Democrat ballot. That is for the U.S. Senate and the candidates are Jason Bollinger and Madison Horn.


Voters who are registered as Independents may also vote on the Democrat ballot.

When Marvin Fields graduated from Purcell High School in 1990, it seemed his future was set. He would follow the footsteps of his parents, Patsy and Alex Fields, the only one of five children to do so.

Then around 1997, he accepted a part-time custodial job with Purcell Public Schools to supplement his barbering income.

His first assignment was Purcell Elementary School where his father worked for 10 years.

After a few years working for the school part-time, Marvin hung up his clippers and went full-time.

No longer actively barbering, he keeps his barber's license current.

On Friday his quartercentury - half a lifetime for the 50-year-old - service to Purcell Public Schools will end.

Marvin is retiring and already missing the people and the memories he will leave behind.

"I have worked at all of the buildings," he said.

5 and 7 p.m.


On September 7, baked goods and fresh flowers will be accepted from 8 to 9 a.m. and building exhibits will be judged starting at 10 a.m.

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

Election day tips for Tuesday

Important reminders for voters

Board Secretary Karen Haley offers these important tips to voters—especially those who will be casting a ballot for the first time.

• Mark your ballot using the example posted at your polling place and inside your ballot booth. If you make a mistake, do not try to correct it. Instead, take your ballot to the precinct officials. They will destroy the ballot and issue a new one.

• You do not need to make a selection for each issue on the ballot in order for your ballot to be counted. The voting device will count votes only for those issues which you have marked.

Voting activity is generally slowest during the midmorning and mid-afternoon, but the Election Board says lines and wait times can vary from precinct to precinct. All voters who want to cast a ballot should be in line no later than 7 p.m.

"Anyone who is in line by 7 p.m. on Tuesday and eligible to vote, will be allowed to vote," she said.

MEET OUR OFFICERS



Capt. Jeff Hixon

How long have you been in law enforcement? I have been in law enforcement for almost 14 years. I started my career on August 18, 2008 working for the Cleveland County Sheriff's Office. I started in the Detention Center, working as a Detention Officer. I worked my way through the ranks, at 19 I was promoted to Corporal, and by 211 was promoted to sergeant. In February 2012, I became a commissioned Deputy and was reassigned to the judicial services division. I then completed C.L.E.E.T. in Ada and graduated August 8. 2012, September 2012, I was reassigned to the Patrol division, I worked as a Patrol Deputy for five years. In September of 2017 I was promoted to Patrol Lieutenant. I was a Patrol Lieutenant until 2020 and was reassigned to be over two divisions as a Lieutenant. I was over the judicial services and the transport division. decided on a career change and applied at the Purcell Police Department. On July 1, 2020 I was hired to be a commissioned officer for the Purcell Police Department. July 1, 2022 I was promoted to Patrol Captain. What made you interested in becoming a policeman? I originally was a detention officer at the Cleveland

County Jail when I was 18 years old, shortly after graduating high school. I got to know a lot of the Deputies, Officers and Troopers and heard about their experiences. The job sounded so exciting and rewarding. From a young age I always had the desire to help people and after hearing their stories I knew this was the career for me.

Where is your home town? I was born in Denver, Colorado. I grew up moving a lot because I was a military brat. In 2005 we moved to Noble and I fell in love with the town and now claim Oklahoma as my home

Family? I'm married to my beautiful wife, Hannah M. Hixon. We have two sons, Stetson John Hixon 2 1/2 and Beau Michael Hixon 1 1/2. Both of our boys middle names are our father and grandfathers first name. We have three dogs and two horses. We have a large family that lives in Oklahoma around us.

What is the most rewarding part of your job? The most rewarding part of the job is being able to truly help a person in need. In 2016 I worked a very traumatic domestic violence case. Another officer and I were able to catch and arrest the subject. In 2018 we went to trial to testify on the victim's behalf. We learned she was able to move away, remarry and live a happy life in a non-abusive relationship. Knowing we made a small difference is one example I have of my short career to explain how rewarding and important this job is.

What is the most challenging part of your job? The most challenging part of this career to me is sometimes we can only be reactive to crimes. A lot of our most violent calls we are called after the chaos has started and can only fix so much. I feel most officers are problem solvers and we want to fix everything but when we respond to these very tough calls we only can start the healing process for the victims. The unknown of, "did I really help them," can eat at you. You just hope you really made a difference



Voters in McClain County are reminded to keep the integrity of the election system in mind, when going to the polls on Tuesday.

While ballot "selfies" or taking photographs of a marked ballot are legal, voters may not share or distribute the image through social media or by any other means while inside the election enclosure.

Voters must wait until they leave their polling place before posting or sharing the picture with anyone.

