during my guitar playing days, every time my parents asked me what I wanted for any holiday, I’d

reply to go see Garth Brooks, not realizing how expensive a gift that was. My dad promised me that someday he’d take me to a concert.

When Garth retired in 2000, I cried for a month after realizing my dream of seeing him in concert would never come true.

When he came out of retirement, I tried to get tickets several times, but never could find anything close. When I was younger, I was disappointed we never got to go see him and as an adult, I’ve wondered if my dad ever thought about his promise.

I realize now how selfish my disappointment was after everything my parents have done for me. I never wanted for anything growing up. My parents both worked hard to make a better life for us than what they had. Once I realized all they sacrificed for us growing up, that disappointment quickly disappeared.

In May, my dad asked what

I wanted for my anniversary. I reminded him it wasn’t until September, and I hadn’t thought about it yet. I thought he’d show me the “next greatest gadget” he’d bought for their house or something for their dogs.

I about fell over when he handed me his phone and there were Garth Brooks’ tour dates but zoomed in on July 30. He smiled and said, “I promised you a few years ago that I’d take you to see Garth Brooks. I haven’t forgotten, so I hope you’re not busy that day, because we have a date in Arlington, Texas.”

The concert was everything I dreamed it’d be and quite honestly, I think if I’d gone when I was six, or 10, or even 20, I wouldn’t have appreciated it the way I did that night.

Democrats crush American more act

Congressman Tom Cole

Since President Joe Biden was sworn into office nearly two years ago, prices have skyrocketed, workers’ wages have shrunk and the U.S. supply chain and labor force have suffered. The accumulation of all of this led to a decline in Gross Domestic Product during the first and second quarters of 2022, which constitutes a recession.

Although Democrats introduced and passed in the Senate their deceptively named “Inflation Reduction Act,” this bill would instead do the exact opposite of what it is named to do.

With a price tag of \$728 billion, this bill would make inflation much worse. In fact, it was this out-of-control spending and Green New Deal policies that played a significant role in causing our economic crisis in the first place.

Additionally, this bad bill wrongly raises taxes on busi-

nesses and manufacturers during a recession. As if Americans are not already paying enough, these higher taxes would be passed onto buyers through higher prices or to employees through smaller paychecks. And despite President Biden’s promise to never raise taxes on individual Americans making less than \$400,000, this bill does just that.

Next, this bill would implement a price-fixing scheme for prescription drugs that would negatively impact patients and our country’s ability to find cures for deadly diseases and only limit them to the top percentage of wealthiest Americans.

In fact, it is estimated that this approach would kill up to 100 new cures and treatments. As the country that produces the most lifesaving cures and treatments in the world, this would completely devastate the fight around the entire globe against

terrible diseases such as cancer and Alzheimer’s.

Importantly, the findings of the nonpartisan Congressional Budget Office (CBO), which is the official arbiter and scorekeeper of legislative costs and savings, expose this “price control” measure as merely a gimmick and limiting our nation’s ability to innovate would in turn raise prices on Americans.

It would not reduce inflation as advertised. Not only would this increase the cost of prescription drugs and raise insurance premiums, but it would also increase Medicare Part D costs by \$40 billion which would be paid for by American taxpayers.

Moreover, this policy would disincentivize generic drug competition, a tried-and-true method of reducing drug prices.

Furthermore, this bill would substantially increase our al-

Your Views

Only viable option

There’s been a lot of discussion and debate about the need and the location for a reliever route for I-35 and I-44 south of I-40. This issue should be discussed and debated because of the impact it will have on some of the neighborhoods and homes along the affected area.

But what is not open for debate is the need to alleviate the congestion, that we not only experience now on I-35 and I-44 but what will take place within the next few years. The average daily traffic counts today for both of these routs south of I-40 exceeds 150,000 vehicles. It is estimated that the daily vehicle count, for those locations will approach 200,000 within the next decade. These are not just my estimates, but those of the engineering community as shown by the Oklahoma Department of Transportation’s Chief Engineer, Bryan Taylor, at the last Commission meeting. He explained in great detail what the level of service or congestion will be on I-35 over the next few decades. He described the problem very well, and shown left unchecked, I-35 and I-44 south of I-40 to the South Canadian River south of Norman and just north of Newcastle respectively will be unusable certain times of the day. This congestion will, and has, caused traffic to use city streets, and as I-35 and I-44 become more unusable so will these city streets. Hence the problem.

