



## Purcell voters will decide school bond

### August 27 Student safety projects proposed

Purcell Public School patrons will have a chance to vote August 27 for a \$19.465 million bond proposal to improve student safety across the District.

If passed, the bond will allow the District to construct tornado shelters at the Elementary School and the Intermediate School. Those shelters will double as classrooms.

“We saw an opportunity to do safe rooms at other buildings,” Purcell Schools Superintendent Dr. Sheli McAdoo said. “We saw we could add

# Bomb scare halts Flyer

## Officials investigate after ticking heard in luggage

When The Heartland Flyer Amtrak train stopped at the Purcell Depot Monday morning passengers and crew members did not expect what happened next.

Due to a “loud ticking” noise from a luggage compartment, officials contacted Purcell first respond-

ers who called on the Oklahoma Highway Patrol Bomb Squad to investigate.

The normal five minute stop turned into a three hour delay that included bus rides to Purcell High School by Purcell buses.

## Pursuit ends here

### After break-in near Maysville

A pursuit out of Garvin County that started at a marijuana grow near Maysville ended at Jackson and Green Avenue in Purcell early Sunday morning.

That's reportedly when the vehicle carrying up to five suspects from a break-in and burglary of the grow facility sustained a flat tire. They ditched the vehicle after striking a stop sign at the intersection and fled on foot.

The incident prompted an emergency message for Purcell residents to remain in their homes with the doors and windows locked.

Reportedly, two of the suspects called for an Uber to pick them up at Mazzio's in Purcell. When the Uber arrived, law enforcement arrested the two men. There were reports of up to five suspects but officials in Maysville and the Garvin County Sheriff's were unavailable for comment.

## Growing marijuana concerns

Grow operations targeted by thieves in area towns

Sunday Garvin County units were dispatched to a grow operation near Maysville.

Suspects fled the scene and ended up ditching their vehicle at Jackson and Green Avenue in Purcell early Sunday morning.

Garvin County units were reportedly in pursuit.

An alert was issued to Purcell residents to remain sheltered with their doors and windows locked.

Some of the suspects have been apprehended.

Last week, deputies from the Cleveland County Sheriff's Office (CCSO) arrested two

suspects who were caught fleeing the scene of a burglary at a grow operation near Noble.

On July 11, just before 3 a.m., CCSO dispatch received a call from an alarm company reporting live camera footage of two male suspects attempting to break into a grow operation on Banner Road. The company also observed two vehicles on the property, a white four-door Toyota sedan and a brown Kia Soul. When deputies arrived, the Toyota was gone, but the Kia Soul was parked on the west side of the building with occupants inside.

When the first deputy and a Noble Police Department patrol unit arrived on the scene, the occupants of the Kia Soul began to drive forward. Despite the deputy's verbal commands to stop, they chose to continue and fled the scene. A pursuit ensued, as the driver accelerated past marked patrol units traveling north.

Near Cemetery Road the driver headed east, at which point a CCSO deputy engaged in a Tactical Vehicle Intervention (TVI) maneuver, ending the pursuit.

Once the car was stopped, the passenger, identified as Devante Houston, exited the vehicle and attempted to flee the scene, after a brief foot pursuit, he was arrested by Noble Police Officers. The driver, Kyron Thompson, was arrested on scene.

The vehicle was impounded and placed on investigative hold. Both, Houston and Thompson were transported to the Cleveland County Detention Center without incident.

Houston is charged with burglary in second degree, conspiracy, possession of burglary implements and obstruction. Thompson is charged with burglary in second degree, conspiracy and eluding.

## Free meals for Lex students

Administrators hope students will utilize the program

Lexington Public Schools will participate in a program which will allow free breakfasts and lunches for every student, regardless of income levels.

Lexington schools has accepted Community Provision status for Child Nutrition.

Beginning this fall, all students are eligible for free meals during the school year.

The key to the program working though is students taking advantage of it.

"If we can get participation up (from students) it will help us," said Lexington Schools Superintendent Chad Hall. "If people don't normally eat a school lunch or breakfast and they choose to participate it will help out the program."



The more students who eat free breakfasts and lunches through the school, the more money the school will get to defray their costs of child nutrition.

The State of Oklahoma has granted initial approval of the program at Lexington for four

years. Hall said the District will review the program and how it's working after each year.

"I hope it can be permanent," he said. "We were glad to be able to do it and it will go as far as people support it."

## National School Lunch Program

Washington, Purcell, Wayne, Dibble, Lexington and Wanette Public Schools have announced their policy for free and reduced-price

meals for children served under the National School Lunch Program and School Breakfast Program.

Local school officials have adopted income criteria and household size for determining eligibility.