Improper use of the photo could result in a violation of the law. Voters may not use the image to coerce, influence, or intimidate another voter.

McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley says voters should be aware that violating the law has consequences.

"While some offenses may seem minor, unlawful activity on election day constitutes a serious crime and could result in a misdemeanor or in some cases, a felony conviction," she said. "We want all voters to be aware of their actions and be respectful of the rights of others."

In addition to disclosing how you voted while inside the election enclosure, voters may not remove a ballot from the polling place.

Also, electioneering is prohibited within 300 feet of any ballot box while an election is in progress. This includes wearing or bringing visible campaign







Questionable option

Dear Editor:

I read with interest the "Only Viable Option" article by Gary Ridley in the August 11 edition of The Purcell Register. Prior to moving to our ranch in East Lexington we lived in Slaughterville. I was privileged to serve as Mayor for two terms and in that capacity, I represented the town in The Association of Central Oklahoma Governments (ACOG). I was honored to serve as Chairman of the ACOG Board for two terms. It was in that capacity that I attended several presentations by Mr. Ridley.

While I totally agree with Mr. Ridley regarding the traffic problems on I-35 and I-40, I disagree with his assertion that the proposed East Norman turnpike extension is "the only viable option." The congestion problems on I-35 south are primarily due to the commuters heading to Oklahoma City for work, education, and other early morning appointments and returning home.

South Oklahoma City, Moore, Noble and Norman have experienced rapid growth, and I-35 is their primary route. It is simply hard for me to understand how the proposed turnpike that exits I-40 East of the metropolitan area and connects to I-35 north of Purcell will relieve any of the commuter traffic.

My main concern is that the turnpike will connect with the proposed Newcastle extension and proceed south through east Norman and Slaughterville. I have seen estimates that approximately 600 homes could be affected.

East Norman, East Noble and Slaughterville are primarily rural and contain many agricultural properties. The area is a large wildlife habitat as well as location of Oklahoma's only Rose Rocks, and an important part of the Lake Thunderbird water shed, Norman's primary source of water. There is also a possibility that "Wildcare," Oklahoma's premier wildlife rescue and rehabilitation facility will close.

So far it appears that the Oklahoma Turnpike Authority has brushed all these major concerns aside with "we will work with those affected" answers. In view of the severe impacts of the extension south from the proposed Newcastle Turnpike to I-35 north of Purcell and what little relief it will offer commuters,



Postal positions Maysville gets new postmistress


Maysville gained a new postmistress on Saturday when Marla Moates' appointment became effective.



Harvest, store and preserve herbs from the garden

Keep enjoying your homegrown herbs all year round. Harvest throughout the growing season and include them in garden-fresh meals. Then preserve a few for the winter ahead.

Snip a few leaves or leafcovered stems as needed. For the same intensity of flavor, you generally need two to three times more fresh herbs than dried except for Rosemary which has an equally strong flavor fresh or dried. So, if the recipe calls for one teaspoon of dried parsley use one tablespoon (3 teaspoons) of fresh parsley leaves.

Continue harvesting herbs as

season. And don't worry about harming the plant because regular harvesting encourages new growth which means more for you to harvest.

You can remove as much as 50 percent of the leaves from established annual herb plants. This is about when the plants near their final height. You can remove up to one third from established perennial plants that have been in the garden for several months or more.

Use a pair of garden scissors or bypass pruners for faster and easier harvesting. Make your cuts above a set of healthy leaves to keep the Just be sure to leave enough plants looking good. Then, preserve the flavor and zest of herbs with proper storage and preservation.

Store thin leafy herbs like parsley and cilantro for up to a week in the refrigerator. Place the stems in a jar of water, like a flower arrangement, and loosely cover with a plastic bag. Keep basil out of the fridge to avoid discoloration and others on the counter for quick and frequent use.

George was a huge supporter of his community in all aspects. He retired from the Rotary Club with 42 years of perfect attendance, even in his travels to Brazil with Joyce, he managed to find a Rotary to attend.

He served as president of both the Lindsay and Purcell Rotary Clubs, and was honored to be a Paul Harris Fellow.

He was President of the Purcell Chamber Of Commerce as well. George was a faithful member of the First Baptist Church of Purcell for 30+ years. It is the start of a new school year here in Purcell. The schools that were empty during summer vacation are now filled with children and teachers. Some may have already noticed there have been changes made to help improve traffic flow throughout the elementary and intermediate school zones with the intent to make the area safer for everyone.

In front of Purcell Elementary, at 711 N. 9th Avenue, construction has been completed during the summer to improve the visibility of the proper flow of traffic within the school zone.