Transportation professionals are problem solvers and this problem has been scrutinized over the past few decades by myself and others. We looked at adding additional lanes in each direction, but this would require us to relocate and add additional frontage roads, rebuild every interchange and relocate all the businesses and homes along the I-35 corridor. The cost and disruption to traffic and businesses would be unbelievable and thus, this is not a viable option.

With the Oklahoma City metro area being one of the fastest growing metropolitan areas in the country, it’s no wonder why traffic congestion, especially south of I-40, has become such a serious problem.

It is my belief that a reasonable estimate for the impact of each leg of the I-35 and I-44 proposed reliever routes after the first two years of operation is between 25,000 and 35,000 vehicles per day. After five years it will probably increase to over 45,000. This will have a huge positive impact on the traffic congestion south of I-40.

The solution that the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority has presented, although disruptive to some, it is the only reasonable option.

Your new normal and resetting your life

People who have lost their houses and cars and everything they’ve worked for all their lives may feel like giving up. Some do.

After 30 or 40 years they don’t feel like they have it within them to rebuild and try again. Some have no choice but to live the life they’ve been handed. Financially they don’t have an option.

I was sitting in a hotel lobby in Pikeville, Ky., last Sunday talking to FEMA workers. Several of them were preparing to go to areas devastated by the East Kentucky floods.

One of the men said, “We are trying to get everyone registered. There is some assistance available but it is small and limited in comparison to what they need. These families have nothing. They have lost everything. Many of them have no means to rebuild what they have lost. ‘Sadly,’ he said this is their new normal.”

We all face and deal with the “new normals” of our lives. Aching knees, the death of a spouse, the loss of friends who have moved or died. Financial changes and health challenges force us to learn how to reset our lives.

Resetting life is easier said than done. Too often, all we have is the energy to stare out the window, if we have a window.

Life’s disasters set us back. Mentally, physically, relationally, and financially such an event may require another lifetime of building your life back, if you have a lifetime. Your lifetime may be five or ten years, and if you are lucky your lifetime will be more.

It’s certainly a little easier to try to climb back up the mountain at the age of 35 than at 65, but to some extent you can if you have the will and physical ability to do so.

There is a time in life when you either quit or dramatically change gears. You don’t feel like standing and teaching a class another 10 years. You can’t go back into the coal mine another five years.

You’ve stood in the assembly line for 35 or 40 years and you are done. There is nothing wrong with withdrawing from one life you enjoyed and resetting to do something else.

This could simply be fishing, golf, traveling, walking by the river or local lake, or sleeping late every morning and enjoying your coffee late in the day. There’s nothing wrong with that.

The old Apostle Paul had been through a lot in his life. Shipwrecked, stoned and left for dead, escaped being murdered, whipped cruelly and placed in a jail cell.

His life was often far less than glamorous. He once said, “Let

us not get tired of well-doing, we will reap a harvest if we don’t quit.”

Many years ago, a friend of mine restarted his life at the age of 50. He had nothing to show for his years of work and life. Old age was looking grim.

He and his wife found an old abandoned hamburger stand in a small town. He rented the building for almost nothing and cleaned it up and he and his wife worked 12 hours a day for the next 17 years and he retired with a couple of million dollars in the bank.

Even this would be out of reach for many today but keep in mind that if you have the mental wherewithal to think it and the physical stamina to put it into action, you can reset your life and try again.

Your current normal doesn’t have to be forever, if you don’t quit.

Boren:

should spend our \$1.87 billion in American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds.

After reviewing public proposals, it was obvious there are certain areas that need desperate attention in our state. Among these are broadband expansion, water infrastructure upgrades, improved mental health services, and workforce development for healthcare workers, nurses and other industries experiencing critical shortages.

