The Burn Brae Mansion is as elaborate outside as it is inside from the stonework, round windows, and detailed trim to the ieweled chandeliers, archways, and treasures found in each and every room.

Mysterious mansion with a history

utumn is upon us here in the Catskills, and with the changing of the leaves, cooler temperatures, and the stillness of the nights comes ghost stories by the fire and setting out decorations for Halloween.

But what if the ghost stories told with toothy grins and flashlights under chins were actually real? A night's stay at the Burn Brae Mansion in Glen Spey just might answer that question.

Burn Brae Mansion was built in 1907-08 by Margaret Ross MacKenzie Elkin and her husband, Charles. Margaret, the daughter of George Ross MacKenzie (third president of the Singer Sewing Machine company), was one of seven children who built elaborate summer mansions in Glen Spey after their father's death in 1892. Burn Brae is one of three mansions still standing.

Since the Elkins, the Mansion has changed hands five times, serving as a boarding house, a tea room during prohibition, separated as apartments, and as a bed and breakfast.

"We've been here for about 30 years," said Pat Fraysse, who owns the Mansion with her husband, Mike. "My husband was a cycling coach, and so that was the original idea when we bought the house, was for Mike to have his own training camp.

That's how everything started."

Mike coached three Olympic teams, several World's Championship teams, and ran training camps for the Cycling Federation and the International League, so when they saw the mansion was for sale he jumped at the opportunity to start his own camp.

When Mike and Pat purchased the home, an older couple in their 80s who had been living on the second and third floor, came

"There was absolutely no way we could tell them to move," said Pat, "so they stayed with us until they passed away at 98 and

During that time, Mike with the help of skilled local carpenters and craftsmen began restoring the original character of the house. Taking down walls that had been put up, restoring pillars, archways, and stained glass

windows to the living room, repairing the main stairway, and fixing leaks in the roof, all while training riders.

Many of those young riders who finished school early would come and stay at the mansion for weeks at a time.

"They were actually the ones who started telling Mike and I things that they were seeing or experiencing," explained Pat, "but we kind of just brushed it off and thought it was

Eventually, Pat's daughter Susan, suggested that on their off-season months they should turn the Mansion into a bed and breakfast, and so Pat and Mike agreed.

"Suddenly guests were telling me that someone was touching their hair or pulling their foot in the middle of the night," Pat said turning on the lamp in an upstairs bedroom. "Other guests told me they heard people talking or moving furniture in the room above them where no guests were at the time."

That's when Pat and Mike started talking to the previous owners to see if they had ever experienced anything, and invited a professional paranormal group that had been working with the paranormal for 35 years - as suggested by their son-in-law - into the Mansion.

"The stuff they found..." Pat said pausing, placing her hand on her chin, "still gets to me when I think about it."

Pat herself hadn't experienced much as she worked in New Jersey up until about four to five years ago, and wasn't in the house as much as her husband, Mike, who spending quite a lot of time alone was beginning to hear and see things. Since retiring from her job, Pat often hears furniture moving, and from time to time notices things that have been moved in the house.

Burn Brae has now been the subject of multiple paranormal investigations and ghost hunting groups. Bed and breakfast guests have reported unexplained occurrences like doors opening and slamming, balls bouncing, seeing a woman in a white dress, a man in turn of the century clothing, children's voices, and the distinct sound of an organ playing (there is no organ in the house.)

"We had the idea to put journals in each of the rooms where people stay so that they can write down their experiences," Pat explained turning the page of one such journal placed neatly on a dresser next to an old



mirror. "Some guests experience absolutely nothing, and others do."

Some guests stay at the Burn Brae Mansion for the paranormal experience, and others stay simply to visit the area or go to Bethel Woods.

Bed and breakfast accommodation packages include a home-cooked dinner and a full breakfast, as well as a guided tour of the mansion - exclusive to overnight guests. Rooms are available in the Mansion, which is open year-round, or the Stables Motel, a 12-room lodge converted from the original horse stables located just behind the Mansion, open April through December.

So if you're wondering if the ghost stories are real, stay a night at the Burn Brae Mansion and find out!






