Schools forced to turn to virtual learning Tuesday

Thunder sleet caused heavy icing of streets, highways and exposed surfaces Monday in Central Oklahoma and across

many areas of the state.

The massive sleet storm forced the closing of many schools and businesses with the area getting a 1/4" of ice to 1/2" in some areas.

Travel was impaired and schools were closed on Tuesday with many going to virtual learning.

The lightning that accompanied the sleet caused a grass fire on In-

terstate 35 at mile marker 90.5 that was put out by Purcell Firefighters.

David Childress works every day from 7:30 in the morning until the Washington School Campus is cleared of students and faculty and he watches over every home high school sporting event.

But he said he really doesn't have a job.

"If you have a love for it, it's not a job," the affable McClain County Sheriff's Lieutenant says with a smile.

He's the School Resource Officer for Washington Schools and is supervisor for all the School Resource Officers on campus at Dibble, Wayne and Mid-America Technology Center.

Childress began his sheriff's department career right where he is now.

"I worked there four years," he said. "All the kids that were in elementary school back then are in high school or have graduated."

That was 2013 with 22 years of police work in the rearview mirror.

The 1996 high school graduate has two science degrees from Oklahoma State University.

So why not a career in science instead of policing?

"I didn't like science," he said with a chuckle.

Childress has logged time with the Ardmore Police Department, Lone Grove's Police Department and as a State Parks Ranger.

He also is an alumni of Wadley's EMS.

As the School Resource Officer, Childress goes from building to building depending on the time of day.

"I visit with teachers and principals and address anything the kids might need like if they are having problems at home or with other students," he said. "I drive around campus several times a day going

Blood supply dangerously low

As winter weather began moving in earlier last week, blood donors began cancelling appointments and blood drives were delayed, forcing an already struggling blood supply to critically low levels. Our Blood Institute (OBI) in Oklahoma is asking donors to reschedule appointments as the weather clears. OBI says a significant number of appointments across its nine donor centers in Oklahoma were cancelled. Before yesterday’s storm, donations were already down from expected collections. OBI typically has a three- to five-day supply of blood available but is well below that level now. This could impact hospital needs.

All successful donors through February will also receive an alien themed “Save the Humans” T-shirt. OBI needs 1,200 blood donations each day to maintain an ample supply of blood for state hospitals. OBI provides more than 90 percent of Oklahoma’s blood supply to more than 160 hospitals and medical facilities. “January is always a difficult time as blood donations typically slow, and the winter weather is magnifying the problem,” said John Armitage, M.D., OBI president and CEO. “Since the start of the year, blood donations are suffering substantially, and fewer people are donating. We need the public to step up and help secure their community blood supply.”

Anyone who is healthy and 16 years old or older can donate. Sixteen-year-olds must weigh at least 125 pounds and provide signed parental permission; 17-year-olds must weigh at least 125 pounds; individuals over the age of 18 must weigh at least 110 pounds. Photo ID required. Blood can be donated every 56 days. Platelets can be donated as often as every seven days, up to 24 times a year. “Blood has no substitute,” Armitage said. “Patients across the state rely on blood products to fight cancer, survive trauma and heal after childbirth. Blood donation takes about an hour and can save up to three lives.” Appointments to donate can be made online at obi.org or by calling 877-340-8777.

Registration is from 8-8:45 a.m. Attendees must have a photo ID and Voter ID card to register. Attending a Precinct meeting is the first step in selecting delegates who will attend the County and State Conventions. The McClain County Republican Convention will be held immediately following the Precinct Meeting. The County Convention convenes at 10 a.m. and will adjourn at 12 p.m. A

\$5 fee will be charged to delegates attending the County convention. The State Convention is Friday and Saturday, May 5 and 6, with the location to be announced by the Oklahoma State GOP office. In announcing these meetings, the McClain County Republican County Chairman Paul Maus said, “A person must be a registered Republican voter of the precinct to take part in a precinct meeting and to serve as a delegate to the Republican County and State convention. Others are most welcome to attend the meeting to view but cannot vote. “These meetings are informative with time allowed for discussing problems at the local, state, and national levels and to elect precinct and county positions,” he concluded. The Newcastle Storm Shelter is located at 851 North Carr Drive, in Newcastle. Please note: February 25 has been reserved as a backup date in case of severe weather. A notice will be published on the “McClain County Republican Party” Facebook page if rescheduled.