During regular session, we approved \$140 million of projects to address these areas. We then went into special session in June and approved another \$70 million in projects. The federal funds will be allocated in the coming months.

The pandemic committee is meeting regularly to continue deciding how best to spend the remaining \$1.66 billion. As they approve more projects and submit them to the Legislature, we will reconvene in special session to review and pass their proposals.

The committee is taking its time and thoroughly vetting submissions. These critical federal funds must be allocated by December 2024 or spent by December 2026

Last month, Oklahoma also hosted SLC and welcomed hundreds of legislators and staff from surrounding states to come

discuss policies of concern and interest to our southern region.

I served on the Energy and Environment Committee and voted for a resolution to Congress, proposed by Georgia state Rep. Mesha Mainor, to encourage the establishment of Regional Transmission Operators (RTOs) and Independent System Operators (ISOs) within the southeastern United States to diversify the present energy monopoly and work towards creating a competitive wholesale electricity market.

The resolution further encourages creating state-run authorities similar to the Fulton Technology and Energy Enhancement Authority (FTEEA), started by Rep. Mainor in her home state, in other southeastern states to mitigate the effects of the energy burden through technology-centered workforce development and the production of renewable energy.

Besides attending classes, I also gave guests a tour of our newly renovated Capitol. If you haven’t been this year, you really should put this on your to-do list. It has been transformed into a breathtaking museum of history while also having the necessary modern conveniences to support the hundreds of state employees who work there.

My tour group included law-

makers from Mississippi who were awestruck by the beautiful paintings depicting our state’s history. I explained how the stories of the Trail of Tears and the Land Run continue to resonate in Oklahoma’s culture and policies.

We attended a breakfast to hear from Canada Consul General Dr. Rachel McCormick about how Canada impacts southern states’ energy policies and how they’ve improved their GreenTech Economy by becoming better partners with the First American Tribes. It was a great presentation.

Our crew packed 100,000 boxes with meals for the City Rescue Mission and raised \$2,500 for them and \$1,500 for Community Outreach. It was such a joy getting to do this with my coworkers and one of my former pages, Oklahoma Christian Academy senior, Amanni Peterson.

I’m so glad that our fellow SLC members got to enjoy and learn so much about our wonderful state and capital city. We discussed some great policy ideas and I’m anxious to see which ones will be presented next session.



Chickasaw White House maintains legacy of tribal and cultural preservation

The stately Chickasaw White House near Emet, Okla., remains preserved today much as it was when constructed in 1895.

The preservation of this cultural treasure stands as a testament to the man who had it built and whose actions helped to preserve and define important aspects of Chickasaw culture: Chickasaw Nation Governor Douglas H. Johnston.

The work Johnston did while his family resided at the Chickasaw White House from 1898-1939 was instrumental in preserving Chickasaw Nation self-governance and Chickasaw cultural identity, and in shaping the political landscape of early Oklahoma.

Its classic beauty has withstood the test of time. Once referred to as a “mansion on the frontier,” the large Queen Anne Victorian-style home was built by Governor Johnston using his personal funds.

The gingerbread-style house features ornate latticework on the wraparound veranda, mahogany mantels, two large, ornate fireplaces and expansive ceilings in the interior rooms.

Throughout Governor Johnston’s 36 years leading the Chickasaw Nation, the Chickasaw White House served as his home and a place to conduct business.

He communicated directly with United States President Theodore Roosevelt to ensure nearly 4,000 fraudulent applicants to the Dawes Commission did not receive Chickasaw citizenship and assets.

Educated at the Chickasaw Academy and Bloomfield

Academy, Governor Johnston understood the value of education and worked to make certain the Chickasaw Nation would be able to control its own schools.

According to the National Register of Historic Places, the parlor was the most important room in the Chickasaw White House. Governor Johnston signed many historical docu-

served as backdrop for several noteworthy events, including the wedding of Oklahoma Governor William E. “Alfalfa Bill” Murray to Alice Hearrell, Governor Johnston’s niece.

