For many, cancer is feared as the bane of our existence. For firefighters, it is more

It is something of a Catch-22 that the garb meant to protect a firefighter from flames might also increase

the risk of a cancer diagnosis. Still, it is a risk firefighters willingly accept in their efforts to save lives and protect

The increased risk comes as no surprise to firefighters, according to Purcell Fire Chief Greg Cypert.

"They are taught that in lots of different classes," Cypert said. "All firefighters understand. We know it's a risk we take."

Knowing the risk, firefighters keep a close watch on their

health, Cypert said. And they also learn about steps to alleviate the risk.

For example, there was a time years ago when bunker gear was never cleaned.

Now, as soon as firefighters return from a fire, they strip off the bunker gear, shower

While installing water lines in Purcell Monday a crew from Harcon LLC in Purcell cut a 4" natural gas line at the corner of Third and Washington. Workers at Wadley's Funeral service and McClain Bank were evacuated for safety precautions. There

Workers at McClain Bank's Drive-Thru and Wadley's Funeral Service were evacuated Monday morning after a water line installation crew severed a 4" gas line at the corner of Third and Washington.

Neither facility reopened Monday but both were back in full operation Tuesday.

After Purcell Firefighters arrived they called ONG who had to call out dig crews to locate the line.

Multiple crews were called out and multiple holes were dug in the street, alley and yard adjacent to the line to help locate.

Firefighters were called to the scene at 10:09 with the evacuations in place by around 10:30 a.m.

To serve their customers, McClain Bank kept its main lobby open on Main Street until 5 p.m.

While crews were working at the scene a severe thunderstorm with intense lightning, strong winds and 1.4" of rain blew in, hampering the process.

Firemen reported the water installation team works for Harcon LLC in Purcell.



Our most recent meeting was August 31. The meetings are streamed live at https://oksenate.gov/live-proceedings. We'll be briefed on LOFT's priority evaluation of the distribution of mental health services in our state. Working in healthcare, this is an area of great importance to me, and I hope this provides us with some valuable insight as to how we can provide better services to those in need.

Biden's student loan bailout

Current estimates reveal that this sweeping action on federal student loans will cost the nation at least \$519 billion. This will only add more fuel to the raging inflationary fire that is already making it difficult for Americans to pay for basic items needed to live and take care of their families. Moreover, the hundreds of

billions of dollars this plan will add to the national debt erases any supposed deficit reduction or inflation relief Democrats claimed their recently passed partisan reconciliation bill would deliver.



"Gardening with toddlers and preschoolers allows them to experience plant care as well as develop an appreciation of plants and learn where some of their food comes from," Mitchell said. "They also learn responsibility, team work and gain a respect for nature. Children take great pride when helping adults with a hands-on project."

With the traditional gardening season winding down, children can still get involved terrarium in the house. The rarium.

environment inside the terrarium allows youngsters, as well as adults, to grow some plants they may not be able to grow outdoors.

A terrarium is a garden in an enclosed glass or plastic container. With proper care, to have a tiny garden inside a terrarium creates a humid atmosphere that protects tender, tropical plants that are otherwise difficult to grow in Oklahoma's dry atmosphere.

"While there are some plants succulents are a category of plants that shouldn't go into a terrarium," Mitchell said. "Succulents thrive in drier soil and low humidity, which is pretty much the opposite of a terrarium."

Selecting the right terrarium container is important. It should be made of clear glass and have a tight-fitting lid. If you don't have a lid, the opening can be covered with clear plastic wrap. You can upcycle an old aquarium or glass gallon-sized

Mitchell said good potting soil from the local garden center in gardening by setting up a is a must for a successful ter-

"It's not recommended to use garden soil because it's too heavy and doesn't provide adequate aeration or capillary movement of water," she said. "It also likely contains weed seeds, insect eggs and diseasecausing organisms, none of which would be beneficial in your terrarium."

Choose naturally dwarf, slow-growing, high humidity tolerant plants that do well in low to medium light levels where the terrarium is placed.

"Get creative with textures and shades of green to create visual interest," she said. "Once planted, place the terrarium near a window but avoid direct sunlight. Don't be alarmed if the walls of the terrarium fog up in the first few days. It may take a couple of days to establish a rain cycle within the terrarium."

To avoid the plants outgrowing the terrarium, keep the use of fertilizer low - about half the rate and frequency recomjars; just make sure they are mended on the fertilizer label.

