## Dibble bond PASSES

To build new high school

Voters in the Dibble School District gave superintendent Chad Clanton the result he and the school board wanted when they went to the polls Tuesday.

By a 61.17 percent super majority, the voters approved a \$15.45 million bond issue to finance the first phase of constructing a new high school.

The unofficial vote total was 271 in favor of the bond to 172 against.

"We are grateful that our

community continues to support our school," Clanton said. "Considering our current growth and anticipated future growth, these facility improvements are greatly needed."

The district plans to demolish the old elementary school and weight room to make room for the high school construction. Also, the bonds will pay for new athletic lights.

Well, McClain County has at least one. Meet Undersheriff James Goins.

James is from Dibble and pretty much has lived and worked in McClain County his whole life.

With an overwhelming interest in helping people, James set his young eyes on law enforcement and never blinked in the intervening years.

In 1989, he became a volunteer firefighter at Dibble.

His first foray into law enforcement followed in 1992 when he landed his first law enforcement job as a reserve officer in Wayne.

He transitioned to full time in 1994.

Five years later he became Wayne's police chief.

Then in 1999, he joined the McClain County Sheriff's Department as a deputy. Don Hewett was sheriff then.

In 2005, James left the sheriff's department to become a patrolman – and eventual chief – at the Dibble Police Department.

From 2009 until December 2015, he worked at a juvenile mental health facility in Norman.

Then Hewett needed him again and on Jan. 1, 2016, James returned to the sheriff's office.

He began working his way up through the ranks until taking his present position of undersheriff.

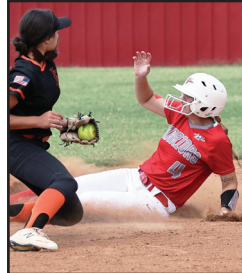
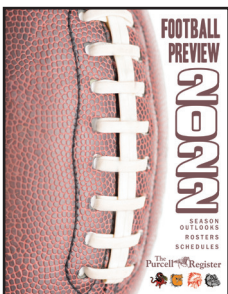
He's been patrol sergeant and lieutenant over patrol.

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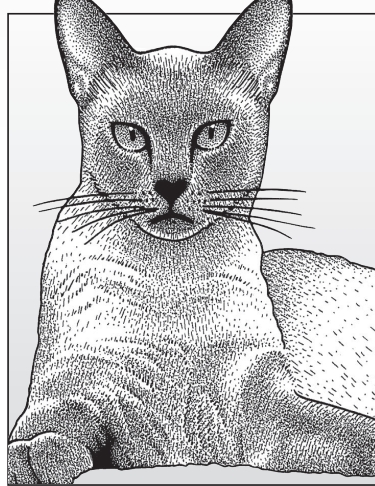

## Educators speak of safety

When area school administrators spoke to the Heart of Oklahoma Chamber of Commerce at last Friday’s monthly luncheon there was one reoccurring theme.

Safety. Superintendents Dr. Sheli McAdoo, Chad Hall, Chris Reynolds and Mike Eubank all spoke about their respective schools while new Wayne High School Principal Malachi Blaxton pinch hit for Toby Ringwald, who had a previously scheduled meeting in Oklahoma City.

Each speaker touched on the state of their districts and all of them spoke of safety measures in place with the Uvalde, TX shooting still fresh in everyone’s mind.

All of the educators said they have been implementing safety measures for years including a sheriff deputy on site at Washington.

Purcell School Buildings are all locked with visitors having to be buzzed in.

Same is true for three buildings in the Lexington District. And ditto for Wayne where all buildings are locked with a fob system.

With the hundreds of new homes either under construction or planned in the Washington School District, Reynolds reports his district will grow by about 100 additional students by December.

He predicts the Washington enrollment will double in the next five to 10 years.

The ever-increasing numbers of students presents building and classroom spacing problems in that district.

He expects another bond issue will be necessary when the current building projects are completed.

## Update from the Capitol

I love this time of year. It’s like hitting the reset button and starting a fresh, new chapter. The kids are off to school, the weather is thinking about cooling down, and work is picking up at the Capitol as we begin looking toward next year’s session.

Interim studies will be getting underway in the coming weeks. Two of my studies will be heard in the Senate Health and Human Services Committee, which will be holding their meetings on September 19 and October 12, and my studies will take place at the October meeting.

Again, my studies will look at using Adverse Childhood Experiences (ACE) screening results to assist in preventative treatment and providing better substance abuse options for our state’s youth.

If you have experience or expertise in either of these areas, please contact me as I’m looking for presenters to help educate the committee. You can also just call or email my office if you’d like to share any ideas on how to address these two important issues.

Anyone is welcome to attend these public meetings or watch them live on the Senate website at <https://oksenate.gov/publications/senate-interim-studies>. A schedule with times and committee room numbers will be posted soon.

### Unanswered questions on Afghanistan

One year ago this month, our nation witnessed one of the worst foreign policy failures of any presidential administration when President Joe Biden decided to withdraw all remaining U.S. troops out of Afghanistan.

The aftermath of that decision in the days and weeks that followed was nothing short of disastrous, and the devastation and consequences of this failure remain.

Unfortunately, the Biden Administration has still left many questions surrounding this decision unanswered, a true disservice to the American people.

This debacle certainly calls for vigorous oversight. It is frankly stunning how little the press or even the Democrat-controlled Congress have dug into why the Administration made such decisions then. In fact, one year later, there are more unanswered questions than answers.

We still do not know why the Biden Administration was compelled by the Taliban deadline, why President Biden chose a total withdrawal over a partial withdrawal and what consultation was made with

military officials and experts familiar with the country.

We also are still unsure why troops were taken out before civilians or what steps were taken beforehand, if any, to help Americans get out of this dangerous situation safely – or whether they even took steps to identify and locate U.S. citizens in the country in advance.

We know that billions of dollars worth of sensitive U.S.-supplied military equipment, vehicles and weapons given to the Afghan government were hastily abandoned and fell into possession of the Taliban and other bad actors.

Moreover, we still do not understand why the decision was made to abandon Bagram Air Force Base – our most significant base in the area for deterring Taliban incursions and a forward position for staging critical assets and providing training to Afghans.

We know anecdotally that our European allies were caught off guard and surprised by this withdrawal, which begs the question of if consultation with our allies took place before the Biden Administration made this decision.

The consequences of this reckless and hasty retreat

undoubtedly emboldened our adversaries. The Biden Administration projected weakness on the international stage, and other countries that are not friends of ours took advantage.

First, we saw Russian President Vladimir Putin’s unjust invasion of Ukraine earlier this year. Meanwhile, China continues to become increasingly more aggressive in the Taiwan Strait and even threatened U.S. officials while they were traveling to Taiwan.

President Biden’s response is still denial of what occurred last August. In fact, he continues to deny congressional requests for information and has not been forthright with the American people.

And although unprecedented peace was reached just a few years ago in the Middle East, this botched withdrawal ultimately caused a reemergence of the Taliban in Afghanistan and opened the door for al Qaeda reentry.

For several weeks, Americans watched in horror as several hundreds of U.S. civilians and our allies were left stranded and unsafe in the hands of an

### Help the committee

**Dear Editor:**  
We, the Lexington Storm Shelter Committee, have recently formed to bring a positive change to our community.

