t was built by volunteers 31 years ago," WJFF Radio Catskill General Manager Tim Bruno said of the Jeffersonville location. The building sits back next to the Lake Jefferson dam that has powered the offices and studio with hydroelectric power since 2000.

weekly programs, to national radio shows from NPR. Community is at the heart of WJFF and every holiday season they offer a wonderful outing for music lovers of all ages.



"We have 2 years' worth of donations and we've got a team of guys dedicated to the music sale," Bruno said. The annual music sale is one of three fundraisers, the other two fundraisers include the WJFF Radio Catskill Community Awards and the sales of t-shirts and tote bags. "They help us pay for the programming and the equipment."

It's the perfect opportunity for music lovers and collectors to find a vintage vinyl record, or shop some old music equipment including speakers, turntables and more. The annual

sale includes LP's, 45's, CD's, cassettes, instruments, musical equipment and all the money helps WJFF Radio Catskill as they prepare for a big move.

While the community public radio station has called Jeffersonville home since 1990, they're looking forward to moving into their new building off Route 52 in Liberty in 2022. Their new location will offer them more space for offices, equipment, control rooms, studios, and a dedicated area for performances, events, lectures and meetings. The new location will also offer them a new digital system to work with, moving from older analog technology to a more customizable program. There's even an extra outbuilding and easier access to a radio tower on the property.

"We had planned to move the end of this year," Bruno explained. But the effects of the COVID pandemic has changed their timeline, and they're still in Phase 1 development of the new space. "We are expecting to move the end of March, beginning of April next year."

"We focus on small local makers," Rebecca Crance, Business Operations Manager at the

Narrowsburg Union, said. The team at Catskills Curated makes sure that the products come from the surrounding area. "We go out and do the research."

All in all Catskills Curated has over 60 makers they work with from 5 counties in the region: Sullivan, Orange & Delaware in NY, and Wanye & Pike in PA. While some of the products are from newer businesses and makers, others, like

Shemanski Maple Syrup go back for generations.

"Every one of them has a story," said Kathy Weidman, co-founder and co-owner of the Narrowsburg Union with her husband Brendan. Visitors can see pictures of products on a revolving slide show in the shop, but Catskills Curated hopes to include pictures and video interviews of their makers soon.

Visitors and locals alike can stop by the shop to peruse their selection of snacks, coffee & teas, sauces, syrups, pasta, jams, mixes, artwork, clothing, soaps, mugs, home décor, utensils and more. If there's something you'd like to taste or try the Catskills Curated staff even offers a tasting tray of new and popular items.

"We're constantly looking [for new prod-

products]...we'll go to shows and to farmers' markets," said Catskills Curated Store Manager Terry Breiman. "It's nice to bring back something that you can use rather than a T-shirt."

And if there's something you already love or want to discover something new, Catskills Curated offers both yearly subscription boxes that ship out 4 times a year, as well as curated gift boxes that come in varying sizes which can be sent for a variety of special occasions.

"Basically, we don't tell them what they're going to get," Weiden said. Each quarterly box offers a surprise of local made items – or you can customize a box if you want.

mail out orders easily – it's also a plus for any local customers looking to ship holiday packages.

Each subscription is kind of full circle for the Weidens. Items are packed with care in a compostable box and nestled in excelsior, or wood wool, which is an eco-friendly packing material that originally brought Brendan Weiden's greatgrandparents to the area. They owned a furniture business, and excelsior was used to stuff upholstered furniture. They eventually bought a mill outside of town that made the material, which the Weidens still own to this day.

"I think really what I am learning is how much talent and creativity there is in the area," Kathy Weiden said. "Hopefully we'll inspire others."

Catskills Curated is open year round, from Thursday to Sunday until the holidays. After that days of operation may change to Friday through



"I never thought food would be such a big seller," owner Jutta Bishop said. Bishop, a designer from Philadelphia and former antique dealer in Honesdale, PA, took over the General Store in 2018 from Joe Hunt. "He made me an offer I couldn't refuse. I started this and I just kept on growing."

sandwiches and coffee, Bishop has stocked the store with local products from the surrounding area. The countertop is covered with delectable pastries and baked goods available for purchase, and there's always a stool available for those who want to stop and sip some local coffee from Black & Brass and Moka Origins.

"You've got everything right here so people don't have to travel," Bishop said. "We try to cater to everybody. I try to give a good snapshot of what everybody has locally."

The Equinunk General Store's shelves are packed with everything from maple syrup and honeys, to vintage cookbooks and locally made sweatshirts. Visitors can stop by to purchase sausages and meats from the Alpine Wurst