Collection, Hauling and Disposal of Municipal Solid Waste **Change in Collection Time**

The City of Purcell has an exclusive contract with WCA of Oklahoma to collect, haul and dispose of municipal solid waste within the city's corporate limits.

Collection Time—Pick up is now the last Monday of the month. Items are not to be put out by the curb until that weekend prior.

Bulk Waste—Brush or limbs shall be bundled in no larger than three feet x three feet bundles. No furniture larger than a pickup bed or that exceeds 75 pounds. Appliances must have refrigerant/compressor legally removed and shall not exceed 75 pounds. Yard waste such as leaves and grass clippings must be bagged. All items must be bagged and no loose items will be picked up.

Hazardous Waste-Solid waste identified or listed as a hazardous waste by the administrator of the United States Enviornmental Protection Agency (EPA) or so classified by any federal or State of Oklahoma statute, rule, order or regulation should not be put out for collection. This includes tire, paint or oil products.

As a result, regeneration slowed by about 50 percent.

Despite this discovery, Forsthoefel said, "We still have a million unanswered questions." The next steps are to understand the role of lipids during regeneration by planarians and whether the same molecular process occurs in other species, particularly those that can regrow body parts, like salamanders and zebrafish.

"Science has come a long way in understanding how to induce regeneration in damaged human tissue, and this work offers more important clues," said physician-scientist Patrick Gaffney, M.D., chair of OMRF's Genes and Human Disease Research Program. "If future research shows that humans need additional lipids to regenerate tissue, we might discover a way of supplying those lipids where they are needed to expedite healing from disease or injury."

Extreme heat and drought impact fall garden plans

With extreme heat and little rain still on the horizon for Oklahoma, gardeners may need to alter their fall garden plans.

"There's nothing better than fresh produce throughout most of the year, but the lack of rainfall coupled with excessive heat may put a damper on successful fall gardening," said David Hillock, Oklahoma State University Extension consumer horticulturist. "Typically, some of the best quality garden vegetables in Oklahoma are produced and harvested during the fall season when the warm days are followed by cool, humid nights.'

In ideal conditions, Hillock said plant soil metabolism is low; therefore, more of the food manufactured by vegetable plants becomes high-quality

Unfortunately, the current climate across much of the state involves high soil temperature, high light intensity and rapid drying of soil.

"This can be a problem for gardeners because achieving a full stand of plants in these extreme weather conditions may require special treatment," he said. "Gardeners may have to employ strategies such as shade row covers when seeding, along with supplemental watering to reduce soil temperature to aid in seed germination."

Cut the yardsticks into four-inch pieces and sand the cut edges smooth. Glue the yardstick pieces vertically and next to each other onto all four sides of the planter. Set the saucer in the bottom of the planter box and place the potted pansy on top of it.

Purchase plenty of pansies. You are sure to find other creative ways to utilize them this fall or simply use them as colorful fillers for voids in gardens and containers.

"In order for viable seeds to germinate or sprout, they must have the proper temperature, adequate moisture and sufficient oxygen," Hillock said.

Shade row covers can be made from burlap and a few stakes, said Laura Payne, horticulture specialist in the OSU Extension Payne County office.

"The burlap still allows light through but diffuses the heat on the tender plants," Payne said. "Gardeners can also use screen wire strips or boards to cover the rows, which will moderate both soil temperature and soil moisture. Remove the covers after the seedlings emerge."

Another option to help stave off the heat is creating deeper furrows in which to plant. This allows the seed to germinate in cooler soil. Even then, gardeners will need to supplement with extra irriga- if necessary." tion to ensure the soil remains moist at seed depth.

While daylight hours are still very warm this time of the year, nighttime temperatures are slightly cooling off, allowing plants to recover in the evening. Payne said the cooler evening temperatures will help with the establishment of a fall garden, but once seeds are sown, irrigate adequately. A garden's soil dries out quickly during the

Gardeners who use transplants should condition them by reducing the amount of water supplied and exposure to full sunlight. Hillock said this process can take three to five days.

"When you're ready to plant the transplants, do so in the late afternoon or early evening when it's cooler to help reduce transplant shock," he said. "Water the plants as they are set. A watersoluble fertilizer can be used

Typical fall vegetables to plant include broccoli, leeks, Season extension methods, onions, peas, radish, kale, such as high tunnels or hoop cabbage, collards, kohlrabi

Managing cattle for a profit has always included pregnancy testing your cows to determine not only whether she is bred or not, but to determine how far along bred she is. By pregnancy testing your cattle it allows you to have information you may not otherwise have. This information will allow you to make some wise decisions that very well may save you during this drought.