Our goal is to work with the City of Lexington and Lexington Public Schools to open a storm shelter location within our community. Through our working with the City of Lexington, via passed ordinances, we were allowed to form our committee and partner with the Lexington Fire Department to collaborate a storm shelter operation guideline. The shelter would be available when school is not in session, providing students absolute priority during school operations. We are currently meeting with Lexington Schools to form a partnership.

We recognize other cities may not have public shelters. Cities like Oklahoma City cannot accommodate the massive population or infrastructure challenges to properly operate a community shelter. However, smaller communities can. Neighboring communities like Elmore City, Maysville, Paoli, Stratford, Lindsay and Wynnewood are just examples. At one time, Lexington had two.

A new shelter was built in 2008 in the new high school but due to circumstances the new shelter was no longer available.

In 2021 a new Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant shelter was built behind the elementary school with passing of a bond. We believe this bond was passed in good will to provide protection to all. We want to join these communities in the protection of lives since not everyone has the ability to have a personal shelter. We want to be proactive and not learn hard lessons after the fact.

El Reno now has four public shelters after the May 31, 2013 outbreak. Joplin has begun the process of building shelters at all public schools. We have responded to local neighboring communities following a direct tornado hit and know of the heartbreak of people searching for loved ones in the dark.

Our partnership was formed to provide a known, reliable, safe place for our community to shelter from life-threatening storms. Lexington is located in the heart of tornado alley and has had near misses in town and direct hits in outlying areas.

A community shelter can fulfill a social responsibility to keep us and our neighbors safe. We have come to know this as the “Oklahoma Standard”. We believe having this facility will be a blessing to protect everyone needing safe refuge including the elderly and disabled. It’s an existing vital asset not currently being utilized. We are asking for your support in our effort. Contact your school board members and superintendant and ask them for their support in this matter. The next school board meeting will be at 6 p.m. September 12 in the middle school at 420 NE 4th Street.

## Work continues during interim

While the Legislature has been in interim since the regular session officially wrapped up in late May, House members are busy behind the scenes working to prepare for interim studies, special sessions and a special investigative committee.

The interim study I’m focusing on this year is one I’m cohosting with Sen. Jessica Garvin. Interim Study 22-047 will look at the factors that influence the quality of life for women in Oklahoma and examine what steps we can take to improve those outcomes.

The study has not yet been scheduled, but when it is, I’ll provide more details on who is expected to speak and when the study will take place.

I am also working to schedule four interim studies before the committee I chair, the House Public Health Committee. These studies focus on a wide variety of topics, from dental benefit plans, post-traumatic stress and the nursing shortage.

# Will less than two percent of Americans fix our financial problems?

According to the IRS, a \$400,000 or more annual household income represents America’s top 1.8 percent income-earners. Per IRS Publication 6292, there were 154 million tax returns filed in 2019, thus approximately 2.8 million people earn over \$400,000.

330 million people live in the United States. (2020 Census) Millions of illegals have and are coming so this number is on steroids.

69.1 million people received benefits from programs administered by the Social Security Administration (SSA) in 2019. 5.7 million people were newly awarded Social Security benefits in 2019. (SSA)

2.8 million people making over \$400,000 a year cannot solve the financial problems of America’s government. Telling Americans that we are going to stick it to the rich or 1.8 percent of our country to carry 70 million retirees and millions of illegals flooding into our country is just political rhetoric.

Most people aren’t doing great when it comes to saving for the future: A 2020 SSA study found that 40 percent of Americans rely on Social Security as their sole source of retirement income. The average annual Social Security benefit for a worker is nearly \$20,000, hardly enough money for most

retirees to subsist on. (CNBC)

The United States Department of Labor data shows that there were 113,062 pension plans in 1990, but only 46,869 in 2018. The average private pension in the United States today is about \$10,788, according to data from the Pension Rights Center. (Annuity.org) In 2023, the year in which the legislation will increase tax revenue most, individuals making less than \$10,000 per year will pay 3.1 percent more in taxes and those making between \$20,000-30,000 per year will see a 1.1 percent tax increase, the Joint Committee on Taxation (JCT) analysis showed.

Tax revenue collected from those making \$100,000 per year or less would increase by \$5.8 billion in 2023 under the Inflation Reduction Act.

In addition, the share of tax revenue collected from all Americans making more than \$200,000 per year would remain at the current percentage, according to the JCT. Taxpayers with an annual income of \$200,000 or greater pay more than 57 percent of all federal income taxes.

Will America’s seniors eventually pay more in taxes? Currently retirees may pay income tax on up to 85 percent of benefits if your combined income is more than \$34,000. Combined incomes between \$32,000 and \$44,000 may be

taxed up to 50 percent of the total, and above \$44,000 may be taxed up to 85 percent of the total. if you’re married and filing a joint return.

Do you think these numbers will go down? There is only one way that taxes have gone in America – up.

Our problems cannot be fixed by one small group of America’s people. We must have a flat tax for everyone making over \$50,000. We have to stop the influx of illegals.

We must be self-sufficient in energy and manufacturing. Many retirees who are physically able may have to go back to work to survive inflation.

In the meantime Government must help us by eliminating the billions of dollars wasted each year. Also, they need to stop trying to convince us that they are going to fix our problems by only going after 1.8 percent of the America people.

ies can be viewed at [okhouse.gov](http://okhouse.gov) by visiting the “Committees” section and clicking on “Interim Studies.” The first studies are scheduled for the last week of August.

While our regular legislative session has finished, the Legislature is expected to schedule our special session again in the coming months. We have two special sessions running concurrently, although neither is meeting right now.

The first special session was called by the Governor to approve tax relief for Oklahomans. This is a difficult economic time right now, and the House widely supported a slate of bills that would offer reductions on the personal income tax and the state grocery sales tax. However, after the House approved these bills in the special session, they stalled in the Senate, where they still remain. The Senate can take up those bills at any time.

Our other special session was called by the Legislature to address federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Funds that have not yet been distributed. We organized several committees and subcommittees to sort through the hundreds of proposals for these funds, and we’ll return to special session before early November to approve those.

Many House members are also members of a special investigative committee. In March, we learned that Swadley’s Bar-B-Q inflated prices for equipment for their restaurants, which had locations in six state parks, and

those additional costs were billed to the Tourism Dept.

In response, the House formed a Special Investigative Committee to scrutinize potential misuse of taxpayer money through vendor agreements in the Tourism Dept. Law enforcement will determine if laws were broken, but our job is determining if laws must change to prevent this in the future.

At the first meeting in May, the committee heard from director of the Legislative Office of Fiscal Transparency (LOFT) Mike Jackson, who said Oklahoma taxpayers could have been saved \$12.4 million if proper processes were followed when contracting with Swadley’s.

The Special Investigative Committee will continue to meet over the coming months to ensure the House overturns every stone. I am not a member of the committee, but I am following their findings very closely. Our citizens deserve and demand the highest level of transparency and accountability we can deliver.

## Back-to-school insurance tips

Summer is coming to an end, and the beginning of the new school year is around the corner. As the parent of two college students and one who recently graduated, I understand how exciting this time is for students and parents.

