

Now in its 23rd year, the annual event returns in 2021 for seven consecutive weeks.


Harvest Festival celebrates the bounty of local farms, talent of local artisans, flavor of homemade specialty food items, and also features live music, food trucks, crafts, special of-



he Laundrette restaurant in Narrowsburg is a gem of local dining offering wood-fired sourdough pizzas, salads, snacks and cocktails overlooking the Delaware River.

Opened in 2016, new owners Tim Mackabee and Ryan Burke recently took over, keeping the menu relatively the same with plans to expand this winter.

And besides the stunning view, the menu is also a standout, where fresh flavors combine with unique offerings.

While pizza is the star of the show, there are also tasty salads, innovative roasted vegetable dishes, hot dogs, tacos and a host of specials.

The menu is constantly changing because it's truly a farm-to-table restaurant that relies on sourcing what's organic and in season. One week a farmer might bring in a box of

tomatoes and the next week a bunch of broccoli rabe (the sausage and broccoli rabe pizza is a must try).

"That's the good thing—every time someone comes there's something new on the menu and it's as fresh as possible," Mackabee remarked. "There's a lot of fluctuation with whatever the local farms have, which we are on board for because it's always amazing."

But then there are the staples that are always on the menu, like the classic margherita pizza or the fan favorite mush-

room pie—with mushrooms, taleggio cheese and truffle oil.

All pizzas can be made with vegan cheese or gluten free crust, making it an easy option for vegetarians and vegans.

And then there's the drink menu with a variety of beer and wine and hand-crafted cocktails, like the millennial falcon—mezcal, pineapple, dry vermouth and lime.

Chef Dave Cole brings different flavors ranging from Asian to Middle Eastern, such as the Thai salad with crispy pork or the hummus and flatbread.


All of the desserts are homemade by Cole's wife, Sue, and delivered fresh daily.

Definitely grab a seat outside in the patio or on the deck and look out over the river with the iconic green Narrowsburg Bridge in the distance. You're sure to see an eagle soaring by or a fish jumping from the water.

"We've invested in the outdoor space, we added more tables, and we're doing







more events," Mackabee said.

The new owners are excited to expand and look forward to all of the offerings that will be in the future. But for now, nothing beats a delicious pizza, a cold cocktail and an enticing river view.



seven-mile trail for any amount you want, or rent bikes for the day and set out on your own adventure.

The shop has bikes of all sizes for all ages in cool retro colors and styles. In addition they have rentals for inline skates and in the winter they will have snowshoes.

Co-owners and husband and wife duo Hal and Lori Simon opened the shop because they wanted to move from Long Island to their second home in the Catskills.

While walking the O&W trail in the winter, they realized how beautiful and special it was.

It was always their dream to make this a permanent residence and so they seized the opportunity.

"The trail is more stunning every season, whether summer or winter, and especially autumn-it's going to be gorgeous out there for the leaf peepers," Hal remarked.

Their business also offers packages for corporate events so employees can get out of the