Johnston Murray, their son, was born in the house and would go on to serve as Governor of Oklahoma like his father. Julia Chisholm, Jesse Chisholm’s grand-daughter and Governor Johnston’s adopted niece, was also married there.

The Chickasaw White House was placed on the National Register of Historic Places for its architectural value,

time period furniture and historic value to the politics within the Chickasaw Nation.

Working with living Johnston family members and the Oklahoma Historical Society, the Chickasaw Nation acquired the Chickasaw White House in 1998, exactly 100 years after Governor Johnston first moved into the home.

The Chickasaw Nation began the restoration of the home as soon as it was purchased. The home was completely renovated.

Original materials were restored when possible, while pieces of the house that needed replacement were painstakingly crafted by contemporary artisans.

The restoration process took more than five years to complete. Now, the grounds surrounding the Chickasaw White House are continually improved, while furnishings are cleaned and restored when needed.

ments on the oak table still located there.

These papers ranged from allotment divisions for individual Chickasaw citizens, matters of state concerning federal and state authorities, and negotiations between other First American tribes in Oklahoma.

Much of the furniture on display at the Chickasaw White House belonged to the Johnston family, along with some replicas of furniture from the period.

Governor Johnston’s granddaughter took a complete inventory and logged the original furnishings within the home. She shared the history of each piece with the Oklahoma Historical Society, which the family had entrusted the property to for posterity in the early 1970s.

Except for modern conveniences, such as air conditioning and modern plumbing, the property is almost exactly as when it was first built.

Design a bird-friendly landscape

Temperature extremes, drought and storms take a toll on our landscapes.

Sometimes a bit of pruning, proper care and patience is all that is needed to help plants recover. Other times, plants need replacing.

It is always sad to lose a favorite plant. The memories, time and money invested are lost, but it presents an opportunity to grow something new.

Consider creating a bird-friendly landscape when selecting replacements for failing and dead plants. Working with nature is a great way to support birds without the use of feeders.

Look for seed, berry and nectar producing plants that attract songbirds. You will enjoy the color and motion these birds add to your landscape. Plus, 96 percent of terrestrial North American birds feed upon insects, helping you manage garden pests.

Plant bird-friendly flowers, shrubs, and trees in clusters whenever possible. This creates an impressive display in the landscape and allows birds to gather food more efficiently and waste less energy traveling between plants.

Select a variety of plants to ensure both seasonal and year-round birds have plenty of food. Include a mixture of plants that provide seeds, berries, or nectar from spring through fall. These plants are nature’s birdfeeders, eliminating the need to clean and fill traditional feeders.

Include native trees, shrubs, and flowers whenever they are suited to the growing conditions in your yard. Native plants, birds and insects have co-evolved over time, making them a great source of food and

shelter for native birds. Audubon’s Native Plant Database provides lists of plants suited to your location.

Consider plants with year-round appeal. Evergreens provide screening and a backdrop for other plants and shelter for the birds. Junipers come in a variety of sizes and shapes and tolerate hot dry conditions once established.

Choose hemlocks for those shadier locations. They require moist well-drained soil and shelter from winter wind and sun.

Deciduous trees and shrubs – those that lose their leaves in winter – can provide multiple seasons of beauty with flowers, fruit, fall color and interesting bark. Many of these also provide shelter and food for songbirds.

Serviceberries have multiple seasons of beauty and produce edible fruit you and the birds will enjoy in June. Dogwoods, including red twig and pagoda, have flowers for pollinators and late summer fruit for the songbirds.

Winterberry is an excellent source of winter food. You will need at least one male for every one to five female plants for pollination and fruit to form. Grow these in full sun to light shade and moist acidic soil.

Reduce the risk of injury and the inconvenience of accidentally knocking out power, cable or other utilities while making bird-friendly additions to the landscape.

They will contact all the appropriate companies who will mark the location of their underground utilities in the designated work area.

August 11 has been declared 811 Day to remind everyone to call 811 prior to any digging project.

Your efforts now to welcome birds into your landscape are sure to provide much beauty and enjoyment for years to come.