Whether you are a recent high school graduate going into college or a nervous parent getting ready for your child’s first day, it is important to review your insurance policies to make sure your entire family is properly covered.

During this busy time of year, I want to remind Oklahomans that having proper insurance can provide greater peace of mind all year long and protect their family from financial disaster. Here are some insurance tips parents and students should consider before heading to school.

**Home**

If your student is moving into a dorm room, your homeowners policy will likely cover their belongings in case of a loss. Ask your child to let you know if they buy a new computer or other pricey items. You’ll need to check with your insurance company to ensure your coverage will take care of these things.

Students living off-campus should consider renters insurance. This coverage will protect students’ belongings and protect them if someone is injured on the property.

Premiums for renters insurance range between \$15-\$30 a month, depending on the location and size of the rental unit and the value of the possessions. Whether they live on campus or off-campus, a home inventory is a good idea. The list of items will make a future insurance claim quicker and easier to settle.

**Auto**

Oklahoma requires every car to have auto liability coverage or otherwise meet the financial

responsibility requirements of Oklahoma law. Auto liability insurance pays for property damage and bodily injury to someone else if you are found responsible for an accident, up to the policy’s limits.

If the title to the car is in your student’s name, they will have to have their own policy. If your college student is driving a vehicle you own, your child can likely stay on your policy.

If your student is heading to college without a vehicle, you might be eligible for a “student away at school” car insurance discount.

Check with your insurance agent or insurance company and let them know where the car will be stored if the address differs from what’s on the policy.

**Health**

Students have several options for health insurance coverage while away at college. If your children are covered under your insurance now, chances are they will still be covered while away at school. Any insurance plan that offers dependent coverage must make that available until the dependent is 26.

Many colleges and universities also offer their own student health insurance plans. The premiums and features vary widely from school to school. Check with your student’s school health center to see available coverage options.

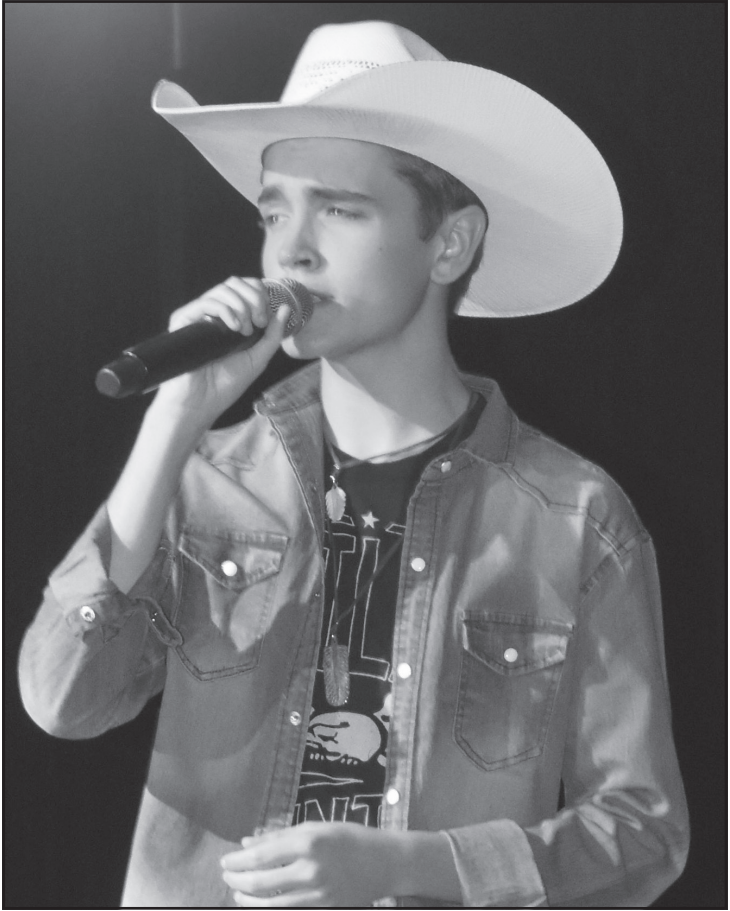

**Mini Cherry Cheesecakes**  
12 vanilla wafer cookies (I use Nilla Wafers)  
28 oz. packages cream cheese, softened  
3/4 c. granulated sugar  
2 eggs  
1 tsp. vanilla extract  
21 oz. can cherry pie filling

Place softened cream cheese and sugar in a mixing bowl; mix with an electric mixer until just combined. Add eggs and vanilla. Mix until smooth.

Line the cups of a 12-cup muffin tin with foil cupcake cups. Place a vanilla wafer cookie in the bottom of each cupcake cup.

Fill each cup 2/3 to ¾-full with cream cheese mixture, dividing the batter evenly between the 12 cups. (I use a large cookie scoop.)

Bake at 350°F for 16-18 minutes until set, with just a small bit of wiggle in the center.

Cool completely. Top each mini cheesecake with cherry pie filling and chill. Store in the refrigerator.

## Smaller pecan harvest expected this fall

Drought is likely to affect the state's pecan crop this year. Becky Carroll, Oklahoma State University Extension fruit and nut specialist, said some orchards appear to be on track while others are sparse with little to no pecans.

Dry conditions are causing a lot of issues for native pecan growers who don't have

the ability to irrigate their orchards.

"During July and early August when the nuts are sizing, we like to get about two inches of rain or irrigation a week, and some places haven't had any rainfall since the beginning of June," Carroll said. "The pecans may be very small this year, and it may reduce overall production for the state due to the size of the nuts because they won't weigh as much."

A typical pecan harvest in Oklahoma yields about 13 million pounds of nuts, but the current drought could reduce that number to 11 million pounds.

"If the pecans are small during this sizing stage when the shells start to harden, then we want to have enough water to fill those nuts properly to get good kernel development, and that takes about two inches (of water) a week as well," Carroll said.

If small nuts receive a lot of rain or water during the next few weeks, they will fill properly, but large pecans that remain dry will harvest with lower quality.

On the other hand, Carroll said the current drought climate could prevent a major weevil infestation.

"If we don't have rainfall, we may not have a weevil problem this year, because they're in the ground and usually come out of the soil when we get a big rainfall," she said.

What started as shoplifting escalated when the alleged thief threatened to shoot two Walmart employees who tried to detain him.

Anthony J. Henn, 29, of Norman, is charged in McClain County District Court with first degree robbery.

He is in the McClain County

Jail in lieu of \$50,000 bond. His preliminary hearing conference will be at 9 a.m. August 31.

According to an affidavit, Purcell police were called to Walmart on July 27. The store manager reported a man, later identified as Henn, had concealed several items on his person and tried to leave the store.

educators and another would expend \$2 million on a virtual coaching and mentoring program for new teachers.

Other organizations proposed using the funds to expand broadband to rural students, pay and hire special education teachers at a school for students with autism and purchase on-line learning products.

Boys and Girls Clubs of Oklahoma City proposed remodeling a building in Capitol Hill for students to use after school.

Oklahoma Christian University asked for \$2 million to award scholarships to students in its paraprofessional to teacher degree program.

Scissortail Community Development Corporation proposed using the entire \$17.7 million to give private school scholarships to low-income and minority students and students with disabilities — similar to the governor’s Stay in School program funded with \$10 million from the first GEER award.