Children from households whose income is at or below the qualifying levels are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. Application forms are being sent to all homes with a letter to parents or guardians.

To apply for free or reduced-price meals, households should fill out the application and return it to the school. Additional copies are available at the principal's office in each school.

The information provided on the application is confidential and will be used for the purpose of determining eligibility and may be verified at any time during the school year by school

# Rollout of new financial aid form stunting plans for fall semester

Daniel Adeleye wasn't planning on taking a gap year after his May 16 graduation from Mustang High School. But a botched FAFSA rollout is forcing him and thousands of other 2024 Oklahoma high school graduates to rethink their college plans.

Millions of high school students rely on FAFSA, a federal government acronym that stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid, to help determine how much financial aid they might receive as they consider which college or university to attend.

According to the National College Attainment Network, Oklahoma is ranked 46th in the nation due to the low number of 2024 high school graduate FAFSA completions.

"I was applying to the University of Oklahoma and Oklahoma State University and colleges outside of Oklahoma like the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, Texas A&M and Howard University," said Adeleye, who graduated with a 4.0 GPA.

Now he will instead continue studying aviation maintenance at Canadian Valley Technology Center in El Reno.

Adeleye aimed for aerospace programs out of state, but the former vice president of the Mustang Technology Student Association said a major reason he is not yet attending college is that he did not receive sufficient scholarships.

"I didn't meet the financial requirements for Oklahoma's Promise, and didn't receive any scholarships from my high school. Staying in state is the least strain on me and my family financially," said Adeleye, who was unable to complete all the forms required by FAFSA due to the confusion of the new layout.

In Oklahoma, 34.3 percent of the class of 2024 graduates completed the FAFSA. Compared to the 2023 academic year, completion rates dropped in Oklahoma by 15.7 percent, or more than 3,000 applications.

The Osage Nation Education Department (ONED) hosted a FAFSA night for Johnson-O'Malley seniors on January 10. The Johnson-O'Malley Program is a federal program designed to help eligible American Indian and Alaskan Native Students from age three through grades 12.

Tribal Education Advocate for ONED, Sam Lockett, at-

tended the FAFSA Night to help the seniors fill out the labyrinthine form.

As a result of the FAFSA Simplification Act, which was passed by Congress in 2021, the application was changed. The revamp was supposed to downsize the form but instead made it more complicated due to repeated delays, technical glitches and new requirements.

According to the Federal Student Aid website, the newest editions of the form had questions about race, ethnicity and sexuality that have no effect on one's financial eligibility.

"When FAFSA did their rollout, (the website) was periodically down, and that night we had a few students able to complete (their FAFSA) and a few students in purgatory," Lockett said. "About 80% of our students in attendance were not able to completely finish their FAFSA that night."

FAFSA is the starting point for students to be reviewed for eligibility for federal, state and institutional need-based aid. The application allows for consideration of aid options that might include grants, direct student loans and the option for parent loans to help cover any funding gaps.

High minority and low-income completion rates have plunged more than 20 percent this year in the Sooner state.

"I (was) in schools for the next few months, so I helped fill out the FAFSA for Hominy, Woodland and Shidler High School students," Lockett said.

Examples like the FAFSA

Night raise the question of whether the decline in completion rates is due to the FAFSA rollout itself or the financial hole dug by attending a university.

"I didn't get any money because of a mess-up on our end and the FAFSA website wouldn't let us correct it," said 2024 Pawhuska High School graduate Liliana Guillen Hudgins. "It took forever for them to review, so I just gave up."

Pawhuska High School's class of 2024 completion rate for FAFSA stands at 56.5 percent, with a 8.3 percent year-to-year increase.

Guillen, 18, a citizen of the Muscogee (Creek) Nation, attended the Dance Maker Academy in Pawhuska and studied ballet while taking on part-time jobs to stay as financially independent as possible.

Guillen said she feared that attending college would be a financial burden to her family. She said she wanted to support herself financially before committing to a college where she would need to juggle more than she could handle.

"I didn't want to take out student loans because I see my family working to pay them off to this day," Guillen said.

Guillen will not be attending a university in the fall, but recently received a cosmetology license from Tri-County Tech in Bartlesville with plans of starting her own business and attending online college in the future.

# Precinct official pay increases

A bill passed in 2023 to increase precinct official pay went into effect July 1 – doubling the pay precinct officials receive for a workday.

State Election Board Secretary Paul Zirriax said he is confident the increase in pay will support recruitment efforts across the state.

"Precinct officials are vital to the success of elections. We are extremely grateful to our state leaders for passing legislation that not only shows our current poll workers how much we appreciate them – but also supports recruitment and retention efforts across the state," Zirriax said.

