

"All of the old houses had porches and that's how people saw the world," says Marilyn Lusker, owner and proprietress of the Rose Cottage.

The Rose Cottage is a continuation of the legacy of hospitality set down by Lusker's parents Walter and Rose Kocher who operated the De Bruce Club Inn during the heyday of Sullivan County's resorts from the 1940s through the 1960s.

In the 1980s Lusker and her late husband Ron bought nearby Nangle's Resort and reopened as the De Bruce Country Inn from 1983 until 2014. After her husband passed in 2014, Lusker pivoted from taking care of over

36 rooms at the Country Inn to renovating the Rose Cottage and opening the 5 bedroom bed & breakfast.

"It's nice to have people still feel at home here," Lusker's niece Anne Miller says. "Something we hear from guests a lot is how well cared for they are. Marilyn is an amazing hostess and she makes people feel like family."

In addition to the Bed & Breakfast, Lusker, and her brother Bill Kocher, rent out the Swiss Cottage just up the road as a short-term vacation rental and have recently overseen the restoration and reopening of Davidson's General Store just a quick walk down the road from the Rose Cottage.

Guests can also explore nature, fly fish in the Willowemoc or just disconnect and return to the calming sense of nature during their stay.

"We have a trail we're in the process of marking for guests to have access to the big water-

Guests at the Rose Cottage are not only treated to bucolic views, but also to a wide array of art from Lusker's former gallery The Left Bank in Liberty.

Breakfast and dinner are included when guests book their stay with seasonal and fresh culinary delights provided by Chef Edwin Pubil. And in the evenings, guests can enjoy a taste of history with the iconic "Pink Lady" signature cocktail – named after the fishing dry fly, both of which were invented in De Bruce.

"Our website says we have a continuing tradition of generous hospitality, and that's what we have," Lusker says.

Whether you're looking for a weekend away fishing, or just want to stop by to visit and learn about the history, the Rose Cottage Bed & Breakfast's doors are open for those in the area and from farther away. And there's a seat on the porch waiting just for you.



enjoy the river...

he Delaware River is perhaps one of Sullivan County's most treasured natural resources. It offers scenic views year round and is one of the most popular spots during the summer months for fishing, boating and more. Visitors and locals alike flock to its shores.

But like any body of water, the river holds its dangers as we saw last summer when there were 5 drownings within a two week span – two in one day. So this year while celebrating the beauty of the river, also keep in mind these tips from the National Parks Service (NPS) on river safety & pre-

plained. "In the winter, we have


large ice flows, and when the river starts to move in the spring those ice flows can move rocks."

You should never jump from rocks or bridges into the river. You won't know how deep the water is, and there could be underwater obstructions you could injure yourself on. And know that the

river is ever changing, from swift currents to drop-offs, so play it safe

While we most often associate life jackets with boating on the river, it's also important to wear one while swimming.

"Most people who drown on the river know how to swim...



...there have been 74 drownings since 1980 when we started keeping track," Susie Kaspar said. "Only 4 of those were someone with a life jacket that wasn't properly worn. We've never had somebody drown on the river that was wearing a properly fitted life jacket"

A properly fitted life jacket should be snug when fastened, and if you pull up on the shoulders it shouldn't come above your chin.

"Life jackets are required on any

vessel that you are on that brings you from point A to point B. So if you head up river, down river or across and back," Kaspar said. These include paddleboards, kayaks, canoes, rafts, and tubes.

By law, all children 12 & under have to be wearing life jackets at all times. Meanwhile adults only have to have them accessible & within easy reach in a boat, but it's highly recommended to be worn at all times. When the river

is over 6 ft. in height life jackets must be worn by all for safety.


If you need a life jacket, the Park Service does have locations with loaner life jackets you can borrow for the day and then return. It's important to always be aware on the river and keep an eye on your whole party. In the case of an emergency, you want to make sure you have your life jacket on before you try to help others. And if your boat flips, try

to stay upstream and away from the vessel.

"People always think people yell for help, but a drowning person very rarely can yell for help," Kaspar said. "They won't be flailing their arms. Their head will be bobbing up and down and they'll be sucking in air. It happens so quickly."

If you see someone in distress you should always be wearing your life jacket, and try to throw them a line or reach for them rather than swim out to them you don't want to endanger yourself. If all else fails go for help.

Remember cell phone service along the river is sometimes spotty, so you should always try to get to a roadway or a residence after coming to shore. Or you can always flag down a livery van to get help.



What's old



is new

he Homestead Restaurant + Lounge's roots go deep in Sullivan County. It has not only rebooted a classic Sullivan County brand to bring its touch to a new generation of visitors and locals, but it's also creating many of its dishes using fresh produce grown in Sullivan County soil on its own farm.

Aptly named The Eldred Preserve Farm, the 5-acre farm is just a stone's throw from Bethel Woods and grows exclusively for The Eldred Preserve, and its hospitality assets, including The Homestead, The Bradstan Boutique Hotel, and The Preserve Weddings + Events.

But leave it to The Homestead to expand the meaning of the oft-touted farm-to-table concept. Instead of simply using farm-fresh produce, The Homestead has taken it a step further by returning its food waste to the farm to eventually become compost.

"Now we are a true farm-to-table-to-farm operation," Eldred Preserve Chief Operating Officer Scott Samuelson explained.

"Not many places have the opportunity to do both," Farm-To-Table Chef and Catering Chef John Botti.

Botti works closely with Executive Chef

Dan Gonzalez to create a multitude of menu items that change with the seasons. Last winter – the first since The Eldred Preserve formally opened its doors to guests – Botti and Gonzalez got to choose what was planted at The Eldred Preserve Farm, with the help of several seed catalogs provided by the farm's Growing Operations manager (a fancy name for onsite farmer), John Donovan.

By being able to choose some of what was grown, Botti and Gonzalez are now able to offer a more creative mix of dishes that fit with the season, each one featured on the menu for two weeks before diners are introduced to something new.

Both Botti and Gonzalez have deep local roots as well. Botti, a graduate of the Culinary Institute of America, used to own and operate John's Harvest Inn at Middletown. Gonzalez graduated from SUNY Sullivan's culinary program.

"I actually started at the old Eldred Preserve," Gonzalez said. He left there and worked at other restaurants, including Scott Conant's Cellaio at Resorts World Catskills.

before returning to The Eldred Preserve to lead the culinary team at The Homestead Restaurant + Lounge.

The farm-to-table-to-farm aspect is just one of the many ways The Homestead is keeping things local and fresh. Everyone on the team makes every effort to utilize locally produced products, including many of the beers and spirits served at its bar.

"We're still building, growing, and evolving, but our priority is always to make peo-

ple feel at home and comfortable here," Botti said. "We have the fine dining, but you can also come and eat at a modest budget."

The Homestead offers multiple dining experiences between the restaurant, the outdoor patio, and the lounge, making it an ideal choice for those celebrating a special occasion in its dining room, joining friends for casual but unique lounge bites, or simply taking a break to enjoy fine dining, fabulous views, and family.

"I'd venture to say we have one of the best burgers ever," Samuelson said. "And guests can still enjoy a taste of nostalgia with the original Homestead's classic raisin bread, which our onsite baker, Olivia, has mastered, and even improved."

But the raisin bread isn't the only "classic" at The Eldred Preserve. Nearly 15 years after the final curtain at The Bradstan Country Hotel Inn Cabaret Series fell, the famous Bradstan Cabaret is back this year with an


