



Remembering Doug Rohrback

he poem written by Michael Ashby titled "The Golf Course In The Sky" has become a favorite writing of Liberty resident Carol Rohrback, whose husband, the late Doug Rohrback, was manager of the Tarry Brae Sullivan County Men's Tuesday golf league for many years.

The poem has become very meaningful to Carol, who addressed the league on opening night (May 4) by saying, "It's hard to forget someone who gave you so much to remember."

The poem reads, "As eighteen flags flew at half mast, and Glasses were soberly raised high, the latest member was having a ball at the golf course in the sky."

"Freed from the gravity of the situation, the first tee shot soared through space bringing a wondrous beaming smile to a kind, down to earth face."

"Surrounded by old club friends once thought never to be seen again, the infinity course beckoned ahead. Eighteen holes were for mere mortal men.'

Carol, surrounded by her daughter Jeni Rohrback, granddaughter Zoe Distefano and members of the Tuesday Tarry Brae Sullivan County Men's Golf League, raised a toast in loving memory of Doug and added. "I'm sure this is what Doug would have said to you, "may all your drives find fairways and may they travel far. May irons find a place to land that helps you to break par. May your wedge float high then softly drop, may your chips caress the slope. May your putts locate that perfect break to always give you hope. It was a pleasure playing with all of you. Have a great golf season."

Attending the league opening memorial ceremony was Tarry Brae PGA professional and director of Golf for the Town of Fallsburg Geoff Walsh and the league's new manager Rodney T. Jester III, who teamed up with Doug last year to finish the 2021 season.

Carol Rohrback noted that Doug immediately took a liking to Rodney and started training him to take over the league management by showing him first how to handle the skins por-

tion of the league funds.

Doug was born on September 25, 1952 in Liberty, the son of the late Andrew and Rhoda Gregory Rohrback. He followed his father's professional background, entering the automobile sales business and retired as General Manager for the M & M Auto group in Liberty.

Doug was a gentleman and a professional in everything he did. Many who purchased a vehicle from him noted that he was always honest and sincere and this is the way he also handled the duties of golf league management.

The Tarry Brae Sullivan County Golf league is approximately 20 years old and started out originally as the old Electric Company league, playing at Grossinger's.

The league changed its name to the Sullivan County Golf League when the league was forced to leave, following the closing of the Big G.

In 2016, Grossingers advised the league that this was the last year for league play at the Big G.

mately 17 years ago when league manager Bobby Jones moved to the Albany area.

Doug was also a member of the Monday Men's league at Liberty's Sullivan County Golf & Country Club.

His parents introduced Doug to the game of golf at an early age and over the years he partnered in this league with Bobby Jones and Kevin Mullen before asking Jester to finish last year with him.

Hole-in-one honors were recorded by Doug on the fourth hole at the Sullivan County Golf & Country Club. Tabbed as a good golfer, Doug maintained a 4 handicap for many years and when he started not feeling well it went up slightly.

In the spring of 2001, after experiencing some health problems, Doug started looking for his replacement and that eventually turned out to be Rodney T. Jester III.

Jester, now 27, played in this league for two years, and subbed for one year, before joining Doug as his partner. Relatively young to the game of golf, Jester started actively playing league golf in 2017 with his grandfather at the Roscoe Twin Village Golf Course. This followed two-years of being the co-captain of the

Tompkins Cortland Community College Panthers baseball team. He was the MVP in baseball at Tri-Valley Central School.

Showing good athleticism, Jester quickly took to the game of golf with handicaps ranging from 1 to 3 and said he enjoys the competition level offered by this Tarry Brae league. Many of the league golfers enjoy watching Jester drive the ball off the tee.

Dan Yaun was a great friend of Doug. In fact, he was with Doug and his family the night Doug passed away.

Yaun noted, "We would play baseball and football at Brad Wheeler's house when we were kids. Later, we played at Sutherland's field. We were on the golf team together in high school along with Mark Etess, Sheldon Shrenkler and Sheldon Pollock. Doug and Miles Kaiser and I went to Woodstock together.