Voter application deadline nearing For the State Question Special Election

February 10 is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the March 7 State Question Special Election. That’s the word from McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley. Haley said persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma and at least 17 ½ years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote. Applications must be received by the county election board or postmarked no later than midnight February 10. Applications postmarked after that time will be accepted, but will not be processed until after the special election. Applications may also be submitted to any motor vehicle agency that is also

an official voter registration agency by the submission deadline. Applicants will be notified in writing when their application has been processed. Approved voters will receive a Voter Identification Card in the mail. Some may receive a letter that explains the reason or reasons the application was not approved. Haley said those who do not receive a response within 30 days of submitting their application should contact the election board office immediately. Voter applications must be approved by the county election board secretary. Registered voters who have moved to McClain County from a different county or state will need to complete a new Voter Registration Application in order to be

eligible for elections in McClain County. If you have moved within the county and need to update your address, you may make changes online using the OK Voter Portal at oklahoma.gov/elections/ovp or complete a Voter Registration Application. Applications can be downloaded from the state election board website at oklahoma.gov/elections. You may also complete a form at your county election board. Most post offices, tag agencies and public libraries have applications available upon request. The McClain County Election Board is located at 121 N 2nd Avenue and is open from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., Monday through Friday. For questions, please contact the election board at (405) 527-3121 or mcclain-county@elections.ok.gov.

Early voting begins February 9

Early voting begins Thursday, February 9, for voters in McClain County. Voters who will not be able to make it to the polls on Election Day, have the option of voting early at the McClain County Community Center, 1721 Hardcastle Blvd., in Purcell. McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley said early voting is open to all voters. “You do not need to provide an excuse to vote early. Oklahoma allows early voting for all elections conducted through the State Election Board—from school board and municipal elections to state and federal elections. This is a great option for those who will be out of town on Election Day or who want to avoid long lines,” Haley said. Early voting is available Thursday, February 9, and Friday, February 10, from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. at the McClain County Community Center.

Annual voter registration statistics released

An official voter registration report by the Oklahoma State Election Board shows 2,225,086 people are registered to vote as of January 15. The annual report comes days after the State Election Board conducted its statutorily-required voter list maintenance process, removing inactive voters and duplicate voters. Current numbers show Republicans make up 51.9 percent of registered voters, while Democrats constitute 29.5 percent of the voting population. Libertarians consist of 0.9 percent of the voter registration rolls and Independents account for nearly 17.7 percent. The routine voter list maintenance process was conducted on January 13 and removed 2,855 duplicate voter registrations and 83,719 inactive voter registrations from Oklahoma’s voter rolls. The removal of inactive and duplicate voter registrations is a thorough, multi-step process the State Election Board is required by law to conduct

every two years following a General Election. Duplicate registrations that were deleted matched newer registrations by the same person at a new address. Inactive registrations that were removed were for voters who failed to confirm their address in 2019 and then had no voter activity through the 2022 General Election. The 2019 Address Confirmation Notices were sent to some voters for one of several different reasons required by law, including those who surrendered an Oklahoma driver license upon being issued a new one in another state, or who had a first-class mailing from the Election Board returned as “undeliverable,” or who were identified as a potential duplicate of a voter registration in another county or state, or who had no voter activity from the 2016 General Election through the 2018 General Election. The State Election Board reminds voters that the dead-

line to register or update their registration for the March 7 election is Friday, February 10. Applications must be postmarked or received by the deadline. New 3D interactive table brings learning to life at MATC

Students in the health and related classes at Mid-America Technology Center can now tap, swipe, and drag their fingertips across the surface on a touch-screen table or tablet for realistic anatomy instruction.

This device, which comes from the company Anatomage, provides fully interactive individual structures and systems that are reconstructed in accurate 3D rendering, featuring life-size digital replicas of humans and animals.

Students can view the whole system in its realistic complexity, or students can rotate, cross-section, and animate to learn how the various body systems work.

“The Anatomage Convertible Table will allow students to experience learning in an immersive virtual environment that simulates real-life scenarios and provides students with a greater understanding of concepts learned,” said Karen Hemmerling, MATC Director of Instruction. “We are very fortunate to offer this type of training to our students as it allows them to explore situations and problem-solve to determine best practices and solutions.”

This new piece of innovative technology provides a realistic life-sized 3D anatomy system as if the students were working with an actual cadaver.

OMRF receives \$3.4 million to study muscle loss in aging

The National Institutes of Health has awarded the Oklahoma Medical Research Foundation \$3.4 million to study age-related muscle atrophy and weakness.

The five-year grant follows a discovery by OMRF scientists Holly Van Remmen, Ph.D., and Jacob Brown, Ph.D., connecting age-related muscle loss called sarcopenia to a missing nerve signal.

Most people begin to experience progressive loss of muscle mass and strength in their 30s or 40s. The condition becomes more pronounced after age 65, leaving older people susceptible to falls and difficulty performing daily tasks.

“It’s just a natural process of aging, and some people lose more muscle mass and strength than others,” said Brown, a scientist in Van Remmen’s lab.

While inactivity is the most common contributor to sarcopenia, Van Remmen’s team has shown another cause: denervation, which is an interruption in communication with the nerves that connect muscles to the spinal cord.

In recent work published in the journal *Redox Biology*, Van

Remmen and Brown found that muscle makes a metabolite during denervation that leads to muscle atrophy. Metabolites are the products of chemical changes within a cell.

With the new grant, the researchers will study whether blocking the production of this metabolite protects against age-related muscle atrophy in research models.

“This is a novel area of research that we hope will lead to new possibilities to design much-needed pharmaceutical interventions,” said Van Remmen, who holds the G.T. Blankenship Chair in Aging Research. “Ultimately, we hope this path of research will extend the time that older adults can remain healthy and active.”

Without current drug options to treat sarcopenia, Van Remmen added that it’s important for older adults to ward off its progression by staying physically active and maintaining a healthy diet.

“Simple strength and resistance training paired with a diet that includes adequate amounts of healthy proteins can make a world of difference in maintaining muscle mass,” she said.

Chickasaw Lighthouse Dive Team completes open water certification

Braving frigid water temperatures of Lake Tenkiller, five Chickasaw Lighthouse Department officers obtained their basic open scuba water certification.

Oklahoma has numerous lakes, ponds, creeks and rivers that provide families with an array of watersports, including swimming, fishing, boating, kayaking and other activities.

With thousands of miles of shoreline, crime and accidents are sure to occur. The Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Dive Team is prepared to address these concerns, and much more.

“Recovery has become our main goal as a dive team,” said Daniel Cloud, investigator for Chickasaw Lighthouse Police. “Most of the time when we get called out, it is to recover items. This can be cars, criminal evidence or even people who have perished.”

Investigator Cloud was one of the five to obtain his basic open water certification, along with Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Officers Dakota Hanks, Austin Ahl, Jon Edwards and Sgt. Ryan Massengale.

The basic open water certification ensures the officers are confident in and around water. The basics of scuba diving are taught to new divers during certification. The course also refreshes certified seasoned divers’ training.

“It is our job to recover what’s been lost,” Investigator Cloud said. “Using a scientific process, we are trained to safely determine if something is within a body of water.”

The Chickasaw Lighthouse Department Dive Team was established in 2006. Lighthouse dive team members complete regular trainings and annual recertification to maintain proficiency in all aspects of water

recovery and rescue.

Using state-of-the-art techniques and equipment, the dive team performs water rescues and assists neighboring law enforcement agencies in recovery of victims, vehicles and evidence.

During the certification, Lighthouse divers were taught how to assemble and use basic scuba gear, manage buoyancy and handle common diving problems. Training is an important stage of preplanning for any dive. Preplanning prepares divers for the highest success rate when called out to a police investigation.

Most Oklahoma waters are considered “dark water” within the dive industry, meaning visibility is extremely poor. Divers are often not able to see anything more than 6 inches away from the face.

During training with indoor pools or other clear waters, dive trainers may duct tape goggles of trainees to simulate blackout conditions of the waters found in the field.

“I consider dark water as not being able to see my hand in front of my face,” Investigator Cloud said. “It is the equivalent of turning off the lights in your bedroom at night and trying to walk across the room.”

Safety is the most important reason for training. According to information from the U.S. Department of Justice, police divers agree the biggest danger is entrapment while underwater. Hypothermia is also a major concern, along with knowing how deep and long a diver can stay under water. Training builds confidence, translating into divers not panicking if serious situations occur.

In addition to search and rescue duties, dive team officers are accomplished investigators.

They retrieve evidence from Oklahoma’s waters, and like other investigators, they are trained how to collect and store evidence properly.

The dive team is one of two specialized teams within the Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department. There are currently six certified divers and one administrative officer who oversees the teams’ operations. As a specialty team within Lighthouse, officers who desire to become members of the dive team must first meet additional team requirements.

“It’s a challenge to be on the dive team,” Investigator Cloud said. “We have had officers who try out and realize they just aren’t comfortable not being able to see while under water. The nature of our work means we get called out during holidays, often during freezing temperatures. The dive team isn’t for everybody.”

It is considered an honor to be selected for the dive team. Dive team members come from all divisions within the police department. It requires a calm, collected personality to be submerged alone in Oklahoma’s cold, dark water diving conditions. Dive team members wear a special badge on their uniform designating them as divers.

“We are not trying to make a Navy SEAL, but we do have tryouts testing physical and mental toughness,” Investigator Cloud said. “We have (prospective) divers tread water, complete a 500-meter swim and pick up heavy objects from the bottom of the pool and bring them to the surface. It is challenging. We also test mental toughness while in the water. Divers must complete diving certifications, as well as an annual physical fitness test.”

Nine former Sooners played in NFL title games

The University of Oklahoma had more former players than any other NCAA program in the NFL’s Conference Championship games on January 29.

The National Football Conference (NFC) and American Football Conference (AFC) Championship Games had nine Sooner alumni on the gridiron.

The NFC championship game was headlined by former Oklahoma Heisman finalist Jalen Hurts as he led the No. 1 seed Philadelphia Eagles versus the No. 2 seed San Francisco 49ers. The now-MVP-finalist found out during his Wednesday press conference that he was named a finalist for the Most Valuable Player award.

“I didn’t know. I put the work in, it’s a cool honor. I don’t have much to say about it, I’m at a loss of words to be honest,” Hurts said.

He isn’t the only Sooner playing in the NFC title game. San Francisco tackle Trent Williams and Philadelphia tackle Lane Johnson were teammates at OU during the 2009 season. Both former Sooners were selected fourth overall in their respective NFL drafts and also named to the 2022-2023 NFL All-Pro Team.

Hurts and San Francisco’s rookie quarterback Brock Purdy were not unfamiliar with what the other could do. In 2019, Hurts and the No. 7 Sooners beat the Purdy-led Iowa State Cyclones 42-41. Hurts and Purdy combined for over 675 total yards along with 11 total touchdowns.

“You know obviously two different teams, two different times,” Hurts said. “I remember getting out early and then had like five touchdowns in the first

half. I think it was like 35-14 at halftime or something like that and then they ended up coming back.”

“It was a good game, I’m glad we won,” Hurts said.

In the AFC title game, the No. 1 seed Kansas City Chiefs went up against the No. 3 seed, Cincinnati Bengals, on GEHA Field at Arrowhead Stadium.

Former Oklahoma running backs Joe Mixon and Samaje Perine make up Cincinnati’s running back room. At Oklahoma, Perine set the NCAA record for most rushing yards in a single-game at 427 in November 2014 versus Kansas. Mixon and Perine were both chosen in the 2017 NFL draft and eventually became teammates again in Cincinnati in 2019.

