t's not very often you'll find a bar and restaurant inside an old firehouse. Besides the unique atmosphere, the Cochecton Fire Station offers mouthwateringly good food and exceptional handcrafted cocktails all at an affordable price and with friendly service.

Owners Zeke Miller and Josiah Early spent

over 20 years in the restaurant business in New York City, starting as bartenders and then doing basically everything all the way up to managing.

When a friend bought a house in Sullivan County they came up to help out and fell in love with the area. Soon enough they were splitting their time between Cochecton and

the city before making it their permanent home.

"We've always loved Cochecton, it used to be a cool little town," Early remarked. "We felt like Narrowsburg, Callicoon and Jeffersonville were already on the up and up and doing their own thing, and we thought this town was probably one that needed something."

The old fire station was for sale, and they knew it would be a good opportunity. They bought it in 2016

and, after renovating it themselves, opened their business in 2018.

In pre-COVID times, it quickly became a favorite spot for locals and visitors alike to cozy up at the bar or by the fireplace with friends and enjoy a cocktail and a bite to eat.

"Our idea was, instead of coming up with a concept and changing the name, what if we just took the fire station, turn it into a restaurant, go around asking people what they like to eat, what they can afford to pay, and kind of give their fire station back to them as something that they could enjoy,"

Early said.

As cocktail connoisseurs Early and Miller knew they wanted to craft a perfect drink menu. They put a lot of time into the cocktails using freshly squeezed juice and making their own syrups.

"Instead of treating it like a college bar, it's taking a chef-like approach to cocktails," Miller said. "Where you're using good ingredients, you're understanding what your ingredients are; it's not just something that's super sweet."

Cocktails include the Hook & Ladder Punch, which is rum, pomegranate, ginger and lemon, and the Ornery Old Fashioned, which is bourbon, orange bitters and stumato, and is named after local farm Gorzynski Ornery Farm.

They also have a beer and wine menu and house-made sodas and egg creams.

The food is classic American fare with a twist—everything is cooked inside the wood-burning oven, giving it an extra layer of smoky flavor. There's the \$6 menu including mac and cheese, crispy rice and beans, and a Hasselback potato, and the "not \$6 menu," which includes skirt steak, shrimp and pineapple and a roasted cheese board.

"It's just a different way of cooking," Miller said.
"We wanted to do something different and liked the concept of doing comfort food out of a wood-fired

oven and making it unique in that way."

In addition to tasty offerings, affordability was at the top of their list, and also making it kid-friendly, quick and efficient.

"We grew up in a generation where you were either going to a kid's restaurant and the parents hated it, or you're going to a grown-up restaurant and the kids hated it," Early said. "And we were trying to make it so families could come together and have a place they enjoy."

When COVID hit they quickly pivoted to a takeout-only model. They

were lucky to have a garage door that they could open to serve people outside, keeping it safe for both the customers and the employees.

"We spent two sleepless nights redesigning our business plan and moving into a takeout only scenario open seven days a week," Miller said.

The pandemic, like for most people, has not been good for business. The owners say they are just getting by, and thank people for supporting them at a time when restaurants need all the support they can get.

"We've got the best customers in the world," Early said.

he Hurleyville Performing Arts Centre (HPAC) was planning their grand opening in the beginning of 2020 before the COVID-19 pandemic hit.

"What I often say is we had to close before we opened," HPAC Executive Director Erin Dudley said.

With safety in mind they didn't hold inperson programming this past year, instead they moved to a digital platform, using Zoom to feature artists and host panel discussions.

"Even though we didn't open for live performances, we all continued to work and we ran over 40 programs that were all digital," Dudley explained. "The intimacy of the Zoom programming actually allowed us to feel closer to the artists and the attendees."

Part of that programming included the "Art on Art" series in which artists inter-

leyville Performing Arts Centre celebrates the environmental and social diversity of the Catskill region through performance, film, and visual art. HPAC presents bold programs that create shared experiences to inspire, challenge, and connect audiences."

Dudley, who also lives in Hurleyville, said, "It's the most diverse place I've ever lived and we want the programming to be as diverse as the people [who live] here."

The arts center was established in 2016 through partnerships with the Center for Discovery, the community, and local philanthropic organizations and became a separate 501(c)(3) non-profit in February 2020.

The sprawling building houses a cinema, ballroom event space, dance studios, yoga studio and gallery and is an independent community-supported organization.





They have a lot of exciting things coming up this year including dance workshops, movies in the park during the summer, and the opening of the Tango Café featuring world-famous chef Tom Valenti.

Throughout the pandemic Dudley thanks people for supporting them and is looking forward to having fun this year.

"The arts need all the advocacy they can get right now," she said. "I think we all discovered during the pandemic how in the hardest of times art can be survival in so many ways."






