where the angler should fish. This is where food will be concentrated and the trout will be found during periods of high water. Note how the water is smooth and slack in this area.

#### **BY JUDY VAN PUT**

A fter making it through the Big Freeze of early February, we are looking forward to the prospect of sunshine, longer days and the opening of the regular Trout Fishing Season April 1.

Although the weather in early April may not be the most conducive for the trout fisher, it is often a time of year when the chance of catching a large fish is increased, especially with the runoff from melting snow and ice entering the river that causes water levels to rise and become discolored. During these times, those who "know" will be out on the river with the hope of catching a large fish when the water is "just right," a term used locally that refers to these stream conditions.

As the stream rises and increases in velocity, the high water will erode the edges of streambanks, especially at turns or bends in the river, causing earthworms

and underground invertebrates to become exposed and enter the stream. Terrestrials such as ants, beetles, grasshoppers and inchworms are washed into the stream from the land, trees and bushes, and with the increase in the speed of the current, nymphal stages of mayflies, stoneflies, caddis and other aquatic insects are dislodged from the bottom of the streambed.

Despite invertebrates having legs and other methods of attaching themselves to the bottom substrate to avoid being washed away in the current, in high water they will lose their foothold and drift defenselessly along with the current, eventually settling out of the fast water and being deposited in the slower inside water of the bend, as the speed of the water is fastest on the outside and slowest on the inside of the curve. stresses of spawning and have lost condition, and will feed hungrily, gorging themselves on the insects and terrestrials that are swept into the stream.

When water conditions are high and roily, some anglers may wonder how it is possible to succeed in catching any fish at all. Fly fishers in particular may be daunted by discolored water, thinking that the trout may not be able to see their fly – however this is not the case. A black or dark fly will stand out and will be visible to the fish.

To improve your chances of being successful in the early season, it's important to know where to fish. Look for turns or bends in the stream that will have these slower, calmer "deposition areas."

With so much food available, the trout will be feeding on or near the bottom. This is the

The current or flow will not only be traveling downstream, but in a bend pool, will also be moving in a circular up-anddown motion, toward the inside of the curve, which is where the insects, invertebrates and debris will be deposited.

If you observe the stream near a bend, you'll notice that the

water on the inside of the bend is calm and looks flat; this slack water also invites trout who will seek not only the opportunity to get out of the swiftness of the current, as it takes less energy to maintain their position in the slower water, but also has the benefit of the additional food that is being washed downstream - a double bonus for the trout, and a good opportunity for the angler to catch them!

Large fish will leave their hiding places and feed openly on this new host of food and abundance of nourishment entering the stream, following the long winter with its limited food supply. Those trout that have spawned in the fall and winter may not yet have fully recovered from the opportunity to cover the most water out of each cast.

My husband Ed remembers interviewing Howard Lindsley, from Livingston Manor, many years ago. Howard related the story of catching a huge brown trout in Junction Pool on the Beaverkill just below Roscoe, way back in 1949. The fish weighed an astounding eight pounds, two-andone-half ounces, and measured 27 inches in length, with a girth of 15 inches. Howard caught it on a nightcrawler in the early evening and said that it took him a half-hour before he was able to reel in the large trout. In the interview (which

occurred many years later) Howard recalled that, "the water was just right."

As you prepare for early-season fishing during high water, before you plan to fish, try to locate sections of the stream with bend pools, with noticeable deposition areas on the inside of the bend. The fish will be located close to the stream bank and you won't have to wade very far to make your cast.

When we fish in high water with nymphs, we tie a dropper of about six to eight inches long at about twelve inches above the end of the leader, to which we tie on the nymph; then attach the weight (split shot) to the end of the leader. This frees up the fly to move along in the current just above the bottom and will result in less chances of your fly getting hung up. If the split shot gets hung up, you can just pull it free or replace it if necessary and still have your fly intact.

Our favorite nymphs to fish with during the high flows of the early season are the Zug Bug (weighted nymph) in sizes #8 - #12 and the Hendrickson Nymph in size #12.

To fish with a nymph and weight in this manner, it's best to use just a short line, fishing only the leader section with your arm extended. You won't need to cast very far due to the high and discolored water, and as a result, you can get close to the trout. Keep the leader perpendicular to the rod and use the tip of your rod to follow the leader as it moves downstream. If you find that the leader is not moving slowly with the current, or

if you cannot feel the bottom with the split shot, add another split shot.

You'll need to be fishing slowly, as the trout will not chase after your fly with so much food already available on or near the bottom. Once the line has drifted below where you are standing, repeat the process by lobbing the rig back upstream in order to cover as much of the entire area in front of you as possible.

Concentrate on the leader and look for hesitation in the movement or a slight tug – you'll need to gently but quickly set the hook, as this may be the only indication that a fish has taken your fly. You may even catch a white sucker – which is a good indication that you are fishing on the bottom.

If you are not having any action after fishing for a while, rest the area and move on to another. Chances are still good that there are trout lurking there to be caught at a later time.