### Federal Auditors’ Findings

The fallout from Stitt’s handling of the first round of funding under GEER has continued.

On August 15, a state lawmaker filed a lawsuit against OMES, alleging the state has refused to provide him details on the GEER expenditures. Rep. Logan Phillips, R-Mounds, states in the lawsuit, filed in Oklahoma County District Court, that he submitted a request for the information under the Oklahoma Open Records Act in May to Stitt and Walters and “no response was ever received.”

According to an email provided by the governor’s office, Stitt’s legal department replied to Phillips a week later, stating “our office does not possess responsive records” and referred him to Harpe. OMES says its staff tried to set up a meeting with Phillips but he

didn’t show up.

In a federal audit issued in July, auditors recommended clawing back \$650,000 and requiring Oklahoma to review another \$5.5 million in purchases in the Digital Wallet program to determine if additional funds were misspent.

Digital Wallet provided \$1,500 grants to low-income families for educational supplies, but a lack of controls and oversight allowed purchases of TVs, home appliances, gaming consoles, and many other items not for student learning, as first revealed in an investigation by Oklahoma Watch and The Frontier.

ClassWallet, a Florida company, managed Digital Wallet and the Stay in School fund. The state on August 5 filed a lawsuit against the company, alleging they breached their contract. But the auditors found it was the state’s responsibility to monitor the funds, and state officials had access to ClassWallet’s platform and spending information but no one from Oklahoma checked it until the program was nearly over.

State officials have agreed to make several changes in its processes of awarding grants in response to the audit, including using a rubric to award funds in line with the intended purpose, and better monitoring and oversight of grant recipients, as well as improved management of funds.

Kate Vesper, Stitt’s press secretary, said the state is working diligently to follow the federal agencies’ recommendations and should be able to award projects in time. “We are in compliance with the timeframe parameters set by the federal government,” she said.

District 21 Drug Task Force.

Those years were perhaps the most memorable due to the abundance of clandestine drug labs churning out ever increasing volume of methamphetamine..

“It was nothing to find a meth lab every shift I worked,” he said.

Those were the early-day meth labs. The ones that required a chemical warehouse of ingredients and copious quantities of water.

Some of the labs had been abandoned. Others were in full operation and there was added satisfaction gained from taking the cooks to jail.

Changing times have simplified production for the bad guys and complicated matters for law enforcers.

“It is so easy to make now,” James said. “Now they can make it in pop bottles.”

Gone are what you might call the glory days for those wearing a badge.

“I remember working one week and making arrests from three or four labs – all within one small town,” he said.

He never personally went undercover, but many times he did surveillance and through the FBI worked with confidential informants in Grady County.

As undersheriff, James’ main duties are overseeing the operation of the sheriff’s department, including the jail.

He is also over investigations and supervises the contract deputies in Goldsby and Wayne – towns without a police department.

The sheriff’s department also has contracts with Washington and Dibble Schools, as well as Mid-America Technology Center, to staff school resource deputies on those campuses.

Under those contracts, the

school districts pay the salary for the deputy.

He is also responsible for scheduling jail inmates for their court dates and arranging transport from whatever facility is holding them for McClain County.

“I do occasionally get out in the field and drive around,” he said. “But not as often as I like.”

James has seen the department change since he first joined it.

The focus now is more on public safety and less on traffic enforcement.

And, of course, civil matters take increasing time and manpower.

Before James ever accepted his first job in law enforcement, he married a woman he’d known since grade school.

James and Tamara Mandrell both attended Word of Life Church and the church-run private school in Dibble.

They graduated in May 1989 and married in December of that year.

They have three adult children. Elizabeth Adamson works for a psychology practice. Michael Goins has a heat and air company and Samantha Goins works for a fast food restaurant while she explored her career options.

Michael is the only one to consider – albeit briefly – following in his father’s footsteps.

“But he changed his degree to construction management at OSU,” James said.

In his present position, James has a unique perspective on the sheriff’s department and its needs.

The most pressing but one which hasn’t yet rung true with voters is a new jail.

James is only too aware of the \$35,000 to \$40,000 every month that McClain County pays to house county prisoners

elsewhere..

The existing jail was built in the early 1990s with a capacity of 53 prisoners.

“We exceed that daily,” he said.

One thing James believes the public doesn’t know or understand is that state law mandates the county jail accept anyone arrested by another jurisdiction in the county.

Lengthy incarcerations for those charged with serious felonies and awaiting trial are the norm.

“A murder suspect may be four or five years in jail before they ever go to court (for trial),” he explained.

As things stand now, McClain County pretty much has contracts with all surrounding counties to house our prisoners.

“Paying another county to house our overflow is almost (cost wise) like building a new jail,” he said.

No job is without problems. And there are always solutions to those problems.

It helps, James said, that the sheriff’s department is on good terms with pretty much every other law enforcement agency in McClain County.

There’s always room for improvement in any job, he believes.

One good example is mental health.

That’s an issue that James said “needs to be revamped.”

“Start at a younger age and not wait until they get older,” he said.

While he is happy with his life so far, James is the first one who will tell you it hasn’t been exactly what he envisioned when he was 5.

“The reality of law enforcement as a 5-year-old and in real life are totally opposite,” he said. “There’s a lot of red tape in the world.

of her city. And it wasn’t long before she declared herself a candidate for state representative.

“I was the only one with an opponent,” she said.

Once in the Legislature, she reveled in arguing the merits of this bill or that and following parliamentary procedure and Roberts Rules of Order..

It was “cool,” she recalled to see her part in all of it.

