

Winter wonders

SULLIVAN COUNTY - The winter sports season got underway in December with a smattering of basketball games, indoor track meets, a skiing scrimmage and some early bouts of wrestling. Cheerleaders added their vibrant spirit with their cadenced cheers and graceful movements, and the gyms came alive with enthusiastic crowds hungry for the sports they revere.

Unlike a year ago when the few basketball games that were played before things were shut down were staged in spectator-less gyms, this year has already seen a resurgence of competitive games and their accompanying enthusiastic fandom.

But the specter of Covid-19 is far from gone. We have already had schools going on remote learning for a week here and there and some games postponed due to the quarantining of players who were purportedly exposed to the seemingly ever-present virus.
