# how to have a seriously fun summer

n 1947, a group of artists from New York City needed to find a summer theater where they could present productions but also have it as a training ground for actors.

They came up to Sullivan County in the winter and found an old barn in Forestburgh, NY and bought it.

The following spring they renovated the



barn and converted it to a theater, and that summer opened the theater, which is now known as the Forestburgh Playhouse.

Since then it's grown and grown and developed over the years, operating continuously as a playhouse and celebrating its 75th anniversary this year.

"We have stood the test of time," said Franklin Trapp, Producing Artistic Director.

They are now gearing up for their summer season, which begins with the Under the Stars series featuring Broadway performers, and continues with the summer program of musicals and plays.

This year's performances include The Diamond Anniversary Revue; Altar Boyz the Musical; Beehive the Musical; The World Goes Round; You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown; Buyer & Cellar; and the world premiere of the revival of Babes in Arms.

"After what's been a very challenging year, the Playhouse is excited to launch its 75th anniversary season," Trapp remarked.

Like most businesses, the COVID-19 pandemic cut revenue and created challenges for the Playhouse. But they stayed open offering outdoor performance last summer and continuing their workshops virtually.

They also created a fundraising campaign called 75 and Thrive that helped them through the pandemic.

"The support of our patrons and friends was incredible," Trapp said.

In addition to plays and musicals, the Playhouse also of-



# beautifying the beautiful

hen you're driving around Sullivan County this summer you may see public spaces that are lush with flowers, or attractive signs welcoming you to town, or a trail system to get immersed in nature.

These are projects supported by Sullivan Renaissance—a beautification and community development initiative funded through the Gerry Foundation. grants, technical assistance and other resources for community groups, as well as spearheads projects from beautification to trail development, enhancement of parks, events, farmers markets, live music, renovations and signage, landscaping and more.

Sandra Gerry founded Sullivan Renaissance in 2000 after she was inspired by her experience visiting a village that had won a regional beautification competition, bringing that idea to Sullivan County.

The non-profit organization provides

And it's all made possible through grassroots volunteer efforts to beautify and enhance the county.

"It was a seed of an idea and over these 21 years it's been nurtured by thousands of volunteers throughout the county. It has re-





ally blossomed and grown into a movement," remarked Denise Frangipane, Executive Director of Sullivan Renaissance.

Since its inception, volunteers have worked with Sullivan Renaissance on a variety of projects that beautify communities for both residents and visitors alike.

"This effort not only gives people a reason to visit here, but also enhances the quality of life of the people who live here," Frangipane said.

She added, "It all is connected in some way. When we see all the efforts throughout the county, we can really see the overall impact."

Visitors to the county can use the project spotlight found on their website and use it as a roadmap to see the area and all the beautiful sights.

"You can get to know Sullivan County through the lens of the Sullivan Renaissance projects, because by doing that you will also get to know your community and the people within it," Frangipane noted.

Anyone can volunteer for Sullivan Renaissance at whatever commitment level they desire, and can assist with everything from gardening to planning to fundraising.

# apples to apples

ouglas Doetsch's family has been in Callicoon for five generations since the mid-1800's. Family lore tells them that his great-grandfather used to grow apples on the old family homestead and made cider and applejack during the Prohibition era.

Now Doetsch is carrying on the family legacy with the opening of Seminary Hill Cidery, located just down the road from his family's property on Kautz Road in Callicoon.

The first thing you'll notice are the amazing views; perched high on the hill the cidery looks down over the Delaware River and surrounding valley, offering stunning almost 360-degree views year-round.

The second thing you'll notice is the beautiful building. It's modern yet evokes the style of old cider barns—with the tasting room on the top floor and the cidery on the bottom floor, which is built into the hill.

"We wanted something simple and rustic that would be warm and have natural wood and a feeling of spacious-

Doetsch and his wife, Susan Manning, had owned the piece of land where the business now sits for around 20 years. It used to be a hay field for the seminary's farm and was later sold to a private owner.

The Doetsch's began to think about the agricultural heritage of the land and how they could tap into the craft beverage market.

So they started to research hard cider, traveling around and drinking a lot of it.

In 2012 they invited renowned orchard specialist, Michael Phillips, to look at their land where their family's home stood and see if it was suitable for growing apple trees.

He concluded that it would be feasible and took a look at the other piece of land off

Seminary Road.

Upon seeing the site he said, this is where you should put your cidery.

And so, they began planting. They put in 1,500 trees of 60 different varieties of apples and pears that had to be custom grafted to get the best possible crops.

It would take a few years for the trees to grow and now they are ready for production.

> Unlike beer, cider is a purely agricultural process. You gather the apples at harvest time, figure out how you want to blend them and then begin crushing and fermenting until you have the end product—delicious hard

Most of the food at Seminary Hill Cidery is cooked outside on the grill (above). The menu is meant to be paired with the cider, and includes this market salad (right). The cidery includes an orchard on site where over 60 varieties of apples are grown (pictured below).

cider.

While some cider makers add extra flavors and ingredients, Seminary Hill produces dry cider varieties with very little added sugars.

"We let the apples speak for themselves," Doetsch remarked.

The on-site kitchen offers food meant to be paired with the cider to bring out the complex tastes and aromas, such as black cherry tamarind ribs, hummus with za'atar flatbread and a cheese board, all using local ingredients and cooked on a grill outside.

"We wanted a place that would be appealing to both locals, as well as transplants from the city or tourists," Doetsch said.

The orchard and business is run with the help of Doetsch's family, including his cousin Bill Hess, the Orchards and Facilities Director. Hess also made the

outdoor wooden tables out of ash and maple trees from the property.