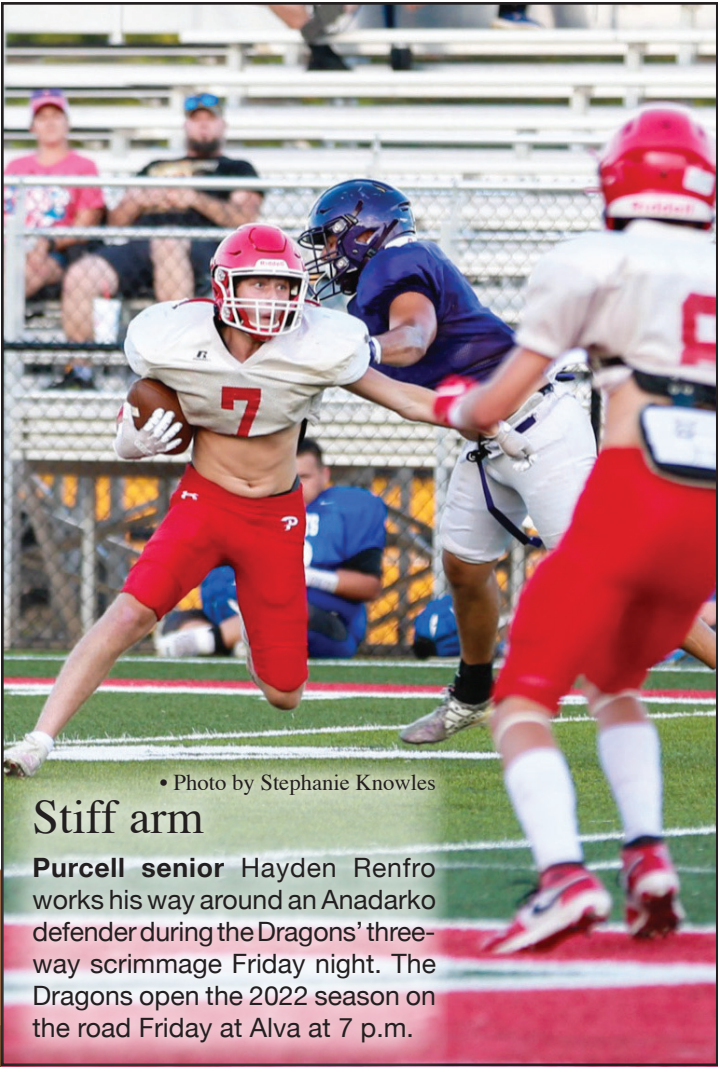

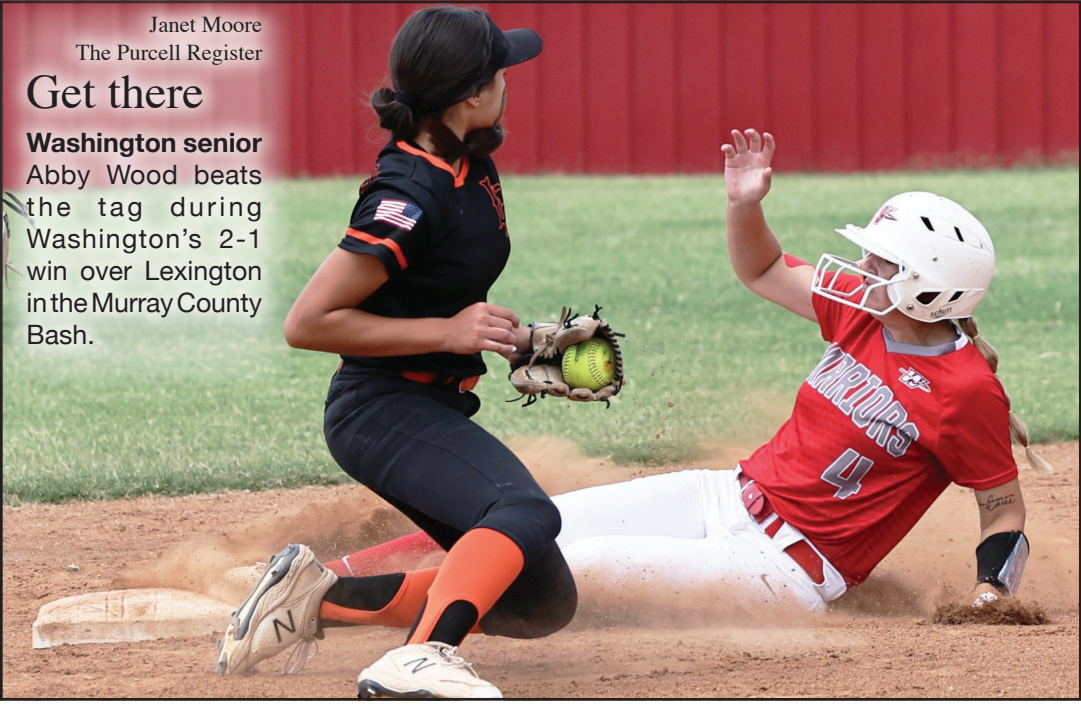

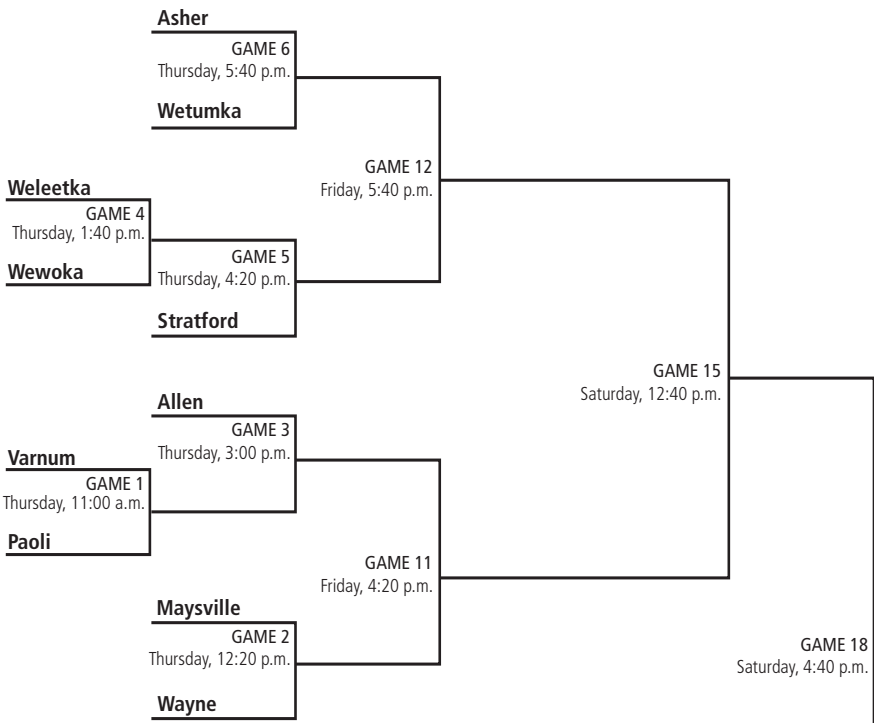

### The Man Who Wet His Pants After Church

Welcome, friends, to the ‘front porch.’

We have been blessed as of late to enter into the water for baptisms, both here in Oklahoma and in Texas and Louisiana. We enjoyed such an experience this past Saturday in Conway, La.; and those experiences always remind me of one special man, a giant of a man, indeed.

You know well this legendary Southern man who brushed my path almost every day for the first 17 years of life, for he’s one of many heroes we’ve shared by the pen for more than 20 years. It is not surprising that he still brushes my path every day, even now, although he’s been gone now for many years. That’s how big of a lamplighter he was.

Our pioneer, old-timey, backwoods, tell-it-like-it-is, Bible-quoting church of Christ preacher, of course, is Preacher

Miller. Obviously, he was not your run-of-the-mill, ordinary preacher, not by a long shot.

When you’d look at him standing up in that pulpit, he looked seven feet tall, especially if you hadn’t hit double digits in years yet. And even if you were quite a bit more than that, you still had to admit he preached that tall, if nothing else.

He didn’t know much about today’s modern psychology and philosophy. He just preached an old-fashioned gospel that would do one of two things: It’d save you or it’d convict you, one. There wasn’t any middle ground.

After he raised the roof and shook the rafters for an hour, you wouldn’t be walking out of there riding the fence. He’d have you on the right hand or on the left – preferably on the right, but you’d have the prerogative to choose the other if you wanted.

His preaching days covered over half a century, this great herald of truth driving a million miles over the country preaching. Through the years, thousands of folks residing on that left side came out to hear him preach. Before the singing and preaching was over, they’d go out on the right hand. You see, he preached during a “golden era” of the gospel, back when people would flock out to hear gospel preaching; and they knew their Bibles, too, inside and out.