An open cow may not consume as much forage as a bred cow because her nutrient requirements are less, but she will also not produce you a sellable product during the next calving season.

If you can determine that cow is not pregnant now and get her off of the feed bill you will be able to save a considerable amount of money during this feeding season that very well may be starting now and continuing on until next spring. With the ever-rising cost of hay and feed during this drought feeding an unproductive cow will make good sense.

Pregnancy determination can be determined by various methods. The most commonly accepted is rectal palpation. This method has been used by technicians with a high degree of success.

This method typically is the least expensive, costing between 5 and 10 dollars per head. Other methods include

ultrasound and blood test to determine progesterone amounts. Both of these methods have a degree of positive and negative attributes associated with

Pregnancy determination has been taught by many organizations so there are people out there that very well may be qualified to determine if your cows are bred or not. If you are in doubt, use a licensed veterinarian. The vet has years of experience and more than likely he palpates several cows a week so they can be very comfortable giving you a good answer.

You may think you are saving a few dollars, but an inexperienced technician may cause you to sell some short-bred cows and retain some open cows. Most technicians can determine pregnancy as short as 45 days.

If a cow is going to maintain a calving interval of one year, she must rebreed at least 85 days after calving. Cows that extend this calving interval will begin to add expenses to the herd and reduce the amount of profit potential by extending the calving season. Extended calving seasons mean that you have fewer calves that will be market ready at one time.

Cows can be open for a variety of reasons. The most common reasons are related to management of the herd. Probably the most common reason for a cow to be open is because she is in poor body condition at calving and does not return to estrus in time to rebreed. Cows that are in a minimum body condition score of six will normally rebreed in at least 85 days or sooner.

Other factors are genetic makeup resulting in poor fertility, diseases, and ovarian cysts. Sometimes the reason a cow is open is not her fault. Bulls that have low or no fertility can result in a large number of open cows. With the extreme heat we have experienced in the past 90 days, a reduction or complete loss of fertility in bulls may be

The expungement process is expensive, time-consuming

Hundreds of people lined up outside the Urban League of Greater Oklahoma City last year in 90-degree heat, hoping for a fresh start.

The advocacy organization was hosting an expungement fair aimed at providing resources and information to people with nonviolent felony and misdemeanor convictions. Expungement can help people with arrests or aging convictions pass background checks and secure stable housing and employment. Most don't take advantage of the relief it offers. The Oklahoma Policy Institute estimates that 93.5% of expungement eligible records remain unsealed.

The greatest barrier to expungement is cost, criminal justice reform advocates say. While it's possible to seek expungement without an attorney, the petition process is complex and typically takes months. The Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation advises that applicants will be held to the same standard as a legal professional and "strongly suggests" that they hire an attorney.

"It is impossible to do this on your own," said Jabar Shumate, a former state lawmaker and the Urban League's vice president of community convening and social justice. "You can only achieve an expungement through the support of hiring a lawyer that would probably total you, if you had a very minimal case, around \$1,500. Most cases could take up to \$5,000 just because of the time involved, coordinating all of the agencies and getting all of the sign-offs."

The State Legislature is considering a solution that would leverage technology to make expungement more accessible. The proposal, House Bill 3316 by Rep. Nicole Miller, R-Edmond, would authorize the state to create a computer algorithm identifying expungement eligible cases and automatically initiating the records clearing

The bill unanimously cleared the House Criminal and Corrections committee last month and is eligible for a full House vote.

"I believe that government itself should not be in the business of erecting barriers to people getting on with their lives and being productive members of society," Miller said during an August interim study on expungement reform. Miller declined an interview request, saying that she was still finalizing the bill's language.

The push for expungement reform comes as individuals with criminal records struggle to find stable employment de-

"I had a graduate in my office last week who was fired from her job because the background showed a deferred probation sentence, which is not a conviction," said Rachel Delcour, the criminal justice director for the Women in Recovery program in Tulsa. "She's coming up for expungement this year, but she's not eligible yet, so they let her go."

Michigan, Pennsylvania and Utah have passed automatic records clearing legislation, also known as Clean Slate laws. The legislation received strong bipartisan support in all three states, particularly in Utah, where lawmakers in 2019 unanimously voted to authorize automatic expungement of many low-level offenses.

Automatic expungement legislation is generally received positively, said Jesse Kelley, national campaign manager for the Washington, D.C.-based Clean Slate Initiative.

The central point of contention among lawmakers is often how far the reform should go. For example, half of the legislature may believe that non-conviction arrests and misdemeanors should be automatically cleared but draw the line at expunging felony offenses.

Oklahoma's proposal, which would not modify expungement eligibility but simply automate the process, has yet to receive significant opposition. A crosssection of statewide policy and advocacy groups, including the conservative Oklahoma Council of Public Affairs, Right on Crime and Oklahomans for Criminal Justice Reform, have expressed support for House Bill 3316.

"Republicans and Democrats can all agree that people who are no longer a threat to society, who haven't committed any sort of public safety violation for a certain number of years, deserve to live a full life," Kelley said.

Building an Automatic Expungement System

If the Legislature approves House Bill 3316, Oklahoma could start creating its automatic expungement system by year's end. It would likely take at least is a significant step towards one year to build the necessary technological infrastructure.

"You have to develop a software that will communicate check websites may reveal across multiple systems across multiple counties," Kelley said. "What's great is that the Clean Slate Initiative is working with another group, Code for America, which will work with and advise state agencies about

automatic bill."

One benefit of Oklahoma's clean slate bill is that there's no break in automation from the initiation to completion of expungement, Kelley said. Arresting and prosecuting agencies would be notified of pending expungements and given 45 days to object. If no objection is made, the names would be forwarded to a judge



for final approval. The records would be removed from public inspection but remain accessible to law enforcement.

Damion Shade, the justice and economic mobility project manager for the Oklahoma Policy Institute, believes the state could start automatically expunging records by 2024 if legislation passes this session. State officials could use American Rescue Plan dollars to fund the creation and maintenance of the system through 2026 at an estimated cost of \$3 million to \$5 million, Shade said.

'Of course, there will always be the cost to maintain that system in the future," Shade said. "But the law enforcement and court agencies that are involved in this, they're going to have to build new data systems anyways because their technology is super old."

The overall economic benefit of clean slate legislation far outweighs the cost of maintaining the system, proponents argue, as more people are able to secure higher-paying jobs. A University of Michigan study found that state's expungement recipients were 22 percent more likely to be employed and earned 11 percent more one year after their records were sealed.

Barriers Could Persist

For people with a prior conviction or arrest, expungement moving on in life. But it's not always a catch-all.

The organization has built relationships with judges and public defenders in Tulsa, Creek and Rogers counties and typically has no issue scheduling an expungement hearing. Those who receive expungement through Women in Recovery might save a few thousand dollars in legal fees, but the long-term social and economic impact is even more significant, Delcour said.

"When someone has a conviction on their record or even a deferred sentence, those things are huge barriers to getting the job that really pays enough to live on or getting safe housing that requires a background check," she said. "We want to save people money, but more than that I want people to get better jobs and better housing and remove some of those barriers."

A significant benefit of House Bill 3316, Delcour said, is that it

"We have staff here who are going to help our women try to seek those benefits," she said. "But not everyone is in a program like ours."

With the assistance of probono attorneys, Shumate said the Urban League is processing hundreds of expungement applications, a process that usually takes at least six months to complete. He hopes the organization soon won't have to carry such a heavy load.

"It has been an overwhelming process because of the way things are structured in this state," Shumate said. "I can guarantee you that once this bill passes, more agencies that help those that are justice-involved will be able to step up to the plate and help people because it's more achievable."







OMRF study finds potential treatment for sickle cell disease An experimental drug being of this drug in sickle cell dis-

tested to treat a rare blood disorder may also benefit people who have sickle cell disease, Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation scientists have discovered.

In research models, the compound reduced the length and severity of vaso-occlusive crises, the most frequent and severe complication of sickle cell disease, said OMRF Cardiovascular Biology Program Chair Lijun Xia, M.D., Ph.D., who led the study. The findings were published this month in the Proceedings of the National Academy of Sciences.

The drug, which targets a blood-clotting molecule called von Willebrand factor (VWF), is in a phase 3 clinical trial to treat a deadly blood disorder that causes clots to form in small blood vessels throughout the body.

"In our study, we discovered VWF plays a significant role in mouse models during a vasoease, our experiments had that effect."

Sickle cell disease is an inherited disorder that primarily affects people of African descent, including about 100,000 Americans.

In the condition, red blood cells change from their normally pliable and round shapes to become rigid and sticky in the form of a crescent or "sickle," causing inflammation, excruciating pain and organ damage.

These pain crises can last for weeks. They often require hospitalization and can be fatal. Current treatments address the symptoms or reduce the frequency of a crisis. One example of the latter is Adakveo, which in 2019 received Food and Drug Administration approval as the first targeted therapy for sickle cell disease. Adakveo is based on the discoveries of OMRF Vice President of Research Rod McEver, M.D.

"In our previous work, we looked at one therapeutic mechanism for vaso-occlusive crises, and Dr. Xia is looking at another," said McEver. "What he has unearthed is another potential therapeutic target. In the future, researchers could see whether they work independently or whether they could work together. This provides the strong basis for a clinical

Hay yields are much lower in 2022 than they were last year, and in areas of the state with the worst drought, hay season is non-existent.

"Producers don't have anything to bale up," said Gary Strickland, Jackson County Oklahoma State University Extension director and agriculture educator. "They may have and maybe a second if it was under irrigation."

In the dryland fields of the forages, such as sudan grasses and pearl millets, have emerged with very little growth. Strickland took a tour of five regional counties a couple weeks ago and found field after field of burnt up grasses from the drought and extreme heat.

Poor hay crop requires

a sustainable winter plan

Southwestern Oklahoma is not the only area in crisis.

"Our producers are talking about feeding hay in the middle of August instead of starting in the middle of October," said Chad Webb, Noble County OSU Extension director and gotten one cutting of alfalfa, agriculture educator. "That's little as 10 pounds daily per two months of feeding with less hay."

• Determine how much hay you have and how much can be fed daily for the expected feeding period. Feeding as cow may require the purchase of additional hay or roughage.

• Test hay and other roughage sources to determine protein and energy amounts. OSU Extension specialist Brian Arnall discusses baling summer crops for an alternative forage on OSU Agriculture's television show, "SUNUP."

• Consider planting warm season annuals as a grazing crop in the late summer to fill early fall forage gaps. Warm season annuals can produce 4 to 5 tons of dry matter per acre in 45 days when planted in late

• Plant cool season annual grasses in pastures.

• Balance a supplement or feeding program that makes sense for the operation.

 Consider feeding monensin to beef cows. It has been shown to decrease forage intake eight percent without impacting cow bodyweight or body condition.

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

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

Cyrus Harris first elected Governor of Chickasaw Nation

Former interpreter selected after adoption of 1856 Constitution

Surveying historic piece

Chickasaw Nation Governor Cyrus Harris' great-greatgrandson, Harris Penner, surveys an old water pump which once stood in the center of old Mill Creek when Governor Harris established the town in the 1800s.

In autumn of 1856, Cyrus Harris, along with a few other men, stood in a field near the Chickasaw Council House at Good Spring (now Tishomingo) and waited.

During the first gubernatorial election, after adoption of their own constitution following the separation from the Choctaw Nation the previous year, Chickasaw voters cast their vote by lining up and standing behind their candidate of choice.

Election judges counted each voter behind each candidate, certified the tally and declared 39-year-old Harris the winner.

Described as a man of "great generosity, integrity, patriotism and self-sacrifice," Harris dedicated his life to serving the Chickasaw people.

Elected in 1856, 1860, 1866, 1868 and 1872 for two-year terms, Harris was at the core of implementing the first Chickasaw government after the 1856 constitution. He guided the Chickasaw Nation through many tumultuous times and

was a staunch advocate for education.

During his tenure as Governor, Harris led the Chickasaws in the years leading up to the Civil War and once again during postwar Reconstruction. He expressed concerns regarding non-First American people moving into Chickasaw lands, development of the railroad and federal government policies advocating for allotment of communal Chickasaw lands.

Harris was a strong advocate for education and signed numerous resolutions leading to the establishment and maintenance of boarding schools on tribal land.

Harris was a businessman and interpreter prior to his election as governor. He was born Aug. 22, 1817, to Elizabeth Colbert Oxberry-Gunn and James Harris near Pontotoc, Mississippi, on his grandmother Molly Colbert Gunn's estate. His great-grandfather, General William Colbert, was a renowned Chickasaw leader.