State law requires each precinct to have a minimum of three precinct officials – an inspector, judge, and clerk. On July 1, inspector pay increased from \$110 a day to \$225 a day. Pay for judges and clerks increased from \$100 a day to \$200 a day.

No experience is necessary to serve as a precinct official, but you must be willing and able to work long hours and have reliable transportation.

He has previously signed these bills, but the ceremonial signing is an opportunity to bring the constituents and stakeholders who helped me develop and pass those measures.

One of the bills, House Bill 2152, will help determine the causes of maternal deaths in Oklahoma. It modifies the membership of the Maternal Mortality Review Committee (MMRC) and make more data on maternal deaths available to the Committee.

The second bill, House Bill 3330, was requested by is a request bill from Healthy Minds Policy Initiative to identify types of mental health areas needing employee recruitment.

My third bill to receive a ceremonial signing was House Bill 3327, which protects school nurses from liability so they don't wind up in legal trouble for not monitoring a diabetic student's glucose numbers when the child is not in school.

It was a very neat experience to get to introduce them to Governor Stitt during the ceremonial signing and host them at the State Capitol.

In other exciting news, I also want to applaud the Dibble Senior Citizens Association for the \$41,252 grant they recently received through the Oklahoma Human Services' Food Insecurity Grant Program. These grant funds may be used for facility upgrades or expanding operational hours in order to provide nutritious food to Oklahomans in need.

The grant program was created by the Legislature in 2023 to manage the distribution of

federal American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) Coronavirus State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF) dollars. The program was designed to support the availability of affordable and nutritious foods in areas that were impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

If you're a senior citizen in Dibble facing a food shortage, you can find more information about the organization on Facebook or visit their location at 12219 Firemans Road.

There were several other nonprofits working to fight hunger in McClain and Cleveland counties who received grants through the program as well.

In Norman, Pantry Partners \$50,000, Alameda Church of Christ received \$45,000, Aging Services received \$30,000 and Veterans Corner received \$5,920. In Moore, Fresh Start Community Church received \$31,625 and First United Methodist Church received \$21,835.

These funds will be used to extend a helping hand to those in the community who face food insecurity. This support provides an opportunity to provide more nutritious meals and offer other vital resources to ensure that none of our neighbors go to bed hungry.

### Jennifer Palmer Oklahoma Watch

The Oklahoma Supreme Court on Tuesday, June 25, ruled against a state-funded Catholic charter school in a case testing the wall of separation between church and state.

In a majority decision, the court blocked the St. Isidore of Seville Catholic Virtual School and ordered the state to rescind its contract with the school. Six justices agreed; two dissented all or in part.

The case is likely to be appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court, whose conservative majority has expanded the allowed uses of taxpayer dollars to religious schools.

The Archdiocese of Oklahoma City and Diocese of Tulsa proposed St. Isidore, named after the patron saint of the internet, as an avenue to make free Catholic education accessible across the state. The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board approved the school in 2023, drawing a legal challenge from the Office of the Attorney General.

The Statewide Virtual Charter School Board met Monday for the last time; starting July 1, the newly created Statewide Charter School Board will oversee all online charter schools and some traditional charter schools. Phil Bacharach, a spokesman for the Office of the Attorney General, said the court's ruling shouldn't require a board vote.

"We read the opinion as declaring the contract to be null and void because it's unconstitutional," Bacharach said. "We expect the board and other officers of this state to follow the orders of the Oklahoma Supreme Court."

The court's decision prevents St. Isidore from receiving state funding on July 1.

Attorneys representing the school are likely to appeal to the U.S. Supreme Court. Four justices have to agree to hear it for the case to be taken up.

Law professors from across the country said there's a good chance the court will consider the case.

Several said the court might first wait to see if other states resolve similar cases. If a dispute emerges among state courts over federal law, the Supreme Court is more likely to accept the petition.

"If you have only one state, they tend to let it lie," Wilamette University Professor of Law Steven Green said.

University of South Carolina Professor of Law Derek W. Black said because the case is centered around the much larger question of whether

a charter school is truly a public school, it ventures into state law.

"I don't think it's an attractive case (to the U.S. Supreme Court)," Black said.

Black cited a similar case the U.S. Supreme Court declined to take up: *Peltier v. Charter Day School*, in which a North Carolina charter school argued that it wasn't a public school and could therefore treat students differently on the basis of sex at its own discretion.

"In a lot of ways, the Oklahoma case is a perfect mirror of the legal issues," Black said.

### Are Charter Schools Public or Private?



St. Isidore applied to become a charter school, a type of school that is publicly funded but privately run. Whether charter schools are public or private is one of the major arguments in the case.