Kansas City has four former Sooners: offensive linemen Creed Humphrey and Orlando “Zeus” Brown, long snapper James Winchester and tight end Blake Bell.

Bengals Head Coach Zac Taylor and San Francisco tight

end George Kittle have ties to Norman as they both graduated from Norman High School.

Oklahoma’s ties ran deep in Sunday’s conference championship games, but it wasn’t the only state with bragging rights.

The University of Michigan had the second-most players competing with seven. Among the seven is former Wolverine and now Super Bowl champion Brandon Graham.

Graham made a huge impact on Super Bowl LII, where the Eagles beat the Patriots. Graham had a drive-killing sack on Tom Brady that resulted in a turnover-on-downs with just over two minutes left.

The Philadelphia Eagles and Kansas City Chiefs will meet in Super Bowl LVII February 12 in Arizona.

Lexington Westside Church of Christ

‘It is the Lord’ gives us life’s best philosophy

(Part 4 of a sermon on ‘How Big is God!’ given at Lexington’s Westside Church of Christ, Dec., 2022)

Near morning – John writes as he begins his narrative in the 21st chapter of John – a shadowy figure appears on the shore of the sea where seven of the Lord’s disciples have fished all night. The unidentified figure calls out to those seven men working some hundred yards from shore: “Children, do you have anything to eat?” which we interpret as, “Have you fellows caught anything tonight for breakfast? They all answer that they had not caught a thing,” and we can imagine that it is with a tone of frustration. I cannot help but think that there is a hint of symbolism there regarding the state of our lives sometimes. We have all seen life’s nights when we endured all-night fishing trips without catching anything. You understand.

Just a note, while we’re here: Be assured that during those barren periods, the One who often works in mysterious ways will always come walking on the shore within shouting distance of our little boats. I say, ‘mysterious,’ and we remember the apostle’s great exclamation that “eye has not seen nor ear heard” what the Lord has done

for us” – or, in this case, what He is about to do for these seven men.

The shadowy figure on the shore hollers back for them to cast the net on the other side of the boat; and, when they obey Him, they draw a netful of fish, full to the brim. Amazingly, it does not break, even though it is too heavy for seven men to pull it into the boat. They immediately head to shore sluggishly pulling exactly 153 fish to shore – a number John includes in his narrative, for reasons that are probably grander than we could ever imagine.

In all His greatness and ‘bigness,’ God is still a God of precision and a God of little things. John, for his part, may have just been adding up just how great the miracle is that his Lord has just performed.

At first, the disciples do not recognize the Lord as he calls out to them in the twilight of the morning – except for one. Were we to guess which disciple guessed who that mysterious man is, we would likely first think of Peter – normally the most perceptive disciple in the group – but it is not Peter this time.

Perhaps his spiritual mind is still cloudy from his abject failure there in Caiphas’ hall only a few days before. It was

the lowest hour of Peter’s life, and it takes some time to recover from those hours.

The one who recognizes the Lord is the writer of this gospel. It is John, ‘the disciple whom Jesus loved.’ When John realizes who is standing there on the shore of that blessed sea, he hollers out something powerful and classic to the rest of his fisherman friends, and to us: “It is the Lord!” he exclaims.

Ah, what an astute observation! But it’s more than that: It is a philosophy by which to live. It is the vantage point from which every Christian and every man of faith learns to look at life, the more the further down the road we go.

The others’ blind eyes suddenly are opened to the great truth; and they all make their way to shore to see the Master, with Peter’s efforts surpassing them all. He dives into the water with a child’s eager enthusiasm. He swims to his Lord so he can beat them all, just as he had beaten John on that resurrection morning into the tomb of our Lord, though he was slower of foot.

