



The hope is that each person might feel inspired to do even just one thing for the bees.


And of course, attendees are always encouraged to wear their best and favorite bee attire, and that includes dressing up your beloved pups too, so get ready and bee creative!

It's a time when farmers markets are plentiful, and Bethel Woods Center for the Arts ushers in the season with their Annual Harvest Festival.

Each week is special with everything from corn and hay mazes to horse and buggy rides, specialty crafters and farm-

t's a place for lovers of trinkets and sundresses, collectors of glass Ball jars and vintage jewelry, fans of tie dye shirts, handcrafted soaps, cowboy boots, and so much more.

Linda's Country Corner Store on Route 17B at the four corners of Fosterdale is a treat to step into - a place to find a little bit of everything.

Owner Linda Fratello, a Bronx native turned upstate farmer, can usually be found behind the counter smiling and chatting with customers. A retired city school teacher of 27 years, she bought the store just a few years ago but has been spending summers here in the Catskills for the last 35 years.

"I've always loved everything local. That's really what I wanted this shop to be about," Fratello said. "To carry local products and support local artists, but also have items like dresses and jewelry, new or vintage."

Originally, the brick and mortar boutique was once the Cochecton Post Office, a drive through hot dog and ice cream stand, and before Fratello bought the building - an antique store.

"I went into this with a vision and needed a game plan for my retirement, so it actually all started with soap," Fratello said laughing. "I loved crafting and I had used goat milk once before, which is fabulous for the skin, so I said that's it. I'm going to start making it."

So, Fratello googled goat milk soap and taught herself how to make it, all while planning a grand opening for the Corner Country Store, but with the onset of the pandemic that grand opening took a backseat.


Fratello didn't let it deter her though, she focused on making soaps, giving them out to friends, and mastering her recipe. She and her partner then acquired llamas and when the

time came to shear, she had to figure out what to do with all the fiber. With the help of the Rosehaven Boutique in Bethel, scarves and blankets came to fruition, which can of course be found in her shop alongside her charcoal and citrusy goat milk soap.

She didn't have her grand opening, but Fratello said she feels so thankful for the amount of people who have come in to shop. Concert-goers at Bethel Woods have come in looking for tie-dye and clear bags, people heading towards the lake grab coverups, while visitors excited to float on the river want ponchos and river bags.

"There is so much to enjoy in the area, it's just a fabulous spot," Fratello said, "and I'm happy to be a part of the community and be here in whatever way I can. This is now my home."

Currently Linda's Corner Country Store is open on Saturdays from 11am - 3pm. In the fall the store will open on Sundays as well from 11am - 3pm.