St. Isidore's attorneys argued that charter schools are actually private schools and that denying access to government funding violates the First Amendment's free exercise clause. To bolster that, they pointed to a 2017 U.S. Supreme Court decision in which a Missouri daycare was denied a public grant for its playground because it's operated by a church.

Green said that case, *Trinity Lutheran*, along with a decision in a Montana case over private school tax credits, show the Supreme Court's willingness to crack the door for taxpayer funding to religious groups.

"This was a real 180 from what has been traditionally understood about the separation of church and state," Green said.

Attorneys for St. Isidore and the Statewide Virtual Charter School Board argued similarities in two Oklahoma cases: a 1946 case about an orphanage for Native American children and a 2016 case over the state's Lindsey Nicole Henry Scholarship program for students with disabilities. But the court noted differences.

The orphanage was operated by a religious entity, but the children were not required to attend church services and were free to choose how they worship. In the Lindsey Nicole Henry case, the funding was spent on religious instruction, but was given first to parents as a scholarship, not directly to the schools.

With St. Isidore, the state would be directly funding a religious school and encouraging students to attend it, the justices wrote. And St. Isidore is more than a religious entity unaffiliated with the state, like with the orphanage and the schools that accept Lindsey Nicole Henry scholarships. St. Isidore, as a public charter school, is a governmental entity and state actor, they found.

### Political Ramifications

The St. Isidore decision could accelerate efforts by the Republican supermajority at the Oklahoma Legislature to change the composition of the state Supreme Court.

Both dissenting justices are Gov. Kevin Stitt's appointees: Dana Kuehn and Vice-Chief Justice Dustin Rowe (Stitt also appointed Chief Justice John Kane, who recused.)

Andrew Spiropoulos, a professor of law at Oklahoma City University, said that's likely to fuel a push by conservatives to reform how supreme court justices are selected in Oklahoma.

"They're going to use this as one more reason why we need to change the way we do things in Oklahoma," he said.

Some Republicans and business groups have tried for years to get rid of the Judicial Nomination Commission, formed after the Supreme Court corruption scandal in the 1960s. The commission, made up of attorneys and laypersons, vets nominees for judicial positions and forwards three nominees to the governor for the final decision on judicial vacancies.

Among the proposed legislation this year was a bill putting age limits on appellate and district court judges. Another proposal, in the form of a state question, would have made state appellate judges directly appointed by the governor, with confirmation by the Senate and House. Neither of those efforts were successful in this year's legislative session.

Good week, welcome to the 'front porch.'

Bring them up, the Spirit says! Raise them! Teach them! What is it that we need to teach them — set the table for them — both the nutrition ("nurture") and the discipline ("admonition") they need. Such teaching, I am sure, covers more than the

books in this world could hold. It covers endless matters of the heart, and it covers a thousand matters of the hands and feet.

But, in that process of teaching, I am sure we must emphasize the spiritual principles that make up the foundation — that is, the principles that tell what it means to have faith, to live by faith, and to walk by faith.

It is not an easy sermon to preach nor demonstrate. But it is the first chapter, and it is the last.

Where do we begin to undertake such a monumental task?

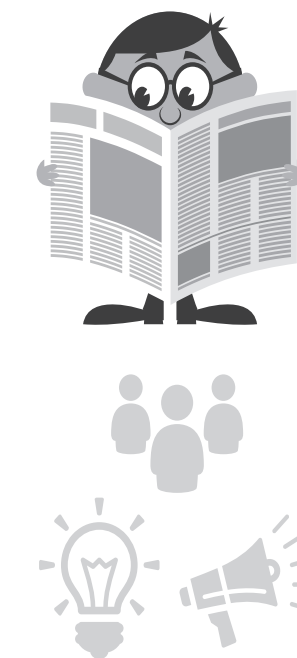

# ‘You guys did a great job’

Council congratulates Water Department for their hard work

During a special Purcell City Council meeting on Monday, Water Supervisor Michael Minor debriefed the council on how the water outage in the municipal water system developed in early July.

At the council’s regularly scheduled meeting on July 1, Minor told the council the water system was “in a crunch” because of the unrelenting heat. As a result, City Manager Sam Demel announced he, Minor and Kenny Sullivan, a consulting engineer, would meet on July 3 to discuss potentially going to odd-even outdoor watering restrictions.

However, on July 3, several earthquakes struck the Purcell area, and Minor believes they were the cause for the water leaks in the system.

One of the leaks fed straight into the Purcell City Lake, which caused hiccups in the water testing process. Out of an abundance of caution, the Oklahoma Department of Environmental Quality issued a boil advisory on July 5, but it was lifted by July 8.

To aid in dealing with any potential future municipal water system issues, Demel

informed the council that he and Minor are putting together a status system.