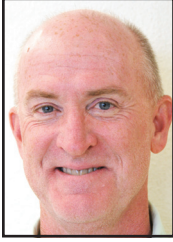

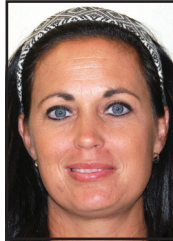

Board:

the board extended Jeff Fink’s contract by five days.

The days of the universal free lunch are gone and the board approved the following meal costs—breakfast for all grade levels will be \$1.90 and lunches will be \$3.10 at the elementary and intermediate schools and \$3.35 at the junior high and high schools. Adults will pay \$2.30 for breakfast, \$4.85 for lunch and \$1.10 for a snack.

New salary schedules for the 2022-23 school year were also approved.

The salary scale for teachers ranges from \$38,752 for someone with a bachelor’s degree and no experience to \$41,581 for a new teacher with a doctorate.

There are step increases for years of experience, maxing out at \$54,583 for a teacher with a bachelor’s degree and 30 years experience, compared to \$59,003 for the same experience but a doctorate.

Salary schedules for teacher assistants, custodians, bus drivers, secretaries, and transportation/maintenance employees were also approved.

Board members were told that teachers ratified the district’s contract with the Purcell Association of Classroom Teachers during their in-service on Monday.

Certified special education teachers will receive a \$1,000 retention stipend, the board decided.

In other business, the board approved Purcell FFA’s participation in shooting sports and a shooting competition during the Oklahoma Youth Expo.

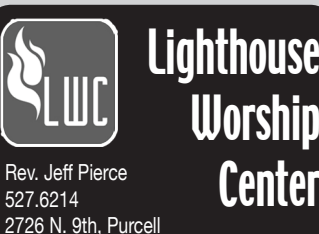

August 14, 2022 is the twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time, the Gospel focuses on the teachings and miracles of Christ during his time on earth.

The Gospel reading this week is from Luke 12:49-53. Jesus tells his disciples that he did not come to establish peace on the earth. In fact, he will cause division even among family members.

What does this mean? Minds much superior to mine haven't completely figured it out. Here are my thoughts. Jesus taught us that we are to follow him.

Often that will mean that we are not in agreement with others.

For example, Christians should easily realize that they should not lie, cheat, steal, or kill. But not everything is black or white only. If one person wants dinner at 5 and the other wants it at 6, a compromise of 5:30 is certainly not a moral misstep. But if a person has no problem stocking a home office with supplies from work, clearly they are compromising their principles.

When some family members become Christians and others refuse to accept them, that is

when Jesus causes division.

Here are a few quotes about principles and compromise.

"All compromise is based on give and take, but there can be no give and take on fundamentals. Any compromise on mere fundamentals is a surrender. For it is all give and no take." Mahatma Gandhi

"When you have to start compromising yourself or your morals for the people around you, it's probably time to change the people around you."

Every now and then I run across a life-changing lesson. That happened a few years ago when a friend named Toni Short handed me a book so thin you could almost see through it. It's called *Balcony People* by Joyce Heatherley.

In the book Ms. Joyce tells of a speech she once heard about the mind. The mind, she says, is divided into three parts: the bottom two sections consist of the unconscious, and the top section is the conscious. I didn't know my mind was of such size it needed multi-levels, but I was glad to hear it.

She goes on to point out that the very bottom of the unconscious mind, the basement, is where we store some of the bad things. It's filled with dark and murky water. There you'll find the "basement people" of your life, those who have long

slung darts down into the dark recesses of your mind. You can hear them now, "Nah, you won't ever amount to anything."

But, if it's all the same to you, we'll not stroll down to that part of the mind today. You don't want to legitimize those mean ol' folks. Let's keep our eye on the prize, my friend.

Where we want to go is to the upper deck of our unconscious minds. That's where we store the most positive thoughts. I liked that thought and began to explore it more. I have come to find that if you want to get up to that section of your brain, you'd better start early. It's a good little ways up to the grandstands where those people sit and cheer.