Become familiar with these special areas before you embark on your fishing trip; there is great satisfaction that comes from learning where and how to fish under high water conditions that most anglers will forego; and you'll add to your enjoyment of the sport knowing to fish when the water is "just right."

# Take your shot at Catskill Pheasantry

atskill Pheasantry & Sporting Clays' near 600 acres of land offers hunters and outdoor sportsmen various types of environments to practice their craft in, including rolling hillsides, woodlands, and streams. The pheasantry is listed as a Class A licensed upland bird hunting preserve.

All are encouraged to try their hand at the bird hunt expeditions as there are no hunting licenses required for pheasants.

Whether it has feathers or is made of clay, "bird" hunting is not the only option when looking to let loose a few rounds and keep the aim sharp. Clay and trap shooting are a staple

for the pheasantry, with two full courses that are expected to give even experienced shooters an exciting challenge.

The first of the two sporting clay courses, "Pheasant Run", was recently outfitted with lighting to allow night shoots.

The upland bird hunt prices depend on the type of bird being hunted, with the Ringneck Pheasant running around \$400 per group and the Chukar Partridge being \$410 per group. Hunting times are split up into two sections, mornings from 9 a.m. to noon, and afternoons from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m.

# Eagles of the Upper Delaware River

n winter, the Upper Delaware River region becomes a temporary home to hundreds of bald eagles. Arriving from Canada and upstate New York, the eagles fly south in search of open water to fish, and large stands of trees in which to perch and roost.

The clean waters and protected lands of the Upper Delaware provide the perfect winter habitat for these magnificent birds, and eagle-viewing has become a popular winter activity. The Delaware Highlands Conservancy offers a series of guided Eagle Watch bus tours in January and February, and on weekends Conservancy volunteers staff Eagle Observation Areas located throughout the region where visitors can look through binoculars and scopes to see bald eagles in the wild.

More information about the bus tours and a map to the Eagle Observation Areas to plan your own driving tour is available on the

Whether eagle-watching on your own or with a guided bus tour, it's important to practice 'eagle etiquette' to ensure you do not disturb the birds. Avoid loud noises such as yelling, car door slamming, horn honking, and unnecessary movement. Use binoculars instead of trying to get closer, and don't do anything to try to make the eagle fly.

Remain inside your vehicle and park only in designated public parking areas. Practicing eagle etiquette ensures that the eagles can conserve the precious energy they need to survive the cold winter months.

By late February to mid-March, most of these winter migrants are heading back north to their home territories—but the Upper Delaware is also a year-round home to dozens of resident, breeding pairs of bald eagles. It wasn't always this way, however.

In the 1800s and 1900s, the region was home to similar eagle populations as today. But as human impacts on eagle habitat increased—cutting down large trees the eagles used for nesting and spraying harmful chemicals such as DDT—the eagle population dwindled until they were nearly eliminated. The DDT made the eagles' eggshells soft, making them unable to fledge young, and by 1972, there was just one pair of bald eagles left in New York and one in Pennsylvania.

Even after DDT was banned in 1972, and the Endangered Species Act in 1973 made it illegal to kill bald eagles, it still took a concerted effort to bring the bald eagle back to the Upper Delaware River region.

Today, habitat loss is the number one threat to breeding eagles. The Conservancy works to permanently protect farms and forests, clean waters, and wildlife habitat in the region, and these protected lands offer safe places for eagles year-round—so even though you are likely to spot the most eagles during the winter months,

# Return of our national symbol

y the 1970's, the bald eagle population throughout the country had been decimated. DDT, a pesticide used in farming, contaminated fish and water fowl. Both of which are an important source of an eagle's diet.

By interfering with calcium metabolism, the females were unable to produce egg shells that would withstand the pressures of incubation.

When Peter Nye, leader of NYS DEC Endangered Species Unit, took over in 1976, only one pair of nesting bald eagles were found in all of New York State.

It was his plan to restore an eagle population by acquiring eagle chicks from other States (mostly Alaska). Having been reared in captivity, it was not known whether or not bald eagles would survive in the wild, much less reproduce and remain in New York State.

An army of volunteers, scattered throughout the State, helped in answering both those questions. As a volunteer, it was our assignment to re-

port sightings in our respective areas, including the bird's age, sex, wing tag, leg band and other other observations, such as illness and injuries.

During late February and March, we would submit nesting information in order to check both the integrity and security of each nest. This is especially important when the eagles are breeding. Then, when the chicks (1 to 3) are between 3 to 7 weeks old (unable to hop and fly),

In the decades following the volunteer efforts, the number of nesting pairs in New York increased drastically.

Starting with just one nesting pair in the 70s, and two in the 80s, the number has steadily increased in the years since. In 1990 there were 14 reported nesting pairs, and in 2000 that number raised to 59.

By 2010, when Nye retired, there were 223 nesting pairs noted in Pete's final report.

In 2017, the number had increased to 323 pairs.

This information and more is available by looking up the NYS Bald Eagle Report 2010. Within the report are photos of the many volunteers as well as a summary of Peter Nye's monumental achievement. I see you!:
