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

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

Teachers encouraged to apply for Colonial Williamsburg Teacher Institute

Applications are now available for Oklahoma fifth- and eighth-grade teachers interested in attending the 2023 Colonial Williamsburg Teacher Institute next summer in the restored capital city of 18th-century Virginia.

The fifth-grade institute is scheduled June 4-10, and the eighth-grade institute is scheduled June 11-17, 2023.

The Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence coordinates the selection of Oklahoma teachers to participate in the renowned teacher institute. Applications are being accepted through an online portal at www.ofe.org. Applications must be submitted by 5 p.m. Feb. 1, 2023.

The fellowships cover all program activities, airfare, lodging and most meals. Each teacher also receives a \$300 stipend for classroom materials.

While in Colonial Williamsburg, the world's largest living history museum, Oklahoma teachers will have the opportunity to meet character interpreters of 18th-century people and be immersed in early American history through hands-on activities and reenactments of historic events.

Participants also will meet daily with a Master Teacher to discuss interactive teaching techniques and develop creative lesson ideas based on their experiences.

"No textbook can replace the inspiration and knowledge gained by walking in the footsteps of early Americans, both famous and ordinary," said Teacher Institute alumna Linda Goodnight of Wewoka.

"Visualizing George Wash-

ington and his troops at Sur-render Field, debating in the very courtroom where Thomas Jefferson and Patrick Henry pled the cause of liberty, and learning to make rope by hand in Jamestown colony will ignite my teaching, and my students, forever," she said.

"The Colonial Williamsburg Teacher Institute is by far the finest, most comprehensive teacher training I have ever attended," Goodnight added. "I am a better American and a better teacher because of it."


Oklahoma's fifth-grade teacher institute is open to fifth-grade social studies/history teachers and resource teachers, such as school librarians or gifted-talented teachers, who plan to teach U.S. history in their schools in 2023-2024. Their sessions will focus on the daily life of colonial Virginians

Donald Sherman appointed to Bankers Council position

American Bankers Association (ABA) has selected Donald Sherman, CEO, McClain Bank, to serve on ABA's Community

Bankers Council.

Sherman attended the ABA Community Bankers Council meeting in Washington No-

vember 14-16.

Bankers had discussions on the impacts of mid-term elections results, legislative priorities for the new Congress, debit and credit card interchange, data aggregation, P2P payments liability, cannabis banking, ECORA, NSF fees, central bank digital currency and other deposit substitution threats, and bank ownership changes.

Council members also had a chance to share ways rising rates and inflation have affected the business of banking, and exchange ideas on operational and business best practices.

"Community banks play such an important role in our banking industry," Sherman said.

"This appointment gives me the opportunity to represent Oklahoma and advocate for the continued success of America's hometown banks."

and the transition from subject to citizen that occurred during the Revolutionary War period. Teachers will be immersed in content and hands-on activities that highlight the stories of the people who lived and worked in 18th-century Williamsburg.

Oklahoma eighth-grade classroom teachers who will teach U.S. history as part of their social studies curriculum can apply for fellowships to attend the Teacher Institute's program for secondary teachers.

Their sessions will examine how the concept of American identity began in the colonial period and continues to evolve and transform with each generation. Through inquiry-based analysis of

primary sources, teachers will explore how that identity influenced American citizens to shape and change the Republic through the 1860s.

The fellowships are available to public and private school teachers. The Teacher Institute requires participants to be fully COVID-19 vaccinated prior to attendance.

Participants are asked to share materials, skills and experiences with fellow teachers through two workshops or in-service programs upon their return from the institute.

The Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence has coordinated Oklahoma's participation in the Colonial Williamsburg Teacher Institute since 1993. The program is made possible through the leadership and

support of the late Oklahoma City businessman Edward C. Joullian III, who was an active supporter and former board member of the Colonial Williamsburg Foundation.

Joullian was also a trustee of the Oklahoma Foundation for Excellence, a nonprofit organization that recognizes and encourages academic excellence in Oklahoma's public schools. Joullian's family, along with a group of loyal donors, continues to support the fellowship program, which has served 922 Oklahoma teachers to date.

Cole, Lucas to be chairmen

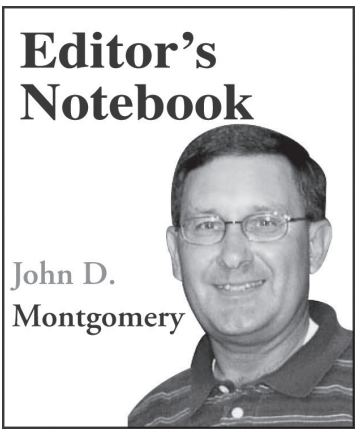
The shift in power of the House of Representatives means a monumental shift in the power of the Oklahoma Delegation including our very own congressman Tom Cole.

Cole is in line to assume the chairmanship of the powerful Rules Committee.

Couple that with him being the senior member of the Appropriations Committee where he will have extensive clout.

But Cole isn't the only Oklahoma Congressman set to chair a House Committee.

He has been in congress since 2003.

Lucas has been serving in the house even longer having first stepped into the chamber in 1994.

Back then he was representing the old Oklahoma sixth district.

Hopefully the two leaders will be in positions to help not only the country but Oklahoma as well.

Update from the Capitol

I hope everyone had a blessed and safe Thanksgiving with loved ones.

While it can be a hectic holiday between knocking out the grocery list, getting the house ready for company, and traveling to visit with other friends and family, it is such a special time.

Hopefully, you also took some time to relax and reflect on this past year and all the wonderful things in your life.

We haven't had much of a break at the Capitol, however, as we continue preparing for the upcoming session. On November 16, which was Statehood Day and Oklahoma's 115th birthday, half the Senate members took their oaths of office, including eight new senators. This is a great group of people with expertise in various areas that will greatly benefit our work in the Legislature; and I'm looking forward to getting to know them better and working with them on legislation.

This past week, members have been relocating and

moving into their new offices. Luckily, I'll be staying on the second floor. We enjoy this quiet hallway but hope you'll drop by if you're ever at the Capitol.

We also had our caucus retreat and re-elected our President Pro Tempore Greg Treat of Oklahoma City, who will continue serving as the leader of the Senate for the two sessions of the 59th Legislature. We also elected a new caucus chair and vice chair as well as a majority whip.

The Democratic Caucus will be announcing their leadership team closer to session. Later this week, the pro tem will announce the committee chairs and vice chairs and we'll then receive our committee assignments in the next couple of weeks.

The bill request deadline is also around the corner on Friday, December 9. If we want to file bills for the upcoming session, we have to submit a request for each bill to staff.

Because this is the beginning of a new Legislature with dif-

ferent members, none of the bills from the 2022 regular session will carry over to the 2023 session, although you may notice familiar language as members often times will copy it from one measure to another in the hopes of getting it to the governor's desk.

Getting bills through the process is not an easy task, and it can take two or three years for an idea to finally garner enough support to get signed into law.

Again, if you have any questions or concerns that could be addressed through legislation, please let me know so I can review those issues. Also, if you have an idea for a new law, I'd love to hear it. The clock is ticking, and we need to figure out what issues we're going to focus on this session, so please contact me as soon as possible.

Another expensive holiday season

For the second year in a row, Americans will experience the most expensive holiday season on record as inflation remains at a 40-year high. While this was first felt while celebrating Thanksgiving last week, unfortunately it does not look like our economic hardships will improve during the rest of this year.

According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, prices increased at an annual rate of 7.7 percent in October. More specifically, the price of turkey is up 21 percent, stuffing mix is up 69 percent, pumpkin pie mix is up 18 percent and dinner rolls are up 22 percent. This makes it significantly harder for families to put a holiday meal on the table.

In fact, according to a recent Morning Consult poll, nearly 40 percent of Americans plan to ease this financial burden by reducing their holiday meals and cutting out some side dishes.

Additionally, because Democrats have significantly slowed

down U.S. energy production, the cost for Americans to travel and visit their families is higher than ever before. In fact, the price of gasoline is up 17.5 percent while airfare is up almost 43 percent.

A sign pointing toward more economic downturn is that seasonal hires this year for the holiday shopping season have already decreased 37 percent compared to last November. Corporations and small businesses' inability to fully staff up will not only be more disastrous for our economy, but also shows our nation's recession is crushing America's job creators.

Also, more than half of U.S. CEOs recently surveyed by CNBC are considering layoffs because of the recession, leaving nearly 40 percent of Americans worried about losing their jobs.

While this should be a season of thankfulness, giving and time with family and loved ones, many Americans are worried about the future of their jobs and income.

Democrats unfortunately remain focused on the wrong things as unaffordable prices continue to hurt Americans and our businesses. However, now that Republicans have regained control of the House of Representatives, Democrats and President Joe Biden must come to the table and reach across the aisle on policies to rebuild our once strong economy and get America back on the right track.

Although this season is filled with financial struggles and worries of a slowing economy, it is possible to pump the brakes on Democrats' car of disastrous policies that has been moving full steam ahead the last two years.

An Example of an Egyptian Feminist for Iran Today

With all that is going on in our nation, it is understandable if you have not been paying attention to what is going on in Iran. However, it is something worth our attention.

Suffice to say that back in September, a 22-year-old woman named Mahsa Amini died in custody of the morality police for improperly wearing her hijab or head scarf. Her death has led to protests across Iran and a brutal crack-down from the government that has led to at least 300 deaths.

Historically speaking, this is not the first time women have protested the wearing of the hijab. Ironically, one of the most famous protests happened in Egypt in the 1920s. That protest was successful. Yet, one hundred years later, women are being forced again to make the same protests and this time with even greater risks to their lives.

Since Amini's death, other women have been arrested. Most notably, Elnaz Rekabi, an elite Iranian competitive climber, was arrested after she returned from a climbing competition in Seoul where she did not wear her hijab as required of Iranian women competing abroad. After not being seen for about two weeks, she emerged only to report that it was an accident that she did not wear her hijab, stating it got tangled during her climb, so she took it off.

Then there are women like Oscar-winning actress Taraneh Alidoosti, who posted a picture of herself unveiled to show support for the movement. What all these women are doing is brave, considering the cruelty of the regime. They are gaining more support for their cause, and even more are standing on the shoulders of giants who have come before them.

Next year will be the 100-year anniversary of arguably the most famous feminist event in the Middle East. Huda Sharawi was born in Egypt in 1879 to a prominent family. Though she was married at age 13 against her will, her husband, Ali Sharawi, was a nationalist who helped lead the fight against England for independence, a cause that was important to Huda as well. When Ali, who was several years her senior, died, Huda turned her attention to women's equality.

The early years of the twentieth century brought a great deal of change for women. Egypt, wanting to fit into the West, was attempting to modernize and so was opening the door for women's rights. Egypt was suddenly open to women's education and allowed them to not only attend schools at all levels but also form intellectual societies which published dozens of new journals dedicated to the advancement of women. Two of the most important groups were the Intellectual Association of Egyptian Women and the Egyptian Feminist Union, both founded by Sharawi.

In the beginning Sharawi's principal fight was against England. Her husband was a founding member of the Waft Party, which was fighting for independence. Wanting to get involved in the fight and being inspired by international women, Sharawi organized the "March of Veiled Women" through the streets of Cairo, one of the largest anti-colonization marches in Egypt. She then organized the Wafdist Women's Central Committee, which she served as president.

In 1922, England folded to pressure and granted Egypt its independence, even though not full control. The Waft Party then took power of the government. Although women were instrumental in the success of the Waft Party, the women found there was no room for them at the seat of power. Discouraged by the lack of freedom for women that came from liberation, Sharawi organized the Egyptian Feminist Union in 1923 and turned her efforts towards women's suffrage.

In 1923 Sharawi's husband died, granting her a certain amount of freedom. That year she attended a women's conference in Rome, and on her return, she decided on an act of defiance that became symbolic for Islamic women everywhere. When she and her companions disembarked from the train, they stood on the station platform and removed their veils. They could not claim to be free anywhere if they were not free at home. She started a movement of women wearing the hijab only if they wanted out of religious devotion, not because of law or custom.

Sharawi would go on to bring about many reforms in Egypt for women. In fact, from the 1930s to the 1960s, it became unfashionable to wear a hijab in public in many Middle Eastern nations. Fashion for both men and women became much closer to American styles than what we tend to associate with the Middle East.

It was not until the 1970s that hijabs were seen in public

Universal blood type impacted due to supply chain issues

Oklahoma Blood Institute is losing hundreds of O negative blood units a month due to recent blood bag shortages. O negative is the only universal blood type, which means it can be transfused into any blood recipient regardless of blood type. Blood bags are essential to draw blood from a donor. Without them, OBI is struggling to collect enough O negative blood, and more donors must be recruited to make up for the productivity losses and ensure patient needs are met. Due to its universality, O negative blood is by far the most in-demand type used by area hospitals. This urgent supply chain issue will impact area hospitals' ability to care for patients such as trauma patients, premature babies and immune-deficient newborns unless more O negative donors step up to donate blood. "O negative donations are a backbone of our collection," said Dr. John Armitage, president and CEO of Oklahoma Blood Institute. "When we need to collect these units,

we put our emergency response capabilities at risk." These supply chain issues have exacerbated an already tenuous situation as OBI enters the holiday season. "Donation rates around the holidays are typically lower, and we're fighting with a hand tied behind our back," said Armitage. "The supply chain foul ups aren't likely to get better anytime soon. Broken manufacturing and delivery pipelines are never good, but in the blood world they put lives and patient care at risk," he said. To get the O negative blood supply back in a healthy range, we need more members of our community to respond by giving blood today. Donating blood takes about an hour and can save up to three lives. 16-year-olds must weigh at least 125 pounds and provide signed parental permission; 17-year-olds must weigh at least 125 pounds; 18+ year-olds must weigh at least 110 pounds. Family Time gets up in last strides to win

It was an all-musical exacta to conclude the races Tuesday as Family Time, a horse co-owned by Country Grammy Award-winning artist Toby Keith, just got up in the final jumps to beat a horse named Hailey's Melody.

Hailey's Melody, trained by Joe Offolter and ridden by Gerardo Mora, had won three of her last four starts in wire-to-wire fashion, and she tried to push that up to four, but Family Time had other thoughts.

That 4-year-old filly by Not This Time (Giant's Causeway), out of the Rockport Harbor mare Royale Harbor, came flying down the stretch to engage the front-runner and the two went at it all the way to the wire. In the end, the filly owned by Country Bro Stables (Danny Caldwell and Toby Keith) of Shady Point, Okla., edged away for the victory.

The final margin of victory for the 1-mile, 70-yard race was a half-length. Family Time, sent off as the 3-1 betting favorite, covered the distance in 1:43.50 over a fast track.

Hailey's Melody (6-1) set early fractions of :24.86 for the first quarter-mile, :49.36 for the half-mile, 1:14.41 for three-quarters of a mile and 1:39.53 for the mile.

The two of them were another four lengths ahead of third-place finisher Missyintomis-chief (9-2).

Jockey Weston Hamilton was aboard the winner for trainer Federico Villafranco. Family Time won her second race in a row at Remington Park in this field of 3-year-olds-and-older, fillies and mares, racing under third-level allowance conditions.

Family Time earned \$21,627 from the \$36,300 purse and improved lifetime to 28 starts, five wins, two seconds and three thirds for a bankroll of \$222,308. Her last race in the two-race skein came on the grass at one mile, showing her versatility.

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OSDH shares food safety tips

Every year, approximately one in six Americans become ill with a foodborne illness, according to the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

The symptoms usually include nausea, vomiting and/or diarrhea, all of which are unwelcome at the holidays. To prevent illness, the Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) reminds everyone to practice food safety when preparing food for the upcoming holidays.

Follow these food safety tips to prepare meals and keep gatherings free of foodborne illness:

- **Clean:** Wash hands with soap and warm water for 20 seconds before, during and after handling food. Wash cutting boards, dishes, utensils and counter tops with hot soapy water after preparing each food item and before you go on to the next food.

- **Separate:** Germs that cause illness can spread from raw food to other foods. Use separate cutting boards and keep raw meats

and their juices away from fruits and vegetables.

- **Cook:** Always check the internal temperature of cooked meat, poultry and egg dishes with a food thermometer to ensure the food is cooked to a safe temperature. For more information, please visit the Safe Minimum Cooking Chart.

- **Chill:** Be safe with leftovers. Refrigerate leftover foods promptly. When foods are left out unrefrigerated, harmful germs multiply quickly. Discard any food left out more than two hours.

- **Illness:** Anyone who has been sick with diarrhea or vomiting should not prepare food for at least 24 hours after symptoms have stopped.