During final comments at the end of the special council meeting, council members congratulated Water Supervisor Michael Minor and his staff on getting the water system back in shape despite all the setbacks.

“I just want to say great job on the work on the water outage,” Council member Greg Wheat said. “I mean, that’s a tough situation, and you’re never going to be able to please everybody. You

did your best. I think you guys did a great job.”

Monday’s special council meeting was mainly held to discuss and consider the city’s labor contract with local Fraternal Order of Police lodge for fiscal year 2024-25 in executive session. The council approved it, ending a series of special council meetings throughout the first half of July.

The council had already discussed, considered and approved its labor contract with the local chapter of the International Association of Fire Fighters for fiscal year 2024-25 during a special council meeting held on July 10.

**Aid:**

With only weeks remaining until the fall semester begins, recent high school graduates are questioning whether to attend college due to the chaotic rollout of the federal student financial aid application as well as increasing tuition rates.

According to the National College Attainment Network’s FAFSA Tracker, students at Ponca City High School, Lawton High School, and Booker T. Washington (Tulsa) High School have reportedly dropped over 30 percent in FAFSA completion rates, while Tonkawa High School, Boswell High School, and Red Creek High School FAFSA completion rates dropped over 60 percent.

First-generation student, Carlee Fort, is a junior at the University of Oklahoma majoring in management information systems who struggled with FAFSA.

“As a first gen with no parents, I have to go a different route than everyone else when it comes to FAFSA,” Fort said. “It was very nerve-racking having to wait to fill it out even longer because normally I have to get three letters written to confirm my situation. I was on an even more stressful timeline, especially with the new way the form is set up.”

Courtney Henderson, executive director of Financial Aid Services at the University of Oklahoma, said “the reduced FAFSA completion rate for Oklahoma is a concern and we encourage students to complete the FAFSA as soon as they can. The National FAFSA Tracker and National College Attainment Network indicate this is an issue across the country. There is still plenty of time for students to apply for fall 2024 and spring 2025 aid. Those applications will continue to be received throughout the upcoming year.”

Despite the flighty new form, Henderson encourages all students, regardless of their financial situations, to apply for aid through the FAFSA and CASH when it opens in October. The Centralized Academic Scholarship Hub (CASH) is an online location where current and continuing OU students can apply for scholarships.

“The FAFSA and CASH resources help students receive additional assistance. I also think all students should get to know someone in the Student Financial Center. Student service experts and MoneyCoaches are here to help students find financial solutions. We need to know the specific issues students are facing to offer them individualized guidance,” Henderson said.

records, the department last received \$689,240 for tribal-compact license sales in fiscal 2021. That year, estimated participation in deer hunting alone totaled 457,020 license holders statewide. The following year, that statistic fell 35 percent to 294,796.

In October 2022, tribes made hunting and fishing licenses available to members and citizens. Most tribes allow their tribal membership cards to serve as their credential or license.

Friday’s announcement noted that all Oklahoma residents with valid state-issued hunting and fishing licenses remain eligible to hunt and fish within these tribal treaty territories under all applicable laws.

Hunting and fishing activities by tribal members and citizens will be subject to the laws of the tribe on whose reservation the activity is taking place.

“We have established the Choctaw Nation Wildlife Conservation Department to assert our tribal sovereignty. This department determines how our citizens hunt and fish on our reservation by using their tribal membership,” said Choctaw Nation Chief Gary Batton.

“We have now taken a significant step forward by partnering with the Inter-Tribal Council. This partnership will provide further opportunities for our tribal members to hunt and fish on our reservations using their tribal membership. Together, we are asserting our tribal sovereignty and benefiting approximately 815,000 tribal citizens as well as all Oklahomans,” Batton said.

The announcement notes that hunters and anglers on the various reservations are responsible for knowing and abiding by any applicable laws. Tribal citizens will also be responsible for securing permission to access land owned by others. Each Tribe will manage programs to provide access to Tribally owned areas.

Tribal citizens or members reporting harvests will report to the tribe to which they are citizens or members.

The agreement honors statewide hunting and fishing limits, which are considered aggregate statewide. According to the announcement, limits will not reset in or outside each reservation.

Each tribe will report basic harvest data each year. The Tribes indicated that they look forward to working with State and Federal partners as they implement this agreement and continue identifying partnerships for advancing wildlife conservation. State game wardens cross-deputized with the respective tribes can ticket and enforce laws on these reservations.



# Tribes announce joint hunting, fishing compact

Oklahoma tribes announced a step Friday that unites the entities, makes hunting and fishing easier for all tribal members, and combines expanding tribal wildlife management efforts.

It further solidifies the end of state-tribal compacts severed by Gov. Kevin Stitt in 2021.

