



of the written word, taking place Friday June 17th through Sunday June 19th.

This year, the festival is focusing on a novel written by a teen runaway, unmarried mother that has had an unparalleled influence on popular culture since its publication in 1818: **Frankenstein; or, The Modern Prometheus** by Mary Shelley. An incredible roster of writers and artists will gather in Narrowsburg to read, discuss and reflect on what this book means to us today. Two years into a global pandemic where the adage "sci-

Farm Arts Collective, the Damascus-based theatre company will create an original performance inspired by the famous sequence in which Frankenstein pursues his creation.



he Hotel Darby really leans into its river connection and it's not hard to understand why. With three river landings within easy access of the latest Foster Supply property, it would be hard not to focus on it.

"The river is a huge aspect," Darby Propst says, "There is something for everyone."



"We try to embrace the community aspect and history," Jenn Eaton says. The property offers a place to gather and disconnect, and a home base to return to each night after a day filled with adventures.