Livestock biosecurity a diligent and serious task

From county jackpots to statewide shows, Oklahoma's youth livestock arena is competitive and fun, but animal health is a priority.

Not all 4-H and FFA exhibitors can bring home a grand champion ribbon, but they're still winners when sound biosecurity measures protect livestock from viruses and infectious disease.

The public's awareness of illness and proper hygiene has grown during the past two years, and animal health is no different. Every time an animal encounters another animal, there is potential for transmission.

"It's very common for cattle to come home from a show and be under the weather," said Dana Zook, Oklahoma State University Extension livestock specialist for the west district. "It could just be a virus, but there's always a chance it could be more."

Rusty Gosz, OSU Extension youth livestock specialist, said event planners have taken serious logistical measures in addition to onsite health management. Those extra protocols include:

- Flipping the timing of breeding and market shows to ensure breeding animals are not exposed to market animals.
- Making market shows terminal.
- Adjusting livestock traffic flow to reduce potential exposures.
- Increasing sanitation practices and using disinfectant sprays on the show grounds, livestock equipment, traffic areas, panels, wash racks and pens.
- Increasing health inspections and the presence of veterinarians.
- Establishing quarantine and exit strategies in the case

of a sick animal.

Before the Show

Elimination and prevention of animal disease begins with a tidy environment in barns or pens where animals reside at home. Routine cleaning of floors, water and feed troughs, buckets and other equipment provides benefits beyond the spread of harmful agents.

"The value of a biosecurity plan requires a team commitment," said Rosslyn Biggs, beef cattle Extension specialist at the OSU College for Veterinary Medicine. "Exhibitors should perform daily health assessments of their animals, keep close records of vaccines and ensure vaccines were administered in an appropriate manner. New animals at home should remain separated from the rest of the herd in isolation for two to three weeks, and animals should be monitored to prevent the exposure of wildlife and other species."

At the Show

Biosecurity precautions also involve a thorough health inspection of animals with accompanying documentation, properly filled out by exhibitors and signed by a licensed veterinarian. Keep that paperwork in an easily accessible spot in a vehicle and have it ready for review upon arrival. This streamlines the check-in process and reduces the amount of time animals must stand in trailers, waiting for clearance to enter the show grounds.

Basic biosecurity measures include clean bedding in an animal's pen and tie-out area, keeping a well-stocked show box of animal health and safety items recommended by a veterinarian in case of an emergency, and being mindful of the potential for disease at the community wash racks.

Monroe Mission School and later a school in western Tennessee. Three years later, he returned to Mississippi to live with his grandmother, mother and later his uncle, Martin Colbert.

In 1835, as groups of Chickasaws were preparing to remove to Indian Territory, Harris, who spoke Chickasaw and English fluently, served as an interpreter at a government land office at Pontotoc. He also served as an interpreter at the numerous councils conducted to arrange details of the Chickasaws' removal to Indian Territory.

Harris and his mother began the forced Removal to Indian Territory in 1837. They arrived at Blue River in present-day Johnston County, Oklahoma, in 1838, where he opened a successful mercantile.

in 1850 when he accompanied Edmund Pickens as a delegate to Washington, D.C., and again in 1854. He was the first elected Chickasaw Nation Governor after the Chickasaw people formally adopted the 1856 constitution.

After serving five terms, iron fence. supporters of Governor Harris in 1878 submitted his name for Governor, but in a contested election, Benjamin C. Burney won by five votes. To maintain order, Governor Harris withdrew and retired from politics.

Cyrus Harris, 70, died Jan. 6, 1888, in Mill Creek, Indian Territory.

But the story of this remark-

Harris was laid to rest on his land in the Old Mill Creek Cemetery, located along Mill Creek near the grist mill he built. Construction of the mill led to the name of the creek being changed from Cherokee Creek to Mill Creek.

in the 1960s, Governor Harris' eroded cemetery land.

Attempts to save the historic Chickasaw leader's grave were chronicled in the July 17, 1960, issue of the Ada Evening News according to Mrs. Tate's notes. by reporter Eric Allen.

In 1827, Harris attended with Governor Harris' greatgrandson, the late Jack Penner, serving as his guide.

> The cemetery was situated on what is now the Penner Ranch. At the time, the remains of Governor Harris' home, a small log cabin, still stood on the property at the edge of a tree-lined meadow three miles west of the present town of Mill Creek. The cabin and surrounding area were once the center of the original Mill Creek, Chickasaw Nation townsite.