Tips for Preparing and Reheating Turkey:

- **Thaw:** Allow enough time for a frozen turkey to defrost. Turkey, thawed incorrectly, may look safe to eat but will be undercooked, allowing illness-causing germs to survive inside. For more information about how to properly thaw a turkey based on weight and time in the refrigerator, in cold water, or using the microwave, please visit Safe Holiday Cooking.

- **Cook:** Use a meat thermometer to ensure the internal temperature of the turkey is at least 165 degrees Fahrenheit. For stuffed turkeys, the internal temperature of the stuffing must reach 165 degrees before it is safe to eat; however, the safest way to cook stuffing is to cook in a separate casserole dish.

- **Store:** After preparing the meal, refrigerate remaining foods and leftover turkey within two hours. Eat leftover turkey, stuffing and gravy within three to four days. Reheat leftover gravy to a rolling boil, and thoroughly reheat other leftovers to 165 degrees.

Selecting and keeping your Christmas tree looking its best

The hunt for the perfect tree is oftentimes an important part of family tradition. Buy local whenever possible by supporting local Christmas tree growers.

Purchasing locally grown trees also reduces the risk of spreading unwanted pests into your landscape. Your local University Extension Service and Department of Natural Resources provide updates on any threats.

Family tradition may dictate your tree choice. Many prefer the fragrance of balsam fir and needle retention of other firs like Fraser, white, Grand, and Noble.

Though not a true fir, Douglas fir needles have a wonderful aroma when crushed.

White pine lacks the fragrance that many prefer. Its pliable branches only support lightweight ornaments, but the soft needles have less bite than the popular Scots or Scotch pine. This evergreen has stiff branches that support heavier ornaments and its needles hold even when dry.

Check for freshness. A fresh tree will last throughout the holidays. Run your hand along the stem. The needles should be pliable yet firmly attached to the branch.

Avoid trees with lots of moss, lichens, vines, broken branches, and other signs of poor care.

Look at the overall shape and size of the tree. Stand the tree upright to make sure it will fit in the allotted space. Check the trunk. It should be straight and the base small enough to fit in your tree stand.

Make a fresh cut, removing at least an inch from the base of the trunk before setting it in the stand. Straight or diagonal cuts work equally well.

A diagonal or V-shaped cut may make it difficult to properly support the tree in the stand.

Proper watering is key. Fill the stand with water and check it often. Fresh trees can absorb as much as 2 quarts of water in the first 24 hours. Keeping your tree stand filled with water is the best way to keep your tree looking its best throughout the season.

Once your tree is in place, you can add lights and decorations. Then take time throughout the busy holiday season to relax with your favorite winter beverage and enjoy the beauty of your Christmas tree.

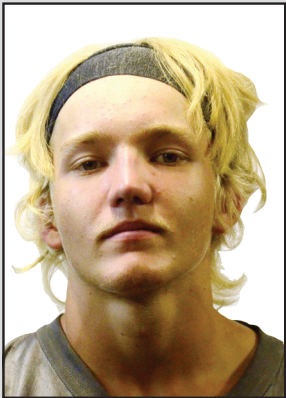

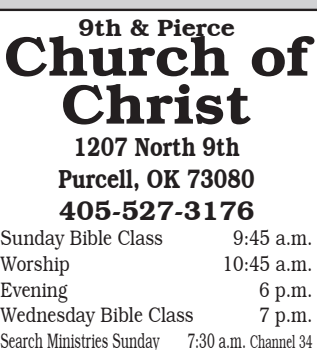

Thanksgiving 1997

In August of 1997, we started writing for my hometown paper in LaGrange, Ga. We are currently celebrating our 25th year of sending columns and stories back home. When Grandma, Zonabelle Miller, was alive up to 2003, she would always say that opening the newspaper every week and seeing our column there was like getting a letter from home. I never forgot that, and I was thankful that it made her day to see it like clockwork.

The first Thanksgiving that rolled around I thought of a story involving my grandma and Preacher Miller, the love of her 93 years. Almost every Thanksgiving since those early years I have sent this column back over the rolling Mississippi down to Georgia, and I have for more than a decade sent it over the Red River, too, to all of you friends in Oklahoma. So, again, according to our Thanksgiving tradition, and in celebration of the 25th Thanksgiving many readers and I have shared together, let's go back again to, 'Preacher Miller Walked the Walk.'

