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

Is your home winter ready?

Water

Most all homeowners have

crucial plumbing lines running through their basements. Many of us, especially in older homes, have unfinished basements and many of those are largely uninsulated. Especially in these cases, it is important to be mindful of what temperatures your waterlines are exposed to. If need be they should have winter insulating wraps around them. Insulating wraps made of foam are inexpensive and can be bought in bundles from most hardware or big box stores.

Of course, it's ideal to plan for overall insulation of your basement.

Back outdoors

Heading back outside, do you have trees surrounding your home?

If so, it's always good to make sure branches are trimmed and a safe distance away from your home. When snow and ice accumulate on them, they will be stressed and falling on your roof or other areas of your home could cause some damage.

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






hen you think of environmental stewardship, what words come to mind? The Catskill Project, a 40 plus acre

conservation easement located high up on a back road in Livingston Manor, invokes such a question. As the region's first and only passive house/net zero community, the project focuses on how we build, how we connect to the land, and the relationship we have to each other.

"This whole property is about environmental stewardship," stated Coldwell Banker Timberland Properties agent James Karpowicz. "Conservation, recycle, reuse, regenerate. So all the trees that were cut when this lot was cleared to build, were sent to a local mill, milled and then brought back. All the floors, trim, and wood surrounding the cabinets is from this lot, from this soil."

And according to Karpowicz, everything is meant to be reusable with very little waste. The whole house could technically be taken apart and used for other things.

Each house or unit is a NetZero home, which means over the net of the year there would be zero energy costs. Every home comes with a base solar package, and with the effi-

ciency of the way it's built - which includes triple pane windows, solar shields and arrays, filtered fresh air, along with its size - it costs nothing to operate.

"Right now, this home is a model home," said Karpowicz, "to show what each house would be like once built."

There are three models to choose from, this particular model being the "Balsam", along with 10 lots on the 40 plus acres to choose from.

"Once you choose the home you want, there are also upgrades to each package," added Karpowicz. "Depending on the time of year, it's about 12 to 18 months completion time from when you sign the contract. These developers really aren't here to just build out a bunch of houses as fast as they can and fill the properties. They're really considerate about how each and every detail is done, and how it all fits together as a whole for the community and the environment."

This model, the "Balsam," is a little more than 2,200 square feet with three bedrooms, 2 and a half baths, a double height living room, and two separate second floor decks or balconies that give you gorgeous views year round.

The Future of Living Catskill Project has also created hiking trails on the conservation easement, along with overlooks for the multiple waterfalls and ponds that are found on the property.




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