The Inter-Tribal Council of the Five Civilized Tribes announced the Five Tribe Wildlife Management Reciprocity Agreement at its July quarterly meeting at the Hard Rock Hotel & Casino Tulsa.

The agreement allows hunting and fishing licenses issued through each tribe to be recognized by the other tribes on respective reservation lands.

According to the announcement, tribal members and citizens of the Cherokee Nation, Chickasaw Nation, Choctaw Nation of Oklahoma, Muscogee Nation, and soon the Seminole Nation can use their tribal membership to hunt and fish on lands of all tribes’ treaty territories.

The announcement notes that the new agreement will allow the Five Tribes to collaborate on wildlife management within their reservations and enhance their ability to manage natural resources.

“Hunting and fishing are inherent treaty rights among our five tribal nations and have been vital to food security for generations of Cherokees,” said Cherokee Nation Principal Chief Chuck Hoskin Jr. “As Cherokees, we can use tribal citizenship photo IDs to hunt and fish on our 7,000-square-mile reservation.

“For the past two years, this has proven to be a highly successful initiative for both the tribe and our outdoor sportsmen. This new Five Tribes agreement makes hunting and fishing in eastern Oklahoma more sustainable, and more diverse for all our citizens.

“The adoption of uniform codes by all tribal governments involved is a significant accomplishment and demonstrates the strength of our collective sovereignty,” he concluded.

The announcement completes tribal efforts to replace a system that ended in December 2021 when Gov. Stitt refused to renew state and tribal hunting and fishing compacts.

Under the compacts, tribes paid the Oklahoma Department of Wildlife Conservation to license their members. It meant lower costs to tribal citizens but kept participation in the state’s records for tracking harvest on all lands within the state and preserved participation numbers that influence federal funding formulas based in part on participation compared state-to-state.

or other program officials. Applications may be submitted at any time during the year.

For school officials to determine eligibility, households receiving food stamps, "Temporary Assistance for Needy Families" (TANF), or "Food Distribution Program on Indian Reservations" (FDPIR) must list the child's name, his/her food stamp or TANF or FDPIR case number, and the signature of an adult household member.

If you do not list a food stamp or TANF or FDPIR case number for all the children you are applying for, then the application must have the children's names, the names of all household members, the amount of income each person received last month and where it came from, the signature of an adult household member, and that adult's social security number or the word "none" if the adult does not have a social security number.

In certain cases, foster children are eligible for free and reduced-price meals or free milk regardless of the child's income. If you have foster children living with you and wish to apply for such meals or milk for them, contact the school. Under the provisions of the policy, a school official will review applications and determine eligibility. Parents or guardians wishing to make a formal appeal may make a request either orally or in writing to the school for a hearing to appeal the decision. The school's policy statement contains an outline of the hearing procedure.

The household of a child currently certified to receive food stamps, TANF or FDPIR benefits will be notified of the child's eligibility and that the child will be provided free benefits unless the household notifies the school that it chooses to decline benefits.

In accordance with federal law and United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) policy, these institutions are prohibited from discriminating on the basis of race, color, national origin, sex, age or disability.

## Pond management

A common, but often neglected element of the Oklahoma landscape is the pond. These are typically used for some combination of livestock watering, recreational fishing, irrigation, aesthetics, or firefighting.

Lack of management and lack of understanding about how ponds function often leads to a state of lowered usefulness punctuated by the occasional crisis.

A pond is unavoidably influenced by what occurs in its watershed. Erosion and improper grazing often result in sediment problems in ponds. Illegal dumps, oil field activities, and pesticide applications raise the possibility of toxic materials harming a pond.

Nutrients from sources like chemical fertilizers, livestock holding areas and never-pumped septic systems typically lead to excessive growth of algae or other aquatic plants often culminating in a die-off of plants leading to a low oxygen fish kill.

Other ponds higher in the

watershed can be a source of unwanted fish introductions. All these problems are best managed at the source.

Good fishing is no accident. Fish species that are generally desirable in recreational fishing ponds include the largemouth bass, bluegill, and channel catfish.

Fish to generally be avoided in a pond include crappie, goldfish, golden shiners, and green sunfish.

Here are some useful Pond Management Tips:

**Never stock fingerlings on top of bass**—they will be eaten. Fingerling stocking on top of existing fish populations usually does not improve fishing.

**Never dump bait buckets into ponds.** Shiners can out-grow bass and become a problem. Likewise, don't transfer fish from other ponds unless you are willing to take the risk of introducing parasites.

**Use herbicides only after identifying your weed.** Understand withdrawal times and look for underlying problems like excess nutrients or shallowness.

Take steps to avoid loss of oxygen due to decay of dead weeds. We can assist you in identifying the weeds if you bring us a sample.