On N. 9th Avenue, starting at W. Harris Street the roadway has been changed to be a One-Way Road traveling southbound until W. Van Buren Street. When the driver reaches W. Van Buren Street and they are in the inside lane, they must turn east onto W. Van Buren Street. They do not have a stop sign at this intersection. If the driver is in the outside lane, they must continue southbound on N. 9th Avenue.

South of W. Van Buren Street on N. 9th Avenue the roadway turns into a two-way undivided roadway. When you continue southbound you will reach a stop sign at W. Jackson Street and be able to turn either westbound or eastbound.

If you are traveling northbound on N. 9th Avenue from W. Jackson Street towards W. Van Buren Street, you will have a stop sign. At the stop sign, you will be directed to turn eastbound onto W. Van Buren Street.

Also, W. Harrison Street and W. Van Buren Street in between N. 8th Avenue and N. 9th Avenue are both One-Way Roads traveling eastbound. The intersection at N. 8th Avenue and W. Harrison Street is a three-way stop. The traffic traveling eastbound does not have a stop sign.

The intersection at N. 8th Avenue and W. Van Buren Street is a three-way stop. The traffic traveling eastbound does not have a stop sign. These new changes will be in effect at all times of the day not just during school hours.

In the Purcell High School/Middle School zones at the 2000 block of N. Green Avenue, the speed limit will be 35 miles per hour. The traffic signs lights will be flashing Monday through Friday 7:40 a.m. -3:45 p.m. When kids are arriving, going to lunch, or leaving school, drivers should maintain a higher level of awareness of their surroundings. Please remember kids will also be walking across the roadway during these times.

Throughout the city, you will notice school buses picking up and dropping off kids. Remember when these buses are stopped and have their stop signs out you are not allowed to drive past these buses in either direction. You are to stop, wait for the children to get on or off the bus safely, and when the bus stop sign returns flush with their vehicle it is safe and okay to continue driving as normal.

Purcell Police Officers will be patrolling periodically throughout their shifts in both school zones to ensure that traffic laws are being followed to maintain the safety of everyone within the area.

The 2022 Purcell Carp Classic will be held on Sunday, September 25, at Purcell Lake.

Purcell Lake has a large carp population, which are notorious for altering natural ecosystems. They uproot and disturb submerged vegetation while searching for insect larvae to eat. Carp reduces water clarity and stir up bottom phosphorus-containing sediments, which contributes to algae blooms.

The City of Purcell Parks and Recreation Department is partnering with Oklahoma Fly Fishing to organize and promote the tournament. Participants are to catch as many carp as they can, while returning other species of fish, such as bass, crappie, and catfish, back to the water. This helps to control carp numbers and let wild habitats in the lake regenerate.

The entry is \$10 per participant. Anglers compete in two divisions: Fly Fishing and Traditional Rod and Reel. They are to meet for a pre-tournament meeting at the Chandler Pavilion starting at 8:30 a.m. Fishing begins at 9 a.m. and will go until 3 p.m. Anglers must have their fish back to the Chandler Pavilion by 3:30 p.m. for the fish count.

Prizes are awarded by the total number of carp caught. Funds collected go towards prizes and to help pay for the construction of plant cages to protect new aquatic plants from hungry carp.





Now is the time to begin planning for your fall garden

still in the heat of the summer, gardening enthusiasts need to be planning for their fall garden crops. Some of the best quality garden vegetables are produced and harvested during the fall season when warm, sunny days are followed by cool, humid nights.

Under these climatic conditions, plant metabolism is low; therefore, more of the food manufactured by the plant becomes a high-quality vegetable product.

in the fall, gardeners need to start getting ready now.

As with any garden, adequate soil preparation, available garden space, selected plantings, space for plantings and obtaining the quantity and varieties of seed must be taken into consideration.

Some crops are more easily grown when seeds are planted early, then transplanting the seedlings to the garden at a later time.



We are continuing to average from 10 to 15 veterans each week who are receiving a 100 percent rating for their serviceconnected disabilities. The average number of veterans who receive disability ratings from 10-90 percent is approximately 50 each week.

As many of you know our Oklahoma Legislature approved several tax benefits in 2005 for veterans who were receiving 100 percent disability benefits from the VA. One of these tax benefits is no property tax on their primary residence. Some veterans rated at 100 percent disabled by the VA receive the same benefit in their home states.

Another Oklahoma State Tax benefit for veterans receiving 100 percent disability benefits is the exemption of sales tax. I don't know if any other states offer any exemption of the sales tax. Personally, I believe veterans and their families are more appreciated for their military service in some states than in others.

If you or any veteran you know is struggling with unemployment and could use access to vocational training, job matching, mentorship, or transportation assistance, the Volunteers of America: Veterans Employment Services program might be a good resource.