Sometimes you'll find them way up in the nose-bleed section, maybe as high up as my daughter Rachel and I once sat

watching an Astros game—up by the steel beams. But that's all right. The people we're talking about don't mind sitting up as high as they need to, just as long as they get to cheer you on.

When you look up and see those blessed friends, you're looking at what Ms. Joyce calls your balcony people. They are pretty special people, and your mind is sure glad they are there. They yell a lot louder than the basement people, too.

You know these balcony people: They are the ones in the bleachers with an umbrella in freezing rain, hollering, "Good job!" and "I told ya you could do it!" They are the powerful positive influences in your life. They are the ones who always believe in you, no matter what.

I know all of us are tired of hearing health advice. However, with COVID-19 remaining active, masks are still advised for those who have serious medical conditions. In the manner of viruses, there is a new variant Omicron that is a bit more virulent, and we may want to continue to take precautions. We have masks and hand sanitizer available.

Please share our prayers for Pastor David Cook. He lost his wife and life partner July 26. She had battled various health issues for at least the last five years or so. Finally, God called her to Heaven ahead of us to give her soul relief from the cares of earthly life. We know she will greet David, their family, and us all when it is our time to be with the other heavenly members of the family of God.

My heart has been hurting over some current situations. There have been four Muslim men killed in New Mexico the past couple of weeks. We know that others have been attacked at other times because they may be Jewish or of a different race. I'm not sure I have the right words to describe what I've felt, but my innermost being tells me that this type of per-

secution is wrong, especially if I claim to be Christian.

In the culture of the Bible we follow, hospitality to others is required. This is a "rule" even today. A number of years ago, a pastor friend (Ron) and his wife went to Egypt. They had a wonderful visit, but what made one of the most loving memories for them was meeting a family there who showed the hospitality of their culture.

In sightseeing there, Ron and his wife Alice met this Egyptian man (let's call him Mohammed) who invited them to his home to share a meal. Ron and Alice didn't know anyone in Egypt before their visit. I don't remember all the details, but I think Ron and Mohammed spoke only Hebrew in their verbal communication.

The important part was that this Egyptian Muslim man invited a Christian American family into his home after meeting them for only one time. They shared a meal and information about their lives in the spirit of welcoming, providing a common meal and the protection of the home of a one-time stranger.

The story of the Good Samaritan tells us that our neighbor isn't the one who lives next door. Our neighbor doesn't have to speak the same language, or look like us, or even have the same religion as we

do. Our neighbor is any human being we meet. Our neighbor is anyone in need, whether it be a need for food, water, or even kindness and respect.

It is our duty to protect all of the people who we meet, regardless of their race, religion, or nationality (or any other artificial division we can make). That doesn't mean we can't protect ourselves, but if we're doing the right big things, we can work around the small things. God's love applies to all humanity. We should probably remind ourselves to include all earthly creatures in God's realm of love.

As I began this essay, I stated that I wasn't sure I had the words to express how I'm feeling. Maybe the best way to say it is this. God offers grace to all of us earthlings. It is up to us to accept it as individuals. Let us make sure that we pay that grace forward to others.

TSET releases updated grant criteria for schools, communities

The Tobacco Settlement Endowment Trust (TSET) released updated criteria for its Healthy Incentive Grants, which are available to schools and communities across the state.

The agency aims to streamline the application process and minimize the time and resource burden for applicants.

"With feedback from previous grantees, we've revamped the criteria with a consideration for applicant time and resources," said Laura Matlock, TSET program officer. "We encourage schools and communities to check out the updated criteria, new application and look for ways to partner with TSET to bring resources to promote health to their schools and communities."

TSET Healthy Incentive Grants promote wellness by offering grants to school districts, school sites and local communities that adopt health-promoting policies

and strategies. The grants are designed to encourage healthy eating, physical activity and tobacco-free lifestyles.

Awardees can use the funds on projects that support healthy schools and communities. Previous awards have increased opportunities for physical activity and healthy choices by helping build city parks, basketball courts, walking trails and purchase playground equipment and hydration stations.