"He really ran a good league, he was very organized and fair and wanted the best for the members of the league. Sometimes, at the end of the year awards' dinner, he had so many prizes to hand out that he would keep calling names until all the prizes were gone, whereby some guys got two to three prizes. I believe he



Now with Doug's passing, I'm the last of that foursome still standing." Kawauchi pointed out that "Doug was 'the

leader' of the golf league. Every year, at the opening meeting Doug would ask us, 'Anybody want this job?' half seriously. But everyone knew he was good at his job. We all trusted him and knew he would always do right by the league and us members. We will miss his leadership and his smile." Tarry Brae PGA Pro Geoff Walsh said he and

Doug "played high school golf against one another, when Ellenville played Liberty, so our association goes back a long time." Walsh added, "However, we did not reconnect until I took the position here four years ago and

everything; scheduling, handicaps, dues collection and payment, rainout decisions and all the other details required for a successful league. He was always very sensitive to operating the league in concert to our daily operations. He

would adjust to any changes without complaint, which is not always the norm. Doug was super organized, and there were never any problems with the league play and our other golfing clientele. That also was not the norm, and it made it very easy on us at Tarry Brae." Sonnenschein pointed out that, "Doug would

always stop in for a drink after play, to not only patronize our establishment, but to make sure all went well with the evening's play. His personality and demeanor made him a pleasure to deal with for us and all the members of the league."

Sonnenschein added. "I sure would agree, he will be missed. Rest in peace, Doug."



the noisy 'King' of the bird world

hen it comes to seeking out the handsome belted kingfisher, listen for the bird's call first.

The wild clattering voice of both male and female belted kingfishers gives them away. Shaggy crested and stocky, the birds dwell along

our streams and ponds and announce with their rat-a-tat voice to keep away as they catch fish for dinner.

In his famous nineteenth century "Birds of America" book, naturalist and painter John James Audubon described the ballet-like dive of the belted kingfisher this way: "If, in the course of its excursions, the bird passes over a small pool, it suddenly checks itself in its career, poises itself in the air like a sparrow hawk or kestrel, and inspects the water beneath, to discover whether there may be fishes in it suitable to its taste.

"Should it find this to be the case," Audubon said, "it continues poised for a few seconds, dashes spirally headlong into the water, seizes a fish, and alights on the nearest tree or stump, where it swallows its prev in a moment."

Belted kingfishers are also known to beat their prey against the tree limb, stunning them with their powerful bills. Ouch!

KINGFISHER FACTS

Some 120 species of kingfishers live worldwide, but belted kingfishers are native to North America. They are one of the few bird species in which the female is more brightly colored than the male – it's her "belt" of a swath of cinnamon-colored chest feathers that the males don't possess.

The birds clock in at about 13 inches in length and are mostly bluish-slate and white in color. On a favorite lake or stream, they patrol their area with a sense of ownership. Should a human intrude, out comes the rattle call with, often, the bird flying ahead of the person until it reaches the limit of its territory. The bird then circles back behind the intruder.

Solitary except during breeding season, male and female kingfishers both aggressively defend

their territory.

But now, it is breeding season and unlike birds that raise their young in trees, belted kingfishers burrow a three-to 12-foot tunnel underground.

"They nest deep in banks in stream-beds and banks that erode naturally," said local author and birder John Haas. "Their cavity is really quite deep and is safe from almost all natural predators and weather events."

Both females and males work on burrowing a three- to 12-foot-long tunnel from the entrance to a rounded birthing area. They use their bills and their feet to excavate and move soil, usually taking turns. The birds dig a foot or more each day, working for a week or two, in April or May.


The female then lays five to seven eggs that are white in color. Both sexes incubate the eggs, often with the female sitting on the eggs at night while the male taking over in early morning.

Kingfishers generally eat fish and crayfish, but also frogs, toads, snakes, turtles, insects, young birds, mice, and even fruits. But now, both parents are feeding their young with partially digested fish and later on, with whole fish.

At first, the young are bare and skinny, running to the mouth of a tunnel as they hear from their parents that food has arrived.

The female kingfisher sports the attractive 'belt' that gives the bird its name. John Haas of the Sullivan County Audubon Society says most belted kingfishers typically migrate in winter. A few were seen this year overwintering at the Rondout Reservoir, Neversink River, and at Phillipsport, all in Sullivan County.

Baby belted kingfishers possess acidic stomachs that help them digest bones, fish scales, and arthropod shells. Later they regurgitate pellets that accumulate on the ground around fishing and roosting perches.

The young leave the nest after about a month. But parents continue to feed them and to teach the young with lessons like dropping dead fish into the water where the young can retrieve them.

When danger is near, the parents step up to the plate, wrote John James Audubon. Both parents, he said, "evince great solitude for the safety of their young" when danger is near. "The mother sometimes drops on the water,

as if severely wounded," Audubon said, "and flutters and flounders as if unable to rise from the stream, in order to induce the intruder to wade or swim after her, whilst her mate, perched on the nearest bough, or even on the edge of the bank, jerks his tail, erects his crest, rattles his notes with angry vehemence, and then springing off, passes and repasses before the enemy, with a continued cry."


The towering challenge heats up


was one of Collin's main influences in getting his license to be a guide. "I remember when he came to the school when I was a kid, and then in 2018 he pushed me to make a career out of it."