He figures he can swim to shore faster than six men can row a boat with fishing gear and

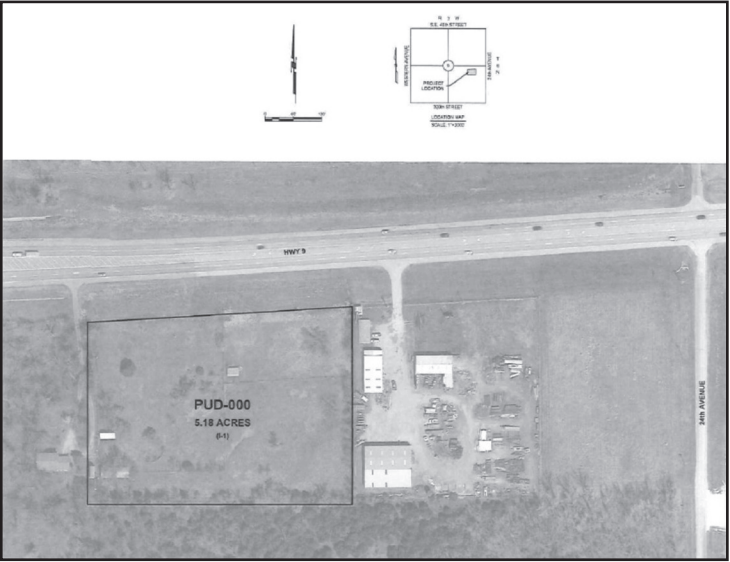

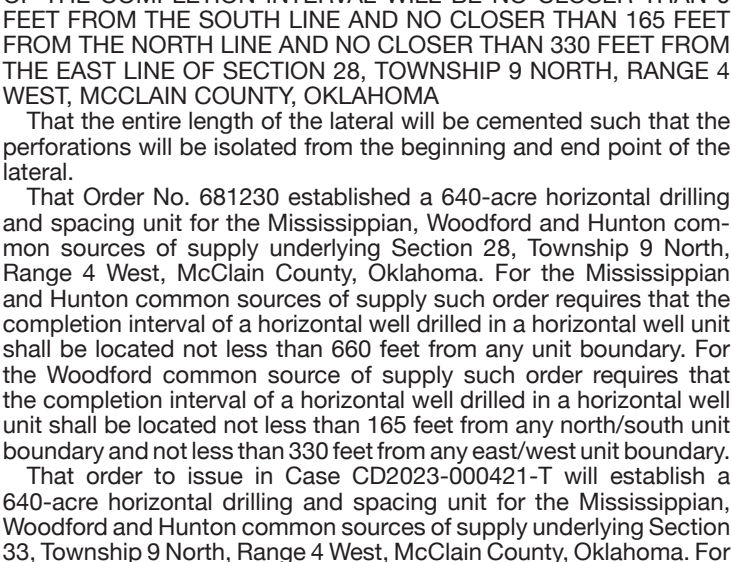
focusing on the positive things that winter has to offer, we can change our attitude of enduring winter to enjoying it.

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Chickasaw Lighthouse Dive Team completes open water certification

Braving frigid water temperatures of Lake Tenkiller, five Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department officers obtained their basic open scuba water certification.

Oklahoma has numerous lakes, ponds, creeks and rivers that provide families with an array of water sports, including swimming, fishing, boating, kayaking and other activities. With thousands of miles of shoreline, crime and accidents are sure to occur. The Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Dive Team is prepared to address these concerns, and much more.

“Recovery has become our main goal as a dive team,” said Daniel Cloud, investigator for Chickasaw Lighthouse Police. “Most of the time when we get called out, it is to recover items. This can be cars, criminal evidence or even people who have perished.”

Investigator Cloud was one of the five to obtain his basic open water certification, along with Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Officers Dakota Hanks, Austin Ahl, Jon Edwards and Sgt. Ryan Massengale.

The basic open water certification ensures the officers are confident in and around water. The basics of scuba diving are taught to new divers during certification. The course also refreshes certified seasoned divers’ training.

“It is our job to recover what’s been lost,” Investigator Cloud said. “Using a scientific process, we are trained to safely determine if something is within a body of water.”

The Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department Dive Team was established in 2006. Lighthouse dive team members complete regular trainings and annual recertification to maintain proficiency in all aspects of water recovery and rescue.

equipment, the dive team performs water rescues and assists neighboring law enforcement agencies in recovery of victims, vehicles and evidence.

During the certification, Lighthouse divers were taught how to assemble and use basic scuba gear, manage buoyancy and handle common diving problems. Training is an important stage of preplanning for any dive. Preplanning prepares divers for the highest success rate when called out to a police investigation.

Most Oklahoma waters are considered “dark water” within the dive industry, meaning visibility is extremely poor. Divers are often not able to see anything more than 6 inches away from the face.

During training with indoor pools or other clear waters, dive trainers may duct tape goggles of trainees to simulate blackout conditions of the waters found in the field.

“I consider dark water as not being able to see my hand in front of my face,” Investigator Cloud said. “It is the equivalent of turning off the lights in your bedroom at night and trying to walk across the room.”

Safety is the most important reason for training. According to information from the U.S. Department of Justice, police divers agree the biggest danger is entrapment while underwater. Hypothermia is also a major concern, along with knowing how deep and long a diver can stay under water. Training builds confidence, translating into divers not panicking if serious situations occur.

In addition to search and rescue duties, dive team officers are accomplished investigators. They retrieve evidence from Oklahoma’s waters, and like other investigators,

they are trained how to collect and store evidence properly.

The dive team is one of two specialized teams within the Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department. There are currently six certified divers and one administrative officer who oversees the teams’ operations. As a specialty team within Lighthouse, officers who desire to become members of the dive team must first meet additional team requirements.

“It’s a challenge to be on the dive team,” Investigator Cloud said. “We have had officers who try out and realize they just aren’t comfortable not being able to see while under water. The nature of our work means we get called out during holidays, often during freezing temperatures. The dive team isn’t for everybody.”

It is considered an honor to be selected for the dive team. Dive team members come from all divisions within the police department. It requires a calm, collected personality to be submerged alone in

Oklahoma’s cold, dark water diving conditions. Dive team members wear a special badge on their uniform designating them as divers.

“We are not trying to make a Navy SEAL, but we do have tryouts testing physical and mental toughness,” Investigator Cloud said. “We have (prospective) divers tread water, complete a 500-meter swim and pick up heavy objects from the bottom of the pool and bring them to the surface. It is challenging. We also test mental toughness while in the water. Divers must complete diving certifications, as well as an annual physical fitness test.”

About the Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department

“Lighthouse” is a historic name given by the Chickasaw, Choctaw, Cherokee, Muscogee and Seminole nations. Once removed to Indian Territory, these tribes created elite Lighthouse police to serve and protect their citizens.

The Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department was re-established in 2004.

It strives to protect the lives and property of the people served, reduce crime, preserve peace and provide a safe environment while working in partnership with local communities to enhance their quality of life.

“The Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department is the tribal law enforcement arm of the Chickasaw Nation,” Investigator Cloud said. “We serve as state, tribal and federal law enforcement within the counties of the Chickasaw Nation treaty territory.”

The treaty territory encompasses 7,648 square miles, including all or parts of 13 counties: Bryan, Carter, Coal, Garvin, Grady, Jefferson, Johnston, Love, Marshall, McClain, Murray, Pontotoc and Stephens. The Chickasaw Lighthouse Police Department is divided into three precincts: WinStar, Ada and Newcastle, where approximately 100 full-time sworn officers provide law enforcement services.

Five divisions and two specialized teams were

created to better serve citizens of the Chickasaw Nation and provide support to surrounding law enforcement communities. Divisions include patrol, K-9, criminal investigations, communications and professional standards. Special Weapons and Tactics (SWAT) and the dive team make up the special teams.

The SWAT and dive teams provide a vital asset to Oklahomans by providing resources during times of crisis. The teams were designed to assist within the Chickasaw Nation and in neighboring areas.

The SWAT team provides a ready response to tactical situations such as hostage situations, suicide interventions and other high-risk incidents. The dive team helps in recovery of victims, vehicles and/or evidence as well as water rescues.