**Don't be too quick to stock grass carp.** They aren't a cure-all for weeds and sometimes hurt the quality of fishing by eliminating beneficial plants. Explore alternatives like spot treatments with herbicides to open areas for casting.

**Remove small trees from dams** before they grow large and cause leaks.

**Don't let pond weeds totally cover and shade the pond.** If you wait too long, total shading of a pond can lead to loss of oxygen and a fish kill.

This is most commonly a problem with floating plants like duckweed.

**Dense green water means a fish kill is likely.** If you cannot see a submerged object in 12 inches of water, a low oxygen fish kill is likely to occur soon.

Look for ways to reduce nutrient inputs – if feeding fish, stop immediately. Consider harvesting as many as practical as soon as possible.

Despite having lived across the world, Rev. Tracy Hoskins is happy to now live in Purcell serving as Trinity United Methodist Church's new pastor.

"[Purcell is] a bit bigger than any of the other communities that I've served," she said. "The church is fantastic as far as I'm concerned. They are very friendly."

Hoskins was previously the pastor of Hobart First United Methodist Church in Hobart from June 2020 to November 2023. Before then, she was the pastor at two United Methodist churches in Morris and Schuler, two rural towns near Okmulgee.

Hailing from Bixby, Hoskins has a bachelor's degree from Southeastern Oklahoma State University in drafting and design. For several years, she did graphic design work for an Oklahoma City engineering company, whose main business was oil.

She got that job right out of college, but it wasn't long before the late '90s oil crisis struck and prices plummeted.

"They were starting to cut back on jobs, so I was going to be laid off," she said. "I had always wanted to go into the

military, but I hadn't yet, so I thought 'Well, this is a good time.'"

Hoskins spent 10 years in the Air Force servicing radios in air traffic control towers. She was stationed first in England then Arizona, where she met her husband, Scott. Eventually, they were both stationed in Japan, and that's when they started attending the base chapel, where she later became its religious education director.

"That was where God's call started," she said.

After leaving the Air Force and returning to Oklahoma with her husband, Hoskins taught technology at Tulsa Public Schools for eight years before deciding to go back to school to become an ordained minister. She received her Master of Divinity from Phillips Theological Seminary in 2017.

Now that she is in Purcell, she wants to impact and influence her new community but does not want to duplicate what others are doing.

## Bomb:

The ticking noise caused train operators to de-board all passengers and crew.

Officials said 114 passengers and five crew members were evacuated and bused to the Purcell High School where they were sheltered under the oversight of Purcell Emergency Management Director Rachael Huey.

As of 10 a.m. Main Street was closed at Canadian Street and the Summer Tree apartments near the depot had been evacuated.

However, the bomb squad found no explosive device.

“They X-rayed it and it was fine,” assistant police chief James Bolling said.

Passengers were able to re-

board the train around noon making their 5-minute stop in Purcell to last for three hours.

In addition to the OHP, Purcell Police, Purcell Fire, Wadley’s EMS and the McClain County Sheriff’s Department responded to the incident.

There were no reported injuries.

some classrooms at the other buildings while having safe rooms.”

Purcell Schools has already received a \$3.3 million grant from the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) for another safe room at the junior high.

That grant will pay for 90 percent of the safe room and the District will have to foot the other 10 percent, about \$300,000.

That shelter will not only be used as a competition basketball gymnasium for the junior high, but also as a shelter that

will be open to the public after school hours.

“We hit a special window that allowed us to get the 90 to 10 grant,” McAdoo said.

Also included in the bond plans are to:

- A new 82-space parking lot and bus loop at the junior high.
- Construct, furnish and equip a new ag barn.
- Renovate the gymnasium at the elementary school.

To pass, the proposition must carry at least 60 percent of the vote.

The last day to register for the election is August 2.

McAdoo is encouraging patrons to register to vote.

“People need to register,” she said.

## Oklahoma experiences first West Nile Virus case, and death, of year

The Oklahoma State Department of Health (OSDH) is reporting the first human case, and death, caused by West Nile Virus (WNV) in a Southwest Oklahoma resident. The patient was hospitalized before passing away.

WNV spreads through the bite of an infected mosquito. In Oklahoma, WNV is primarily spread by the Culex mosquito, which feeds on infected birds and then spreads the virus when biting humans, horses, and some other mammals.

This type of mosquito increases in abundance during mid to late summer when temperatures are high, and the weather pattern is dry.

"We expect the number of human cases to increase as the temperatures rise throughout the summer," said Jolianne Stone, the State Epidemiologist. "Typically, summertime is the beginning of the WNV season in Oklahoma, so with more people participating in outdoor activities there are increased opportunities

for encountering infected mosquitoes." OSDH officials are reminding the public to take precautions to prevent mosquito bites.