"TSET incentive grants are a way for us to support schools and cities working hard to make healthy choices available and easy for all," said Julie Bisbee, Executive Director of TSET. "Incentive grants help local communities and schools add amenities, improve access and support improved health behaviors. Through these grants, TSET partners with local decision makers to break down barriers to safe physical activity and healthy choices." The application period for

schools will open in September and January. Applications for communities will be accepted in November and March.

Grant dollars are limited and awarded on a first come, first serve basis. In previous funding cycles, demand for incentive grants have exceeded available funds.

To be eligible, applicants must pass and implement approved policies to promote clean air, access to healthy and nutritious foods and physical activity. Documentation of having met each criterion is required.

To date, TSET has awarded over \$7.7 million in incentive grants since 2012.

Washington Board of Education Spectator Code of Conduct Athletics Program

The following code of conduct for spectators should serve as a model for sports fans at all school-sponsored athletic events:

Believing that sportsman-ship is a by-product of a spirit of tolerance and good will and the centering of attention on the good qualities involved, and

Believing that my conduct is an important part of the school's athletic program,

I pledge to act in accordance with these principles.

As an athletic spectator, I will:

1. Exemplify the highest moral character, behavior, and leadership so as to be a worthy example.

2. Maintain and exhibit poise, self-discipline during and after the contest.

3. Conduct myself in such a manner that attention is drawn not to me, but to the participants playing the game.

4. Regulate my actions at all times so that I will be a credit to the team I support, knowing the school gets the

praise or blame for my conduct since I represent the school the same as does the athlete.

5. Support all reasonable moves to improve good sportsman-ship.

6. Treat a visiting team and spectators as guests, being courteous and fair.

7. Avoid actions that will offend the individual athlete.

8. Accept the judgment of the coach.

9. Honor the rights of visitors in a manner in which I would expect to be treated.

10. Respect the property of the school.

11. Display good sportsman-ship by being modest in victory and gracious in defeat.

12. Pay respect to both teams as they enter for competition.

13. Appreciate the good plays by both teams.

14. Show sympathy for an injured player.

15. Regard the officials as guests and treat them as such.

16. Direct my energies to encouraging my team rather than booing the officials.

17. Believe that the officials are fair and accept their decisions as final.

18. Learn the rules of the game in order to be a more intelligent fan.

19. Consider it a privilege and duty to encourage everyone to live up to the spirit of the rules of fair play and sportsmanship.

20. Realize that privileges are invariably associated with great responsibilities and that spectators have great responsibilities.

21. Realize that obscene cheers, littering, throwing of

One of the trends we have been seeing for the last couple of years is the increased number of surviving spouses who are applying for DIC benefits. Many of the veterans who we have lost have died from COVID and complications of their other health issues.

For a surviving spouse of a disabled veteran to receive DIC benefits, the veteran's service-connected disability must be listed as a contributing condition or the primary cause of death or the vet must be rated at 100 percent for the last eight years of their life.

Sometimes the physician who signed the Death Certificate will request that the Oklahoma State Health Department provide an Amended Death Certificate showing that their service-connected disabilities contributed or caused their death. One of the things we tell our veterans with dependents are to make sure their families are aware of what disabilities are service connected.

Our volunteers are continuing to help many veterans and their families each week. I would certainly like to see more veterans and spouses join our team of dedicated volunteers. Twenty plus years ago when we started our mission to change the lives of veterans and their families, I never

anticipated that the need would be so great. As we continue to grow, I'm sure that others will step in to be a part of what we do.

Last week, eleven veterans were rated at 100 percent for their service-connected disabilities. Forty-eight veterans received disability ratings from 10-90 percent.

As always, we need more volunteers to assist us in improving the lives of our veterans and their families. We have hundreds of thousands of veterans and surviving spouses in our state who need our help to receive the VA benefits that they are eligible for.

Would u consider being a part of our Veterans Foundation? Volunteer applications are available on our website or stop in Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. until 12 p.m. at 1233 West Lindsay Street in Norman.