Generally speaking, I think people were more concerned with hearing truth than having their ears tickled; so, at the offering of the invitation, the stirring in the crowd would be more than just a few people getting up to go to the bathroom. Some would come up to

August 28, 2022 is the twenty-second Sunday in Ordinary Time. During Ordinary Time, the Gospel focuses on the teachings and miracles of Christ during his time on earth.

The Gospel reading is from Luke 14:1, 7-14. Jesus had gone to the home of one of the leading Pharisees. Upon observing how the guests were being seated, Jesus told a parable. He said a person should not take a seat in a place of honor because another more important person may have been invited. It would be embarrassing if the host asked you to move to a lower place.

Jesus also cautioned the host to not invite those who can repay him but invite the poor, crippled, lame, and the blind. In verse 11, he says, “For everyone who raises himself up will be humbled, and the one who humbles himself will be

raised up.”

We encourage others to stand tall, walk proud, and look others directly in the eye. Does humility mean to abandon that?

In an article written by Anna Katharina Schaffner, Ph.D., she says, “humility has nothing to do with meekness or weakness. And neither does it mean being self-effacing or submissive. Humility is an attitude of spiritual modesty that comes from understanding our place in the larger order of things. It entails not taking our desires, successes, or failings too seriously.”

Humility is practiced by providing the opportunity for others to be heard. Everyone recalls being in class and one student taking over and not letting others participate. Not only is this rude but it denies other students the opportunity

to learn even if their answers are incorrect. The know-it-all needs to hush.

As in most of his parables, Jesus illustrates using commonly known activities. His banquet table setting was easily understood in those days.

I have not been to a banquet table in years. However, I was a senior specialist and one of my tasks was to help new employees learn personnel management skills. My young trainee, a college honors graduate, was anxious to strut his stuff.

We were invited to a meeting in a large conference room, and we were the first to arrive. The conference room seated about 60 and had a conference table for 12. Mr. Trainee sat at one end of the table. I said, “Let’s sit in the gallery since we don’t

baptized, there that very night. You didn’t dare put something that important off until you had a group together.

The preacher would take them out to an old creek or a running river or a cow tank and baptize them while the crowd coming to rejoice would sing “O Happy Day” with enough vigor that it wouldn’t have surprised me if the animals in the woods had gathered around to see what was going on.

Often he had to break the ice on the river before immersing a convert; but, because I think he had ice water in his veins

when it came time to preach or baptize, he probably never knew the water was cold.

Sometimes at the end of a sermon during a gospel meeting, he’d notify the congregation in his loud, raspy voice that always demanded your attention: “Awright, brother, sisters, and friends, tomorrow night I plan on wettin’ my pants!”

And, sure enough, Preacher Miller would usually have them wringing wet by the next night, and two or three other people’s too—down at the river!

Veterans who were exposed to the toxic chemicals from Burn Pits in the Gulf Wars and in Afghanistan, may now be eligible for service-connection

of the diseases that were caused by that exposure. From the information that I have read, it appears that many of the veterans who served there are encouraged to file a claim for any of the presumptive diseases that are listed.

We encourage all veterans who served in those locations to sign up for the VA Burn Pit Registry and to follow up with one of our volunteers who can help them to file a claim for service-connection of their disability. Many of the veterans from those wars are now suffering from one or more of the presumptive diseases that were caused by their exposure to the smoke and fumes of Burn Pits.

We suggest that all veterans read up on the diseases presumptive to this exposure. When VA says a condition is presumptive to exposure, it means that if you are diagnosed with one or more of those conditions the veteran will be approved for service-connection.

After talking to several veterans who were exposed to the Burn Pits it looks like we will have plenty of veterans who will want us to help them to file for VA benefits. Also, for the surviving spouses of veterans who served there, they may be eligible for DIC if one of the new presumptive conditions is listed on the veterans death certificate as a contributing condition or the primary cause of death.

## Farmers face uncertainty with summer crops

Harvest is approaching for Oklahoma summer crops, and fields are either looking really good or really bad with no middle ground, according to Oklahoma State University Extension crop specialists.

Overall yields for crops, such as corn, soybeans, milo and cotton, are projected to be lower statewide.

“Even the crops that look good probably don’t look as good as they normally do,” said Josh Lofton, OSU Extension specialist for cropping systems. “We always have this heat in July, but this has been a long period to be at over 100 degrees and expect crops to be able to come out of it positively on the back end.”

**Corn**

For corn fields, Lofton said the biggest problem with the heat wave was pollination.

“Some of the corn in the state tasseled right before this big heat wave, and that corn is probably okay, but some corn tasseled during this heat wave, and that has left us with whole cobs of corn that have very few kernels on them,” he said.

A lot of Oklahoma corn, especially dryland corn outside the Panhandle region, has been repurposed for animal

feed.

“Hay and animal feed stocks are low, so it’s good to have something, especially for folks who have cattle. It’s just unfortunate we are having to sacrifice corn crops to get that,” Lofton said. “I know more people not taking corn to yield than previous years. We might have a short harvest of acres being taken for grain being significantly down.”

**Milo and Soybeans**

The story for milo and soybeans is much the same.

“Crops like soybeans are very indeterminate, so just as easily as it can look bad, we can get a good rainfall and some cooler temperatures, and it can still finish out,” Lofton said.

He cautioned producers on haying out crops too soon but also with waiting too long.

“Don’t pull the trigger on haying out a crop, especially soybeans, before you are sure that most of the bulk yield has been lost because soybeans can still surprise you,” Lofton said. “But in saying that, the inherent risk is you don’t know when it will freeze for the first time.”

If producers wait too long to give their crops the opportunity to mature, they could lose the crops anyway in an

early frost.

“We’re behind on soybeans. We should be filling pods vigorously by now, and a majority of people I’ve heard from are saying the pods are set, but the seeds and pods are very small or don’t seem to be growing. That’s a concern,” Lofton said. “Making hay out of soybeans may be more worth it to a grower than risking waiting to see if their soybeans will mature.”

**Alfalfa**

Alex Rocateli, OSU Extension forage systems specialist, said this is the hottest and driest year he has experienced in his seven years in Oklahoma.

Right now, alfalfa crops are going into dormancy, meaning the plant is not growing anymore and is flowering.

“If you see your alfalfa has been stunted, flowered and has less than six inches of growth, do nothing. Just let it be,” Rocateli said. “As soon as the rainfall returns, new growth is going to come from the bottom part of the plant.”

When the new plant’s growth reaches about 10 percent bloom, producers can consider harvesting.

“On the other hand, some producers started to experience drought when alfalfa was in advanced vegetative

growth, meaning it had high plant stands and was close to flowering,” he said. “In these circumstances, I would say let the plant get at least halfway bloomed, preferably 100 percent bloomed. That way, producers can count on a regrowth.”

Rocateli said it does not make sense for producers to cut a high stand of six inches or above because the parts of the plant that will be left in the field are deteriorating, and new leaves are not growing.

“Make sure you have minimal trampling if you opt to graze a drought/dormant alfalfa stand as a last forage resort,” he warned. “Do not graze lower than six inches to keep a minimum amount of leaves there for the alfalfa to continue doing minimal photosynthesis to resist the drought.”