Tips to avoid mosquito bites and prevent WNV:

- Use an insect repellent containing DEET, picaridin, or IR3535 on exposed skin and clothing when going outdoors, particularly between dusk and dawn when mosquitoes are more likely to bite.

Insect repellent with permethrin should be used on

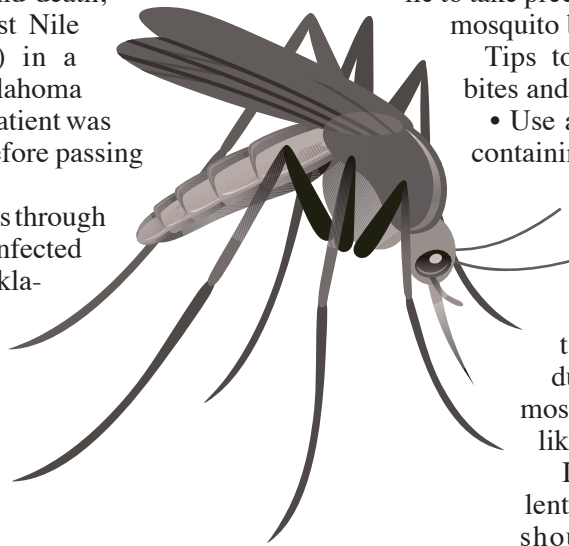
clothing only.

- Repair or install window and door screens to keep mosquitoes out of the home.

- Prevent items such as buckets, cans, pool covers, flower pots, children's toys and tires from holding water to prevent providing mosquitoes a place to breed.

- Empty any pet's outdoor water bowl and refill daily.

- Scrub and refill bird baths every

## Voter registration deadline approaches

Friday, August 2, is the last day to apply for voter registration in order to be eligible to vote in the August 27 Runoff Primary election, according to McClain County Election Board Secretary Karen Haley.

Haley said that persons who are United States Citizens, residents of Oklahoma, and at least 17-1/2 years old are eligible to apply for voter registration. However, you must be at least 18 years old to vote.

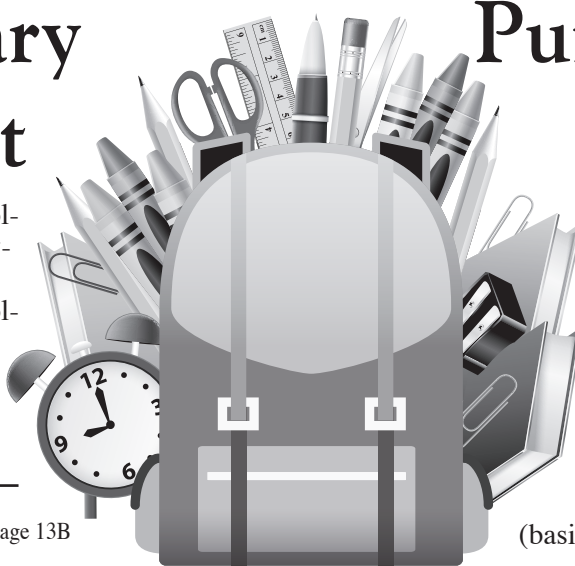

## Prune raspberries for an abundant harvest

A bit of summer pruning goes a long way to keeping your raspberries healthy and productive. So, get out the mosquito netting, long sleeves, and pruners and get busy.

The summer harvest is produced on two-year-old canes called floricanes. Remove those that bore fruit to ground level once your harvest is complete.

These canes will not produce more fruit and their presence can increase the risk of insect and disease problems. This is also a good time to remove damaged, insect-infested, or discolored canes.

Summer is also a good time to thin the remaining canes

### Pruning raspberries

Proper pruning of raspberries can maximize the summer and fall harvest.

on summer-only bearing raspberries. Remove weak or damaged canes, leaving three or four of the sturdiest canes per foot of row or six or eight stems per hill when growing in the hill system.

Thinning increases airflow and light penetration, resulting in healthier plants and a better harvest next season. Wait until next spring to reduce the height of the remaining canes.

At that time, you can determine winter dieback, and damage, and prune accordingly.

Everbearing raspberries are often called fall raspberries and form fruit on first-year canes called primocanes.

Haley reminds voters to allow time for an absentee ballot to be received, completed, and returned by mail to the County Election Board.

"With some exceptions, all absentee ballot affidavits must be notarized before being returned. Voters should give themselves plenty of time to make sure all steps have been followed and that the ballot is returned on time in order to be counted," Haley said.

## Absentee:

Voters exempt from having an absentee ballot affidavit notarized include those who are physically incapacitated and those who care for physically incapacitated individuals who cannot be left alone.