> The town of Mill Creek was moved to its present site, 3 miles east along State Highway 7, after the railroad was built in 1901, bypassing the original

> Governor Harris' burial place was north of the cabin. In 1960, it was overgrown with trees and knee-deep brush.

"You will find it hard to be-Harris' political career began lieve that one of those broken and lichen-covered tombstones marks the grave of Cyrus Harris," Allen reported in the **Ada Evening News** article.

At the time of the reporter's visit, the creek had cut into a corner of the graveyard and washed out a section of the old

The reporter speculated an abutment could be built to save this important burial site from being wiped out.

Fast forward about a year, and the reporter's pleas for preservation were answered when the Governor's remains were relocated.

In 2014, former tribal Judge Charles Tate shared notes his able man did not end with his late mother, Chickasaw Hall of Fame member Juanita Tate, had preserved about moving Governor Harris' body to Drake-Nebo Cemetery, located a few miles west of the original burial place.

About Drake-Nebo Cem-

Named for the surrounding communities, the rural Drake-Nebo Cemetery is the final resting place for several members of the Cyrus Harris family among its more than 500 gravesites.

The Harris family gravesite is in the middle section of the cemetery's west side. A wrought-iron gate surrounds the burial plot.

Also interred are five members of the Williams family who were killed by a tornado in 1917. A monument to the family, who had been buried in unmarked graves for many years, was erected.

The cemetery is located 6 miles south of Sulphur, off U.S. Highway 177, west on Goddard Road for 1 mile, then south 1.5 miles and west 1/4 mile.

About Penner Ranch

The oldest continuously family-owned business in Oklahoma, the Penner Angus Ranch can trace its roots to 1855, when Cyrus Harris founded the town of Mill Creek and began raising livestock, among many other business ventures.

Governor Harris' daughter, Amanda, married Felix Penner, a Texas native born to German immigrants, in 1891, according to Chickasaw Nation marriage

Mr. Penner expanded the livestock operations and introduced Angus cattle to the area in 1912. The ranch eventually contained 11,000 acres. Charles and his brother, Cyrus, continued the ranching operation after Felix Penner died in 1939.

In 1995, the ranch received an Oklahoma Centennial Farm and Ranch award. At the time, the Penner Trust owned the Penner Angus Ranch and developed it around the families original Chickasaw allotments.

The ranch is still in operation today as a cow-calf operation with Cyrus Harris' great-greatgrandson, Harris Penner, and his family at the helm.

"These are no relation (to the medical marijuana industry) but I'll do what I can," she said.

Garvin said there is a need for better regulation and a balance to the industry.

"I'm trying to learn all the things about cannabis and marijuana and CBD, and all the things, and try to find meaningful legislation that is proindustry, pro-manufacturing, and pro-economy, but also is still responsible legislation that is geared towards the medical side," Garvin said.

The senator said, however, that her concerns and the state's priorities towards medical marijuana may have to change.

'We do have a State Question we are looking at on the ballot probably in November — to create recreational marijuana, so that will change the whole scope of things if that goes through," she said.

mans for Sensible Marijuana Laws was submitted in July to the Secretary of State's office, which eventually verified that enough valid signatures, more than 160,000, had been obtained. The Secretary of State filed the petition creating State Question 820, and it now goes to the state Supreme Court.

The State Question, if approved, would legalize, regulate, and tax recreational marijuana usage for anyone over 21 years of age in Oklahoma. The state Supreme Court has not set a time line but is also tasked with determining whether enough signatures were obtained.

For now, the State has pulled the Oklahoma Medical Marijuana Authority out of the Oklahoma Department of Health, and they've worked on better regulating medical marijuana. Garvin said the move to pull OMMA from the Department A petition by the Oklaho- of Health will help those in the

Department to really focus on the regulatory side.

Garvin said, "Let's call a spade a spade: We have recreational marijuana in Oklahoma. If you have a paper cut you can get a card. I think what we will start to see is more of a push toward medical and with that

regulations getting clarified." One main topic will be clarifying the statutory definition of a school. She said the State needs to clarify this in order to keep these types of operations away from schools, churches and businesses.

She said there will also be more money from the State going to the Oklahoma State Bureau of Investigation to shut down illegal operations.

"Since this is the will of the people I will work on fixing this," Garvin said. "I will work with OMMA so that we have polices and procedures