Rocateli said the alfalfa growing season is only half-way complete right now, so the drought does not mean producers won’t get any more forage from the crops.

“We just need to hope for more rain and wait for four weeks after rain, and alfalfa could really catch up with growth. You could have at least two cuts this season,” he said.

# Flowers:

ready to dye (RTD) or prepared for dying (PFD) fabric or pre-prepare the fabric yourself. You'll find supplies and directions at most craft stores.

Prepare a space for pounding flowers onto paper or fabric. A large cutting board or piece of wood will protect the furniture below. Or better yet move this project outside onto the sidewalk or other surface that can't be damaged by the pounding.

Cover the surface with wax paper and secure with masking tape to prevent the flower color from soaking through onto the cutting board. Cut the fabric to size and secure it or the paper to the board with masking tape.

Gather a few of your favorite leaves and flowers. You will have great results from thin brightly colored petals and leaves.

Consider starting with rose, daisy, geranium, petunia, and pansy petals although any flowers and leaves can work. Remove or reduce the size of the large center of cone-flowers, black-eyed Susans and similar blooms so they lay flat on the fabric. Or remove the petals, discard the center, and arrange as desired.

Remove any stems, sepals, or other plant parts you do not want to transfer. Then place the desired parts face down on the paper or fabric.

Once your design is set, cover with several layers of paper towel or another sheet of watercolor paper. Taping leaves and petals in place on fabric helps reduce the risk of petals moving during the

pounding process.

Gently tap the leaves and flowers in place using the flat side of a hammer. Next, evenly hammer from one side of the design to the other, making sure to hit every part of each plant.

Lift the paper covering and remove the crushed flowers and leaves from the paper along with the tape from the fabric. Allow your design to dry and carefully brush off any remaining plant pieces.

Set the design on fabric using an iron set on the hottest setting without steam. This sets the colors but will not make it washable. Preserve the bright colors of your works of art on paper with a UV protective acrylic spray.

Be sure to read and follow label directions and apply in a well-ventilated area.

Pounding flowers is a fun project for all ages. It is a simple way to transfer a plant's natural dye onto paper or fabric to create works of art, greeting cards and more.

Providing depth there are capable backups Rowan Ardery and Tavian Engert, Carlos Miranda and Luke Edelman. ▶

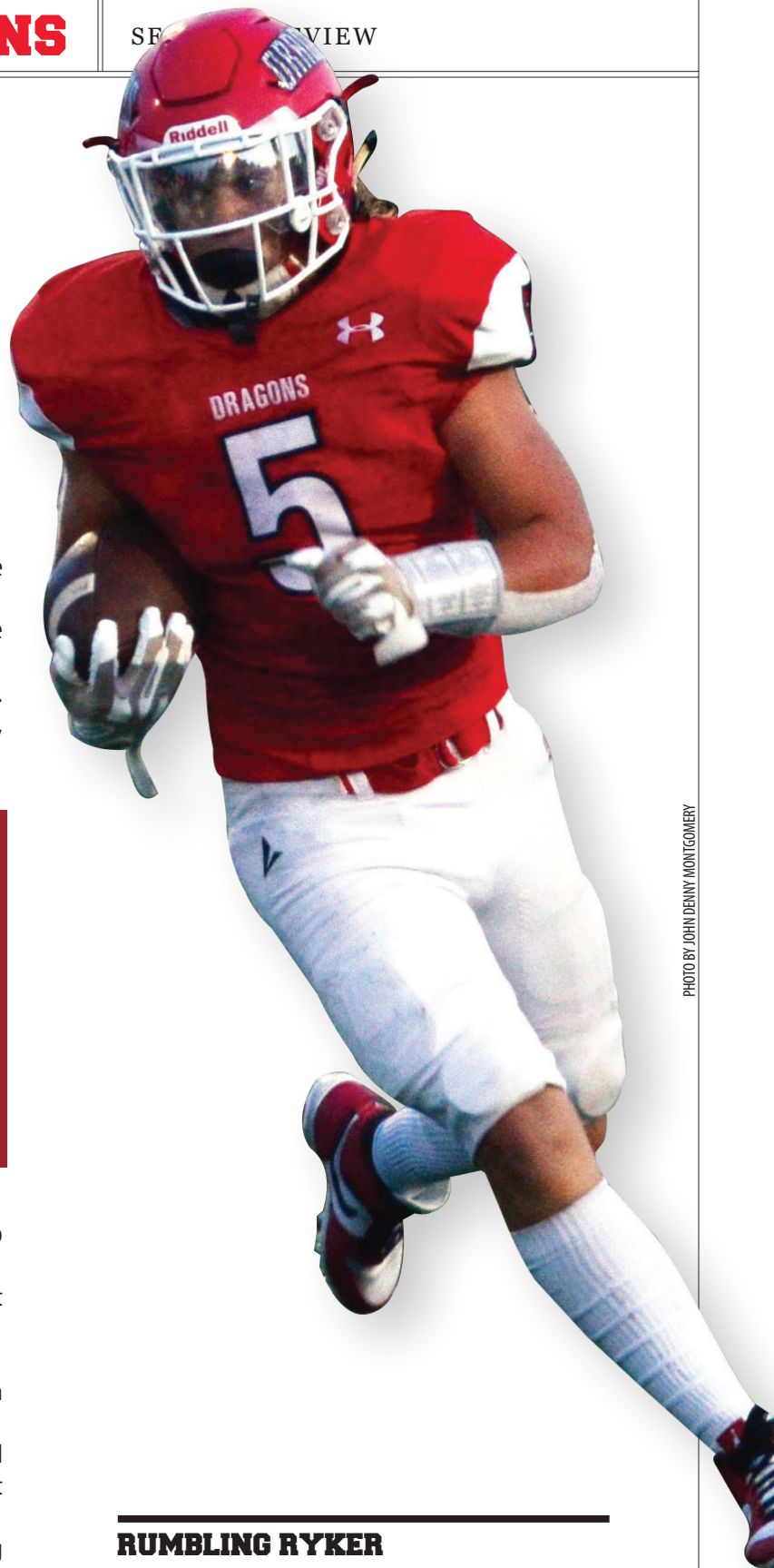

► “Those guys can step in anywhere and help out,” Scott said. “Jose Ochoa and Jose Tarango both played quite a bit at slot last year.”

Ty Jaspersen and Austin Burton will bring some experience at wide receiver.

In the backfield Galyean will have a bevy of running backs to feed.

Payson Purcell, Ryker Fink and Boston Knowles all logged plenty of playing time last year and figure to do the same in 2022.

“The strength of our offense with getting Brody Galyean back is that we will be pretty balanced. Last year we were run heavy with the quarterback and then throw deep,” Scott said.

“This year we will be a more balanced pass-run team, which is a real good thing,” the coach said.

Scott mentioned several players, including some new faces, who had good spring camps and 7 on 7 competition this year including Colt Taylor, Lincoln Eubank, Hayden Ice and Jett Tyler.

"And, we've got guys who can step in behind them. We have more depth in the defensive line," the coach said.

He was referring to Derek Cravens, Ardery and Ice when he gets more experience.

"I expect Hayden to help us immediately on offense but defense takes a little longer with coverages and things like that."

Burton returns at cornerback and Ochoa and Guthmueller at outside linebacker. Purcell will be back at defensive safety.

"Our kids play hard," Scott says flatly. "They pretty much like each other. They are a good bunch of kids who will get after it. As a group this team is closer this season."

The key for Purcell offensively is running the offense and taking what the defense gives us, Scott reports.

Likewise on defense, Scott says the key is just getting people running to the football every play and people doing their job.

"Doing your job is what our defense is based on. Everyone has a responsibility that they have got to get done."

Purcell will base out of a 3-4 defense.

"But with all the defensive linemen we have, we may morph into a four man front," the coach said. "I'm excited about this football team," he concluded.

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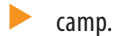
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camp.

"And we're excited to have coach Ennis back. He's a phenomenal secondary coach and is great with the kids," Garrett said.

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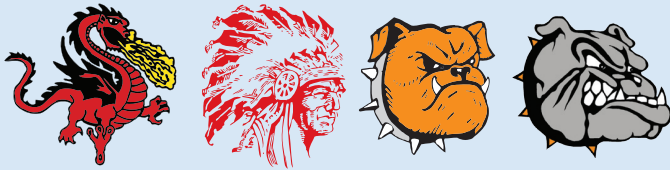
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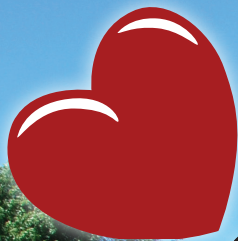

**W**ayne is in reloading mode.

After graduating a large, talented senior class last season, they will look to a group who is eager to make their own name in Bulldog football.

Wayne head coach Brandon Sharp, who enters his 15th season as head coach of the Bulldogs, said there has been healthy competition for several vacant positions.

"We're rotating guys around to find the best 11 for us," Sharp said. "The overall attitude of the team is great and they're working their tails off."

## Defense

The Bulldogs will be in their traditional 4-3 defense again this season.

The front four is still being worked out right now but Sharp expects several players to see time in the rotation.

"Jake Solis is really coming on and we're looking at him at the five technique," Sharp said. "Kyler Cantrell has been playing at the nine but he can play inside or outside."

The coach also said Eli Hobson could see time at defensive end.

"He might play there some for speed," Sharp said. "Eli will play multiple positions for us, he's a utility guy."

Multiple players are vying for the inside tackle positions, including Casey Kane, Noah Alviso and Joel Rojas. Lane Jones and Jesse Hartless are also getting reps inside. ▶





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► “We have different options there, and all those guys are working hard right now,” Sharp said.

The linebackers figure to be Kevin Alviso at the weak side, Adolfo Vasquez at mike and Rhett Kennedy on the strong side.

Hobson will likely see time at backer as well.

“The ‘backers will get after it,” Sharp said. “They’re learning how to take on blocks and do their job. I’ve been working with them this season and they’re fun to work with.”

The secondary will be anchored by senior Kaleb Madden.

“Kaleb will be at corner and he will follow the other team’s best player.”

Along with Madden will be Isaac Hill and Jaxon Dill.

Bradey VanSchuyver is also battling for a spot in the secondary.

Assistant coach Shane Collins will take over calling the defensive plays this season after the departure of assistant Sammy Sharp.

“Shane worked under Sammy and he played in a 4-3 while he was in college,” Sharp said. “We think he’s going to do a great job.”

### Offense

The Wayne offense will have little resemblance of itself from last season.

With the departure of an incredible class with the likes of Brannon Lewelling, Ethan Mullins, Jairo Hernandez, Jr. Perez, Dom Sampson, Andy Lee, Kevin Bynum, Cody Davis, Maddox

Mantooth, Braxton Smith and Jerry Akins, the approach will be different.

The quarterback run game that Wayne relied upon so heavily in years past with Mullins and Lewelling in the backfield will give way to a more balanced attack.

“We’ll throw it a little more this year,” Sharp said. “We’ll pick our times and take some chances. If teams load the box they need to know we will throw it this year.

One player Sharp will look to for home run plays is senior Madden.

“As dynamic as Kaleb is we’ll have to get him the ball with jet sweeps and bubble screens, as well as taking off the top with him deep.”

Madden will be joined by Kennedy at the “Z” receiver spot. The crafty senior has as much experience under his belt as anyone on the team and his football IQ will come in handy as he’ll be used in more positions than his listed place.

“He’s our Swiss Army knife,” Sharp said. “He could start at quarterback or running back if we needed him to. He knows football and can step in at any spot. He’s a good weapon to have and he’s also a good blocker.”

Josten Dauzat and VanSchuyver will add depth to the receiver corps.

Despite the talent at receiver, the Bulldogs will still use the run game as their money-maker.

“We’ll be tailback-oriented and the backfield is pretty

Tailbacks will split time to stay fresh for the other side of the ball and Isaac Hill and Vasquez look to get a lot of the carries at that spot.

"Isaac has looked good at tailback," Sharp said. "He puts his foot in the ground and can find a crease and take it to the house."

"Adolfo is the thunder to his lightening," Sharp continued. "He's powerful. Both are good and we'll use both to keep them fresh for defense. My roots are on defense."

Hobson and Kevin Alviso are penciled in to be lead blockers at the fullback position.

Sophomore Jaxon Dill will direct the offense from the quarterback position.

"He's doing a great job leading," Sharp said. "He knows football and he knows what I want on offense. I feel like he'll be a great quarterback for us."

Dill will play under center and the Bulldogs will operate out of the wing-T look.

"It will be well-rounded," Sharp said. "We'll run some spread to let our guys get in space to run."

Jones is likely to start at center with Moore "right there" behind him.

Noah Alviso and Kane are penciled in at guard. Cantrell will anchor one tackle spot while a battle for the other spot brews between Solis, Rojas and Moore.

"We may use some different combinations in scrimmages to see what works. We've got some decent size up front but they're a little inexperienced," Sharp said. "We'll be learning on the fly but the good news is it will give us two more weeks of practice with no week zero game. That will benefit us."

### Specialties

Sharp said he hasn't made final decisions on the kicking game other than the fact that Hill will be the punter and Vasquez will handle the kicking duties.

Madden will return kicks, along with Hill, Vasquez and Spencer.

Graduate assistant Jordan Land is working with deep snappers and will have someone ready to go, according to Sharp.

"He deep snapped in high school and is coaching them up."

Overall, Sharp is optimistic about the season's outlook.

"We have a lot of young guys who are battling and working hard," he said. "I'm having fun."

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# 30th Player of the Week

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Nominations are made by head coaches and **The Register** staff makes the final selections for each week's winners. Players chosen receive a T-shirt, picture and short story in **The Register**.

Statistics are compiled each week to be used for the end of the year selections.

The Offensive Player of the Year for 2021 was Wayne's **Ethan Mullins**. Mullins rushed 215 times for 2,504 yards and 38 touchdowns. He was 24-55 passing for 475 yards and three touchdowns.

The Defensive Player of the Year was Washington's **Layne Spaulding**. Spaulding racked up 142 tackles, 19 of those for losses and registered six quarterback sacks.