There's just something special about Thanksgiving, isn't there! The mood seems to stick to you kind of like that turkey and dressing. It's one of those holidays that last far beyond that special Thursday every year. We seem to write about Thanksgiving all the way through the holiday season into the next year.

A Thanksgiving never comes around that I don't think about my grandfather, E.H. Miller. "Preacher Miller" was an old-time, tell-it-like-it-is, back-to-the-basics church of Christ preacher. He preached a great

many sermons in his days. But one of the best sermons of his life wasn't one he preached. It was one he lived!

In the mid 60s, Preacher Miller, Grandma, and some friends got in a bad car accident driving home from a revival in Marietta, Ga. Two cars were drag racing that night on the two-lane Atlanta highway, and Preacher Miller, who was driving, met the car in his lane when he topped a hill.

"It happened so fast," he later would say, "that we didn't even have time to swerve."

I still remember the phone ringing late that night at our little house on Juniper Street. The news wasn't good for anyone, but the four in Granddad's car were the fortunate ones.

Those riding with the preacher had numerous injuries, but Preacher Miller was hurt the worst. The impact was so great that his shoe melted to the gas pedal, and the workers had to pull his foot out of his shoe to get him and his broken hip out of the burning car.

The doctor did all he could for the preacher for several days, but one morning he walked into the LaGrange, Georgia hospital room and delivered the news: "Preacher Miller," he said, "I'm sorry, but I don't think you'll ever walk again."

The preacher didn't buy it. He said, "Doctor, you, me, and the Lord can do better than that."

In a month he was walking, and preaching, on crutches. In three months he was walking with a walker. In six he walked, period. Just with a limp.

While he was a man of great faith, he also became discour-

aged often during his rehabilitation. One day when he was really feeling sorry for himself, he started wheeling through the hospital, looking around. He was surprised by what he saw.

He saw a man who was missing a leg. He saw another who couldn't get out of bed. He saw one he knew likely would not see many more sunsets. So, he went back to his room that day and gave thanks. I guess that was a "thanksgiving day" for the preacher.

He never took walking for granted again. As soon as he was well enough, he walked stairs almost every day for the rest of his life. And that was back when walking really wasn't the "in" thing.

Walking stairs, of course, isn't something you can do at home. So, every day he'd go out and find one of the tallest buildings in his hometown; and there he'd walk the stairs. It was a place he attended daily as part of his preaching visits anyway, and it was a place where he could go and never feel sorry for himself. He had always tried that.

So, he would go to that very place where the doctor had told him soberly, 'Preacher Miller, you'll never walk again,' And the preacher of faith had replied just as confidently, "Doc, you, me, and the Lord can do better than that." Yes, he would go every day and walk those tall steps up at the LaGrange hospital. I am sure he never walked them when he did not give thanks all along the way. It was a special place, a place he learned to walk the walk, even if it now was with a little bit of a limp.

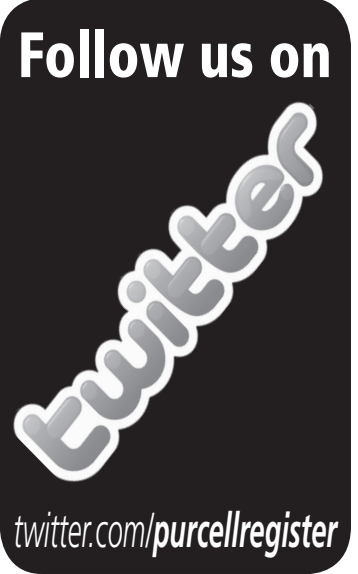

§ 106-405 Junk Vehicle on Private Property Prohibited.

No person in charge or control of any property within the city, whether as owner, tenant, occupant, lessee, or otherwise, shall allow any partially dismantled, non-operating, wrecked, junked, or unlicensed vehicle to remain on such property longer than seven days and no person shall leave any such vehicle on any property within the city for a longer time than seven days.

This section shall not apply with regard to a vehicle in an enclosed building, a vehicle on the premises of a business enterprise operated in a lawful place and manner when necessary to the operation of such business enterprise, or a vehicle in an appropriate storage place or depository maintained in a lawful place and manner by the city.
